FCC Favors FM Over AM There will be few if any more standard radio broadcasting station licenses issued by the FCC. The FCC has stated that an AM license would be issued only if it could be proved that the area to be served was not receiving adequate AM service. The FCC urged that potential station applicants file for FM licenses because, "FM is technically a better service and does not add to the interference (static) as nearly all AM facilities do." FM has a better range of service at night than most AM stations do, according to the FCC.

NATIONAL BUREAU OF STANDARDS - WWV and WWVH

To better serve its users, the National Bureau of Standards (NBS) is contemplating a change in its broadcast format on radio stations WWV and WWVH. A voice announcement regarding this matter will be transmitted from WWV and WWVH starting 0000 GMT on 15 Oct. 1969 between 3 and 4 minutes after each hour and continuing on this schedule until 1 Dec. 1969.

Several modifications for consideration effecting a possible change in broadcasts will be sent to users of these stations in the form of a questionnaire which is now being prepared. Your participation in this survey will be appreciated.

- I. PURPOSE The purpose of this Policy is to specify the content of the DX Monitor and the authorities of the IRCA Editorial Staff.
- II. CONTENT The DX Monitor shall consist of the following sections:
- A. Administrative and General Feature Section
1. The cover page, prepared by the Publishing Committee Chairman, to include announcements of club interest such as DX program schedules.
  2. The IRCA President's reports, to include results of voting by the Board of Directors.
  3. Club membership and financial reports, prepared by the Secretary-Treasurer.
  4. Reports from the IRCA Committee Chairmen (including the Contest Manager).
  5. DX Records, a listing of members' verification and/or reception achievements.
  6. Additional feature columns as approved by the Board of Directors.
- B. DX Sections
1. Domestic DX sections, to include all reports from members in the U. S. and Canada concerning stations located in these two countries.
    - a. Each member will report to the editor(s) representing his own section of the continent, as follows:
      1. East Coast Section -- Atlantic and Eastern Time Zone areas
      2. Midwest Section -- Central and Mountain Time Zone areas
      3. West Coast Section -- Pacific westward to and including Bering Time Zone areas
    - b. There will be two columns for each reporting area, a DX Forum (DXF) and a DX Roundup (DXR).
    - c. DX Forum
      1. The DXF columns will contain reports from individual members with information or comment about their DX activity and equipment, the IRCA and its policies, and any other relevant and allowable discussion that cannot be fitted into another column. Members may mention call letters, frequency and location only of selected new catches in the DXF, but no long lists of stations will be permitted.
      2. Recent verifications may be mentioned in the DXF.
      3. Members may include in their DXF reports any reasonable and prudent mention of non-DX information, provided it does not jeopardize the column's size.
      4. DXF editors shall have the authority to limit reports to 15 lines in the interest of conserving space for other reports or of eliminating non-pertinent information.
      5. DXF editors may rephrase any report or portion thereof if they deem such rephrasing to be in the best interests of their columns, this Policy or the IRCA. Any such rephrasing must, however, be indicated as such by the editor, with the knowledge that the reporting member assumes no responsibility for the rephrased text.
      6. DXF editors may omit from reports any statements made in a language other than English which, in the editor's judgment, would not be understood by or of interest to the general membership.
      7. If a member submits more than one DXF report per issue without instructions to destroy those previously submitted, the editor may disregard the earlier reports, unless they have already been stencilled; in that case, the editor may either defer or disregard the later rpts.
    - d. DX Roundup
      1. Each DXR column will contain reports of domestic loggings and tips such as sign-on and sign-off times, frequency checks, and any other useful station schedule or reception information.
      2. Reports shall be listed by frequency and should include call letters, location, date and time of reception, type of programming, and any other concise and useful comments, e.g., signal strength, interference encountered, and whether a regular or uncommon catch.
      3. Certain high-powered Mexican "border" stations, and certain other clear-channel foreign stations which provide substantial QRM to domestic stations, may be listed in the DXR at the editor's discretion.

- II. B. 1. d. 4. DXR editors may omit from their columns tips that, in their opinion, would not be of interest to the majority of the readers.
- e. Preferably the DXF editor will also compile the DXR for the same section of the continent. However, if necessary, one editor may be appointed for each column from a particular area.
2. Foreign DX Section, called DX World Wide (DXWW), to include all reports of stations located outside the U. S. and Canada and, separately, all reports of domestic stations heard by foreign members and all DXF reports from foreign members.
- a. DXWW shall contain reports of loggings, schedules, addresses, and verification information concerning foreign stations.
- b. Reports will be listed by frequency and should include call letters (if any), slogan (if applicable), location, date and time of reception, type of programming, and any other concise and useful comments, e.g., signal strength, interference encountered, and whether a regular or uncommon catch.
- c. DXWW may also contain any other information deemed helpful to foreign DXing by the editor.
- d. There will be only one editor for DXWW.
- C. The DX Monitor will normally consist of twenty pages (ten sheets) per issue, but may be larger at the discretion of the Publishing Committee Chairman, provided that it is financially possible to publish a larger issue. Each bulletin in excess of ten sheets will be published to take advantage of postal rate break points, in increments of one ounce.

### III. GENERAL

- A. Reports to the DX Monitor should deal with reception of and comment concerning stations in the medium-wave band as opposed to short wave, FM, TV, etc.
- B. All times reported in the DX Monitor will be in Eastern Standard Time, regardless of the time of year.
- C. Editors shall have sole authority over the content of their columns, including filler material, subject to the provisions of the IRCA Bylaws dealing with irregularities.
- D. Editors may determine the individual formats of their particular columns, and methods by which reports are to be submitted, within the specific provisions of this Policy.
- E. Editors may omit portions of reports to comply with size regulations, provided such omission does not remove pertinent DX information or detract from the effectiveness of included portions.
- F. Editors may omit any report or portion thereof that they deem would
1. Violate any applicable portion of this Policy
  2. Be detrimental to the IRCA, its individual members, or its policies
  3. Be interpreted as profane or otherwise improper as to language
  4. Violate any federal, state or local law.
- G. Editors may omit reports submitted by other than IRCA members in good standing; however, interesting reports from non-members may be included at the editors' discretion if they comply with this Policy.
- H. Editors may omit illegible reports.
- I. Editors may add to columns or reports only if such additions do not violate size restrictions and if their comments are both pertinent and in accord with this Policy.
- J. Editors may incorporate into their columns material from other clubs or publishers provided that the source of this information is cited and/or advance permission is secured from the source or holder of the copyright.
- K. No advance publicity will be given to any station broadcasting in violation of the rules of its specific nation's radio regulatory agency. However, reports concerning reception of such stations may appear in applicable DX columns.
- L. The IRCA Board of Directors shall have sole authority over the passage, amending, interpretation and enforcement of this Policy.
- M. Any violations of this Policy will be dealt with in accordance with the IRCA Bylaws.

For some reason, the clandestine RL, which in my opinion was an operation of relatively minor importance, has been of great interest to many of DXing's more conservative, and the NRC article seems to have sparked considerable grapevine type discussion. However as clandestine topics are often made unavoidably confusing (infuriating?) by a multitude of conflicting and sometimes "classified" sources, it's always advisable to pin down a source's qualifications and previous connections as much as possible. MM 10/20 was the best night ever observed here for reception from NA, and it finally got me over the hurdle of 35 states hrd, where I had been stationary for several months, in the shape of WPNX-1460 Ala. for my 36th state. I understand this one is a reluctant verifier, but will try. The beautiful 20 db/S9 signals of such ECers as WWRL-1600 (previously logged but not well enough to report, now reported), unnn WMEX-1510, etc., were a sound for sore ears. Rpts out for that morning are KXEO-1340, WDIC-1430, KWLA-1530, KUDI-1450, KGGM-610, KVOP-1400, WBNS-1460, CFOX-1470, WKMF-1470. Despite excellent cx, KSKI-1340 Special was not heard. Was it on? Other rpts lately to WKAR-870, KKGf-1310, WGTO-540. Veries are from WVAB-1550, most distant rpt as their previous best was San Diego, WVON-1440, KRAM-1340 most distant rpt, KBZY-1490, KJNP-1170 for Alaska #9, KNCR-1090, KIKK-650 first from Hawaii, KGAY-1430 who seemed amazed that I was hearing them at 8:30 a.m., their local time, but this is in fact quite typical of propagation from the Pacific Northwest in the winter when Ore. and coastal Wash. stns dominate the channels here after most of Calif. has faded out. So far unhrd are Miss., Md., Del., N.C., S.C., N.J., Ind., Wisc., W.Va. and New England exsept Mass., also the Canadian Maritimes. I can't get WBAL-1090 because of a local mixing product (KTRG-990 + KHVH-1040). Any hints from WCers on logging the others would be appreciated. My article "Standard N.A. reception in Hawaii" in the 10/4 DXWW is intended as a basic list of stns which will not generally be reported in the WCDXR. By combining it with rpts there, you should get a fair idea of what is being hrd in Hawaii.

Broadcasting in Barcelona- Rolf Berger, ADDX (Germany) translated by Richard E. Wood

There are seven stations in Barcelona, Spain's main port city. Although my vacation spot, Canet de Mar, was located 25 miles from Barcelona, I visited the city three times during my stay in Canet, since the round-trip train ticket cost only 30¢.

The first station I visited was the one whose music program we used to listen to at the beach, Radio Juventud, La Voz de Cataluna [1025 kHz., -- all frequencies added by REW], Via Augusta 17-19, Barcelona 6. This is the address to send your reports to., MW fans! According to the WRTH, the power is 5 kW., but I was told it had been increased to 6 KW. This according to the station's Director, Sr. Jose L. Surroca Pratdesaba. We conversed in English (his secretary spoke English too), and he said he had had reports from Scandinavia, Germany, the Benelux countries, and England. Reporters had often asked for pennants, and now they had taken steps to have pennants prepared, and CSL cards as well. Finally, he led me through the bright, modern, cleanly equipped studios, which are in a multi-story commercial building. I said I would try to receive his station back home, although Radio San Sebastian is well received with its 5 kW on the same frequency. He pointed out that his station operates one hour longer each night, until 0100 GMT, and that it would then be possible to log Radio Juventud de Barcelona. In leaving, Sr. Pratdesaba gave me a long-play record with Sevillanas, typical Spanish songs.

Then I visited another station, Radio Miramar [licensed to; suburban Badalona, 1520 kHz., REW]. The address is Plaza Cataluna 9. There, too, they showed me the transmitter, studio, recording studio, and record library. At Radio Espana de Barcelona [1124 kHz] I had the chance to talk with an announcer in English, until two minutes before 6 p.m., when she rushed into the studio with her script. Ten minutes later, she emerged and explained what she had been saying. Then she showed me the broadcast and recording studios. There, and also at Radio Peninsular (also known as Radio Reloj [1178 KHz] de Barcelona, I handed in my reception reports for loggings made in Germany, and asked that the CSL verification be sent to my home in Germany. As is well-known, Radio Peninsular is also known as the second program of Radio Nacional de Espana (RNE), and it is commercial.

The next day I visited the SER (Sociedad Espanola de Radiodifusion) station, EAJ-1, Radio Barcelona. [827 kHz]. The day after, I looked for the sixth station, Radio Popular de Barcelona [1430 kHz], whose address is not given in WRTH, so that I had to look for it in the telephone book. After a half-hour's walk through Barcelona, map in hand, I was standing in front of... a radio repair shop called "Radio Popular." And thereupon I gave up the search, and spent the rest of my time seeing the sights of Barcelona. That's the way things are, in Barcelona! My plans next year call for searches for the elusive Radio Popular, and for Radio Panades [1106 kHz], the seventh station in Barcelona.
