WBEN's 40th Anniversary WBEN, Buffalo, New York, celebrated its 40th anniversary last month. The Buffalo Evening News station, which first went on the air Sept. 8, 1930, marked the occasion with a series of 'memory spots' scattered through the broadcast day. The bignettes included flashbacks of old radio programs including soap operas, variety shows, and musical series, plus anniversary salutes from former WBEN staffers like Jack Paar, "Buffalo Bob" Smith, and Mike Mearian. WBEN, a longtime CBS affiliate, is on the air 24 hours a day. It operates on 930 kHz and has the largest staff of any station in the Buffalo area.

KPFT (FM) Houston Silenced Again by Blast An explosion knocked out the transmitter of the controversial Radio Pacifica,

KPFT (FM). KPFT is one of several stations operated by the non-profit Pacifica Foundation and has often been accused of giving too much time to radical and extremist views. The station's transmitter is on the outskirts of Houston, several miles from its downtown studios. Policemen investigating the blast said no one was hurt.

As yet, DX is still very slow, with nothing new hrd since 9/7, but I am hoping that the new unheard stns will soon be coming thru my speaker. Only four new stns hrd all summer. The following veries found their way to my "pad", tho: WQIC WGBR WGOC WGAD WVAM WRNG WGOW KNBY WVAK WLGW & would you believe WOHO took 3 years, 2 months? All ppc's. Does CKY-580 verie? Been waiting 5 weeks for it. I went to Fla. on my vacation, and took my T-O along. (Trans Oceanic. - MD) Daytime ground wave activity good in that state, but night time DX is just plain "lousy," with all the Cubans and jammers all over the dial. Some examples: only Chicago stn that made it in the clear was WLS. WMAQ, WGN, WBEM, & WCFL just weren't readable with all the SS QRM. Super, Super Long Wire Antenna Jerry Conrad has constructed a 1000' (one thousand foot) Long Wire antenna, commonly called the beverage antenna, one that is in common use Down Under but is rare in NA because of room limitations most of us have. The minimum length for effective results is about 700' and the sky is the limit. It must be in one straight line but may go up and down over hills, etc. It should be at least 3' off the ground; anything higher, up to 15', is better. The beverage, says Jerry, is an extremely directional antenna, far more so than the loop antenna and is completely unlike the loop in its operating characteristics. Major lobes are at + or - 10° from the direction of the wire. In Jerry's case, the wire is due E and W (90° and 270°) so major lobes are 80°, 100°, 260° and 280°. As an example of the amazing performance, Jerry has taped KWOW-1600 Pomona, Calif. 500w, KGER-1390 Long Beach, Calif. 5kw, and KLEI-1130 Kailua, Hawaii (!!!), 10kw. While this much space is just a dream for most of us; if it is available, it would seem this is just the thing for extremely selective DXing. For foreign DXers, Jerry reports tent. reception of Togo-1394 and positive reception of Sierra Leone-1204. Among the comments passed along was the caution that, to be effective, the antenna must be used in a vicinity without strong locals. A strong local will result in every possible mixing spur imagineable.
