No Election Stencils from Dave Prather!! With the ballots stuffed, the envelopes metered and John Clements soon to be on his way for SM DXing, the stencils for the election didn't show up at the last minute. There is no alternative but to include the ballot card and wait until next issue for the election stencils. Please SAVE YOUR BALLOT CARD. -DEE

Forgot to mention in my last rpt that Oster and I logged YSS-655, XETNT-650, and YNX-750. Last DX sessions here have included a second reception of BBC on 1214, KUAI-720, KCIN-1590, KTEL-1590, KGST-1600, KASH-1600, KUUU-1590, TIGM on 1225, WBTS-1480 (r/c), HJDB-990, Chongjin-635 (relog), Peking-645, PJA6-925, YVNN-940, Vladivostok-1376, JOOR-1210, KLOU-1580, Khabarovsk-1529, and Huehot, Inner Mongolia on 675. Two unid receptions have also been made. They are on 1465 kHz, 11/15 0830-0930 GMT appx, a Latin running a request program of Andean music; on 860 kHz, 11/15 1000z, six pips floated thru the QRM caused by duo of KONO and a KABL-960 spur. The six piper was hrd while looking for the sign-on of WDMG, which never transpired in my rx. The list of pips provided by Art Peterson says that Malaysia uses these on the half hour (which could mean either :00 and :30, or :30 only), and that New Zealand uses them on the hour. Listed on 860 are two 10kw 6-pippers, 1YZ and Malaysia. At 1030z, I checked and hrd nothing. Further check at 1100z was made useless by all the domestic QRM, which now consisted of a KABL-960 spur, KONO, and the combined sign-ons of KOAM (Kansas) and CJBC (Ontario). WRTH includes information on AM-FM-TV stations worldwide though its U.S. listings are rather limited at best. For foreign BCB DX and for SWBC DX, WRTH is a must. Among the interesting items listed by country are time conversions (compared to GMT), principal language(s), networks, station addresses, verification policies, interval signals, telephone #'s and cable addresses, publications issued, and so on. There are also helpful listings by frequency of both long/medium wave and short wave stations by continental area. SWBC stn DX programs are listed in one guide. Another listing is of news in English. There are maps and time table/time map features. Standard freq. and time signals are listed. There is a list of DX Clubs, though not notably accurate. All of this information is available at a rock-bottom price through IRCA. Send your order now. Repeating, final deadline is December 31, 1971, in Denver. -DEE

CKUA-580 John Oldfield reports that it is likely CKUA's license will not be renewed when it expires in March, 1972. CKUA is owned by the University of Alberta and the federal government of Canada does not wish to have stns operated by local or provincial governments. CKUA was given a non-commercial license in 1927. Operation is by Alberta Government Telephone; because the Quebec government desires to operate stations, the CRTC would prefer to not renew CKUA's license rather than get involved in requests from Quebec. The above by phone from John.

CFFB-1200 NOW ON 1210 Flash - CFFB is now in operation on 1210. The Manager, in a letter to John Oldfield, stated the station has been operating on 1210 unofficially since the early part of the summer. The official grant came Nov. 1, 1971. This 250w stn moved to avoid interference to marine broadcasts/transmissions operating around that freq. Because of the great importance of the marine freq's in that area and because of the short period during which shipping is done in the Hudson Bay (2 months a year), the rush change was made to accommodate the shipping season. At other times of the year, the Hudson Bay is frozen over. This also by phone from John Oldfield from info in the letter to John.

Swan Islands Now Belong to Honduras Clippings from the 11/22 Seattle Times and the 11/23 New York Times from Mike Worst and Tom Sundstrom relate that the Swan Islands, formerly home of Radio Swan and Radio Americas, have been ceded to Honduras. While Swan Island was well known to practically every BCB and SWBC DXer until Radio Americas (formerly Radio Swan) left the air, the news clippings devoted almost no space to same. The New York Times noted, "for a time, he (Sumner Smith, Lincoln, Mass.) also got some rent out of a radio station, said to be financed by the CIA, which broadcast anti-Communist messages to Cuba during the 1960's."

KTI-931 650 kHz By phone, Steve Dildine, new member in Arlington, Va., reports that this stn has been widely heard operating with lkw ND on 650. The station is used for antenna pattern studies. They broadcast open carrier and IDs every 30 minutes. If you hear this unusual station, reception reports can be sent to: Baltimore Radio Show, Inc., WFBR, 13 E. 20th St., Baltimore, Maryland 21218. It is suggested you include a prepared card; the stn will naturally not issue QSL cards and the quantity of reports would probably preclude letters. Steve heard them at 1130 EST on 12/1/71. It is not known how long they will remain on the air.

Geomagnetic Indices Please note that geomag indices published by Father Jack are  $A_{Fr}$  values (Fredericksburg, Maryland); when pub. adds an entire week of geomag values, they are also  $A_{Fr}$  as received by both of us in the mail. Those quoted from WWV, however, are  $A_{Bo}$  (Boulder, Colorado) values taken from the air. They do not usually match but will be similar. If you would like to receive the geomag indices by air mail from the Natl Bureau of Standards, drop a postcard to DEE and it will be taken care of promptly. -DEE

- 830 ... China, Luta noted here briefly 1440 when JOBB faded out. Female in shrill talks. Heard for 3-4 minutes until JOBB came in. 11/18. (PP,W)
- 840 ... China, Harbin in weakly in CC at around 1230 on 11/21, no sign of the usual JJ. (GWE,W)
- 844 VSZ1 Gilbert and Ellice Islands, Tarawa good tentative on car radio while driving through Astoria! 0905-0915 11/15. Oriental music with girl singer (like in movie "MASH") and female announcer. Pat Martin was hearing this easily earlier. I was less patient and it was gone later when I tuned back for an ID, so will try again. (BH,W)
- 860 ... TP. When I say "on ½ hour" I mean ½ hour only. The reason for this is that Malaysia's time zone is GMT +7½ hours, so an IS on our ½ hour is on their hour. Same is true of Singapore and a number of other countries. 860 was definitely NZ and could not have been Malaysia. (AWP,W)
- 870 KAIM Hawaii, Honolulu tentatively the long symphonic SSB alone and weak 1003 11/15, carrier cut right after SSB. What do I need another Hawaiian for anyway, Hi? (BH,W)  
 JOGB Japan, Kumamoto, NHK2 a relog on this new frequency, thanks to new shuffle, 0955 11/1. (AWP,W)
- 877 ... North Korea, Wonsan, non-stop female yakking 1011-1020, looping NW, never heard before but the resemblance to 655 was unmistakable. Station remained in as late as 1325 mainly as a carrier. For a while, right after 1100 GMT, a LA signal on 875 caused a het, but the LA not noted after about 1220. Also heard this AM, TP carriers on 725, 735, 785. (GM,M)  
 +The wandering North Korean noted on 876.4m with yelling and shrieking at 1451 11/12. Heard daily in the past week around 1200-1500 sunrise. (PP,W)
- 890 ??? Re JM' report. Am I in the dark about a frequency change, or did somebody goof? I thought 3LO was on 770 and 5AN was the one on 890? (BP,W)
- 967 HLSA South Korea, Seoul, Oriental talk noted through 950/970/1000 slop 1440 11/31. (BP,W) (Two questions, Bruce--has anyone definitely gotten word that this is HLSA? and isn't 11/31 the date that CHOAX holds their annual frequency test? Ed)

- 970 ??? UnID Station in JJ heard over KOOK, Billings, for about ten minutes at 1107-1117 11/14. Kqrea back on frequency? New JJ station? Didn't get ID. (PP,W)
- 1010 ... China, Fukien in weakly in CC at around 1130 11/21/ (GWE,W)
- 1170 JOUK Japan, Akita NHK1 new frequency heard 1200 11/1 with NHK pips. (AWP,W)
- ??? UNID, possibly JJ, and if so, probably KOHO, around 1145 under KLOK.(BH,W)
- 1178 VOA Ryukyu Islands, Okinawa just not there on DX test 11/14. Tried from 1118 on, heard possible carrier and maybe a TT but was still there afterwards. My receiver isn't accurate enough so it could have been 1180, and could have been my imagination! On 11/15 it would have been easy. (Naturally I didn't try anything above 900 on the 15th.) (BH,W)
- +Pathetic signal on DX 11/14. Weak audio around 1105 with lots of KAYO slop. Completely inaudible during DX 11/21. (BP,W)
- +NRC Test did not show. VOA came on at regular 1100 s/on in assumed CC; very poor 1100-1130 tune out 11/14. (DEE,W)
- 1210 JOOR Japan, Osaka, Mainichi BC here at 1445 11/13. Good morning for JJ openings Talks. (PP,W)
- 1440 JOWF Japan, Sapporo, Sapporo Televi Hosu, on new frequency, heard 1005 11/1. (AWP,W)
- 1475 ??? Asiatic RSFSR. Has anyone heard this one so far this season? Nobody in Seattle has, and with conditions the way they've been, and the signal they've had in past seasons they should be coming in like gangbusters. Maybe they've moved to 1529? (BP,W)
- 1526 ??? UnID UFO here; either China or Russia here fair in CC with opera 1520, CC talk by woman 1525, then piano music, more talk until 1530 when KFBK slop wiped them out, on 11/13. Also heard at 1430 with IS vaguely resembling Kremlin chimes with a few notes changed or missing. Frequency was determined by comparing its logging scale reading with those of KYXI and KFBK but I could be off slightly. I'll just have to keep trying, I guess. (BP,W) (A Chinese has been reported on 1537.Ed)
- 1529 ... Asiatic RSFSR, Radio Moscow still going strong in Chinese 1215 11/1. (AWP,W)
- Overlooked earlier:
- 1214 ??? UnIDed tone 3 nights in a row, 0525-0528. Seems that something signs on then but surely not BBC? The quantity of stations on this TA frequency suggests that Albania and Tallinn are among the visitors to Riverside. (DEE,W)
- 656 ... Asiatic RSFSR, Verkhoyansk, Radio Moscow once more heard with Kremlin Bells under North Korea-655 at 1200 11/15. (AWP,W)

England Radio I and II operate 0530-0202. They are parallel from 0530-0700, and 1903-0202; rest of the time they have separate programming. Radio III operates 0700-2335; Radio IV from 0625-2348. Information from an Irish newspaper dated 9/14. (Bruce Portzer)

Radio Northsea International British correspondent Desmond J. Colling reports that RNI has bought the supply tender "Offshore I"; and their own tender, Mebo I (which in Collings' opinion is much too big to act as a tender--it is a sizeable ex-coaster) is being refitted under a tight security screen. Questions to the powers that be--are we going to get an up-to-date list of members shortly? The last one I have is over a year old. Are we going to get a copy of the Constitution and Revised Bylaws? Maybe all that is needed for such copies is a typist to copy them. If so, maybe you (now I'm speaking to you members) might volunteer to get this out.
