Editorial Comment

Much comment, both rational and otherwise, has been appearing in the bulletin lately on the subject of a merger with the NRC. I feel that it is time to bring the problem into perspective, as the fact is that there can be no merger. Though many would hypothetically favor or disfavor a merger, the fact is that the governments of the two clubs are not going to institute proceedings leading to a merger. It is most obvious that any such attempt would lead (if it has not already) to the same type of bitter, divisive debate as occurred last year. No one who truly seeks the betterment of the hobby (one of the arguments of the pro-mergerists) would desire such a situation, and I believe this is especially true of the governments of the respective clubs. In my opinion, then, to seek action on a merger at this time is not only futile, in view of the extremely vocal opposition to such an undertaking, but is not in the best interests of the hobby or of the IRCA. This is essentially the position of the NRC government, as well, as confirmed in a recent discussion with Gordon Nelson and others of that club. (mbn)

(2) At the time this was originally proposed, the NRC was supposedly interested in becoming a democratically run organization; nothing else is really a club anyway. (Again, untrue. The NRC was not interested in changing its own government. NRC stated that it would accept a democratic government for the merged club. -MD) But in the interim no move has been made in that direction. Therefore, as the currently proposed constitutional amendment is primarily designed to facilitate this merger, I believe it is neither in IRCA's best interests nor (ANARC take note) DXing generally. (One line was omitted. -MD)

I have been doing a little statistical juggling with my U.S. loggings. The power breakdown of the 401 U.S. mainland stns I have heard is interesting. Counting those heard at two powers at the lower, the breakdown is as follows: 63x50 kw, 2x25 kw, 32x10 kw, 129x5 kw, 101x1 kw, 20x0.5 kw, and 43x0.25 kw, plus 11 at powers still not definitely known. Hence, the average power of mainland stns hrd is almost exactly 11 kw. Latest verifications are from KSCO-1080, KARK-920 most distant rpt, WCMN-1280, KCTA-1030, WBNS-1460, WKAR-870 most distant rpt, WMAL-630 most distant rpt the stn has had since it went on the air Oct. 12, 1925. Rpts are out to CJVR-1420, KBYE-890, KHAR-590, KPGE-1340, KELP-920, KXLE-1240, WHOM-1480, KYAK-650, CJAD-800, KVEN-1450. The enormous signals of KYAK indicate that it has no null to the south, so it should give many people their most needed state. Brother Al's logging of WOND-1400 confirms the reputation this stn has the most remarkable U.S. graveyarder. I heard and verified it in England, it has been hrd in Holland, Sweden, New Zealand, etc., and though not yet hrd here, it is certainly my prime prospect for an N.J. logging and I always look for it on good EC nights. 9/29, the MM of the WOND and other good EC loggings in Calif., was also the best EC night in my experience here. 73.

- 1394 ... Albania, Tirana was noted at s/on 2359 on 10/27 with IS. Good signal on peaks, but highly variable. (ELK)
- 1439 ... Luxembourg Marnach was "splittable" at 1845 on 11/1, and just about the rest of the evening. Good signal but tough copy due to the 1440 QRM. (ELK)
- 1475 ??? UnID TA. I'm watching for Wien, Austria for a report, but there's seldom a signal at the listed 2330 s/on time. About S4 by 0043 or so; later s/on now? (KGS) (I have 2350 EST listed, Gray. Ed)

- 760 HOXO Panama, Panama City started in September staying on till 0100 EST (which is local time) Saturday and Sunday AMs with an EE pock-MoR program with occasional religious "ads" called "Nightbeat." Program goes 2300-0100 Fri. and Sat. nights. In addition to local originations, program incorporates Stateside "Silhouette" and "Powerline" programs. Station's RS is 05450-2300 weekdays, 0630-2230 Sunday. All religious in SS or EE with some "good music" and classical. Station is sister of HCJB, Quito, Ecuador. Power definitely 5 kw.
- 790 SCN Canal Zone, Fort Clayton, NSP. RR 0000-0500 Mon-Fri. AFRTS station. Power supposed to be 5 kw but is usually 1 kw; when it works, they have a 10kw transmitter. Modulation set for about 60% but it still manages to distort, hi.
- 1120 ??? Panama, Panama City, NSP was formerly all SS ads and TC ("Radio Mia Minutera") but is not automated MoR. Power believed 1 kw; frequency approximate. (Call HOS22 according to WRTH. Ed.)

Format, soft MoR, recorded announcements, in both SS and EE, SS TCs. Has no studio mike and sounds automated but isn't. Power believed 1 kw, perhaps less. (Call HOE28 according to WRTH, Radio TNT. Ed)

The only other station on, after 2400 is the station on 1010, AN all SS music station. It's unchanged, so I didn't write it up. It's also NSP. My lack of knowledge of Spanish is a definite hangup down here. So are the 25 local stations in Panama City which make DX before 2200 or 2300 next to impossible! Oh well, I oughta be back in the N.W. this Christmas, DXing stations I can understand!

New Zealand The NZBC asked the Supreme Court to stop the Broadcasting Authority from calling for applications for private stations in Auckland, Hamilton and Dunedin as it claimed no survey was conducted to find the needs for these stations. In the meanwhile two pirate stations have announced their intentions to commence operation shortly. Holiday Radio is expected to commence operation on Nov. 1 and operate till late February off Tauranga in the Bay of Plenty. The company Radio Investment says it has a powerful transmitter, professional studio equipment and staff. The second station plans to commence operation on Dec. 1 on 1450 kHz; also TV later. The broadcasts will be limited to the Bay of Plenty. The boat, which will have a crew of 15, would move to the Hauraki Gulf about February, as the weather in the Bay of Plenty would deteriorate then. (Arthur Cushen, via WRB) Canterbury Broadcast Co, Ltd is in the process of being issued a license for Christchurch, with 2 kw. No frequency has been announced yet. It will be known as Radio One. (Richard Ginbey, via WRB)

Mozambique New transmitters have been installed and are nearing tests at the new Beira station. At present MW frequencies are 872 and 1043 kHz. One 100 kw transmitter has been installed. Next year another 100 kw transmitter is planned. (WRB)

Zambia Peking is to supply Radio Zambia with one 200 kw transmitter. (SCDX)

West Germany The new MW transmitter of the Bayerische Rundfunk operates on 1602 kHz from Munich-Ismaniggen since Oct. 15. Output is 370 kw daytime and 185 kw at night. The station at Nuremberg-Dillberg has left 1602 and is now broadcasting on 800 kHz with an output of 100 kw. (SCDX)

Brazil Radio Guaiba, Porto Alegre, is now on the air 24 hours a day on 720 kHz. / (SCDX)
