 Another DX season and here we go again on merger. As last year merger gives us the chance to end duplication of effort and provide all DX info to members of both clubs. For IRCA it gives the chance to have offset printing which is too expensive for the present size IRCA membership. This would give 2 advantages: 1) Lower dues, for all (note LBG and rFS) as the per member cost of offset drops rapidly as membership increases. Dues could be as low as \$8.50 to \$9.00 - anyone who calculates it as \$14 or \$15 must've flunked third grade math. 2) Very stable publishing - offset is done by a professional to whom printing is a business, not a hobby activity. DEE is doing a good job publishing the DXM but what if he re-resigns? No one else has been found who can take over the job. Despite all this I oppose merger. Several NRC members have recently brought NRC out of a rather bad situation and I can see no reason to risk these gains by allowing the anti-NRC loudmouths in IRCA to join NRC by merger or otherwise. They would only cause trouble and make a worse split than what we have now. Thus, while these few, but vocal, children are part of IRCA I will oppose merger. I had hoped that while the proposed committee would be doing their work in fairly assessing advantages and disadvantages for merger that there would be a voluntary moratorium on comment in the DX Roundups on merger. Then without harranguing from anyone, I had hoped that each member would assess the pros and cons and come to their own decision on their merits. Apparently I was much too idealistic about the motives and reasonableness of some members. I regret that some people cannot discuss a question calmly and rationally. The irony of the whole matter, as has been pointed out before, is that those who are so rabidly opposed even to the remote possibility of merger are people who actually contribute very little (except their gripes) to DX Monitor. Check over the past year's issues and see for yourself that certain individuals never make reports to the DX Roundups--only to DX Forums, and then usually with some complaint about the club. All of the comments received so far about the format of DXWW seem to indicate that it should remain the same. "I like it as it is as you can see readily what's being heard in your section of the country" (Art Peterson) "I want to know what's being heard by DXers in my general area so that I will know what to try for. Your current format is obviously the most efficient way to meet these needs." (Marc DeLorenz6) "The way it is presented now helps the members know what is being heard in their area. If it were changed as suggested, then the members would have to search through the entire section to see what is being heard in their area. It might help the experienced if changed, but hinder the newcomers." (Mike Hardester)

Japan JOBB-830, Osaka, and JOBK-670, Osaka are now 300 kw for the Olympic games and Osaka '70. (from summer supplement of WRTH and JEP's former Chemistry teacher) Weren't the Olympics in Tokyo in 1964? Expo '70 will be in Osaka, though.

France ORTF will install six new medium wave transmitters during 1970 for broadcasts abroad. There will also be a considerable increase in the set up of SW transmitters. (SCDX)

Dominican Republic Not included in WRTH are Radio Ahora 1040, and HIJB 830, both in Santo Domingo. (SCDX)

West Germany A commercial broadcast station will be erected in Sandberg in Saar by Freie Rundfunk AG, an amalgamation of Radio Europe No 1 and a group of publishers. (SCDX)

Clandestine Breakthrough- C.M. Stanbury II
 In the current (January 1970) Electronics Illustrated is the complete story (by CMS. Ed) on high powered portable broadcasting; past, present, and (maybe) future. Every last piece of the puzzle fit; the "24 hour" unit used in Botswana (which, with an experienced crew, can actually be put on the air in just eight hours--and presumably can be removed just as fast), the Thailand portable on 843 kHz, VOE Vietnam (760 kHz), VOE Marathon (which was already obsolete 9 months after it went on the air--that was the real "Marathon Mystery"--the piece of the puzzle which first started DXers exploring this whole area), VOA Dry Tortugas, VOA Sugar Loaf and even Radio Swan. Many DXers contributed to this breakthrough (sometimes unwillingly, h9)--mostly through the pages of IRCA's DX Monitor. The implications of this are considerably greater than even I had anticipated. To name just a couple: (1) a high powered clandestine could be one place on a given day and several hundred miles away the next, and this has been the case since mid-1963; (2) in event of any major civil disorder, a station comparable to WKBW, KOMA, KNX, etc. (in coverage) could appear on the scene overnight.
