Dave Christensen, IRCA Contest Manager, advises by phone of the following items:

1. In the Singleton-Eliminator Contest, the limit has been changed from 3000 miles to 1500 miles. All foreign stations (those not in Canada or the 48 contiguous states) 1500 miles or more distant count.
2. Add 1240 to the list of local (graveyard) channels on the rules. Deleted by error.
3. D.C. is counted as a state for a possible total of 51 U.S. states.
4. Puerto Rico is not a state but a foreign country for purposes of the contests.
5. DX Specials must be verified. See note below by publisher.
6. Zones for the Singleton-Eliminator will be decided/announced after the end of the entry period. Deadline for entering has not been decided. Entry fee is 75¢ per contest; \$1.50 for both by cash, check or mo. -3434 39th Ave. W, Seattle 98199

Don Erickson makes the following comments regarding the contests and, as such, they are unofficial observations to be verified by Dave next issue.

1. In fairness to those who originally designed both contests, it should be pointed out that the rules are taken from previous contests. The Singleton-Eliminator was designed by Don Reynolds and the Domestic Heard Contest was designed by Don Kaskey. The S-E was a joint NRC-IRCA contest; the DHC was a NRC Contest.
2. Having researched the original rules and amendments thereto, some notes should be made.
3. The original S-E rules did not bar re-verification; this due partly to the fact that the limit started at 3000 miles; it was later changed to 2000 miles (IRCA's is now changed to 1500 miles). While Dave gives the impression stations may not be re-logged for the S-E Contest, I assume this was an oversight since the term "log" is nebulous as means different things to different DXers. Some keep no log at all; others consider heard/logged to be synonymous; still others consider a stn logged only when a report is sent. See Dave's comments next issue.
4. Dave does not specify what is considered a DX Special or Test. The original rules required that the program be at least 30 minutes in length and receive sufficient advance notice for the average member to know about it. As a suggestion to Dave, a Monday morning program should appear in the bulletin dated 9 days earlier. Your publisher does not want to get caught in the middle with irate members screaming about errors in DX Calendar so certain guidelines will be established. Naturally, a program would have to be aired on the announced date and a generally correct time. -DEE

RADIO TODAY Those who have been asking what happened to Radio Today sub switchover to S9 should by now have received a card acknowledging the switchover as either a new subscription or an extension. ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS COMMITTEE
FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT TO THE 1971 IRCA CONVENTION
(Abridged)

The Achievement Awards Committee or AAC was conceived in 1967 by Mike Northam. His proposal, setting up five classes of awards, passed the Board, but Mike discovered that time limitations did not permit his carrying on with the project. As I had expressed interest in the scheme earlier, Mike gave me a chance to take over the venture. I accepted. Through a round robin of letters between Mike, Larry Godwin, and myself, regulations were set up, certificates printed, and the "show was on the road" on June 15, 1969.

Since that time the AAC has issued 359 awards to 157 IRCA members.

Many things have happened in this past year affecting the AAC, but the most important is the availability (soon) of the new Graveyard Channel Awards. For ver-graveyard channels, you can receive an award. I hope that this BCB exclusive will attract interest and applications.

This year, the AAC has given out 149 awards, an average of about 12 a month. As in previous years, the most popular awards was the States Award which drew over 50% of all applications. In fact, we've given away so many States Awards that, in addition to printing 200 of the new Graveyard Channels Awards, we've also re-printed 200 States Awards.

Thank you for you continuing support of this Committee.

President's Report

Now that my term of office has officially begun, many of you are probably wondering what changes are about to take place.

Firstly, it must be realised that the IRCA is an organisation that has long since passed the stage where everyone can know everyone else or even know about other people through second hand information. We have over 400 members and, as such, we simply must become more efficient in a number of ways.

Many of the outlined changes are definitely a step towards a greater and possibly slightly less personal bureaucracy, but hopefully it will be an efficient bureaucracy, capable of dealing easily with the day to day problems in the Club. Because the President's Office is the clearing house of a great deal of very important material pertaining to the governing of the Club, it is essential that the President know all the facts about certain situations. Hence the need for the form mentioned later. (Show me an organisation with this many people which is completely devoid of any kind of form!) Then again, it is essential that Club members are kept informed of Club Government activities. This concept of immediate feedback underlies the monthly reports which are explained below.

Your critical analysis of the ideas put forth is appreciated. A few of these aims are mine, but I am indebted to a great many people for the great majority of them.

Board of Director Proposals

1. Each month, either at the beginning of that month or at the closest weekend to the beginning, the BoD will be sent a letter informing them of current proposals for the purpose of voting. Since the BoD has 21 days in which to return their ballots to the President, their votes will be in and tabulated by the beginning of the next month.
2. Each month, either at the beginning of that month or at the closest weekend to the beginning, the President will stencil a President's Report, outlining
 - (a) the BoD's vote on matters sent to them during the previous month and
 - (b) any proposals which are of such a nature that the President feels that general club discussion would be in order.

The latter (b) has been an unofficial policy for quite some time now. In addition to the listing of such proposals in DXM for discussion, the President will also designate the month that the proposal will go before the BoD, allowing enough time for membership comment. This time will probably be about two months in most cases.
3. To clarify any questions about this system, let's assume it is in operation. Hence, October will bring these activities about:
 - (a) the BoD will be sent all proposals for balloting
 - (b) a President's Report will appear in DXM as soon as the Publishing Committee receives it. The Report will contain:
 - i. the BoD activities for the month of September
 - ii. a description of currently pending proposals which require discussion, along with the month in which they will be put to a BoD vote
4. Should there be no proposals for the BoD during any particular month, that body will be notified accordingly.
5. Should there be no need for a President's Report, the Publishing Committee will be notified and will make this fact known.
6. Upon submitting a proposal, provided said proposal is in order with regard to the IRCA's Bylaws governing this action, the person submitting the plan will receive an acknowledgement of receipt. This card will indicate receipt of the proposal, along with the proposal number it has been assigned and the month it will go before the BoD. If it is of such a nature that club wide discussion is necessary, this fact will be indicated. Naturally, the date of BoD voting would be moved ahead correspondingly.
7. Note that, with this system, proposal's not requiring club discussion would take about seven weeks at the most to go through the BoD. Postal delivery times could delay it somewhat in reaching the pages of DX Monitor, but at least it will have cleared the Club government as quickly as possible.

8. While on the subject of proposals, perhaps it would be a good time to explain to everyone how the proposal numbering system works. A typical proposal might be numbered thus: 5.1-14. The "5" stands for the fifth administration held by an IRCA President. Hence, I am the fifth President since the Club's origins and all my proposals will begin with a "5". The "1" indicates that the proposal was submitted during the first year of the fifth President's term. A "2" found here tells the reader that the proposal was submitted during the second year of the two year term. The number "14" is the actual proposal number. Each year the President begins numbering proposals, always starting at "1". Note that 5.1-14 will be a different proposal from 5.2-14 as the latter will have been submitted in the second year of the President's term. (Actually, since the Board of Director's term coincides with that of the President, the "5" stands for the fifth administration of both Board and President. This was left out above to simplify matters.)

Club Directory of Officers, Editors, and Committee Chairmen

Every six months a Club Directory of Officers, Editors, and Committee Chairmen will be published in DX Monitor. This directory will list names, addresses, and telephone numbers (the latter only if this is agreeable to the party concerned). Along with this listing will be found a brief description of the function of these people. Thus, both old and new members will have a handy, up to date directory. Incidentally, listings will be made by function (e.g. Board of Directors, not by an alphabetical listing of names). The first directory will appear in November, or possibly sooner. It will be easy to update from that point onward.

Seven Day Service

In the past, in connection with the Achievement Awards Committee, (which, incidentally, I intend to retain Chairmanship of, pending BoD approval), I have always tried to answer applications within seven days. Illness and occasional spurts of work (especially around report card time) have not always made this possible, but it has been followed in the main. It is my intention to continue this practice with all mail dealing with Club affairs. If something concerns you, please write. Prompt replies are guaranteed.

Offset Printing

Many members are confused over the issue of offset printing. Although our future in this area seems to depend largely on the outcome of the NRC's bid for second class postal rates, some facts, both pro and con, should be presented. This will be done shortly. No conclusions will be attempted and the writers will try to omit any bias.

Mission Statements

Each committee chairman will draw up a statement of the aims and purposes of his particular committee. These need not be long, but they should be comprehensive enough so that, when published, members old and new will be able to see how the club serves them and, if they are interested, join a committee to further its work.

IRCA Application Form

The President has the extremely important task of selecting candidates for editorships, chairmanships, etc. As such, he simply must have all pertinent information about applications before his recommendations to the BoD can be done critically. The only way to find out the same information about any group of persons is to ask each individual the same questions. This can be done most expediently through the use of a form, especially since the questions about many aspects of club work (e.g. Can you type?) come up repeatedly. I hope that the membership realises this and will lend support. In future, all editorships, etc. open to the general membership will contain, in public notice of availability, of the post concerned, my address as the source for forms. A sample form appears elsewhere in this DX Monitor.

I look forward to serving you in the weeks and months ahead.

NEW YORK

No matter how well a state can be heard there are always some areas in which reception is difficult. The "Empire State" is no exception. With good selectivity reception is relatively easy from coast to coast. However, those who are not blessed with selective receivers can suffer many miseries. Jay Murley explains the problems and solutions to this for those WC members who are having a trying time in logging New York. "New York can be a tough state for some of our younger west coast and south west DXers. Sure, they haven't got the gear, they're using long wires, and their families prohibit staying up past midnight for good reasons. The results 1) they've never heard KGO San Francisco off on a MM, missing WGY in the process. If they can't stay up past midnight, suggest they set the alarm clock for 4.30 a.m. PST in mid - winter. By WC standards, WGY's early morning show is different but it's also superbly professional, adding up to a worthwhile logging. 2) for many, Mexico City buries WNEC - 660. Listen to whatever's under "La Hora Nacional". If a novice has not got a loop and is blocked by mountains from single hop reception of N.Y. City then they (WNBC) aren't dominant in certain highly populated areas of California and Arizona. 3) WHAM - 1180 can also be tough if you can't null the groundwaves and ferocious splatter of California's 1170's & 1190's. If a youngster can't get Rochester and can't invest some money in gear, please suggest that 'HAM is still on MM's when KEYZ - 1190, KLOK - 1170 & KCBQ - 1170 are all off. He oughta have 'em logged by 1215 a.m. PST, hi ! (Better advise them to check for aurora the night before or brush up on their spanish if it's in, hi !)." Thanks Jay ! In the mid - west, WHAM - 1180 is usually the first N.Y. stn to fade in after sunset; quickly followed by the other 50 kw N.Y.C. stns and WGY - Shenecady. A few regional stns appear, notably WNDR - 1260, WHEC - 1460, WGR - 550, WBEN - 930 & WWRL - 1600. Going east, crossing the Mississippi River comes the first widely hrd daytimer, WADR - 1480 which is superb at sunrise during the summer. Likewise, the two gy's WYSL - 1400 & WSNY - 1240 come in with their AN NSP RR shows. Nearer the EC one can ring up a numerically high total by hearing the many daytimers at SR & SS. With just over 150 stns it is not too difficult to log 100 N.Y. stns. At the other end of the ladder there are some exceedingly rare stns. The North Country stns located in upper N.Y. state by the St. Lawrence seaway, for example, are very hard to hear. In fact, out of the 400 plus tips this column rcvd only one tip was for a north country stn. Reception miseries are under north country subsection.

Due to the large number of N.Y. stns this SoM is being divided into seven geographic areas commencing with the best heard area right down to the rarest area. This should help in giving you an idea where the stns are located.

1. New York City
2. Mohawk Valley
3. Niagara District
4. Hudson Valley
5. Long Island
6. Southern Tier
7. Champlain Valley
8. North Country

Six stns from the city have made it to Hawaii and WNBC - 660, WABC - 770, WCBS - 880, WNEW - 11350 & WQXR - 1560 have made it well, with good conditions to the WC. Occasionally two regional stns will be hrd on the west coast. They are WHOM - 1480 (spanish) and WWRL - 1600. There are 16 stns in N.Y.C. and east of the Mississippi River it is possible to hear most of them. The hardest to log is WLIB - 1190 which is blocked to the west by WOWO in Fort Wayne, Ind. Also, now that WBNX - 1380 is off AN they will be much tougher as will WNYR - 830 who has also cut down on its broadcasting time.

- 660 WNBC 30 Rockefeller Plaza, 50000 D & N, AN SP MM 0130 - 0530, NBC, contemporary MoR - pop days, phone eves and talk AN w: Long John Nebel Talk Show 0000 - 0500 Tues thru Sat. "Happy Day Stn." Carries N.Y. Rangers Hockey & N.Y. Knicks BKB. VoP MM 0000. Days as far W as Ind. Nights good to Wisc and to Minn unless there is a severe aurora in which case XERPM dominates. Sometimes to WC w: XERPM nulled or at MM sign on w: XERPM off. Occ to Wash w: KFAR or XERPM depending upon aurora. V:q. Has CM but doesn't send it with card.
- 710 WOR 1440 Broadway, 50000 D & N, NSP but appears now to be off 3rd MM at times leaving OC on, same E-W pattern day & night, MoR 0500 - 1000, 1600 - 1800, talk rest of sked w: upbeat mx weekends, AN Barry Farber talk show competes w: WMCA 2315 - 0500. Further W, is fair at SSS to Wisc before WHB fade in, rare to Minn u: KTBR and only if WHB is off. Nevertheless, w: exc cx has made it to the WC u: KBTR.
- 770 WABC 1330 Ave of the Americas, 50000 D & N, NSP, Ac, chicken RR AN - 6 with talk on MM using aux 10 kw xr 0100 - 0400. Throughout the years WABC has been in a frequency controversy with KOB. KOB began broadcasting in 1922 and was assigned to 1180 kh in 1928, sharing the frequency with KEX. When the first NARBA meeting was held in 1940 Mexico objected to KOB using 1180. Other frequencies were examined including 1200, 1210 & 1030. Eventually KOB landed on 1030. However KTWO had already applied for 1030 and KOB was on the move again and the FCC assigned KOB a special service authorization to operate on 770 kh. WABC objected but was told the SSA was temporary. WW II prevented the FCC from determining a more suitable frequency for KOB and in 1944 the two stns decided that KOB would not push for permanent use of 770 if WABC would not object to KOB's temporary permits. And since then things haven't really changed much. Oh there has been some grumblings on both sides but KOB's coverage is not affected too much by WABC's ND signal and as long as KOB is directional to protect WABC then WABC will not lose any of its listeners. And so every year KOB receives another 'temporary' permit. Receptionwise WABC is strong W to the Mississippi w: only slight traces of KOB. Usually o: KOB to Minn but only even w: KOB in Man. Usually covered by KOB in Wash but audible if KOB can be looped. JOUB may make WC reception difficult in the future. Sends a slow blue & white v:q.

Swaziland A high powered commercial station will be put on the air, about December 1, 1971. The station, known as Swazi Radio, will operate on 1376 kHz on medium wave and undetermined SW frequencies. Power will be 50 kw on BCB; 10 kw on SW. Hours will be 0500-2400 GMT. All programs will be in English, with American announcers. The type of programming will be modern American contemporary music. The transmitter site is on the western section of Swaziland near the Amsterdam border into South Africa, in an area known as Sandlane. Mark L. Wodlinger, who supplied Glenn Hauser with the above information, is head of Intermedia, Inc., which owns KBEA-1480, Kansas City., as well as FM and TV stations in the US. C.M. Stanbury states that there is apparently no connection between this station (owned by Swaziland Commercial Radio, of which the Swaziland government reportedly owns 20%) and the new relay of Trans World Radio which is also going up in Swaziland. At present the only other station in Swaziland is a 10 kw station on 881 kHz. (Information from GH and CMS)

East Germany RBI has taken its 1430 kHz outlet out of service. (EBU, via Dave Alpert)

Portugal. Emissora Nacional has activated a 1 kw station at Miranda do Doure on 629 kHz. (EBU via Dave Alpert)

Romania The 1052 kHz station at Iasi has boosted to a super-power 1000 kw; and the Bacau transmitter on the same frequency has been taken off the air. (EBU via Alpert)

Spain The following frequency changes have taken place:

Radio Castellon moved from 1412 to 1475 kHz.

Radio Castella moved from 1412 to 1570 kHz.

La Voz de Mancha moved from 1570 to 1550 kHz. (EBU via Dave Alpert)

West Germany DLF-548 kHz, now uses 800 kW day and 400 kW night; their 1538 kHz outlet runs 350 kW day and 700 kW night. (SDXK via Dave Alpert)

France The director of broadcasting has announced that three new local stations will soon go on the air; Radio France Inter Marseille; France-Inter Bordeaux; and France-Inter Pennes. Similar stations will be built at Nancy, Lyon, and Grenoble, and their power will probably be less than 10 kw. These stations will not carry nation-wide programs except for newscasts; otherwise they will operate as independent stations. (WRB) No frequencies given.

New Hebrides Radio Noumea has donated a 1 kw MW transmitter, as part of the South Pacific Aid program; operations will be established on a frequency near 1400 kHz. (WRB, Bob Padula)

Haiti 4VEH has installed a 270 foot steel tower to replace the 2 180 foot towers. This will radiate the signals of the two MW stations on 830 and 1035 kHz. This requires a special tuning network and critical tuning adjustments to isolate the two 10 kw transmitters. The transmitters are located on the edge of a bay just east of the city of Cap Haitien. (WRB)

Fiji The latest MW station to operate is Sigatoka on 1210 kHz with the English National program from 1800-1045 GMT. Rakiraki on 1320 kHz is 1500 watts. (Arthur Cushen, WRB)

India A new 100 kw transmitter has been inaugurated in Alleppy on 580 kHz. Trichur has now moved to 630 kHz. They are listed in reverse order in WRTH. The new AIR station Panji on 1540 with at least 10 kw is on the air. (WRB)

Malta Technical officials from Deutsche Welle to start tests from the relay station located at Nigret near Zurrieq. The station which the German government built will be in the hands of the Maltese government. Tests began on July 23. Malta Station, the MW station, broadcasts on 998 kHz.

New Zealand 2YX, Nelson, is a new repeater for the National program on 1150 kHz with 1 kw. Its schedule is 1800-1115. (Arthur Cushen, WRB)

Ireland Bids have been invited by the Eire government to build an all-Irish station at Connemara, in County Galway, near Derrynea. The station will be called Radio Gawltacht. All programs will be in Irish on MW. (SCDX)

Angola Cr6CD Radio Clube do Huambo, Nova Lisboa is still going very strong on the old "deleted" frequency of 1594 kHz. (WRB)
