AWARDS PROGRAM

We are happy to announce the inauguration of a set of awards. These awards are intended to upgrade the meager DXing skills of our membership by giving them DXing goals. They are also intended to recognize outstanding feats of DXing (or prevarication) by issuance of Certificates of Supremacy in recognition of these feats.

Initially, two awards are available: Verified Several Continents, and Verified a Number of States. Initial awards will be granted for three continents (VSC) and for 20 states (VNS). Endorsements are available for each additional three continents or 500 states. One need not be a club member to win an award, but a \$2.00 non-member fee will be charged for each certificate or endorsement granted to a non-member.

In order to avoid the controversies which sometimes afflict other clubs over definitions of continents, etc., the following rules apply:

1. Only stations verified since April 23, 1902 may be counted.
2. A "state" consists of a political entity, e.g., Texas, Illinois, Labrador, Gambia, Los Angeles Metropolitan Water District.
3. A single political entity may be counted as separate states if a geographical separation (either by land or water) exists, e.g. East and West Pakistan, East and West Caroline Islands. There is no minimum separation required, but a water separation must be at least 12 inches deep at the time of the logging.
4. Historical, political, or geographic boundaries may also be used in determining the boundaries of a state. Thus England, Scotland, and Wales are separate states.
5. A station need not be within the state for which it is being counted, thereby allowing Washford-881 to be counted as Wales, etc.
6. A continent is a piece of land which is surrounded by water. Examples are Eurasia, North America, Australia, Catalina, and Manhattan.
7. A \$1.00 fee will be charged for each application processed. The fee must be submitted in cash.
8. Each application must be submitted on an Award's Application Form with 13 carbon copies. In order to protect against fraud, AAPs which contain erasures, strikeovers, or which are not perfectly legible will be disqualified.
9. Award Application Forms are available from the awards committee for a nominal 25¢ per sheet.
10. Awards committee funds are not accountable. All dealings will be in cash. Application fees and non-member fees are not refundable.

Provided that these arrive on time and in satisfactory condition as promised, your CPC staff will be assured of both transportation and of the cooperation of the station's staff. Verifications will be handled either through Box 88, Moscow, or Box 257, Havana. More details later.

RUMP ELECTION REPORT

Unfortunately there was insufficient time to notify the membership. 145 ballots were received, however, an excellent showing in view of our membership total of 35--even more remarkable when one reflects that only four members knew of the election. 72 were received from Riverside, 36 from Newport Beach, 35 from Santa Monica, and 1457 from Mattachine, Arizona. Since 1456 of the Arizona ballots were Xerox copies, they were disqualified. The results:

President: 36 each for Lief Erickson, Ken Donney, Jay Molar, and Rabbi Jack, 1 for Hans Mouthon.

Vice President: 36 each for Lief Erickson, Will Brians, Mant Granning, and Phil Bremont, 1 for Hans Mouthon.

Treasurer: 72 for Lief Erickson, 36 each for San Edcok and Mike Goering, 1 for Hans Mouthon. (136 ballots for Digger O'Kasket written on El Rancho Hotel cocktail napkins and mailed in one envelope were disqualified.)

Secretary: 36 each for Lief Erickson, Prat Dither, Rollie Bliss, and Will Hankinson, 1 for Hans Mouthon.

Inas much as none of the candidates received a majority of the votes cast, an election committee of Ken Donney and Jay Molar reluctantly declared the faave null and void. (Before the San Diego group took more drastic action.)

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Although the constitution remains lost (See "37", Vol I, April 4, 1970), and attempts to eliminate the constitution were declared void by those who wished to avoid a coup, amendments and comments theron continue to be received.

Portable Jammers Revisited-- C.M. Stanbury II

A statement in the November Electronics Illustrated which seems to have raised a few more eyebrows than expected is as follows: "Every key BBC medium-wave station is now assigned a portable jamming unit in the form of a truck with telescoping antenna with powers ranging from 1 kw to 1.4 kw." The units, of course, can be used either for jamming or for legitimate broadcast purposes and, if the BBC were asked, they would almost certainly list the latter as the unit's purpose. But the most significant use of the BBC portables, so far, has been for jamming. Presumably this same qualification would also apply to the Soviet portable jammers used in Czechoslovakia. In point of fact, the speed and flexibility inherent in every such unit of modern vintage makes all of them, portentally, "portable jammers".

- 820 HJED Colombia, Cali was extremely strong MM 10/26 all AM, even better than HJKC-850 at times. Maybe a news transmitter or antenna? Carriers the CARACOL AN program //750 and 850. (LBG)
- 825 TIOS Costa Rica, San Jose strong with "Titania" ID 0130 10/26, still AN. (LBG)
- 840 YVMY Venezuela, Barquisimeto had a strong signal in the clear with "Radio Juventud" ID at 0408 MM 10/26; believe s/on at 0400. (LBG)
- HJBI Colombia, Santa Marta was conspicuous by its absence MM 10/26. This channel was essentially clear the entire AM. (LBG)
- 844 VSZL Gilbert and Ellice Islands, Betio had fair signals with a woman talking at 0218 MM 10/26. Not as strong as heard several weeks ago, tho. (LBG)
- 870 HCONY2 Ecuador, Guayaquil fairly strong with "R. Cristal" ID 0448 MM 10/26, with the Cuban partially looped. Wasn't this one supposed to move to 1050 kHz.? (LBG)
- 1030 ??? UnID EE station very weak with XEQR looped 0335-0400 10/26. At 0356 there was a commercial, but most of the period I listened consisted of a discussion-type program. Could be an image, although not of a Denver area station. Ruined by WBZ OC at 0400; not audible before 0300 due to KTWO. (LBG)
- 1049 HJ.. UnID Colombian heard //HJER-1025 0322-0430 MM 10/26. At 0429 gave RCN network ID (no local ID): "Transmite RCN." (LBG)
- 1083 HIJM Dominican Republic, Santiago tentatively the SS heard 0431-0500 MM 10/26. Had pretty good signals, with little QRM from 1080 except during occasional KRLD open carrier tests. Believe s/on at 0430. At 0432, it seemed a woman said "Escriban a Radio Amistad..." During a newscast at 0451, the announcer mentioned "el pueblo de Santiago" and gave a TC for EST+ $\frac{1}{2}$ hour. This station was having transmitter difficulties, as it left the air twice for brief periods right in the middle of the program. (LBG)

- 1210 HJFF Colombia, Pereira, "La Voz Amiga" was quite strong AN MM 10/26. Unlike many of the AN Colombians, this one gives frequent local (as well as TODELAR) IDs. (LBG)

- 640 cont. Was heard later with "la hora equis" and what I am pretty sure was "radio exitos" several times. At 0345 noted a TC as "dos de la manana" and "noticias de ultima hora". Signal would fade completely out for about ten minutes, and appear during KFI fades. They hit S-7 a couple of times. Signal was 5 or 6 Hz away from KFI, thus no audible het. A Florida DXer reports logging HRVF here, with very good signals, so must be them, altho I didn't definitely ID them. Steady background noises here makes looping not always possible, would have been easy if I were in a quiet location. Reason for Cuban being silent has not been determined, but if they are off again, this one should be possible in the East. (BF)
- 640 TGW Guatemala, classical violin and piano occasionally just behind or even with a S-9 CMQ (who were programming a vocal group) and noted 0015-0100 10/11. No announcements were heard, even at :30. Would be in for 2-3 minutes, out for 5-6 and faded completely out then. 30-50 hz away from CMQ. Faded in at 0059 and gave call "tay-gay-dobleway" twice; MW, SW 49 meter, and FM frequencies and off with NA 0101. I heard KFI peeping thru CMQ so suspect Guatemala is close to assigned frequency and Havana is the one off. I understand TGW has been running late, in fact with rock music at times so suspect this represents competition for them. (BF)

High noise level and 660/670 splash made copy almost impossible. This might be a new station or one of the low powered relays, as carriers were noted at this time on the other WIBS frequencies of 535, 705, and 1575. Worth watching. (AM)
- 719 ... Portugal, definitely the one listed in 10/10 DXWW. Has been one of the strongest signals so far this season and is usually the first TA audible in the evening, even beating 665. 719 // 665. (AM)
- 737 RNE? Spain, het heard against CBL 2000 10/10 with bits of SS audio, but no positive logging. (DSS)
- 750 JBC Jamaica, Port Galina) under WSB, with ID in EE 2100 10/11. (DSS)
- 800 XELO Mexico, Ciudad Juarez in real well with Voice of Prophecy 0057 10/25 under/over CKLW. (DSS)
- 930 XEU Mexico, Veracruz in fair under WRNL slop all evening 10/24-25. What is their power? They seem too strong for 500 watts. (DSS)
- 970 XEDF Mexico, D.F. with WWSW 10/26 0130 with LA music, SS versions of US pops. (DSS)
- 1200 CMKD Cuba, Holguin with all news destroying WOAI (if it was on) 10/26 0106. (DSS)
- 1285 YNRPS Nicaragua, Radio Grenada with good signals 1945 10/23, readable even without crystal selectivity. (CMS)
- 1560 XEVIP Mexico, D.F. with s/off in EE 10/23 0100. (DSS)
- 2480 HJGN Colombia, Emisora Barranca-Bermeja harmonic (2 x 1240) good here at 2115 10/23. This was a super. night for MW from LW. (CMS)

- 665 ... Portugal, Lisbon. This ANer back with fair carrier but poor audio 2130-2150 10/25, but gone by 2200. Maybe the past fortnight's poor reception period is coming to an end. (GM)
- 764 ... Senegal, Dakar, heard poorly 0059 10/14, sounded like drums. Also poor, with Muezzin caterwauling at 0112 10/15. (GM)
- 770 RJR Jamaica, Mandeville heard with this "call" ID at 0446 MM 10/26 with strong and readable signals, little QRM. (LBG)

Radio, RNI, etc. Also featured is a station I have never heard of before, C.N.B.C., "Commercial Neutral Broadcasting Company."

Now that RNI has left the air, the many low-powered land-based pirate stations are flooding the airwaves every Saturday and Sunday. There is one that programmes nothing but jokes.

Finally, some disturbing facts for all MW DXers. I received some literature from the International Broadcasters Society on Capital Radio. The Dutch-Canadian executive director, Tim Thomassen, states that "A conventional mast aerial gives off a large amount of wasteful 'skywave' (sometimes as much as 40-50%), Capital Radio's unique horizontal aerial (patent pending) gives off only a measured 2%. This is believed to be something of a technical breakthrough."

Report from England on Pirates-- Terry Greenhill

In the music paper, "Disc" for 10/10, the owners of Radio Nordsee International state that the ship is up for sale for £800,000, and that a "Mediterranean gentleman" had made an offer. (I thought of Abie Nathan and his "Voice of Peace" project). A week later, in the same music paper, the owners say that the ship is not for sale, is still anchored off Schenveningen with all the DJs on board, and may start broadcasting again.

In the music paper, "Record Mirror" for 10/17, an article states that the Dutch Government has shelved plans to introduce a Marine Offences Act, and to ratify the Strasbourg Agreement. A spokesman for the government said that it would be very unlikely that any action would be taken over Radio Veronica, (and Capital Radio, which is now back on the air). When asked what if Radio Nordsee returned to the air, the spokesman made no comment.

For those interested in pirate radio, they should write to "Impulse Publications Ltd, 28, Guild Street, Aberdeen AB1 2NB, Scotland. They have for sale: "When Pirates Ruled the Waves," by Paul Harris (English price is £1.16..0.); "The Radio Nord Story," by Jack S. Kotschack, (E.P. is £3.5..0.); on 10/31, a long-playing record, "The History of Offshore Radio" is to be released. (English price: £3..0..0. In preparation is "The Veronica Saga" and "The Radio Luxembourg Story". I have received a 45 rpm "sampler" disc of the "History" disc, and it is excellent; many recordings are studio made. Some of the stations featured are: The Swedish Radio Nord, Radio Syd, Radio Mercur; the Dutch Veronica; New Zealand's Radio Hauraki; and Radio Caroline's North and South, London, 270, Sutch, King Radio, Capital Radio, Britain

REVIEW OF THE SX-130-----Dave Christensen

The SX-130 is designed mostly for SW and ham DXing, and most of the features and abilities of the rx are SW and ham. The rx has controls for such things as crystal phasing, which is to be used with the selectivity knob. This crystal phasing (i.e., to phase out harmonics, spurs, etc.) is good only on SW, and I was disappointed with that (as being within sight of about 7 stns towers, I get quite a few spurs). It is very good in the sensitivity department, tho, as I can often pull in the stations that used to be fades or hets. It has a strange IF frequency, 1650 kHz, so you can't use a Q-multiplier with it unless you have the ability to modify the rx. The selectivity of the rx is terrible! I have trouble getting anything on 910-1020 because of slop on 910, 950, and 1000. I would rate it as a poor AM DXing rx due to this. (Ed. Note--- I recently went shopping for a new rx, and in the course of a phone call to the Herbert W. Gordon Co. in Mass., the salesman described the SX-130 as a "dog"!-HLH).

REVIEW OF THE PANASONIC RF-728-----Dave Christensen

This has nine transistors, is FM/AM, and has good selectivity but lacks the sensitivity of the TRF. It is fairly good for WC DXing (or EC if you live on the EC, etc.) but I wouldn't try for anything tougher than that! I can loop out stations if they are a good distance away. I know that this past summer, I went to Oregon and was able to loop stations 200 miles away in order to receive stations 800 miles away. Overall, I would rate it as a fair portable.

Dave includes some additional comments on the Realistic TRF portable, which has been reviewed earlier: "I'll just add my raves to the ravings of HLH and GS. I have had mine for only a few days, but already I have heard a TP, and have added 6 or 7 new stations to my totals, while only staying up a few minutes past midnite. In my mind, there is no better portable currently on the market, but I haven't used them all either. I'm taking mine to Calif. this Dec., and I don't plan on being hampered by the smallness of it compared to my communications rx, as I think it will do just as well."

RADIO VERONICA CELEBRATES TENTH BIRTHDAY

(The following material is condensed from a special section in the September issue of England's well-known Record Mirror, submitted by Larry Godwin. Many thanks, Larry!)

Although DXers tend to think of offshore pirate stations as a relatively new development, Radio Veronica recently celebrated ten years on the air. The enormous popularity of this station in the Netherlands is demonstrated by the fact that the station receives more than 10,000 letters per week from a country whose population is only 12,000,000!

Although Radio Veronica is thought by many North American DXers to be just an offshore operation, almost the only facet of Veronica's operation which takes place off the mainland is the actual transmission of signals. More than 90% of the programs are recorded in Hilversum and are sent out to the ship. Of course, the business offices are on land. There is even a Radio Veronica Drive-In Show, which travels around the Netherlands on weekends with Veronica Djs, records, and even live bands. About the only people who do work at sea are the radio engineers and the newscasters.

Although the station now makes a healthy profit (they have recently been forced to turn down advertising offers), the early days of Veronica were anything but successful. The station director, "Bull" Verwey, stated that "we did have many difficulties in the first years. I certainly never dreamt that we would face so many problems!"

When asked why Veronica survived the crises that killed the British pirates, Mr. Verwey replied: "Veronica remains where it is because it does not offend anyone. It never criticises the government---that's a mistake some other offshore stations have made."

What are the future plans for Veronica? Mr. Verwey makes no bones about the fact that Veronica wants to become a land-based station. Mr. Verwey is quite confident that the station will eventually become land-based. As he puts it, "One day we will build our mast in the open field behind our studios in Hilversum!"

The special issue of Record Mirror that saluted Veronica had an advertisement for the Free Radio Association. Details on this organization are available for an IRC from Free Radio Association, 239 Eastwood Road, Rayleigh, Essex, England.

"King David--A new pirate AM broadcasting station went on the air at 6:00 a.m. GMT, September 1. Instead of the top-heavy mast used by many pirate broadcasters, Capital Radio uses a ring-type antenna that is claimed to radiate no skywave! NRC and IRCA DXers take note!"

There's always a silver lining dept: have you noticed that a few stns that planned to go AN or NSP have curtailed those plans in the current recession? And how a growing handful have cut their post-midnight broadcast hours? Not the Metro rockers, perhaps...The current trend of 18-34, or in total, 12-49, audience concentrations in larger cities desired by many advertisers is giving successful top forty (and tangental) operations heavier sales than ever. But minor market older-adult audience facilities are taking a hard look at operating costs in view of current billings. Those that habitually ride the NBC Net's Monitor on weekends, for instance, came out of last week's affiliates' meeting in San Francisco with a sharp pencil realligning their scheds. So, a prediction: at least two 50kw regional clears that planned to go NSP from AN on or about 1/1 aren't going to do it (one is an NBC affiliate). At least one (and probably a second) of that new breed of 50kw western stns sharing Eastern clears will slash post-midnite broadcast hours very shortly, perhaps by the time you read this. Result: new Detroit-area DXers will have a harder logging New Mexico, but southern Calif. DXers will have an easier time logging Tonga!
