Since I don't have the NRC "ideal" loop to compare it with, I'll have to settle for IRCA loop and a 100' longwire. S-meter readings with the Space Magnet are about 2 S-units stronger than the IRCA DCL loop with the amp off, and with the amp on there's no comparison. (I assume you mean the amp on the Space Magnet, Dave, right? -LDB) S-meter readings with the longwire are about equal to the SM with the amp off, and with the SM amp on it's about 3 s-units better. So I'm very satisfied with it. In the daytime with the SM I can pick up groundwave signals from WCCO WMAQ WGN WWL, etc. All readings were taken on my Drake SW4A. In the daytime with the SM, KSIW-1450 (30 mi. away) is 40 db/S9, yet I nulled them enuff with it to get a report on KWBW, about 150 mi. from Buffalo. Veries from: KWOE (for 1969 rpt w/o f/up) & KWSH. I heard a weird chanting on 764 kHz about 1/10 after 0100. No ID but I suspect it might have been Dakar-764, which would be my first TA. 73 & DX.

My listing of "twenty interesting countries" from both coasts in the 1971 Communications Handbook seems to have aroused some discussion. Let me comment briefly on my reasons for including certain stations and omitting others. The list was headed "20 interesting countries" and was written, not to provide 20 easy but rather similar and dull countries, but a challenging variety of different countries on different continents and in different languages, whose reception is not difficult; countries, as I quite simply said, "that are audible". One of my prime desires was to avoid dullness and inclusion of too many countries with similar broadcast formats; it is precisely for that reason that I omitted most of the Central American republics; I chose the largest and closest, Guatemala, and then passed to more varied nations, including the perhaps challenging but worthwhile and entirely feasible Senegal, Alaska, Tonga, etc. Regarding my omission of ZBVI-780, at printing time Barbados was still on 780 and ZBVI not so easy. Although I am a keen IA DX'er, a list consisting largely of SS IA stations simply would not have appealed to the reader and novice DX'er.

For some unknown reason, the results of the October 1970 KSWW DX were never published. With that in mind, here is a brief summary of the test. Approximately 16 reports were received and about 3 phone calls from people who didn't send in a written report. Station manager Jack Hughes was extremely pleased with the test (and also the fact that I did the test instead of him, hi). My sincere thanks go out to each for making the test so successful. Believe it or not, our files prior to the test contained only 5 DX reports, two of them from Phoenix! Anyone interested in a repeat of this test sometime this spring, around Easter? 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Panama (and LA in general) -- Bill Hardy

With Ash Wednesday coming up February 24, Panama, like many LA nations, will have Carnival the days before it. During celebrations, Panamanians tend to stay on AM with remotes from AM dances at bars, etc. These are noted other times during the year (like Labor Day weekend; we went to Boqueta in western Panama, and HOC20-1180, David, did an AM remote from our hotel keeping us awake AM!) but the Carnival is the biggest celebration of the year and AM dances are very likely. Distinctive features include announcer with feedback, reading endless announcements between dance numbers, often with many commercial plugs; distortion (phone lines) on both announcer and music; music too loud; same type of music AM. Music can be "Big Band" (more like Tijuana Brass) or "tipico" music (accordian, percussion, repetitive singing, similar to Andes music). IF you hear a station AM with live remote, it is NOT regular. CoF list has included Panamanians AM in the past who are not AM normally. Usual AMers are 1015, 1120, and 1250 in Panama City, 1240 in David, and of course SCM on 790 and 1420 in Canal Zone. HOC2-1045 was often reported AM last year but it was usually live remotes. One more thing: usual AMers (in fact most stations) go off entirely on Good Friday.

Geomagnetic Indices

To explain what the numbers mean, I quote from Gordon Nelson, in DX News: "A_{fr} is the Fredericksburg index of geomagnetic/auroral disturbance in the Earth's magnetic field. High values of A_{fr} occur during a heavy influx of electrically charged particles into the upper atmosphere as a result of certain types of solar disturbances. The medium-wave signal absorption produced by one of these events is strongest in high latitudes and persists for some days following the initial particle influx. Values of A_{fr} above about 20 are inevitably associated with high levels of absorption along high-latitude TA and TP signal paths. Very high values (above about 40) are usually accompanied by E layer blanketing over North America and Europe; on such a night stations from the South will appear to dominate most channels. Long periods of low geomagnetic/auroral activity are necessary but not sufficient to guarantee excellent high latitude TA and TP reception- other ionospheric effects such as the "midwinter anomaly" may effectively mask what would otherwise be periods of excellent reception on high latitude paths during periods of continued low geomagnetic/auroral activity."

THE OLD RADIO SHOP
The BC-221 & LM Frequency Meters
(for the serious DXer)

What is a frequency meter? It is a device for measuring, or radiating RF signals within the frequency range of 125-20,000KHZ. Generally, accurate to .01%, plus or minus 50 hertz, whichever is greater. There is a calibration book containing dial settings, corresponding to certain selected frequencies as a part of the instrument. The serial number in the Cal. book, must match the one on the name plate of the meter. The meter is no good without it's book!

Operation In operation, the instrument is warmed up for fifteen minutes, then to measure an unknown frequency that your receiver is tuned to, (say 852KHZ) you would look up a frequency close to the unknown, (say 850KHZ) in the book. On this page will be a "Crystal Check Point" the meter is zero-beat to this dial reading, first setting the dial, then using the "corrector" control to "fine tune." The meter is then calibrated to the internal crystal standard. From here, the dial is moved up in frequency until it is zeroed on the frequency your receiver is on. Then, the new dial reading is looked up in the book, and will cross over right on, or between two frequencies. On my BC-221, it would read: 3394.6, for 852.0KHZ. There are detailed instructions in the calibration book on the use of the meters.

Availability and cost. These meters are available from almost any large, and many small surplus stores. They are also advertised in many Amateur magazines. The LM (Navy) type differs from the BC-221 (Army) type in that it is not as accurate as the BC-221, (but the difference is so small...) and slightly smaller physically. Otherwise, they are identical. They may both be had with 500 hertz modulation built in. Cost varies, I've seen them locally for \$15, with book, (I didn't have the money!) FJP recently picked one up for \$25, an LM w/500 hertz modulation, in excellent condition. In the ham magazines they run up to \$57-60, and my surplus catalogs indicate \$65-129.00. Cost may be considered high, but then my Dad used the one I have for ham radio when he was my age! There is one available here now for \$35. at Acro Surplus...
