IT'S THAT TIME AGAIN! With the coming of weekly issues, the workload of publishing each bulletin becomes less while the job of handling DX Cal. becomes ever greater. In the meantime, every CPC member is reminded that every notification on a program should contain the month, day of the week, date, time EST (not EDT), call, freq., city of license, power of stn or that used during pgm, the club for which it was arranged, who arranged it, the program content, if known, the verie signer, station address, city, state the ZIP.

A SUGGESTION AND TIP Bruce Portzer reminds everyone that hurricane season is here once again in the Gulf of Mexico and Caribbean areas. There is a good possibility of it affecting some stations' schedules, either due to downed towers/power outages or because of extended schedules to provide emergency information to the area. Which brings up the subject of:

HURRICANE CELIA Not long ago, Hurricane Celia hit the area around Corpus Christi, Texas, with unexpected force. Just about every radio/TV station was off the air for at least some period of time. In communications with a TV engineer for KSIX (1kw on 1230) and a gentlemen at KCCT (1kw-D on 1150), it was learned that, as of Sat. Aug. 8th, KSIX was just preparing to return to the air with 250w. Full 1kw will possibly not come for several weeks. KCCT was operating at full power thru regular power mains. KRYS was the only other stn known to be on the air on AM. The TV picture was as follows: NBC KRIS-TV 6 may not return to the air for quite a while. Their tower crashed thru the studios, destroying a large amount of equipment. KZTV CBS 10 expected to return to the air the evening of Sat. Aug. 7th or early Sun. Aug. 8th, dependent upon installation of necessary power poles. KZTV loaned ABC KIII-TV 3 the use of their microwave dish to enable them to return to the air with reduced power from emergency generators. KCTA-1030 is presumed off the air or at least was on the 8th. Next issue will contain a more thorough rundown on the BCB situation in and around Corpus Christi.

KCRL TOWER FELLED "The owner of new radio station KCRL has offered a \$10,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of those responsible for felling its 322' tower. E. L. Cord, owner of KCRL-TV and a new 50kw KCRL on 780 kHz acted after someone Sat. (date is in mid-June. -DEE) sawed thru 4 of 18 guy wires to topple the tower north of Reno. Damage was estimated at \$10,000."

KCRL now on the air KCRL has begun testing their xr; see details in West Coast DX Roundup. And if you hope to get a quick verie from KCRL, now is the time to do so before the station is flooded, if it is not already too late!

First Commercial Radio Station In 1909, Charles D. (Doc) Herrold hung a "carpet" aerial with 11,500 feet of wire in it between two wings of the 7-story Wells Fargo Building in San Jose, Calif., and became a radio pioneer. The stn operated experimentally until 1912 when it was licensed to broadcast to San Francisco's Panama Pacific International Exposition 6 to 8 hours a day. The station got its KQW call letters in 1921, and in 1925, it became a regular commercial broadcasting station.

Please mark in huge red markings on both sides of the envelope the appropriate notations because the PO can easily overlook S.D. and deliver as regular mail as has happened before.

ALL MEMBERS PLEASE TAKE NOTE: To permit your pub. to act as Backup editor in

the most speedy manner and to compensate for different methods used in compiling DX Roundup material by different editors, you are all asked to abide by the following standards and specifications for your Roundup/Forum reports.

1. Please put your full name, full address, and ZIP code on each and every sheet of paper.
2. Use only one side of the paper for your report to accommodate "cut-and-paste" arrangement.
3. Please double-space all Forum reports and double-space between each station in your Roundup report. Specify frequency for every stn, even when it is repeated. Single-space (no space between lines) individual stns. Arrange in freq. order!

These guidelines will enable both the "cut-and-paste" and "search-and-type" editors to work from any report. The failure of members to follow these guidelines, through NO FAULT of anyone, required extra hours of work.

The purpose is not just to provide a place for you, the member, to show off all your catches. It is to disseminate TIPS on stations and provide as comprehensive a listing of what is being heard, and where, as possible. A tip with time and date is no tip at all. You can't log a stn without some idea of programming be in "with ID" or a long review of the stn's format. And rarely is there no QRM or slopover even if slight. If you use a loop, the necessity of using it to null a particular stn would be helpful. If a regular is unexpectedly off making reception possible or if this stn is running AN, mention it, please! Every tip you send in should contain as much useful info as can be provided. If you don't hear/log a stn, don't let that prevent you from submitting any info you might gather to Roundup. And don't hesitate to list stns you've heard before or assume you MUST list a stn just because it is new. Unless there is reason to believe you are providing a tip to someone or providing information on what has been heard, the purpose of Roundup is defeated. In that vein, the logging of a 50kw clear channel during a normal SP is every bit as much of a tip as the 250w stn a dozen states away that everybody hears regularly. Mr. and Mrs. Raleigh Biss showed up Thursday evening, but the party really didn't get started until early Friday afternoon with the arrival of Dan Adams, Steve Kamp, Brother Al, and many others from that point on.

Friday's agenda was open, giving visiting DXers lots of time to get acquainted. The IRCWBC DX GNUS, a beautiful satire on DXM, designed largely (we hear) by Bruce Portzer, was distributed free to convention goers. PRK was snapping pictures like mad and says that he got a snap of nearly everyone attending. General "hanging out" places that day were PRK's single and DEE's and Co.'s suite. ERBA, of course, was predicatably to be found in the bar. Some DXers held a frisbee war in the swimming pool. Later, Don's suite became the general meeting place. It certainly was

hopping that evening, what with a color TV going, Len Lockwood's VHF receiver running, and a host of people all talking at once. Phil Sullivan and "Klicker" Kulka phoned to wish their best to everyone and to chat with a few people. Kevin Slater played a tape of an IRCA spot broadcast over KASH-1600, Eugene, Oregon. A radio was in PRK's room but no DX was heard, either that nite or Saturday nite. The trouble seemed to be a lack of interest, even though the set was a National HRO of 1942 vintage. Soft drinks, milk, yogurt (!), beer, cookies, and other refreshments were supplied and consumed in wholesale quantity, both this nite and throughout the convention. Reports have it that the party in DEE's room finally broke up around 4:00 a.m. in the morning.

Saturday morning found various people having breakfast in various places at various times. Some spent the morning watching cartoons on DEE's color TV set (kinda figures when you consider the mentality of the average DXer, right?). Station tours of CBU, CKWX, CKIG, and CJOR consumed about three and a half hours of the late morning/early afternoon of nearly all conventioners. A special bouquet goes to CKIG's friendly CE, Mr. Peter Mackintosh. The big convention banquet started just after 7:00 p.m. and consisted of seafood cocktail, salad, steak, baked potato, green beans, with peach melba for dessert. Mike Northam conducted a short business meeting after dinner, details of which will appear elsewhere in this issue. Fred Jordt, unable to make the convention, passed along his greetings through PRK. After a short break for a breath of air, everyone took their places again at the cleared tables and an interesting evening began. Firstly, door prizes were given out. A special ladies' prize consisting of a hand-painted bone china brooch and earring set, each piece having a flower on it, was won by Mrs. Biss. Karen Portzer drew prizes for the men. She drew all right! First name out of the hat was Bruce Portzer! He received (amid loud and strident cries of "Fix!") a speaker in a finished wood enclosure. A small high intensity lamp was awarded to Dave Prather, while Don Kenney got two 5" reels of tape. Mike Worst won a desk pen with a marble base, while Don Kaskey got a postal scale (with calibrations for Canadian postage rates!) The auction, the highlite of the evening, began about 9:15 p.m. Brian Williams conducted what turned out to be a very successful venture. A total of \$212.73 was raised for the IRCA treasury from 96 bids on items or bundles of items. Some of the bids were outrageous, ridiculous, and often hilarious. A road map of Argentina brought \$5.75 from Mike Northam, while a CJCA-930 Tiger Poster earned a bid of \$4.01 from Dave Christensen. Randy Seaver and Father Jack consistently started the generous bid of 14¢ of many items. A lite dimmer (rheostat) went to Saralie Northam for \$1.20. She got a bargain, as the item is usually worth \$15 or \$20, but I don't know what Mike will do to her when she installs it and it radiates its world famous RF interference! Surveys, old magazines and club bulletins, a radio or two, a Radio Prague record, two broadband amplifiers, an FET pre-amp, and other assorted items cleared the block at various times in the evening. The center-fold of a donated August Playboy upset Brian so much he very nearly forgot all about the auction! Another item which gave trouble was an Italian 10 Lire piece. The opening bid was 10 lire, countered by 25 yen from PRK. DEE called out 3 pesos, but mbn raised him to 2 cents! Brian Williams, for the first time in the evening, was stumped! He put aside the piece for later sale when people would possibly be more reasonable and bid in known currencies! A snapshot of the CJCA-930 Tiger was sold for 15½ cents to Pat Martin. How IBG will explain that ½ cent in his next Treasury report is unknown, but it could be interesting! Throughout the evening Brian took king-size swigs from a water jug. Maybe he was thirsty, but the jug is rumored to have contained ½ bottle of vodka.... After the auction broke up around 11:30, DXers scattered everywhere. It is understood that a lot of talk, coupled with refreshments, went on in various rooms until the wee small hours of the morning.

Sunday morning found most people up by 11:00 a.m. Over half the visitors left the convention, but there were still enough people to play the traditional softball game Sunday afternoon in a park on a nearby mountain slope. Tradition was waived, however, in the matter of teams. Instead of East versus West this year, it was ERBA versus Everyone Else. Actually, there weren't quite enough players to go around so one or two ERBA helped out Everyone Else. Nevertheless, three innings later, when all concerned decided to call it quits because of exhaustion, ERBA had defeated

Everyone Else by the whopping score of 23-5! Brian Williams, representing Everyone Else, presented the pennant, a Canadian Ensign flag which had served admirably for second base during the game, to ERBA President Don Kaskey. Thereafter, ERBA members promptly went to a nearby clearing and flew kites! (PRK has photographic documentation.) They didn't fly well due to lack of breeze. This is surprising, because there were certainly lots of ERBA members there to supply volumes of hot air...er... ahem! A few DXers, including some ERBA, were still around Sunday nite to engage in the only serious listening of the convention. Eldon Luoma said his pirate CFAY would test after midnite on 1490. (A few conventioners had logged it Saturday nite.) Though they tried hard, it wasn't heard on the aforementioned HRO. Calibration problems may have been the cause, however. A weak Canadian carrying religious programming was logged on 1600. A faint hourly ID revealed the mystery station to be CHUB-1570, in Nanaimo, B.C.! And that was the best catch of the nite! Larry Killick and Dan Sys caught the CBE-1550 sign-on on the car radio. They also suspect they heard WCOY-1580 (500 watts in Pennsylvania) sign-on. ERBA...well, see Convention Sidelite #5 (below) for that story!

1969/1970 IRCA CONTESTS The Final Standings have been submitted by Bruce Collier, the former IRCA Contest Chairman. They are being held until next issue (as promised in past bulletins) because of lack of space. The rules and entry procedures for the 1970/1971 contests will appear either next issue or the following.

FRIENDLY DX CONTEST There has been no word on the results of the FDXC sponsored by Dave 'Fish' Fischer; these will appear if and when received. Fish's address is Box 6256, Lincoln, Nebraska 68506.

The IRCA Convention and Annual Business meeting in Vancouver was very successful. A summary of the business meeting will be published shortly, if not in this bulletin. Two proposed Constitutional amendments were submitted for hearing before the convention, and will be voted on by the membership shortly. The texts of these proposed amendments appear below for your consideration:

Proposed amendment to Article VIII [submitted by George Bryson]:

"Amendments to the Constitution of the International Radio Club of America may be made by first submitting a proposal for amendment to the president of the IRCA, who shall have said proposal published in the DX MONITOR no later than 30 days after receipt of said proposal. After publication, the president shall have the proposal put to a vote by the total membership of the club no later than 60 days after publication in the DX MONITOR, with a deadline for acceptance of balloting to be set by the election committee. Results of Balloting shall be published in the DX MONITOR no later than 30 days after [the] end of voting. To be enacted, an amendment must have the expressed favor of 2/3 of the total voting membership; members who did not vote shall not be counted as against the amendment in any way whatsoever.

A. Any merger attempt brought about by either the government of the IRCA or any other DX club, shall follow the same proposal and voting guidelines as set forth above, but for a merger to become enacted, it must have the expressed favor of 2/3 of the total club membership. Members not voting shall be counted as against said merger."

Proposed amendment to the Constitution, adding Article IX - PUBLICATION [submitted by Phil Sullivan]:

"ARTICLE IX - PUBLICATION

All official publications of the IRCA shall be printed using either a typesetting or photo-offset process. The IRCA shall not rely entirely on volunteer effort to produce any official publication. This Article shall take effect 30 days after ratification."

Volunteers needed:

The position of West Coast DX Roundup Editor is now vacant (Grant Manning has been appointed temporary editor until the position can be permanently filled.)

Anthony Marks has been forced to resign as New Member Welcome Committee Chairman. If you would like to help make new members feel more "at home" in the IRCA, this would be an excellent opportunity for you.

Mike Worst, Chairman of the Countries List Committee, has indicated that he would like to see "new blood" incorporated in the committee (Mike has served in this post since the club started). If you are interested in this area, please let me know.

Someone is needed to coordinate compilation of a "Ready Verifiers List," an aid to novice DXers (and others). Sort of an inverse of a "blacklist," this list would provide useful information for the CPC as well as interested individuals.

If you are interested in any of the above posts, please write to Mike Northam. Please include a brief description of any prior experience or special qualifications which you feel would weigh in your favor when I make appointments.

Proposal going to the Board soon:

Amend III-F-2 of the Editorial Policy so as to read: "Be likely to result in payment of damages against the IRCA or its personnel responsible for the insertion of the submitted material." [Deleting the old text.] (Submitted by Jack Alexander, Jr.)

Amend Article X, Section 3 of the Bylaws so as to read:

"Section 3 -- Convention Location

The Board of Directors shall solicit during September of each calendar year bids submitted by those wishing to host the annual convention. The Board shall subsequently cause a special election to be held among the members to select the convention site and date. Such special election shall be conducted during the final third of each calendar year. The Board may, on its own motion, determine any bid made as unqualified prior to the special election." [Submitted by Jon Pearkins.]

Father Jack Pejza has submitted a proposal that Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) be used in DXWW instead of EST. In accordance with the spirit of the proposal, I am proposing that the Editorial Policy be amended as follows: Add II-B-1-f; All times in the domestic sections of DX Monitor will be Eastern Local Time. Add II-B-2-e: [Father Jack's proposal]. Delete III-B of the Editorial Policy.

Merit Certificates: Gerry Dexter, Chairman of the ANARC Awards Committee has announced that ANARC Merit Awards will now be given out periodically to worthy persons who have contributed to the benefit of the hobby. The award may be presented for: significant contributions in the form of club leadership, long-term editing jobs, continuous and long support of a particular club or column, general promotion of the hobby, a single or series of outstanding DX loggings, etc. No restriction is placed on the number of times a person may be recommended for, or receive, the award.

Members of ANARC-affiliated clubs may recommend a person for a merit award by sending a letter giving full details as to why the particular individual deserves to be recognized. Four carbon copies of the letter and a SASE should be sent to: Gerry Dexter, Rt. 1, Maple Road, Lake Geneva, Wisconsin 53147.

There are no restrictions geographically. Anyone in the world may be recommended, as long as the general guidelines are observed. The Awards Committee will give full consideration to each recommendation received. Recipients of the Merit Award will be announced periodically in the ANARC Report.

Executive Secretary for next term. There still have not been any nominations for the post of executive secretary of ANARC for the next two-year term. The voting deadline will be September 30, so there is still time to volunteer or submit a nomination.

President Northam asked for and received reports from the following individuals:

Secretary-Treasurer Larry Godwin: We have \$900 on deposit in our savings account at present, and should show a healthy profit for the year ended August 31. As of July 18, the club has 378 members compared to 304 in August of 1969.

Achievement Awards Committee Chairman Percy Kesteven: To date 230 applications for awards have been received from 89 members. Possible new series of awards will be offered for 45 states and the 48 continental states; a certain number of stations in a given city; and a certain number of stations on a given frequency.

Incorporation Committeeman Larry Godwin (in the absence of the Chairman Bill Lipis): The committee is still trying to determine if it is to the club's advantage to accept a new Colorado law for non-profit corporations.

Countries Committee Chairman Mike Worst: A new Countries List will appear soon in the bulletin. Mike is considering stepping down from his post if another member would like to chair the committee.

Election Committee Chairman George Tanner sent word by Mike Northam that there was a tie in the balloting for the TVA. The two recipients were Don Erickson and Larry Godwin.

Publicity Committee Chairman Jon Pearkins reported he has contacted three magazines regarding publicity for the IRCA, and a number of radio stations in western Canada regarding running taped PSAs describing the club.

Chairman of the Board Don Kaskey invited proposals on any club matters from any members desiring changes in club policies, documents, etc.

President Northam read two Constitutional amendment proposals which he received from the following members:

George Bryson submitted a suggested amendment to Article VIII which would make amendment of the Constitution easier except with regard to proposals of merger.

Phil Sullivan would amend the Constitution by the addition of a new Article IX, which would require the DX Monitor to be reproduced by offset or typeset.

There was general discussion on the amendments, and President Northam named his wife Saralie to chair a committee to study the feasibility of converting to offset publication.

There being no further business, President Northam adjourned the meeting at 8:55 PM.

ID Switching-- From 1962 to Free Czech Radio?? C.M. Stanbury II

As noted (somewhat cryptically) in the September Electronics Illustrated, another clandestine broadcast technique has recently come to light as a result of testimony by a fully identifiable, government-source (the head of the Dry Tortugas project). Although dating back to 1962 at least, it is nevertheless comparatively sophisticated and involves the deliberate arranging of IDs to confuse. At the time of the Cuban missile crisis, R. Americas IDs (as well as those from WIWO) were aired by stations at Boston (Scituate), Mass., and/or Greenville, N.C. and/or Belmont, California.

During the 1962 missile crisis, this technique probably served primarily to confuse Castro's jammers, and may have been limited to short wave frequencies (the 1040 kHz DT relay received transmissions only from SWBC transmitters). But the system of arranging IDs to confuse may be the solution to another major MW mystery-- Free Czech Radio.

During the August 1968 invasion of Czechoslovakia, the Czechs were able to keep a network of potent BCB voices on the air right under the noses of the invaders. The explanation usually advanced for this, both by Moscow and in the West, is that the Czechs had a number of high powered portables (similar in performance to what the Soviets subsequently brought in). The Russians maintain that these were smuggled in from West Germany while others claim they were part of a civil defense network. Considering the nature and number of these units which would have been required (even the most advanced high power portable takes 8 hours to put on the air and this figure does not include dismantling time), neither source seems very plausible. The technically simple system of arranging IDs to confuse offers a more likely explanation. Consider, for instance, the Bratislava 701 kHz station and the one at Prague on 638. If this pair switched identities (and frequencies of course), it would appear to the Russians in Prague that the regular 638 kHz transmitter had been replaced by a weaker clandestine outlet. The same deception would be achieved, temporarily, at Bratislava. With a number of transmitter sites (19 are available even under normal conditions) and a few secret studio locations (since reported by Czech sources) the pattern could have been varied every half hour or so. This could have readily fooled the Soviets until they were able to get their DF gear into action.

Radio Nordsee International

On June 21, two days after the British Elections, "Radio Caroline International" returned to being R. Nordsee International. British observers seem to agree now that the "Caroline" IDs were just one of several extensive campaign devices employed by RNI against the Labour government. Since the election, some press sources have begun giving RNI considerable credit for Labour's defeat; most notably, the London Daily Telegraph stated on July 22 that "One of the issues which the Conservatives believe help swing the young vote on Thursday was the question of free radio". A few days after the election, RNI was completely jammed and moved to 1385 kHz. After operating on 1385 for one day, RNI moved back to 1232 kHz (CMS says 1227) where it is still operating with its warbling jammer in the background. On July 23 RNI announced that they were sailing back to the coast of Holland and the jamming stopped. However RNI has not been heard on MW on any frequency from August 1 on. The FM frequency has changed, since moving back to Holland, from 100 MHz to 102 MHz. They were operative on SW by at least August 1. (Terry Greenhill and C.M. Stanbury II)

Gambia

In the last issue of DXWW there was a report that the former Swedish pirate, Radio Syd, is operating on 908 kHz from Bathurst, Gambia. "Free Radio News" states that the ship is used for a discoteque/restaurant and that Mrs. Britt Wadner is a very good cook too!! (Terry Greenhill, Hertford, England)

Capital Radio was heard by Terry Greenhill on July 16 testing, and also July 18.

An urgent call to RCA was placed for a circuit breaker. All announcements were started and finished with Handel's "Water Music," EE ID by a male announcer, and Dutch by a female announcer. Full EE ID was as follows: "This is a test transmission from Capital Radio. Capital Radio transmits on 1115 kHz, 270 meters in the medium wave-band, broadcasting from the motor-vessel "King David" anchored in international waters. Listeners reception reports will be greatly appreciated by our Technical Department. Upon request, and receipt of two IRCs, listeners' reception reports will be verified. Reception reports should be addressed to the Chief Engineer, Capital Radio, Box 270, Bussum, Holland." Signals are excellent with just a slight het from the 10 kw Belgian station on 1124. Terry received a QSL which has a verification message, but no time, date or v/s. The ship, pictured on the QSL card, has a very unusual horizontal antenna.

Report from Australia--Allen Evans, Glen Innis, Victoria

My DXing has been rather limited this month. However, I've heard a few stations, mainly in the Asian area. I received a verification letter from the Chief Engineer of the Abu Dhabi Broadcasting and TV Service following a report on their transmission on 809 kHz, and this was followed a week later by a letter and full information about the station from Philips, the transmitter manufacturer, who seemed to be pleased that their transmitter was heard as far away as Australia.

- 840 ... Fiji. The new station at Labasa has the best signal of all the Fijians here, heard around 0200 EST.
- 844 VSZ1 Gilbert and Ellice Islands. One of the best Pacific signals. Relays ABC programmes on some evenings.
- 980 3HA Australia, Hamilton, Vic., now uses this frequency, having moved from 1000 kHz in early July.
- 1000 1ZD New Zealand, has its own commercial programmes for most of the day. Heard until after 0700 EST.
- 1115 DYRM Philippines. Heard on this frequency at 0600 with IDs in English.
- 1210 JOOR Japan. Heard at 0830 with JJ commercial programme.
- 1350 JOER Japan. Also heard at 0830 with similar programmes.

Abu Dhabi Broadcasting and TV Service

In August 1968 the Government of Abu Dhabi decided to establish a MW station, and ordered a 50 kw transmitter from Philips. The project was completed on 19 June 1969 and testing began with the next few days. The official inauguration was effected by

the ruler of Abu Dhabi, His Highness Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan al-Nahayan on August 6, 1969. The initial operating frequency was 706 kHz, but this was moved to 818 kHz because of interference. Currently the station operates on 809 kHz. Reception reports should be sent to the Chief Engineer (Mr. C.I. Kennedy), P.O. Box 17, Abu Dhabi.

- 900 OBX4X Peru, Lima, R. El Sol. 7/13 0540 Andean music, all in Quechua. 0600 much talking in Quechua, ID and TC in SS. Good thru CJVI OC.

- 1090 KHAI Hawaii, Honolulu. Is definitely NSP and format is "something of everything", RR, CW, EL. etc/

- 818 ... UAR, Cairo, Arabic 7/17 1743.

- 840 HLKY South Korea, pop music 1420 7/23, announcement, IS at 1429. AN?
- 890 ... China, at 1234 7/1 ID sounded like "Yen Nai J.K.T."--the closest I can find in FBIS 69 is Yen Tai, listed 1450; signal contained relayed RTTY at sides.
- 1040 RM Malaysia, Penang, but IDing as Kuala Lumpur (I think Kuala Lumpur originates entire sked of all West-Malaysian stations), and with (get this) time signal at 1745 7/14, then news in Malay. Must go with the news intro, not WWV-type accuracy.
- 1188 ... Thailand, now have a local here...probably the one formerly around 1340. Seems to have an affinity for Peking frequencies, and at night the two are about equal strength (het 1190). - 1556 ... Thailand, Yan Kro, Bangkok, ID as 1550, distorted, 1756 7/14.

Because it was always weak I had not, until recently, seriously considered the possibility that super-power La Voz de la Victor had returned. Now I am informed that TIRICA has been back on SW (9615kHz) since May. As I was not checking 31 meters carefully up until a couple weeks ago (too much RNI and UHF TV, hi) I've not yet had a chance to compare these two transmissions but this shouldn't be too difficult when and if the 625 signal appears. (CMS)

- 760 1YA New Zealand, Auckland, not heard since morning of 6/15 when it and KGU arrived level together 0615-0620 bounding the needle to S10-S12 area in a rare spasm of volume. This in a hot frequency for summer DXing here for my study of sunrise times suggests it will be late September before WJR begins overlapping the San Diego s/on at 0700. (GM)
- 765 YSKL El Salvador, (city unknown; see 770 below), s/on //770 0557 MM 7/27 with strong signals. (LBG)
- 770 YSKL El Salvador, San Salvador, //765 s/on 7/27. Announcer gave this location for 770 and said transmitters in Santa Ana were on 750, and San Miguel and Sonsonate were on 760. So which is 765? (LBG)
- 807 ??? UnID SS station in obvious sports play-by-play 0107-0120 7/18. I suspect YSFA drifted away from 810 for it sounded much like other Salvadoreans I have heard in sports broadcasts. (GM)

Radio Geronimo, the London based operation using Radio Monte Carlo's 1466 kHz transmitter for Saturday and Sunday night broadcasts to England, was complaining over the air in July that the BBC leaves their 1457 kHz Clevedon station on the air for over an hour after Radio 4 closes down, which interferes with Geronimo in certain parts of Britain. On July 23 bags of red paint were thrown at the BBC Broadcasting House in London and a BBC local radio station manager was assaulted as a protest against the "deliberate" jamming of Geronimo. In the press, BBC denies deliberate action against the commercial service. (C.M. Stanbury II)
