The f/c list and CoF list would be outdated six months a year, and would have to be reprinted and revised each Nov. and May. I think most people in this country are at least partly conversant with Eastern time, due to network news. Example "The president's speech will be carried live tonight at 8:00 Eastern time". Besides, a 1300 sunrise on the west coast for November--there would seem to be a credibility gap somewhere, hi. Roger tells me MM 11/8 came up a bummer--only unneeded TAs and a possible Australian on 1550 covered by a good s/on from a 250 watt Puerto Rican! I'll take his bum MMs any time, hi. Virtually any evening I turn it on splits are audible on 655, 665, 675, 725, 765, etc. w/o the xtal filter nothing is audible but a het. Both the Sw4A and HQ-145 are about equal in sensitivity & perhaps it is slightly easier to determine the precise freq. w/the Sw4A. Veries rcvd since last report: KTXO KATZ KFRO KIOA KERB KNIN KORU(FM) KTBA(FM). KTXO is verie #500; it took 9 years of DXing to reach that mark. Not a world's record, hi! - 1110 WWLE Cornwall, 1000d, dir., Ai, good mx, some semi-cl, some C&W. R:c 1st SAT 0000 - 0015 w: TT. Fair N at SSS. New stn. V;l
- 1220 WGNV Newburgh, 5000d, dir., mostly MoR w: some SS on weekends. West, o: WGAR to E. Mich at s: on & once to Ind on snow emergency. R:c 0000 - 0015 3rd TH w: TT. V:l.
- 1230 WHUC Hudson, 1000:250, 0545 - 2205 (on longer if carrying Nets BB), MoR days, C & W nights. Early s:off prevents this stn from getting out.
- WFAS White Plains, 1000:250, AN - 6 SP MI 0100 - 0545, Mutual, upbeat MoR; jazz; R & R in 1/2 hour blocks with short nxcast every 1/2 hour. Quite fair to Ohio between 0100 - 0400. Occ N to Ont. Has a v:q but is rarely sent.

- 1310 WVIP Mt. Kisco, 5000d, dir. 55° true north w: two towers, Ai, show tunes and slow mx. All local commercials except during mx. Wall St rpts all day. Nx on the hour by Ai. Nx on the ½ hour by WVIP. All nx 0600 - 0630 from both Ai & NBC. V:l.
- 1390 WEOK Poughkeepsie, 5000d, dir., MoR. Fair N SRS. R:c 1st MM 0245 - 0300. Friendly v:q.
- 1460 WVOX New Rochelle, 500d, "Matinee Radio", "Radio stn of the people of Westchester", light adult mx. Nx .00 & .30. Many WVOX program spots. Nx is headline & wx is only one minute long. .58 local men in armed forces listed. Sends a QSL card along with a bumper sticker.
- 1490 WKNY Kingston, 1000:250, AN - 6 SP MM, CBS, MoR w: C & W on the weekends. Good N to E. Ont SSS. Occ to Ohio w: WOLF - Syracuse.
- WDLC Port Jervis, 1000:250, 0630 - 2315 (2100), emphasises local nx & community participation w: a background of MoR nx. "serving the tri-state vacationland incl Orange & Sullivan Co. N.Y., Pike Co. Pa and Sussex Co in N.J." Once to Ind when the stn stayed on past 2315 s:off to carry Phillies BB game when the team was on WC. This is the only time & way to hear this very rare stn. At this distance this is an exceptional catch as this stn does not get out. Even w: 1 kw under average cx on DX test, signal barely squeezed N to Ont, S to NJ and W to central N.Y. Only other possibility comes when their 0630 s:on coincides w: sunrise and QRM to the east (notably WTXL-W. Springfield, Mass) is lessened. The Phillies make two trips to the WC each year, try them then. Sends a letter and coverage map.

LONG ISLAND

Almost all the stns are daytimers, if not then they are on gy channels. The only exception is WGLI - 1290. Thusly stns from this area are rare but some would make for excellent DX tests i.e. WGSM a few years ago.

- 540 WLIX Islip, 250d, light MoR mx w: no titles given. Pronounced "I - slip" "Long Island radio" (how original). W; the best cx in the last 4 years made it fair up to Ont. at SSS. Used to be a non - verifier but recently has been sending out letters, probably a new CE at the stn.
- 740 WGSM Hungtinton (mail add: 900 Whitman Rd, Melville 11746), 5000d CH 1000, upbeat MoR, nx .25 .55. Signal: lkw is non-directional and used during early morning and late afternoon. (Critical Hours 2 hrs before SS, after SR) It gets out slightly better than 5kw in a few area where the dir 5 kw has nulls to protect WVCH - Chester Pa. The lkw is used to protect CBL. Widely hrd on DX TEST. V;q & CM if you request it.
- 1100 WHLI Hempstead, 10000, easy listening nx, hrd well N to Ont SSS w: WKYC nulled. V:l. Has a large FM CM.
- 1240 WGBB Freeport, 1000:250, NSP, RR. Carries N.Y. Knicks BKB. Hrd quite well on AN R & R show.
- 1290 WGLI Babylon, 5000:1000, NSP, Ae, RR. Disappointing signal. Best bet is SS before pwr drop. Ken Cole Show 0000-. V:f.

- 1370 WALK E. Patchogue (pronounced Patchogg as in Kelloggs!), 500d PSA 500, MoR & slow melodies, daytime signal carried along Conn coastline. Yankees BB days only.
- 1390 WRIV Riverhead, 1000d, MoR, to central NY during May 0600 s: on w: much WEAM. Still good N to Ont at the same time. Best when 0600 is near to sunrise.
- 1520 WTHE Mineola, 1000d, Mutual, C & W. Has reduced pwr from 50kw to 10 kw to 1 kw in past few years. V:l.
- 1580 WPAC Patchogue, 10000d CH 5000, Ai, MoR, .50 marine wx rpt, Long Island Datebook. "Have a happy day" Exc N early SS to Ont. Strong on ETs to Ind o: WCLS. Dir ant has null W. On WEND DX test, WEND made it to Hawaii whilst WPAC was not hrd despite the much greater pwr.
- 1600 WLNG Sar Harbour, 500 PSA 500, Mutual, RR. Once N to Ont SSS. Otherwise WWRL-N.Y.C. effectively covers them. Is most easterly N.Y. stn!

SOUTHERN TIER

Because of it's location in the SW part of N.Y. state many southern tier stns are hrd well at sunset in Penn and Ohio. An interesting stn to try for is WHCU in Ithaca who stays on until WWL sunset.

- 680 WINR Binghamton, 1000:500, 0530 (0800) - 0000, NBC. Once to Ind late evening. Hrd poorly on DX test and to add insult to injury they did not verify any rpts. Tough Channel.
- 730 WDOS Oneata, 1000d, MoR. Fair N to Ont SSS. Is another day-timer apt to be on AN for snow emergencies, signals of which have made it easily to Ind on an uncluttered channel.
- 870 WHCU Ithaca, 5000d and 1000 nights until sunset in WWL land, RS: Ithaca SR - La. SS, CBS, RR, good daytime sig to Ont. Fair SR & SS to Mich and once on ET to Minn w: WWL. Would do well on DX test. V:q.
- 1000 WIQT Horsheads (suburb of Elmira), 1000d, Ae, MoR. Fair N to E. Ont SSS. V:q.
- 1110 WSWW Seneca Falls, 1000d, MoR, r:c 2nd Tues or Th 0030 - 0045 w: TT. Fair SSS N to E. Ont w: phone in show. Slow v:l.
- 1240 WGVA Geneva, 1000:250, 0525 - 0100, MoR & community features, s: on is read by a YL. V: CM.
- 1290 WNBC Binghamton, 5000 D & N, 0500 (0725) - 2355 (0005), MoR & RR, "WNBC fortune jackpot." Great signal nightly N to Ont w: WKNE-N.H. to E. Ont and WHIO to other parts of Ont. Once SSS to Ind and rare to Minn due to KOIL-Omaha & WIKL-Pecora. Only hrd once in Man o: KGVO & KOIL. Sends a v:l or v:f depending upon whether you ask any questions or not.
- 1320 WHHO Hornell, 5000d PSA 500, RR & upbeat MoR. Once good S to MD. Hrd well on test to Ind. R:c 0015 - 0030 2nd Tues. Sent v:f on test but sends v:l otherwise.
- 1360 WMNS Olean, 1000d PSA 500. A very easy stn to hear on r:c and completley impossible at any other time. R:c 2nd Th & 3rd Fri 0045 - 0100 and r:c has made it easily as far W as Ind o: the usual 1360 mess of WSAI & WBAY etc. V:l & CH.
- WKOP Binghamton, 5000:500, 0530 (0730) - 0100, CBS, C & W. Naturally best at SSS before power drop. Good to E. Ont at this time as well as west to Ohio. Sends a colourful card.
- 1410 WELM Elmira, 1000:500, AN, CBS, sends most of it's signal S where in MD it is hrd well after SS w: MoR wx. "Radio I" & very proud of stn & personnel. Quick friendly v:l.

- 1410 WDOE Dunkirk, 1000:500, 0600 (0730) - 2315, Ac, ex: "teens thru adults." Serves the Dunkirk-Fredonia steel production area. Good NE along L. Ontario SSS. W, to Int'l Mts: on two min before WAZY-Lafayette s: on w: WING-Dayton QRM. V: f, v: l & CM.
- 1430 WENE Endicott, 5000 D & N, used to s: off at 0100 now appears to be NSP or has a late s: off. Seems to get out best during summer s: on when signal is momentarily as strong as WIRE-Indy as far as Mich and can still make it right to WIRE land at this time. Natch, quickly fades after 0600 but try them then. Possibly reluctant to verify.
- 1470 WTKO Ithaca, 1000d PSA 500 soon to go fulltime (yeesh!), Ai, format: "easy-listening one with two hours of rock daily for the teens after school hours. This seems to give us the best of both worlds." So says CE. "Serving southern tier counties of northern Pa and southern NY. Advertises itself as 'the biggest little stn in the nation' & 'your radio signal of friendly service.' Exc N at s: on when 0600 is at sunrise. V: l.
- 1480 WLEA Hornell, 5000d PSA 500, Ac. Again, exc N 0600 s: on. This is the case with many daytimers. At their 0600 PSA s: on, in the winter they are totally impossible as 0600 is still dark and they are swamped by many other stns. However in summer, or late spring, listen when 0600 coincides with sunrise and the stns will be much, much easier to hear. V: l.

THE CHAMPLAIN VALLEY

The scenic Champlain Valley is tucked away in the north east corner of the state isolated from the rest of the state by the Adirondack Forest preserve. Champlain stns are quite hard to hear because only two stay on as late as midnight! The other reason for difficulty is that there are only one or two DXers living up in that neck of the woods to hear them. The easiest Champlain stn to hear is WIRY, on 1340.

- 920 WIRD Lake Placid, 5000d PSA 308, Mutual. Occ SSS W to Ont. For the one or two people that can hear them they have a most attractive card showing the picturesque Valley with 'WIRD-920' punched upon it.
- 960 WEAV Plattsburg, 5000 D & N, 0530 - 0100, MoR. Beautiful null W to protect Kingston (CKLC). Beams its signal to the north & clear up in Quebec. Heard nowhere.
- 1070 WKDR Plattsburg, 5000d, Ac, MoR but has survey chart of the best of MoR, "Radio 107 serving the Champlain Valley" Good daytime groundwave in comparison to other Plattsburg stns. A SSS possibility. Weak to Mich SSS w: CHOK QRM. Has made it at sunset to Wisc. Only been on the air a couple years. Friendly v: l.
- 1250 WIPS Ticonderoga, 1000d PSA 500, MoR - community minded stn. Signal pulled greatly N-S by river. Hrd one SRS s: on to E. Ont before CBOF-Ottawa s: on. Extremely friendly stn. Sends v: l, v: q, CM & map of N.Y. state.
- 1340 WIRY Plattsburg, 1000:250, 0545 (0745) - 0000, Mutual, R & R, Signal again pulled slightly by Champlain River. Gets out well for a guy. V: CM.

This land of many coloured liscence plates sleeps during a long cold winter and then comes alive during a short hot summer during which the vacation land of the St Lawrence Seaway is flooded by tourists. Heavy on community services, especially in the winter my only recommendation regarding reception of these stations is a hearty Good Luck ! These are amongst the rarest of all eastern stns. Early sign offs and gy frequencies curtail their signals and they are unheard of at any distance. Bon chance !

- 790 WWNW Watertown, 1000 D & N, 0600 (0800) - 2300, CBS, MoR & EL, has CBS nx at .00 followed by N.Y. St ck Market rpt (after 1700) & local news at .07. Then specidic stocks that affect Watertown at .10. Weather Watch at .15 & .45 has wx for St Lawrence & Lewis Counties, then Jefferson & Oswego Co. then maritime wx for eastern Lake Ontario.
- 1050 WYBG Massena, 1000d, Ac, has Ac nx at .55 with N.Y. state nx at .00. Used to be a good RR stn until a disasterous format change three years ago, has recovered and is now a fair MoR stn. Will oft mention Cornwall (Ontario) in ads. SID: "This is the sound you know is new, the bright exciting sound of tomorrow, WYBG." Sends a letter and CM.
- 1230 WIGS Gouverneur, 1000:250, 0600 - 2300, classical nx 2000-2200, MoR 1900-2000, uptempo MoR rest of day, has Expos BB. V:l.
- 1240 WATN Watertown, 1000:250, 0545 (0800) - 0015, Mutual, MoR. 0845 Morning Devotions Mon-Sat. "Watertowns first b'cast-ing stn." As with all of the other North Country stns the signal is pulled NE along the river by the river. V:l.
- 1340 WMSA Massena, 1000:250, 0555 - 2000, Ac, MoR, V:f. No way, lads!
- 1400 WSLB Ordensburg, 1000:250, 0600 - 2200, Mutual, C & W early 0600-0800 and MoR rest of day. V:PPC.
- 1410 WOTT Watertown, 5000d to go fulltime any day now with prob. RS of 0600-1300, Ac, good days N to E. Ont. ET has been hrd in Ind c:WING-Dayton so can get out. Non-verifier.
- 1470 WPDM Potsdam, 1000d PSA 126, Ai, MoR, community callander .45. Carries Montreal Expos BB daytime only. Never gets out.

HAWAII

For listeners on the WC who are just starting and for those trying to log some N.Y. regional stns here is what REW rec'd in Hawaii. It should give WC members a good indication as to which stations have a good westward sky wave signal.

- 660 WNBC Quite often in winter
- 770 WABC Nearly daily during good N.A. cx; dominance over KOB a good guide to cx. Rarely skipping c: KOB at Hawaiian dusk.
- 880 WCBS Third from NY after WQXR & WABC. Good guide to cx.
- 1180 WHAM My first NY logging & the loudest, most consistent signal from NY although WQXR is hrd on more nights because of its higher frequency. The best EC stn there for strength.
- 1390 WFBL Weakly hrd one MM.
- 1460 WHEC Hrd and verified once on MM, at s:cn.
- 1480 WHOM Noted several times on MM s:cn, often at good strength.
- 1560 WQXR The only NYC hrd all year round, in summer sometimes still at fine strength. Best hrd when testing prior to daily s:cn. Often hrd when nothing on lower frequencies made it from the EC.
- 1600 WWRL Hrd three times on MM at good strength c:u KLAJ.

Every DXer is aware of the existence of powerful, legendary stations; stations that he should have bagged long ago but which stand tantalizingly out of his reach. What would normally be easy catches lie as spectres in his dreams, all for want of that dying blessing, a clear channel! DXers of the trans-Atlantics, in particular, have an impressive list of such stations: Rennes, Amman, Lisnagarvey, Alger, Göteborg, Skive, and more. All of these aforementioned stations broadcast on Copenhagen-Plan frequencies that coincide with our own 10 kHz separations; they are the "EVEN TAs," the "sour-grapes" story of the east coast.

But the fact remains that many of the even TAs can and do make it through, but most DXers have a negative attitude about them, passing them by in search of the more promising TA "splits". But this is wrong. After all, trans-Pacific stations make it to the West Coast on zero-ending frequencies, and so do the deep South Americans. Of course, we must qualify this by noting that TPs and SAs are heard during relatively quiet early-morning hours while TAs must charge the full blast of evening QRM. But DXers are logging and reporting the even TAs, and these stations deserve more attention than they have been getting.

There are twelve frequencies available for even-TA hunting. Most feature stations worth trying for, but a few, such as 1520 and 1570 kHz, offer very slim probabilities because of low-power operations on these channels. The following frequency-by-frequency survey will serve to analyze the potentials of the individual even TAs and offer suggestions on the best times and conditions to try for them.

620 kHz. One of the easier even TAs is the RNE outlet in the Canary Islands. Try for them on a MM starting at 0645 GMT. Reception as late as 0800 may be possible in December and January. A check on the signal strength of Agadir-935 is useful for evaluating the chances of hearing RNE-620. Challenging reception are several NSPers, such as WSUN, which discourages chances in the South. As RNE programs in Spanish, be sure not to confuse it with XENK or R. Tricolor.

A less likely possibility is RTVB in Wavre, Belgium, the FF language companion of BRTV-926. Reception as late as 0800 GMT is also possible for this one in Dec. and Jan. Check 746, 836, and 926 kHz for signal evaluation; if these three are blasting in, RTVB-620 is worth a try.

Egypt's General Programme out of Bâtra would be nice, but....

710 kHz. Were it not for WOR and its marathon schedule, one of the easiest even TAs on the band would be Rennes (pronounce it "Ron"), France. This station was recently heard by Russ Edmunds and Page Taylor, in NJ, during one of WOR's rare SPs. Check // 's on 602, 674, 791, and 836 kHz for powerful signals, then, at least, use a loop or a cardioid array to try to get rid of WOR. Reception is possible until 0800 GMT during mid season. Tallinn, Estonian SSR, is also here, but an all but impossible reception under present conditions.

800 kHz. The Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan is a country that most of us would like to add to our 100+ countries lists. Unfortunately, this is their frequency. This is also Leningrad's main outlet. More likely to be heard are the Bayerischer Rundfunk in Nürnberg and SER-800 in Madrid. Thanks to PJB, CKLW, XELO, etc., best reception of any of these stations will be noted on a trip to Europe!

890 kHz. Alger II, the FF language service, has been noted by the author and several other EC DXers during past seasons, and it should still be possible. Challenging reception are HJCE and sometimes WLS. Try between 0600 and 0700 GMT, especially if WLS is off the air. Checking the // on 1304 kHz may be worthwhile; also note 548 kHz for signal quality from that area.

980 kHz. Alger I, the Arabic service, is not as easy, what with a growing list of NSPers here, including WSIX and YVTB, but powerful signals from the area may break through. Also possible is Göteborg, Sweden, whenever the other Swedes are in very well. During Dec. and Jan., Alger I is open until 0700, Göteborg until 0800 GMT.

1070 kHz. Paris I-V is more than possible; it has been noted by the author competing with KNX on a weekday evening. Available until about 0745 GMT during mid season, check for this one whenever // Bordeaux-1205 is especially strong.

1160 kHz. Although seldom reported, Strasbourg, France, should make it through. The only challenges are KSL and a few Colombians. Check // Nice-1554 for evaluating possibilities. Reception is open as late as 0730 GMT in December and January.

1250 kHz. The new megawatter in Tripoli, L.A.R., is possible but will be difficult at best. Tentative reception has been noted by Dave Gleason in Puerto Rico. Mid-season reception is possible until about 0615 GMT, and Tripoli may even make it at sunset if conditions are right. Check // Benghazi-1124 for evaluation.

1340 kHz. Northern Ireland is a rare, and possibly doomed, DX country. The author recalls the reception of the now BBC-4 in Lisnagarvey by former NRCer Ron Schiller in Monmouth Beach, NJ. Especially good signals can and will break through the din of graveyarders along the East Coast. Check 809 and 1151 kHz to evaluate chances. DXers so equipped may use the wide null of a cardioid array to attenuate much of the inland QRM, thus opening the channel for this one, but beware of ZBM2, especially in the South. Lisnagarvey may be noted as late as 0900 GMT or beyond in mid season. Grab this country while it lasts!

1430 kHz. Skive, Denmark, is not too powerful, and its signal faces a lot of QRM in North America. Possible until 0830 GMT in December and January, check // Kalundborg-1061 and pray!

1520 & 1570 kHz. These two frequencies are losers. Both harbor low-power operations, and their reception in North America is almost hopeless. Try the above ten channels first before attempting these two!

In summary, try for the even TAs whenever their split-frequency companions show capabilities of dominating adjacent domestics. Check the parallel (//) of the particular station you seek for information on signal strength and programming. Whatever you do, don't pass them by. We understand that this will be a very good year for grapes, especially in Rennes, Paris, and Strasbourg, so give the even TAs a hearty try!

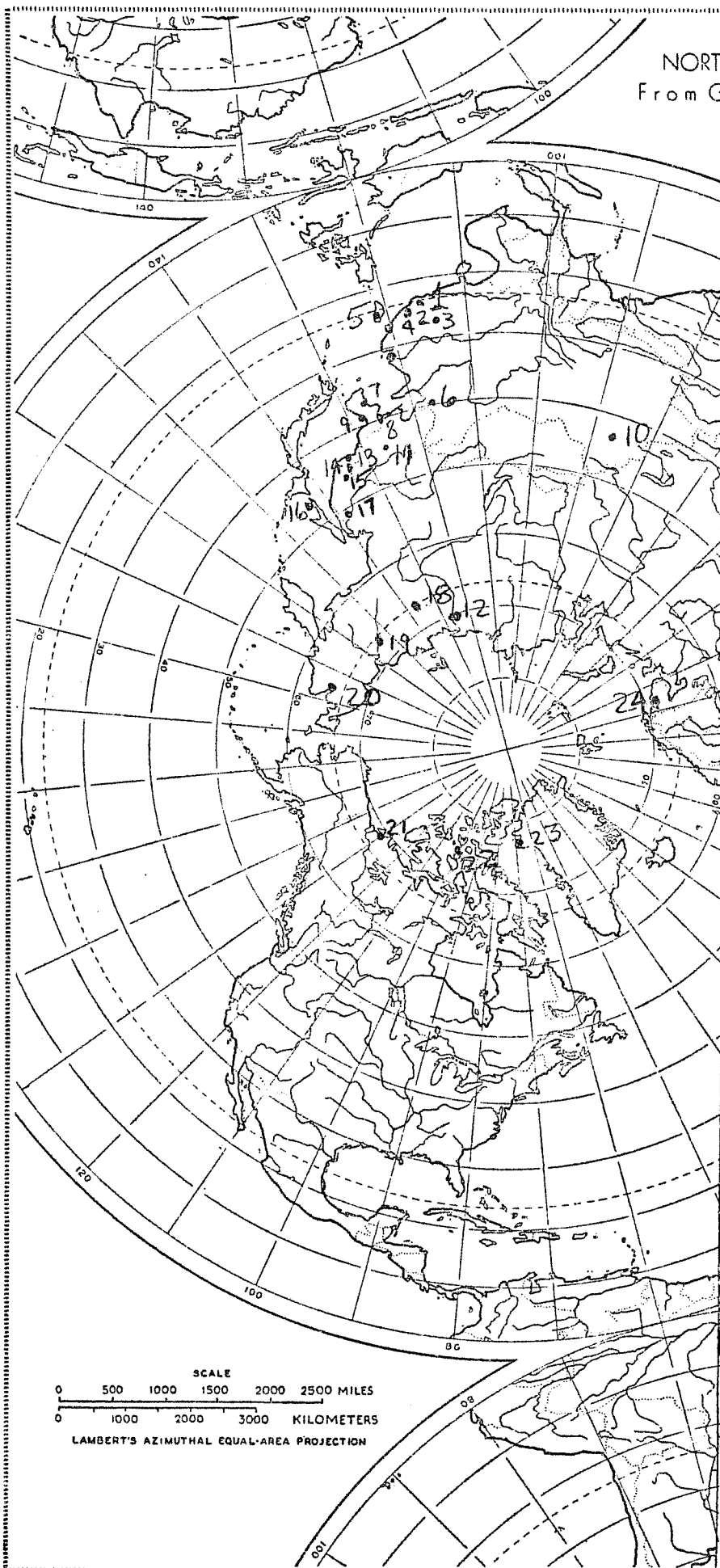

- 783 CMJN? Cuba, Camaguey. Is this the one of Castro's boys here? Familiar "Territorio libre de America" ID heard 0201 11/3 with WBBM looped. (DR,M)
- 785a CMJD Cuba, Holguin, another drifter, and strong! "Radio Rebelde". Nominally on 780. Easy. (QKB,E) (Probably Dave's Cban/ Ed)
- 810 XEFW Mexico, Tampico in with good signals with KCMO looped, with call ID 0145 11/6; mentioned was operating on "canal internacional". (DR,M)

+Heard SS here over/under WHAS 0340-0400 11/6 with lots of R. Libertad IDs. "Ah hah! Panama!" was my reaction. Then I played back the tape and found IDs as "R. Now stuck with spiral loop, far too little gain for use with R390A on TAs. LW, about 150' and poorly built is not a lot better.

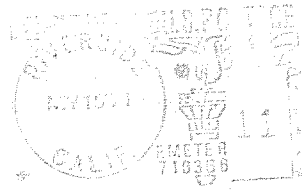
