1969 Official Business Meeting

The 1969 business meeting was called to order by President Larry Godwin at 8:00 PM at the Conrad Hilton Hotel in Chicago. Greetings from members who were unable to attend were read, and a letter expressing our greetings to the NRC members at their Labor Day convention was circulated.

\*\* Officer and committee reports were presented:

Secretary-Treasurer Mike Northam reported by letter that our bank balance is currently \$790 and the overall position of the club is more promising than at any other point in his term of office. As of the August bulletin, we had 304 members compared with 252 a year ago. It appears the club is moving out of its deficit position; a complete financial statement as of August 31 will be presented very soon.

Chairman of the Countries Committee Mike Worst reported by phone that a new, up-to-date list will be ready for publication soon.

Contest Manager Ed Krejny reported the results of the 1968-69 season contests (to be reported soon in the DX Monitor).

Awards Committee Chairman Percy Kesteven reported by letter that 118 awards have been mailed to members in the last year. The financial picture is good, for the club is recovering the cost of certificates faster than anticipated. Several ideas for new awards series are being considered at this time.

Incorporation Committee Chairman Bill Lipis noted by letter that the committee is now considering the new Colorado Article 24 which the club may elect to adopt. We will be required to file an annual report with the State, in any event.

Advertising Committee Chairman Robert Schneider was present and reported that some manufacturers have been contacted concerning possible advertising in the DX Monitor.

Publicity Committee Chairman Jon Pearkins sent a suggested letter to be mailed to all-night stations, requesting them to air announcements about the IRCA. The committee is working on taped and live manuscripts for club publicity.

ANARC representative Larry Godwin gave a report on the activities of ANARC during the past year, and announced that the 1969 ANARC Man of the Year is Gordon Nelson. The August ANARC convention in Toronto was a success.

Election Committee Chairman George Tanner was present and reported the results of the recent elections (see below).

President Larry Godwin reported on the activities of the Board of Directors during the past year and announced the results of voting by the Board in August (see below).

\*\* The floor was declared open to new business, and the following were discussed:

Offset printing of the bulletin does not appear feasible in Denver or San Diego. From estimates received, the dues would have to be raised very substantially.

A constitutional amendment will be put to a vote by the membership soon, with the objective of changing the procedure of amending the Constitution. If passed, the new procedure would be that a proposed amendment would have to receive a 2/3 vote of the Board and a 2/3 of members voting in order to become approved. It was determined by a show of hands that the members present greatly preferred using EST rather than GMT in the DXWW column.

It was announced that Mike Northam is working on a project of providing WPE-call cards to the members at \$4.25 for the first 100 on glossy stock, or \$4.00 printed on non-glossy stock (and \$2.00 or \$1.80 per additional hundred, respectively)

It was announced that Father Jack Pejza has proposed a joint foreign contest this season between the NRC and IRCA, and the suggestion has been referred to the new Contest Manager Bruce Collier.

A redrafting of Article III of the Bylaws (dealing with elections) was proposed; details are presented elsewhere in this bulletin.

A proposal that the IRCA offer letterheads on erasable bond paper met with near-unanimous favor, and a proposal will be sent to the Board soon in this regard. Although the 1970 convention site will not be determined until the first of next year, attention was drawn to Vancouver's bid.

\*\* The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 PM.

President's Report

(Speech presented at the IRCA Convention Business Meeting in Chicago August 23.)

I feel we should consider again a merger with the NRC.

The merger proposal of a year ago was handled poorly in several ways. First, the attempt was made to have the merger approved immediately with little discussion. The IRCA Board of Directors passed a resolution supporting the merger by a telephone vote; normally proposals are presented in the bulletin before the Board takes action.

Our club had just purchased 10,000 two-color mastheads that might have no value if the merger was approved.

There was more emphasis placed on what each club would retain of its own than on cooperation. Each club wanted its own club and bulletin names, format, editors and even convention site.

There was too much concern in the IRCA over the constitutional and legal implications of a merger. The problem was blown out of proportion. Some were not content to allow a majority of the club decide by vote if the club should be dissolved and merged into a new club.

Some IRCA members pointed to old controversies with the NRC that had long since been resolved.

Two bulletins were proposed, with the domestic part coming from Riverside and the foreign from Boston. There would have been duplicate postage, addressing and mastheads.

The tone of the discussions were: the merger has already been approved by the NRC and IRCA governments. Let's proceed at once. Some viewed the vote by the membership as merely a formality.

Now let's review the pros and cons of a merger at this point in time:

Pros

Elimination of much repetition of DX tips, and duplication of effort by members, editors and publishers.  
Less dues overall for those of us who belong to both NRC and IRCA.  
The strong points of both clubs could be combined into a single club (e.g., democratic government, technical articles, etc.).  
More stable publishing.

Cons

Loss of competition between the clubs.  
Risk of change in domestic format from the Roundup style to Musings as NRC has now. (Presumably a combined vote would decide this question.)  
Loss of the IRCA name, bulletin name, emblem, signature melody, etc.

I think the climate is right to begin thinking of a merger, if one is desired. Both clubs are stronger than they were a year ago. The NRC has achieved a stable publishing arrangement and it appears the IRCA is coming out of its deficit position. Time has elapsed to think about the merger and forget the shortcomings of the original proposal.

I would like to see discussion concerning a merger in both DX Monitor and DX News to determine how the memberships feel about it. If there is sufficient interest on both sides, a joint committee could be established to work out new Bylaws, arrange a timetable, etc. Then the two clubs could vote to determine approval or rejection.

I think a target date of September, 1970 might be reasonable, if the members of both clubs do want a merger.

When you send your comments to the DX Forum, please remember our suggested limit of 15 lines. Also let's remember to keep in mind that this is a friendly club and the merger advantages and disadvantages can be discussed at a mature, informative level. Let's avoid the emotional overtones that brought about so much ill feeling last year. If a merger does come about, we'll all be in the same club; that's all the more reason to keep these discussions friendly. If a merger does not result, we want to continue our friendship with the NRC.

We need a new chairman of the Poor Reports Committee, which sends form letters to DXers who are not club members, explaining the value of good reports and introducing them to the IRCA and NRC. Write Mike Northam if you are interested.

New proposed Constitutional and Bylaws amendments will be announced next issue.

- 750 HJDK Colombia, Medellin was my mystery with "Un Dia Como Este" at 0530 several AMs. Heard with frequent mention of Medellin. (LBG)
- 760 1YA. New Zealand, Auckland very good 7/15 0603-0629 with TCs and news. Only DU heard during the entire summer. (LBG)
- 770 YSKL El Salvador, San Salvador s/on 0600 MM 7/14 with very fine signals. Reported. (LBG)
- 800 XELO Mexico, Ciudad Juarez s/off at 0200 every morning with EE and SS announcements. (RLK)
- 890 YSLA El Salvador, Santa Ana "Radio Musical" s/on 0556 MM 7/14. (LBG)
- HJCE Colombia, Bogota surely the one with mention of TODELAR network at 0120 MM 7/21. Not usually AN, though. (LBG)
- OAX1K Peru, Piura heard again 7/17 from 0602-09 with very readable signals and little QRM. Also heard at s/on 0559 7/10. (LBG)
- 900 TICS Costa Rica, San Jose probably the Central American station s/on 0557 MM 7/14 saying "Desde Costa Rica..." No ID heard. (LBG)
- 1020 TG-- Guatemala, (Unidentified) "Radio Frontera" continues to blast in almost every AM at s/on around 0600. Mentions Chiapas state in Mexico (which borders Guatemala) and a city called Santa Marta which I can't locate on my atlas. Identifies as part of the RCM, or "Radio Cadena Maya" of Guatemala. I can't find any listing of this station. (LBG) (Nor I. FJP)
- 1180 TGT Guatemala, Guatemala is now here ex-1187, heard with "Radio Sonora" IDs between 2330-2358 on 8/1 with little QRM. (LBG)
- 1380 KPOI Hawaii, Honolulu w/rr music at 0429 7/21, S-5 signals w/WKJG QRM. (RLK)

England Due to antenna maintenance, BEC Daventry on 647 kHz will be operating at a reduced power of 60 KW until the end of September. (C.M. Stanbury.)

Malta The BBC relay here has switched from 1178 to new 1546. Schedule is 2245-0045 and 0800-1600 EST in Arabic. (C.M. Stanbury II)

Radio Today 73 magazine, the well known ham magazine, is preparing the first few issues of "Radio Today" magazine, a monthly periodical targeted for the non-amateur faction of radio enthusiasts, particularly the DXers. They are interested in buying manuscripts of all types, for \$12 to \$20 a page. They feel that it is time that there is need of a commercial SWL oriented magazine, in order to elevate DXing to a parallel level with the amateur radio hobby. The first issue is supposed to come out this fall. The address, for more information, is Peterborough, N.H. 03458. Let's make sure that IRCA gets represented from the very first issue.

Canadian stamps I have a considerable number of Canadian 6¢ stamps to trade with anyone for U.S. stamps. Please enclose return postage with your stamps. Canadian members, I'll probably be in need of more stamps shortly, now that the new DX season is with us.

Brunei At long last, I have received a reply for my report of last May's reception on 895 kHz. Unfortunately, I have been informed that they were not on the air at the time I reported them. Gordon Nelson noticed in the background of the tape which I sent him what sounds like facsimile or some other type of pulse-coded signal. This, together with my comment in the April 5 DXWW of noting jammer-type sound on 890 with 5AN, and my mystery reception of BBC audio on 870, leads him to believe that all three receptions originated on SW and were beated into the BCB by a parasite in my FET RF pre-amplifier. He has told me that FET loop amplifiers, especially those operating in an unbalanced configuration, are quite prone to exhibit high-frequency parasitic oscillations if insufficient care was taken with shielding. He has noted parasites when first working with the design which I used, and others have noted them as well. This type of spurious response results from a just barely unstable operating condition, and shows up usually on a small segment of the BCB only. Thus ends my hopes of having a fantastic catch. I am seeking to remedy this situation by building the new altazimuth loop and balanced FET amplifier designed by Gordon and finally appearing in DX News.

At the beginning of this new DX season, I might as well re-introduce myself. I am a Catholic priest, 35 years old, business manager and Physics teacher at Villanova Prep School, 75 miles NW of Los Angeles. I began to DX the SW bands about 2½ years ago, although I used to do a small amount of DXing about 20 years ago when I was in high school in San Diego. I began to DX the BCB seriously about January 1968, and joined IRCA the following March. I became editor of DXWW last November. I probably have heard about 500 stations, and have verified about 135 (my exact totals aren't here, as I type this.) I have verified ten countries (plus another two or three on tape. This next season I hope to be able to increase my totals considerably, especially my foreign totals. I started off with an old Lafayette receiver, and have traded my way up to a HQ-180A. I use a 3' loop with FET RF pre-amplifier, as mentioned above. I have two tape recorders, an Ampex and a Concertone. This enables me to dub tapes to send to the stations I report. Since I have become DXWW editor, my interests have been primarily with foreign stations, although I try to increase my domestics, especially through DX tests. (CFC members, keep up the good work!) I was just recently elected to the Board of Directors for Region 7, Southern California. My latest project is a set of worldwide sunrise/sunset monthly maps. These should start appearing very shortly, as soon as I finish inking the rough copies I have made and DEE gets them printed. These, I think, will help those trying for foreign DX. As DXWW editor, I want your help. Although we still are near the peak of the sunspot cycle, much good foreign DX has been reported. It's up to you to send me your reports so that DXWW will continue to improve. As I mentioned in the last issue, there definitely will be a foreign DX contest this season. LBG, who so ably filled the position of president for the past two years, and mbn, our new president, haven't indicated to me who the contest manager will be, but I would like to see an active participation by as many members as possible.

## OFFICIAL 1969-1970 FOREIGN AND DOMESTIC CONTEST RULES

Rules Common to All Contests

1. These contests are open to all U.S. and Canadian members in good standing. Entrants will be automatically disqualified if they cease to be members. A separate division will be set up for members living outside of these two countries (in any or all contests) if enough express an interest in competing.
2. The entry fee for the Foreign Contest is 50¢. The entry fee for the Domestic Singles and Doubles Contest is 50¢. Entry in the Domestic Singles Contests automatically makes you eligible to enter the Domestic Doubles Contest. However, this year, you choose your own partners by mutual agreement. The contest manager will help you finding a partner if desired. The deadline for entries will be announced when the first Contest Standings are announced.
3. The contests will run from 0000 (local time) on 15 September 1969 to 2359 (local time) on 30 June 1969.
4. Stations may be submitted for scoring until 1 August 1970.
5. The contest manager reserves the right to request for inspection the actual verie, or a reproduction of it, from any station submitted for verification credit scoring. This will not normally be required, however.
6. The contest manager will have the final word on all scoring and rules interpretations, including whether or not a station will be accepted for scoring.
7. Standings will be in order of points scored and will be published monthly in the DX MONITOR.
8. Winners will be announced at the 1970 IRCA convention, and the final contest standings will be published in the first issue of the DX MONITOR following the convention.
9. No stations may be re-verified (OR re-logged in the Foreign contest) for any of these contests.

FOREIGN CONTEST

(Please see publisher's note at the end of the Rules)

1. The idea of this contest is to LOG and VERIFY as many different NEW foreign stations as possible. Points will be awarded for each continent and country HEARD, and points will also be awarded on the basis of the distance each station is from the DXer's location. BONUS POINTS will be awarded for each country and continent VERIFIED. Note that U.S. (except Alaska and Hawaii) and Canadian stations are NOT eligible.
2. Along with your entry fee, entrants MUST include their current "Countries Heard" total. The Official IRCA Countries List (17 August 1968, or a new one when published) should be used for this purpose. Note that both the U.S. and Canada should be included in your total if they have been heard.
3. There will be two separate contest divisions: Senior and Junior. Only entrants with 25 or fewer countries heard may compete in the Junior division, although they may compete in the Senior division if they so desire. If enough entries are received, separate Eastern and Western leagues will be set up within either or both divisions.
4. Stations submitted for logging credit must include the following information: (a) Station call and/or slogan, if any; (b) Frequency on which the station was heard; and (c) Date and time heard (USE EST please). A brief summary of the programming should also be included. NOTE - POSITIVE ID's are mandatory; DO NOT submit stations whose ID you are unsure of. Complete honesty is expected on your part! Stations submitted for verification credit should include items (a) and (b) above along with the date the verification was received.
5. Scoring will be as follows:
 

Each continent heard	10 points	(If subsequently verified	10 bonus points)
Each country heard	5 points	(If subsequently verified	5 bonus points)
Each 1000 miles (or fraction thereof) the station is distant from the DXer	1 point	(Maximum of 5 points for each station)	
6. The winner in each division (or league, if applicable) will be awarded a prize along with each runner-up. Prizes will be announced and will depend on the number of entries received.

DOMESTIC SINGLES CONTEST

1. The idea of this contest will be to verify up to three stations in each of the 50 states of the United States and the 10 provinces of Canada. A premium will be placed on verifying daytime stations and stations NOT operating on clear channels.
2. The first station verified in each state or province will count 5 points; the second 3; and the third 1 point. A bonus of 2 points will be given for each Regional Channel station verified, and a bonus of 5 points will be given for each Daytime only station verified. (It need not, however, be logged in the daytime.) If a Clear Channel station (no bonus) or a Regional Channel station (2 bonus points) are among the first three stations entered for a given state or province, they may be replaced at a later date by stations worth more bonus points.
3. The Regional Channels are: 550-560-570-580-590-600-610-620-630-790-910-920-930-950-960-970-980-1150-1250-1260-1270-1280-1290-1300-1310-1320-1330-1350-1360-1370-1380-1390-1410-1420-1430-1440-1460-1470-1480-1590-1600. The Local Channels are: 1230-1240-1340-1400-1450-1490. All others are Clear Channels.
4. Entries should include the call letters and frequency of the station, the state or province in which it is located, and the dates it was heard and verified.
5. The winner and runner-up will each be awarded a prize. Others to receive prizes and the exact nature of these prizes will depend on the number of entries received.

DOMESTIC DOUBLES CONTEST

1. The idea of this contest is essentially the same as the Domestic Singles contest above. However, scoring will be made by teams of 2 DXers, not individually. A premium will be placed on each verifying as many states and provinces as possible.
2. Scoring will be identical as in the Singles contest (See rule 2 above), but extra points will be awarded as follows:
  - A bonus of 5 points will be given for each state or province from which BOTH DXers verify at least one station.
  - A bonus of 10 points will be given for each state or province from which BOTH DXers verify 3 stations.
 Note that the "best" (Worth the most points) stations will be selected from the 2 DXers if they have combined to verify more than 3 stations from a given state or province.
3. Teams (Doubles) must be from entrants with the following as a goal: One DXer east of the Mississippi, and one west of the Mississippi with their locations at least 1000 miles apart. IRCA has approximately equal distribution on both sides of the River; however, if difficulties arise the contest manager may amend or eliminate this requirement.
4. Prizes will be announced and will depend on the number of entries received.

Publisher's note: These rules were typed at publishing headquarters after limited discussion of the subject with Bruce. It had first been decided there would be no foreign contest except as handled by Father Jack Pejza, DXWW Editor. However, in a subsequent letter, Bruce specified there would be a contest. Whether the rules stated on the other side will apply, it isn't known. But the entry fee is 50¢ so enter your fee at this time. Any changes in the contests or rules will definitely be announced in the 20 September 1969 issue of DX Monitor. It would probably be to your advantage to wait until then to compile your list of countries heard; but DO send in your fee now. As emphasized for the Foreign contest, rules changes may be made or clarifications of present rules issued. But, as far as the Domestic contests are concerned, they will definitely be held on the basis of the rules listed. Enter the Domestic contests now, start looking for a partner, and on Sept. 15, 1969, start your DXing!
