Hawaii -- Credo Bisquera

I already wrote Dave Christensen concerning KAHU-940, but I will explain it to the general membership. KAHU is country-western music, but on Sunday evenings (local time) various language programs are beamed, particularly Filipino until 10:00 PM and Samoan from 10:00 to 11:00 PM (0800-0900 GMT). Most of the stations have Filipino or Japanese daily from 5:00-6:00 AM (1500-1600 GMT) and on Saturday and Sunday evenings, the programming is usually Filipino, Japanese, and Samoan. The Hawaiian language itself is "dead" but efforts by University of Hawaii students are trying to revive it on a "talk" show on station KCCN ("the Hawaiian station")

Philippines -- C. Alan Taylor

FEBC says they are planning a 250 kilowatt medium wave cutlet in the Philippines, according to a pamphlet received from FEBC, Whittier, Calif. They probably will use the cld KSBU-1360 transmitter. No information was given on frequency or location, but I would surmise they will use Ilocos region (NW Luzon Island) due to geographical proximity to People's Republic of China, and availability of cheap electrical power.

Trucial States -- C.M. Stanbury II

Don Jensen has advised me as follows: According to the BBC MS, both the Dubai and the Abu Dhabi stations annuunced in Arabic, beginning with early December of last year, 'Sawt al-Imarat al-Arabiyah al-Muttahidah'. This ID was monitored by BBC MS on both stations. BBC MS translates this as 'The Voice of the United Arab Emirates'. I haven't any recent BBC MS information on what Arabic ID is being used by the two stations so I have no way of knowing whether the above situation has changed. Of course, QSLs bearing the English words 'Dubai Broadcasting Station' were received during the period in which, according to BBC MS, the station's Arabic ID was 'The Voice of the United Arab Emirates'. 'The above does demonstrate just how complicated broadcasting has become on a global scale.

Verifications--Joe Markewicz

I don't think that the verie policy of some stations is that different for their SW station. I recently got a verie from HJKJ-6160 kHz, which has a sister station on 610 kHz. In just two weeks I got a nice letter from their Vice-Presidente who enclosed a RCN Emisora Nueva Granada-610, Bogota, pennant. I just sent some mint aereo stamps with the report. The 6160 station is strong here nights and it could be a good parallel to 610 (too much KGGM, WDAP, KDAL here, hi) for some, so the verie policy of their SW station is a good indication of what to expect from their AMstation.

Then there's TGN-730. In about a month and a half I received a form letter from the Recording Engineer which verifies TGN, TGNA, and TGNB. Also enclosed were some nice QSL cards for their stations. TGN operates with 1/4 wave vertical antenna. Their transmitter is 15 kilometers from Guatemala City in a town called Petapa. Mint Guatemalan aereo stamps were sent with the report.

Radic Inconfidencia with an AM station on 880 from Belo Horizonte, Brazil, and a SW station on 6000 verified in over a month with a form-letter in PP and EE, signed by Diretor do S.R.D. Mint Brazilian airmail stamps were sent with the report but were not used.

A lot of people think I have a special way of getting veries from Cuba. So far quite a few people have written me asking me how I do it. First of all, I don't know any Spanish, but the IRCA report forms and the SS report form from Radio Nederland are a great help. Anyway I try to make my reports as detailed as possible and I do not send IRCs or stamps because they are government stations. Also the Cubans are they easiest Spanish stations to report, because you know when to expect a "La Voz de Cuba" or "Territorio libre del America" ID, etc., but I get lost on any other commercial Spanish stations where they talk so fast and have so many spots. This is where the Latin American Commercials book, put together by some Swedish DXers comes in handy. I got mine last spring and Ron Schatz had a review about this book in DX News not too long ago. One of these days I'm going to send a report to Cuba written in French and not in Spanish for no other reason to see what kind ofresponse I would get.

IRCA Foreign Log

The new IRCA Foreign Log has been selling well since it went on sale two weeks ago. As we get into the new season, this is your opportunity to see what stations have been heard. Especially if you're planning on entering either the GOATBPSLC or the IRCA Foreign Contest, you need the IRCA Foreign Log to help you pick out likely frequencies and times. Just send your check or money order (no cash please) made out to IRCA, to Father Jack Pejza, 3266 Nutmeg St., San Diego, Calif. 92104. IRCA members pay only \$2.75 for this 124 page book; others will pay \$3.25. John Oldfield called from Edmonton the other night to say how valuable he thought the Log was. You also will think so, when you get your copy.

There are three time slots on each of the evenings of the contest. You can log a station in each of the three time slots, if possible. Your entry in the contest will consist of your best five blocks, out of the fifteen possible blocks.

The time blocks are 0800-0930 GMT, 1000-1130 GMT, and 1300-1430 GMT.

Frequencies and dates are as follows:

October 2, 1972 825-845 kHz. October 9, 1972 750-770 kHz.

October 15, 1972 1020-1040 kHz. (Sunday morning)

October 23, 1972 640-660 kHz October 30, 1972 870-890 kHz.

Remember, to have your entries count, you must report them either to DXWW or to NRC's IDXD. Good luck!

I think one point of clarification is needed about Greenwich Mean Time. I have noticed conflicts in dates and times of reports, particularly on Monday morning reports. Midnight GMT, the beginning of the new day, occurs early Sunday evening here in North America. During Daylight Time, 0000 GMT occurs at 2000 EDT, 1900 CDT, 1800 MDT and 1700 PDT. During the winter 0000 GMT is at 1900 EST, 1800 CST, 1700 MST, and 1600 PST. A report submitted for a reception after that time should bear! the date of the day GMT. For instance, suppose it's Sunday evening attyour location on the East Coast, let's say Sunday, October 15, at 2100 EDT. When you report that station to DXWW, you have to convert the time to GMT, first of all, namely 0100 GMT. But in reporting it, you must also change the day to 10/16, since that is what it is as far as GMT is concerned. The time period which is involved is between midnight GMT and your local midnight. If you just remember that when you change your time to GMT, if the GMT time is past 0000, then you have to also change the date to the next day, you'll be all right. If you still are confused, submit your report in your local time and date, with that notation, and I will convert to the correct GMT time and date.

CPC Results and Flash Tips Alan Merriman, Fairfax, Virginia, reports no luck on KGHO-1560 DX 9/25. DX. On 10/9, Alan says TA cx were excellent with TA's everywhere. +++ Bob Neal, Forbestown, CA, reports not luck with WIZM-1410; only CKVN and KERN 0258-0345 using an SPR-4 and 120' LW. +++ Bill Feidt, Laurel, MD, reports WPHM-1380 IRCA Test in surprisingly well 0305-0325. Hawaii -- Credo Bisquera

I already wrote Dave Christensen concerning KAHU-940, but I will explain it to the general membership. KAHU is country-western music, but on Sunday evenings (local time) various language programs are beamed, particularly Filipino until 10:00 PM and Samoan from 10:00 to 11:00 PM (0800-0900 GMT). Most of the stations have Filipino or Japanese daily from 5:00-6:00 AM (1500-1600 GMT) and on Saturday and Sunday evenings, the programming is usually Filipino, Japanese, and Samoan. The Hawaiian language itself is "dead" but efforts by University of Hawaii students are trying to revive it on a "talk" show on station KCCN ("the Hawaiian station")

Philippines -- C. Alan Taylor

FEBC says they are planning a 250 kilowatt medium wave cutlet in the Philippines, according to a pamphlet received from FEBC, Whittier, Calif. They probably will use the old KSBU-1360 transmitter. No information was given on frequency or location, but I would surmise they will use Ilocos region (NW Luzon Island) due to geographical proximity to People's Republic of China, and availability of cheap electrical power.

Trucial States -- C.M. Stanbury II

Don Jensen has advised me as follows: According to the BBC MS, both the Dubai and the Abu Dhabi stations announced in Arabic, beginning with early December of last year, 'Sawt al-Imarat al-Arabiyah al-Muttahidah'. This ID was monitored by BBC MS on both stations. BBC MS translates this as 'The Voice of the United Arab Emirates'. I haven't any recent BBC MS information on what Arabic ID is being used by the two stations so I have no way of knowing whether the above situation has changed. Of course, QSLs bearing the English words 'Dubai Broadcasting Station' were received during the period in which, according to BBC MS, the station's Arabic ID was 'The Voice of the United Arab Emirates'. The above does demonstrate just how complicated broadcasting has become on a global scale.

Verifications--Joe Markewicz

I don't think that the verie policy of some stations is that different for their SW station. I recently got a verie from HJKJ-6160 kHz, which has a sister station on 610 kHz. In just two weeks I got a nice letter from their Vice-Presidente who enclosed a RCN Emisora Nueva Granada-610, Bogota, pennant. I just sent some mint aereo stamps with the report. The 6160 station is strong here nights and it could be a good parallel to 610 (too much KGGM, WDAP, KDAL here, hi) for some, so the verie policy of their SW station is a good indication of what to expect from their AMstation.

Then there's TGN-730. In about a month and a half I received a form letter from the Recording Engineer which verifies TGN, TGNA, and TGNB. Also enclosed were some nice QSL cards for their stations. TGN operates with 1/4 wave vertical antenna. Their transmitter is 15 kilometers from Guatemala City in a town called Petapa. Mint Guatemalan aereo stamps were sent with the report.

Radic Inconfidencia with an AM station on 880 from Belo Horizonte, Brazil, and a SW station on 6000 verified in over a month with a form-letter in PP and EE, signed by Diretor do S.R.D. Mint Brazilian airmail stamps were sent with the report but were not used.

A lot of people think I have a special way of getting veries from Cuba. So far quite a few people have written me asking me how I do it. First of all, I don't know any Spanish, but the IRCA report forms and the SS report form from Radio Nederland are a great help. Anyway I try to make my reports as detailed as possible and I do not send IRCs or stamps because they are government stations. Also the Cubans are they easiest Spanish stations to report, because you know when to expect a "La Voz de Cuba" or "Territorio libre del America" ID, etc., but I get lost on any other commercial Spanish stations where they talk so fast and have so many spots. This is where the Latin American Commercials book, put together by some Swedish DXers comes in handy. I got mine last spring and Ron Schatz had a review about this book in DX News not too long ago. One of these days I'm going to send a report to Cuba written in French and not in Spanish for no other reason to see what kind ofresponse I would get.

IRCA Foreign Log has been selling well since it went on sale two weeks ago. As we get into the new season, this is your opportunity to see what stations have been heard. Especially if you're planning on entering either the GOATBPSLC or the IRCA Foreign Contest, you need the IRCA Foreign Log to help you pick out likely frequencies and times. I think one point of clarification is needed about Greenwich Mean Time. I have noticed conflicts in dates and times of reports, particularly on Monday morning reports. Midnight GMT, the beginning of the new day, occurs early Sunday evening here in North America. During Daylight Time, 0000 GMT occurs at 2000 EDT, 1900 CDT, 1800 MDT and 1700 PDT. During the winter 0000 GMT is at 1900 EST, 1800 CST, 1700 MST, and 1600 PST. A report submitted for a reception after that time should bear! the date of the day GMT. For instance, suppose it's Sunday evening at your location on the East Coast, let's say Sunday, October 15, at 2100 EDT. When you report that station to DXWW, you have to convert the time to GMT, first of all, namely 0100 GMT. But in reporting it, you must also change the day to 10/16, since that is what it is as far as GMT is concerned. The time period which is involved is between midnight GMT and your local midnight. If you just remember that when you change your time to GMT, if the GMT time is past 0000, then you have to also change the date to the next day, you'll be all right. If you still are confused, submit your report in your local time and date, with that notation, and I will convert to the correct GMT time and date.

CPC Results and Flash Tips Alan Merriman, Fairfax, Virginia, reports no luck on KGHO-1560 DX 9/25. DX. On 10/9, Alan says TA cx were excellent with TA's everywhere. +++ Bob Neal, Forbestown, CA, reports not luck with WIZM-1410; only CKVN and KERN 0258-0345 using an SPR-4 and 120' LW. +++ Bill Feidt, Laurel, MD, reports WPHM-1380 IRCA Test in surprisingly well 0305-0325. No luck on WVOV or KWOA. +++ Bill Hardy, Aberdeen, WA, has the following regarding KGHO DX: "KGHO was on 0302-0502 EDT. Pgm was all mx, mostly loud rr, with TDs practically every record. Tones not used. Phone calls from John Oldfield, Edmonton, reporting fair sig, louder than KPMC Bakersfield had been; Patrick Martin, Warrenton, OR, saying it was weak - probably between ground and sky wave zones; and an NRCer in Ohio asking if it was on. KPMC popped on at 0349 w/brief TD per Pat Martin." (over)

TA conditions were good for a couple of days per tip from Gene Martin on 10/5 AM GMT; carriers on 1205 and 1214 that AM; 10/6 had some audio and by 10/7, BBC-1214 had audio as good as anything hrd last season on the R-390A and this with just an RBM-3. The Sanserino loop made all the difference. By 10/8 AM GMT, vy weak carrier was about the only thing and cx have not improved here in CA since. +++ Tom Sundstrom reported good TA cx on Mon. 10/2 with Lille-1376 at S9+5. No luck on KGHO 9/25. KWOA and WVOV sked for 10/9, not hrd. WPHM-1380 was heard, however thru WBNX.
