My location is about 12 airline miles from the KOA transmitter, but I have found that when I null carefully, I can hear VSZ1, Tarawa at 844, and the separation is not extremely difficult. In fact, with KOA nulled, the looping is NE-SW, and I get more interference on Tarawa from WHAS than from our 50kw local. The loop I am using is a much-modified version of the Gordon Nelson "Special", but no amplifier, no tilting feature. I also converted his 35 by 35 inch square into a 47½ by 22½ inch rectangle, mounted on a wooden frame, installed in a casement window, and turning on a fixed axis at top and bottom. The rigid axis is vital to precise nulling, and when I null KOA carefully enough, then I can hear background noise and static come into its reception. My tank coil is 8 turns of ordinary Radio Shack bare antenna wire, one-half inch spacing, but I accepted his 14-gauge insulated wire for the link coil. Also using the Nelson-prescribed variable capacitor, Q-gain control and switch. Have decided I am well-satisfied. (With results like that, I'd be satisfied too. The above two reports have been in my possession over a month, but were accidentally placed in the wrong basket. My sincere apologies to Gene and Bill for the oversight and delay. -LDB)

DR. RICHARD E. WOOD - Dept. of Foreign Languages - L.S.U. - Baton Rouge, La. 70803

Can't agree with Tom Sundstrom's suggestion (ECDXF 12/4) that each section be in "its own" local time. The ECDXR, MWDXR, & WCDXR have no "own local" time, as all cover more than one time zone; e.g. Ariz., Cal., Alas., in WCDXR. When I was in Hawaii, converting to the (there irrelevant) ELT was bad enough, when reporting to WC sections; adding 8 hours some of the year, and 7 hours the rest, to my GMT logs, would have been worse. Internationally, let me emphasize what others have said, that the number of pips on the hour or half-hour, while varying from country to country, never has any intrinsic significance and does not indicate any specific hour. Foreign DX results reported recently are admirable; my current DX activity, however, is chiefly in FM.

Everyone be sure and vote, right now while you're thinking about it, on the proposals presented in the 12/11 DXM. Betram Podall: in answer to your questions of the Nov. 27 EC DXF I can say (1) any kind of metal wire can be used for LW antennas (however, bare steel, iron, and tan wire will rust), and (2) Any diameter will do, just as long as the wire can stand-up to wind & weather (and you don't use the ant for xmitting). Also, (3), the wire can be insulated, but bare wire can be used just as well for receiving a signal. I would suggest that you get some Copperweld wire from BURSTEIN-APPLEBEE. Check their 1972 calalog (No. 72) on page 156. Stock nos. 2N44 thru 2N47 for the size and amount you want. When selecting, also consider the weight the antenna will exert on the supports (the longer the antenna, the heavier). 73

ARE SUPER POWERED KMTRS CHANGING THE IONOSPHERE???

-C.M. Stanbury II-

From a site near Platteville, Colorado the U.S. Dept. of Commerce's Institute for Telecommunications Sciences is operating a 100 million watt short wave beam which directs energy vertically toward the ionosphere. This modifies the electrical energy of ions in an egg shaped area 50 to 100 miles long, extending along lines of the earth's magnetic field and centered at a height of nearly 200 miles. This technique causes effects which are similar to those created naturally by solar magnetic storms and by accus-tical waves generated from giant tropospheric storms.

Among other objectives it is hoped that the new facility will "provide a method for predicting the effects produced in the upper atmosphere by future high-powered transmitters, and probably permit an estimate of the effects being caused now by the aggregate of all radio transmitters, each of which by itself creates an effect too small to be observed".

In operation only about a year, some of the experimental results were entirely unexpected. The amount of radio energy which would be reflected by the ionosphere was expected to increase. Instead, it rapidly decreased to about a hundredth of the amount reflected before it was illuminated with the high-power transmitter. Another major surprise was the artificial creation of an occasionally occurring natural phenomena - "Spread F". The F region is of course the uppermost portion of the ionosphere. Spread F can have a strong and deleterious effect on some types of radio transmissions.

The Panasonic RF-759 AM/FM Portable
By George B. Sherman

The Panasonic RF-759 AM/FM portable is one receiver that can give you good DX on both bands for a very reasonable price. The sensitivity and selectivity are about equal to the TRF in side by side tests on the AM band. The only complaint I have is a few SW (no MW) spurs the RF-759 gets that could block the reception of very weak AM signals. It does, however, have much better DX capabilities than most portables. It can pull in groundwave up to 400 miles using the built-in antenna. I think perhaps the sensitivity is slightly better than the TRF and the selectivity is slightly worse. Still it is selective enough to receive stations on most frequencies adjacent to locals. A disadvantage is that the back must be screwed off to connect an external antenna, whereas the TRF snaps open easily and quickly. The FM on the RF-759 is quite sensitive with fairly good selectivity. Stations up to 175 miles are audible with the band dead. The radio features a dial light and earphone so you can DX at night without disturbing others. The RF-759 is powered by 4 C cells or the built-in AC cord. The manufacturers suggest list price is \$59.95, but should be available for \$49.95 or less. Check the yellow pages under radios for your nearest Panasonic dealer. If you are an FM and AM DXer who can't afford expensive stereo and communications receivers, this may be what you are looking for.
