To the best of my knowledge, the above balance sheet presents fairly the financial position of the IRCA as of August 31, 1969 in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles consistently applied.

I'm very happy to say that the financial position of the IRCA is healthy once more. Although the IRCA apparently was in a deficit position last year, in 1969 our net worth is a positive \$292.58. Credit for the figure can be given to Don Erickson for managing our financial resources at the publishing level in the most efficient way, to Mike Northam for his scrutiny of the IRCA's expenses for the year, and to the fact that IRCA's membership increased nicely from 239 at 8/31/68 to 304 a year later. Membership as of the 11/8/69 bulletin is 329, and is ever increasing. As Mike Northam reported at our convention in Chicago, the financial position of the club is very rosy indeed!

However, that doesn't mean we can lower dues or refund our retained earnings to the membership. It's comforting to know we have a nest egg to rely on in case of emergency, for example, in case our mimeo machine suddenly becomes inoperative. Also, if postage rates or supplies costs should increase suddenly, our raising the dues would only affect new members and renewals; we would have to incur losses on the memberships yet unexpired.

We have just purchased a large supply of paper and other publishing supplies, and have a very adequate bank of postage stamps on hand at Riverside to carry us through most of the coming season. Yet our bank account balance at 11/1/69 is \$1,064.

A proposal will soon be sent to the Board of Directors requesting authorization to open a savings account where we can put our excess cash to work.

FISH on FDXC-----Rule Change: The previous clause reads: "Any FDXC form which is not completely filled will receive a deduction of five (5) points for each frequency or line skipped or omitted." This applies to both foreign & domestic contest. Henceforth the clause shall read with five (5) changed to three (3). Also, what is to be logged on some of the clear channels in the domestic contests has been questioned: Based on NRC log, the following channels with four or less US or Can. stations are listed with stations to be considered in FDXC. 650: KORL WSM KYAK, 670: WMAQ KBOI, 700: WJW, 720: KUAI, WGN, 830: KIKI WCCO KBOA WNYC, 840: WMOB WRYM WHAS WVPO, 880: WCBS WRRZ WRFD WBDH (KRVN about April '70), 890: WLS KBYE AFRS WHNC, 1030: WBZ KCTA KTWO, 1040: KHVH WHO KIXL 1160: KSL WJJD, 1180: VOA(Fla) WLDS WHAM KOFI, & 1200: WOA, CFFB. After you have logged all the stations listed above on a given channel, no point deduction will apply to that channel. This list is pending new stns taking to the air on these channels prior to the end of the contest, but if you log all stns listed on a channel before a new station takes to the air, you will not be deducted the 3 points in the interim time interval. Greetings, DXers. Well, the new DX season is producing results. The TP's are really barreling in here. So far my latin reception has left much to be desired, however. An item that should be of interest, especially to those with loop antennas, is the great circle chart of the world offered by Radio Amateur Callbook Inc., 4844 W. Fullerton Ave., Chicago 60639 for \$1.00 postpaid. This map is centered on the U.S. and has the property of showing great circle routes as straight lines radiating from the center. Since the shortest distance between two points on a sphere is the great circle route, a loop antenna bearing for a given city can be read right off the map and the distance can be measured directly. The map is centered on Kansas, but distances from any part of the U.S. will be within 2% of the right value. Bearings are listed to the nearest degree for three cities on each coast for greater accuracy. I really like mine. KOMW-680 made it really loud here on the Special. Good DX & 73.

My thanks to all of you who have welcomed me to the Club, and to those who have sent suggestions for possible catches from my 14 unhrd states. Some of the prime fq's recommended, however, notably 1010, 1090, & 1550 are greatly troubled here by powerful Asians, especially in winter when the more northerly EC stns are likely to be hrd, and the angle for looping is not very great. I still think I am more likely to hear new states on graveyards and regionals, if anywhere, rather than clears.
