The typical car radio is a magnificent piece of junk. The total expenditure for parts is believed to be in the vicinity of \$5-10. They are sold for several times that.

Typically, they consist of a stage of tuned RF, a converter, one stage of 262KC IF amplification, and a two stage audio circuit. From the factory, they are as broad as the proverbial barn door, although sensitivity is adequate.

With so little to work with, and generally poor construction techniques used by the manufacturer to begin with, there isn't a whole lot you can do to make improvements. It is possible to make it more selective with a compromise on overall audio gain and quality.

I don't recommend doing much more than the following modifications to a car radio, as the end result would not warrant the effort/cost. It is possible to increase the selectivity of these sets (provided you don't have the miniature Jap IF transformers) by taking both IF cans apart, and moving the coils $\frac{1}{4}$ " further apart each. This decreases coupling, and increases selectivity (quite noticeably) Be careful not to break the leads on the coils! The end result is a sharper response curve, less audio, less "highs", and obviously, less IF gain. It's not anywhere near a decent communications receiver, but much better than the factory job.

This article came about by yours truly wanting to listen to KWIZ, 1480 next to local XEBBC 1470, (one of the super splashers) and not wanting to spend a lot of time ripping up the car rx. The results were gratifying as far as KWIZ goes, plus I noticed both TGJ 880, and WLS 890 in nicely last night, heretofore inaudible next to XEMO 860, and KDEO 910 sidebands.

Radio Nordsee International is now verifying with an inspecific QSL card. The card has an aerial colored photo of the m/v "Mebo II" on the front. On the back it just states: "Radio Nordsee International. Broadcasting (Comm) Radioship 'Mebo II' International Waters. MW-transmitter: RCA 105kW, F = 1232 kHz-244m/1367kHz-220 m*; MW antenna-vertical Marconi. SW-transmitter: I: BBC 10 kW, F = 6205 kHz-48.3 m. SW antenna-inverted V. FM transmitter, R&S 1 kW, F = 100mHZ, canal 44. Generators: 2x500kVA Struver-Diesel. 'Mebo II': Length- 60 m, Width, 9m, Displacement- 570 BRT, Aerial mast- 52 m." The address given is: RNI- Radio Nordsee International, QSL Department, P.O. Box 113, CH 8047 Zurich Switzerland. I suggest for stateside members, 3 IRCs and a self-addressed envelope as the card is rather thin and is easily damaged in the mails. I also suggest to get out follow-ups as the Dutch government is to outlaw offshore radio. You have nine months to verify RNI and Veronica. RNI QSL received 5/24, took 50 days. (*Only on 1367)

Another station, although not a pirate, to start verifying is EAJ-29, R. Intercontinental, Madrid. EAJ-29 is also verifying old reports. A U.K. DXer received a v/q for a June 1966 report.

- I have managed to verify some low-powered land-based pirates with prepared cards:
- 1300 Radio Odyssey. For 5/9 reception. Homebrew tx, 25 watts, 40 foot end-fed antenna horizontal. Located at Southgate, North London.
 - 1324 Radio Jackie, for 5/9 report. Homebrew tx, 18 watts, 150 ft. end-fed antenna. Located at Ewell, Surrey.
 - 1325 Radio Unity. for 5/30 reception. Homebrew 50 watt tx, 50 foot long-wire antenna with loading coil of 120 turns. Located at Wood Green, North London.
 - 1335 Radio Free Atlantic. For 5/30 reception. Homebrew 60 watt tx, 120 ft. long-wire antenna. Located at Dartford, North Kent.

The only holdout is Radio Free South on 1280, which is almost on my back doorstep, only 8 miles away. Other pirates moving up and down the band are: Radio Diamond, R. Prune, R. Telstar 1, 2, 3, and 4, R. Tracey, R. Splodge, and Thames Radio. Most of these pirates operate around midday Sunday in the frequency range of 1250-1460. Some have been heard as high as 1525 and I have heard a Radio Capital City on 755. Radio Jackie-1324 also operates on Saturday afternoons on 94.4 FM. Some of these stations have been operating in the early hours of Sunday morning which makes reception of the privately owned Greek station, "Pyrgos Radio" on 1349 impossible, with their poor modulation and hets. The worst offender is Radio Diamond, which does not programme music as the others do, but just likes "playing ham" giving signal strength reports to other stations.

As of July 1, WWV is broadcasting the geomagnetic indices, not for Fredericksburg, but, I believe, for Boulder. While not identical with the values as given above, they should be close enough to give you an idea of what kind of conditions exist. WWV broadcasts the indices at 18 minutes after the hour; WWVH at 45 minutes after the hour. For June 30, for instance, the value was 10.

Indonesia RRI has activated a station on 1335 kHz. It was heard in New Zealand with classical music to 1700 GMT s/off. Indonesia has not broadcast on MW for 30 years. This station may be a possibility for this fall. (Radio Nederland via Dave Alpert)

Albania A new high-powered station is now relaying Radio Peking on 1457 kHz. The programs seem to be transmitted on shortwave from China. Polish at 2000, repeated at 2030, Serbo-Croat at 2100, repeated at 2130. The transmitter is probably located between Tirana and Durrës, a few miles from the Adriatic Sea. (SCDX)

New Hebrides Operation in the broadcast band is planned for Radio Vila, from information received from the Information Officer at the station. (WRB)

Bolivia The full 10 kw of La Cruz del Sur, La Paz on 730 kHz is not presently being used, but will be soon when a new generating system is installed. (Richard Wood, via WRB)

South Korea The Far East Broadcasting Company will establish a 250 kW transmitter on Cheju Island, just 250 miles from Shanghai. Broadcasts will be directed toward mainland China and the Koreas, although a news release from FEBC seems to indicate that transmissions also might be directed toward Japan. (SCDX)

On tap for next issue is an article on Broadcasting Formats in the Philippines by Charles Taylor. Not enough room for it this issue. I have been trying to find a way of mounting my alt-azimuth loop more securely; at present, there's much wobble which cuts down on the ability to move it to positions where I can deeply null. I have installed a new FET-pre-amplifier, constructed by Ralph Sanserino, which is inexpensive, but really does a tremendous job. The FETs cost about 50¢ apiece; and other parts are equally cheap. After having tried in vain for many months to get the NRC "Super-loop" pre-amp to work properly, I now am able to get a tremendous signal once again. Hope to see many of you at ERBA headquarters in West Sacramento over Labor Day for the NRC Convention; I won't be able to get to Toledo unfortunately. Our advertising folder didn't seem to do the job in getting the convention here; I wonder if "9 for 6" will be equally as successful, for the parties involved. We'll find out in about a month. In the meanwhile, how many are continuing to DX this summer? Very few reports here, as you can see above. Keep trying for those deep South Americans. Enough of my ramblings for this issue...73 de FJP.

These irregularities may be divided into two classifications: 1) Irregularities relating to the 1971 election of officers, and 2) Unauthorized censorship of members' contributions by the IRCA Publisher.

1] Irregularities relating to the 1971 election of officers:

Bylaws Article III, Section 5, Part 6 states: "Ballots and the campaign statements are to be mailed to all members with the June issue of the DX Monitor". Bylaws Article VI states "The official publication of the IRCA shall be known as DX Monitor. It shall be issued 34 times each year, except in cases of emergency. With the permission of the Board the number of issues may be changed. DX Monitor will normally be published beginning with the first Tuesday in October up to and including the last Tuesday in March, twice in April and September, once in May, June, July and August".

It is common knowledge that Don Erickson was given responsibility for mailing the ballots and that the ballots and campaign statements were not mailed to all members with the June issue of the DX Monitor as prescribed by the Bylaws. Instead, Mr. Erickson mailed ballots and campaign statements together with a tiny fraction of the June DX Monitor. This packet was mailed about ten days before the June bulletin was sent out.

We feel that the club elections are very serious business, and it is therefore essential that all relevant regulations be strictly followed. We would also call attention to our belief that as a candidate for office, Mr. Erickson had an ethical responsibility not to act as distributor of ballots. An obvious conflict of interest occurred, and we believe that Mr. Erickson adopted this irregular method of ballot distribution in an effort to further his personal interests in club affairs. We regard as significant the fact that Mr. Erickson provided no advance notice of his scheme to any of us.

2] Unauthorized censorship of members' contributions by the IRCA Publisher:

It is common knowledge that on numerous occasions, IRCA Publisher Don Erickson has deleted portions of DX Forum reports which have been submitted by many club members. In some cases, he has caused the deletion of entire Forum contributions. In many instances, Don Erickson has printed statements in which he admits to this behavior. Upon careful study of the IRCA Constitution, Bylaws, and Editorial Policy, it becomes clear that the Publisher has no authorization whatever to delete Forum contributions or any portions thereof. In addition, we believe that this censorship by the Publisher is in clear violation of the IRCA Editorial Policy: Article III, Part B states: "Editors shall have sole authority over the content of their columns including filler material, subject to the provisions of of the IRCA Bylaws dealing with irregularities." Article III, part E clearly entrusts editors with the responsibility to insure that unacceptable material does not appear in DX Monitor. No mention of deletions by the Publisher is to be found. Article II, Part B 1, c 1 sets aside the DX Forum for comment about, "The IRCA and its policies and any other relevant and allowable discussion that cannot be fitted into another column." We feel that Mr. Erickson's arbitrary censorship serves to abridge this essential purpose of the DX Forum.

In conclusion, it is our hope that the IRCA government will take whatever action is needed to remedy the above cited irregularities and to prevent any recurrence.

THE 1971 ELECTION FRAUD

Fellow IRCA members: As you all know, IRCA has held an election this year. This 1971 election should have been conducted within the rules set down by IRCA's Bylaws. These rules were enacted so that elections would be conducted in a fair and honest manner. In a democratic DX club, it's essential that they be followed. It is also essential that if someone desires change, that he work for it through the democratic process. It is our feeling that when IRCA's Bylaws are violated in a gross manner for someone's own gain within the club, a major piece of corruption can be said to have taken place.

Few realize that Don Erickson did not mail the campaign statements and ballots out in the manner prescribed by IRCA's Bylaws (Art. III, Sec. 5, Pt.6). This clause states: "Ballots and the printed campaign statements are to be mailed to all members with a June issue of DX Monitor" (Amended Art. III, DXM 12/5/70). Another relevant portion of our Bylaws is the entire Article VI, entitled "Publication". This Article states that DX Monitor is to be issued 34 times a year, with one single issue in June. Clearly, the ballots and campaign statements should have been mailed together with the entire June bulletin as the Bylaws specify. But this is not what happened. Instead, Don Erickson saw fit to mail ballots and related material ten days in advance of the June DX Monitor. Why did DEE adopt such a bizarre method of distributing ballots? Why didn't he give any advance notice of his scheme?

DEE stated his reason for implementing this illegal scheme on page 11 of the campaign statements: "...in order to eliminate the need to replace missing ballots caused by lost, delayed or returned third class bulletins; all ballots are being sent out in this separate packet by first class mail to all." On the surface, Erickson's reason sounds plausible.

However, if you look a bit deeper, a fly in the ointment appears. It certainly isn't necessary to mail the ballots ten days early in order to eliminate the "poor mail service problem". Why didn't DEE simply place first class postage on all of the bulletins and mail one June bulletin as the Bylaws specify? Erickson knew all along that his scheme was in violation of the Bylaws, and we suspect that he didn't care as he had an ulterior motive.

As most IRCAers know, a booklet was sent out this year, and it promoted nine candidates for IRCA office. Seven of these nine candidates are well known for their advocacy for free speech in DX Monitor and democracy in IRCA's government. Don Erickson was well aware that a committee had been formed to advance the Free Speechers' campaigns. It was a good bet that some kind of mailing would be forthcoming, and DEE wasn't about to see it succeed.

It is well known that the overwhelming majority of those who vote in IRCA elections do so immediately upon receiving their ballots. So, in an attempt to minimize the booklet's influence and possibly defeat the persons promoted in it, DEE mailed the ballots ten days early.

On page 11 of the campaign statements, Erickson gives Steve Kamp the dubious credit for this idea. According to DEE, Steve's suggestion appeared in his 6/12 Forum report. But if you have read Steve's report you'll notice that all he suggested was that there be no numbering, duplicating or changing of any ballots. He opposed all of this because it is inherently dishonest. Steve NEVER suggested that DEE's scheme be used. The "10 days in advance" idea was DEE's so that his opposition wouldn't win.

Erickson's regrettable manipulation of a crucial IRCA election is perhaps the most blatant corruption in IRCA's history--perhaps in the recent history of any club. One annoyance about all this malpractice is that it has been impossible to tell the membership about it or even so much as refer to it in the bulletin. Both Steve Kamp and Paul Lotsof attempted to inform their fellow members, and both reports were completely censored by DEE. Here it should be noted that DEE has absolutely no authority to censor anything, according to the club's rules. Because of this illegal censorship, it is necessary for us to print and distribute this material at our own expense.

Contrary to our image as "careless rabble-rousers", we happen to be deeply interested in IRCA and want to make certain that it stays the democratic DX club that it was originally intended to be. IRCA certainly has "strayed somewhat in its aims" if it allows unnecessary censorship and corruption to go on without something being done to solve these problems.
