As a new member of IRCA and also a recent Short Wave drop out, I find the Medium Wave medium very challenging. As a young 47 year old teenager, I appear to be in a hobby amongst members a few years my junior, but thoroughly enjoy the youth of today. I started my Short Wave and Medium Wave DXing using a Grundig TR-5000 Transistor Portable and long wire antenna. Having taped with fellow member Chuck Sadoian, who as a member of American Short Wave Listeners Club, furnished and drew up a drawing and gave instructions on the building of a four foot loop antenna which I built up. My Medium Wave DXing has vastly improved....and I would like to thank Chuck Sadoian for his personal help in giving me the necessary pointers and help to get me started. Since June of 1969 I have 117/47 stns verified, 21/15 states. I would like to find a good tube type rx for BCB DXing. Anyone have any suggestions? For the record, I will state that I have been, am now, and always will be against a merger of IRCA-NRC of any kind, even if it involves IRCA swallowing up the NRC. I am a member of both clubs. Sometimes it is a case of money, sometimes it is a case of not liking a particular club. Even tho I might benefit from reduced rates, I still would not go along. Reasons: (1) The IRCA and the NRC are two COMPLETELY different clubs (except for the fact that we both deal in the BCB), and we have TWO kinds of DX. (2) Many members have stated that by combining the two clubs, we would eliminate the duplication of material. The only material that would fit in this category would be the CoF, f/c list, etc. But even these are different. I hope we end this talk about a merger. We have a great club, and I think we should concern ourselves with running it. 73.

With regard to the NRC-IRCA merger. I'm in favor of it, provided that the merged clubs keep the good features of both clubs. This includes the NRC foreign and technical sections, the IRCA domestic format, and, of course, the NRC offset bulletin. It also includes the NRC dues structure. With regards to Ron Schatz's claim of \$14-15 dues per year, I just don't think so. If I did, I'd be against merger. I can afford to belong to both clubs. I recognize that many can't. It is my feeling that the members who would benefit most from merger are those who can afford to join only one club, and thus miss features which appear only in the other club's bulletin. In reality, the dues for both clubs are controlled only by mailing costs and by publication costs. The mailing costs are essentially the same for both clubs, and turn out to be the controlling factor on the amount of material published. Much of what is now published by both clubs is duplicated material and much of the rest is "filler" which is held until it can be inserted into an otherwise scanty issue. Much of this filler could be held over until summer or skipped entirely with no great loss. 73 and good DX.

President's Report

The following Constitutional Amendment, proposed by Phil Sullivan, will be submitted to the membership for a vote in the near future. To be adopted, the amendment must receive a 2/3 majority of the total club membership (at present there are 315 members).

"Article VIII of the IRCA Constitution shall be repealed and replaced by the following:

'Amendments may be made to this Constitution in the following way: Nine copies of the proposed amendment shall be sent to the President who will then forward one copy to each member of the Board of Directors and one copy to the Publisher for publication in the next issue of the DX Monitor. Thirty days after the proposal is published in the DX Monitor the President shall poll the Board of Directors on the proposal, they shall have 15 days in which to cast their votes. If the proposal passes by a 2/3 majority of the Directors voting, it shall be submitted to the membership for ratification. The members' votes shall be due no later than 30 days after the proposal is submitted to them for ratification. If the proposal is favored by a 2/3 majority of the votes cast it shall be declared enacted and go into effect immediately unless the amendment itself specifies a specific date at which it will take effect."

The effects of this amendment would be primarily two-fold. First, it will make it possible (although by no means easy) to amend the Constitution in the future, should this be necessary. Second, it would allow amendments to be made at any time of the year (proposed amendments must now receive a hearing at the annual convention).

Proposals to be acted on soon by the Board of Directors, listed here for your comments (you are urged to state your opinions on any measure--either in a Forum report, or to your Director):

Amend Editorial Policy III-J to read: "Editors may incorporate into their columns material from other clubs or publishers provided that the source of this information is cited and/or advance permission is secured from the source or holder of the copyright."

To allocate \$25 from the club treasury to the Ted Vasilopoulous Award Fund.

To dissolve the Ted Vasilopoulous Award Fund, expenses of the TVA to be administered from the general treasury.

To authorize club sponsorship of printing QSL (WPE) cards with the IRCA emblem (the cards to be offered for sale to the membership).

Authorize a bulletin exchange with ASWLC.

Authorize a bulletin exchange with IUH (International Utility Hunters).

Election Committee. The Election Committee has determined that Charles Grise is the winner in the Region 2 Board election. The ruling was made after it had been determined that the five abstentions (plus one other invalid vote) should not have been counted in determining the total number of votes cast. Charles Grise received a majority of the valid votes, and hence has been declared the winner of the election.

ANARC Report

The ANARC Convention in Toronto attracted 2 dozen DXers representing 7 ANARC Clubs. In discussion, it was suggested that ANARC should ask to hold its convention in conjunction with a club convention next year. It was also recommended that each club should try to send at least one of its ANARC reps to future ANARC conventions so that a business meeting might be held. Also announced at the convention was the selection of Gordon Nelson (NRC) as the 1969 ANARC Man-of-the-Year. Gordon received the prestigious award for his scientific research into propagation and direction-finding on the medium waves, his outstanding contributions to NRC's organization, management and editing, and perhaps the outstanding club innovation of the year--successful use of offset printing for regular weekly publication of a DX bulletin.

Phil Sullivan reports that over 700 ANARC questionnaires have been received (about 1/2 of all club members). If you have not already done so, please fill out your form and send it in (duplicates may be obtained from DEE.)

Gordon Nelson, Manufacturer's Liason Committee, reports that none of the radio manufacturers contacted feel the market warrants upgrading receivers to meet the specifications required by today's DXers (particularly on the BCB).

The DX Archives Committee has tentatively found a museum willing to house a small number of older QSL cards, but no facilities for a larger collection.

However, its performance does not quite come up to that of my Zenith Trans-Oceanic, using my NRC loop on either rx. If any of you are familiar with the SX-24 and know the year or years these receivers were manufactured, I would appreciate hearing from you. 73 and have a good upcoming DX season.

A Brief History of CKNW:

Bill Rae had himself a radio station, at last. Although it was not in Vancouver, where he had made his first application, it was in the area. The BBG was, at that time, approving no more stations in Vancouver, but this third application - this time for New Westminster - put the International Broadcasting System on the air on August 14th, 1944. CKNW began from studios in the now defunct Windsor Hotel, where they remained until 1950, and transmitter at Queensboro on Lulu Island with 100 watts of power on 1320 kHz.

In 1956, after years of growth and popularity, CKNW was bought by Western Broadcasting Co. Ltd. CKNW was still on 1320 kHz, but with 1000 watts now and NSP programming (since 1953) at studios at 227 Columbia St. Bill Rae, meanwhile, moved to California where he is today, still very active in broadcasting in Santa Barbara.

CKNW has moved forward very quickly since their 1944 birth. 1958 saw a change of frequency to 980 kHz and power increase to 10d 5n. The fifties also saw CKNW climb to the top of the BBM ratings, where they have remained to date. 1964 saw another power increase -- to 50kw DA-2 and xmtr relocation to Fry's Corner.

1969 is seeing new studios and plans near completion for CKNW-FM. The 16,000 square feet of studio space at 815 McBride Blvd include ten control rooms and six talk booths and cost in excess of \$500,000. Every item in the studios was custom built (e.g. - air conditioning - \$90,000) including the audio equipment by McCurdy and Langevin (Anaheim) for expected expansion and progress in the next ten years inc CKNW-FM.

Currently, Western Broadcasting Co. Ltd. owns controlling interests in CKNW and CJOB AM & FM as well as 40% of the interests of British Columbia Television Broadcasting Limited (owners of CHAN-TV and CHEK-TV) (this is the first of a series of histories of Canadian stations)
