Commentary

Note that the Board of Directors has failed to reconfirm the appointment of two editors (5.1-116 and 5.1-121). EDXR is already vacant due to Sheldon's resignation shortly after the September Board letter was mailed. See below for details on the vacant Questions and Answers Editorship.

Proposals Going Before the Board of Directors in January 1973

5. -3 Membership of IRCA shall be open only to individual radio hobbyists. It shall in principle not be open to governmental agencies and commercial firms. However, at the discretion of the Board of Directors and by vote thereof, a commercial non-hobbyist subscription rate equivalent to 4 (four) times the individual membership dues at the appropriate mail category, without voting or other membership rights, may be offered such agencies and firms. Submitted 7 September 1972 by Dr. Richard E. Wood.

Comment on Above: Dr. Wood's proposal, a long-standing point of view on his part, was drawn into the open by 5.1-109 (see last page). Larry Godwin's proposal was to "tide the FBIS over" until January, when the government could put the expenditure on the books (obviously some bureaucratic bookkeeping procedure). Dr. Wood feels that the CIA has no place in hobby ranks and that they should "pay through the nose" for "the fruits of our volunteer labors". Dr. Wood opposes sending them DX Monitors at any price, though perhaps the above would be an alternative. Also, Dr. Wood challenges the "special subscription" that FBIS is receiving, questioning the constitutional basis for it. If you have a viewpoint on this matter, write it into a Forum report and or send it to me for distribution to the Board in our monthly letter.

Reference Works

For the benefit of newcomers to foreign DXing, here is a list of the most common and useful reference books and lists available. Most of these are used widely by experienced foreign DXers, alone or in combination, since any listing of radio stations is bound to be somewhat inaccurate by the time it is printed. From time to time both IRCA and NRC have current information on stations, updating information in printed works.

World Radio-TV Handbook (WRTH), one book that every foreign DXer should definitely have. Published annually by World Radio-TV Handbook, Denmark. Lists all radio (LW, BCB, SW) and TV stations of the world (except certain low power stations). Can be purchased at a discount through IRCA. Also handled by Gilfer Associates. Lists call, frequency, powers, schedules, slogans, and addresses.

Broadcasting Stations of the World (FBIS), published about every two years by Foreign Broadcast Information Service, a branch of the CIA. Can be purchased through the U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. Comes in 4 parts, two of which are of interest to BCB DXers. Part I, AM Broadcasting Stations according to countries; Part II, AM Broadcasting Stations according to frequency. Lists most stations outside of the U.S.; more accurate for areas in which the CIA has an interest. Lists location, call, power, frequency and owner/operator. Sells for about \$2 a volume.

NRC Latin America Log, published by the National Radio Club, P.O. Box 99, Cambridge, Mass. 02138. Lists all stations in Central and South America by calls, frequency, power, slogan, and addresses, with some schedules. Also has articles on LA DXing. Edited by Howard Fountain. I don't know whether it is still available.

North American Radio-TV Station Guide (VJ), by Vane A. Jones, published by Howard W. Sams and Co. Latest edition cost \$3.95. Primarily a domestic log, but also lists stations in Mexico and Caribbean, although these lists must be checked against other lists such as the RFS Mexican and Cuban lists. Lists frequencies, calls, locations, and powers.

IRCA Foreign Log edited by Father Jack Pejza, lists all stations reported to IRCA during the past season by region and frequencies, with calls, locations, slogans, times of reception, and program details. Costs \$2.75 to IRCA members if ordered directly from FJP; \$3.25 to others. Also available from Gilfer Associates.

NRC TA Log, edited by Page Taylor and Russ Edmunds. Brand new, this is a Xeroxed list of all European and African stations with powers over 1 kw, by frequency, location, power, network, schedule, and exact measured frequency. Costs \$2. Can be obtained from Russ Edmunds, P.O. Box 946, Wayne, N. J.

There probably are other references which could be listed. Wireless World magazine has a listing, I believe. These, however, are the most common and the most useful.

Radio Caroline Returns--- London Record Mirror, Sept. 16 and 30th.

Radio Caroline will be back in business shortly. The old Caroline South ship, Mi Amigo, was taken from a Dutch harbour to a position about half a mile north of the existing pirate ships, Radio Northsea International and Radio Veronica. The ship is now owned by a company calling itself the Bell Commercial Broadcasting Company, registered in Amsterdam. At the moment the ship is being fitted out in preparation to begin broadcasting on 256.4 meters in English daily as well as on 270 meters

with middle-of-the-road music programmes in Dutch. The English transmissions will be of a top 40 format. The English service will broadcast from 7 AM until 7 PM (BST=0600-1800 GMT); the Dutch will be on from 7 AM until 3 AM (0600-0200 GMT). The station will broadcast as Radio Caroline International and may use some of the old Caroline disc jockeys. Several Dutch jocks, currently working with RNI, are transferring to the Mi Amigo along with one of RNI's English broadcasters and an engineer. Among the daily features will be two half hour segments presented by the Seventh Day Adventists. Forty new jingles have been made in Detroit. The operation will be coordinated by Jim O'Hoolahan who has attracted continental advertisers. There will be a sponsored news service.

In connection with the two clippings which have been summarized above, Terry Greenhill sent along the following report:

On Saturday afternoon 9/30 and the early hours of Sunday morning 10/1 I heard long periods of pop music, no announcements on 1190 (approx); you may remember that the "old" Caroline South frequency was 1187 kHz, so maybe the station is returning.

Early this morning 10/2, at around 0130 GMT I happened to tune to Radio Veronica's frequency of 1562 to find only a kind of frequency marker consisting of four to six pips in morse style (such as some stations use to introduce the news) and a sung ID that sounded like "Veronica K.C.R." This was repeated at about 30-45 second intervals. When I was ready to turn in for the night at 0430, I flipped up to 1562 to find the "marker" still going. The first thing I did on waking at 1030 GMT was to check 1562 again, only to find "Veronica K.C.R." still repeating itself endlessly. I then left the receiver whilst I had a shower and grabbed some breakfast (breakfast at 1200 BST?!), on my return to the receiver about 1145 GMT there was the familiar Dutch programming until 1200, when surprise, surprise, on came the ID, "Dit is Radio Nordzee International". I flipped on my other receiver, and sure enough RNI was running in parallel on 1367 and 1562. So, where was Veronica? Had she moved frequency or merged with RNI? I started to search the band for an answer and at 1300 GMT, I found here, with a clear "Dit is Radio Veronica mit der nieuws". Veronica has moved from one end of the band to the other, 560 kHz (give or take a kHz); bad news (or nieuws, hi) for stateside DXers who still have to bag this one; still I bet some lunatic will manage to dig it out from under the mess, hi!

Now a little moan. I often read in DXM some guy's coming to Europe on vacation. Now, why on earth do they never try to contact us poor outcasts, either before or whilst they are here? I for one would like to meet anyone from across the lilypond and spend a few hours talking DX over a few pints of the local brew.

To celebrate their 50th anniversary, the BBC is to issue a book in November titled "The Biggest Aspidistra in the World." Anyone interested in a copy write me. Whilst on the subject of BBC, the Radio One jocks decided that they did not like the words, "disc-jockey", so instead of "DJ's" we now have "JD's", or "josh-dickies". The mind fairly boggles. 73.

Comment on Alaska-- Tom Garcia

Having lived in North Pole, Alaska for several years I am quite familiar with the area. North Pole is half way between Eielson AFB and Ft. Wainwright. I remember when Wainwright AFRS went off the air, about 2 years ago. While I lived there (1967-1970), Eielson was never on the air. I have been to quite a few of the "sites" and a number have gone out of business in the last few years. Enclosed is the latest list from the Enroute Supplement, dated 14 Sep. 72. It's the same old list that was published 2 years ago, way out of date. It does answer Glenn Hauser's question as to what he heard on 1360 kHz. (Ft. Richardson is the other station, besides Ft. Wainwright listed. Ed) I have written to AFRS Hq at Elmendorf telling them the proper procedure to submit a change to their ES listing. Will check from time to time and see if changes are forthcoming. The publication is issued every 28 days.

The IRCA Foreign Logs are going fast. Get your copy now while the supply lasts. It's a most useful tool for IDing those foreign stations you hear.

DXing From Europe-- Page Taylor

1. Except for many Germans, the band is relatively clear of QRM from 0000 local time Greenwich to 0600.
2. Daytime reception over distances of 400-500 miles in mid-summer appears to be commonplace.
3. When one listens to stations like Luxembourg-1439, Nordsee-1367, Veronica-1562, and Saar-1421, one occasionally remarks, "What happens to all that audio when it gets to the other side?" And, of course, WDR-1586 is unreal - all the way from 1560 to 1600 with receiver pointed that way. That familiar "beep-beep, bop-bop-dum-de-dum-de-dum" of sidebands is unrivalled, even by WABC at 5 miles.
4. Reverse-TA DXing is, of course, a VERY late night pursuit; hets start appearing in August (first week) around 0100 GMT. Noted: WNEW-1130 (patches of audio), WCBS-880 (het only, bombed by Berlin-881), and a tentative WBZ-1030).
5. Many TAs turn on OC a half-hour before commencing sked, TT 10 to 15 minutes ahead of s/on. Likewise, a great number of them also leave carriers on after s/off for as much as a half hour.
6. Conditions over there are just as unpredictable as over here: e.g., some nights were "4-star" for Russians, Scandinavians without a trace of Med or Iberian stations. Then, some nights were top-drawer for Med/Iberians, nil for Russians. A few pertinent examples: on one given night, 1259 would yield only the Spaniard; another night, just Poland. Or Algeria-1304 vs. Poland and AFN.
7. A conspicuous absence: nothing readable on 557 kHz. No wonder this is such a Waterloo for ECNA DXers! Monte Ceneri's pattern must be directed at the summit of the Matterhorn or the bottom of Lake Lugano, hi.

- 548 ... USSR, Leningrad noted with potent signal; news in RR by woman from 0000 non-existent prior to this time indicates either favorable pattern change or s/on. (PT, Scotland)

+Heard with new IS strong at s/on 10/6 0345. IS is on piano, and is D-D-D-G an octave above middle C. (RJE,E)

- 683 RNE Spain, Sevilla heard again 10/7 2355-2358 ID as Radio Nacional de Espana; faded quickly by 2400 IS. Interestingly there was no sign of WDR-1586 until much later in the evening. (AMG,E)
+Has been a powerhouse here all week with their AN program //584 and 737. (AM,E)

- 854 RNE Spain, Murcia weak with long fades and QRM from PJC2; Barbra Streisand vocal at 0120 10/4. (RSD,E)
+Good at 0536 10/9 //773. AM,E)
- 863 ORTF France, Paris had strong carrier at 0537 10/9 but little audio. Was not //7836. (AM,E)
- 881 BBC Wales, Washford. Noted with news in Gaelic 0630-0645 daily. Transmitter location at Washford Cross, England, delivers a pitiful signal into North and central Wales daytimes. (PT, Wales)
- 881 ??? Putting a good het on WCBS just before and after 0600 several nights during this TA period, but no audio ever showed up. By the way, I believe the 880 Cuban may be silent some nights. (GM,C)
- 908 BBC England, one of the BBC stations strong here at 0538 10/9. Some type of interview or discussion program. (AM,E)
- 908 ??? UnID station testing with tone on 10/9 between 0330-0400. Fairly strong signal and I suspect BBC. (AM,E)
- 917 ??? UnID. Have noted a carrier on this frequency AN for the past week but never able to get any audio. Is the Spanish station AN here? (AM,E)

- 926 RTB Belgium, Wavre excellent 8/29, many subsequent AMs; 0425 carrier, 0430 IS, ID, followed by short newscast, then up-tempo music, some rock. IS in WRTH is correct. (PT, E)
- 935 RTM Morocco, Agadir 9/14, daily since, at 0500. Sked change? (PT,E)
- 935 ... Ukraine, Lvov, fair level 10/9 0300 s/on with NA, news in RR and light classical music. First time station has ever been heard here despite location on Polish border and power. (WG,E)
+Believed to be the station noted here at 0405 10/9. Male and female announcers alternating. Not real strong. Language didn't sound like GG or AA. (AM)
- 935 ??? Someday I will get something here! Always seems to have a carrier from NE when TA conditions are good. Even had some unreadable audio at 0715 10/7. (GM,C)

- 1052 ... Rumania, Iasi. Despite the excellent conditions this station has not been heard this past week. Wonder if they are off or possibly using a directional antenna. (AM,E)

Radio Veronica is now using a new transmitter on 557 kHz. Their old transmitter on 1562 is being used on a test basis by Radio Northsea International for an alternate English service (RNE IIO at 0500-1800 //6205v (1367 has Dutch during this period). 1562 also has been heard with unannounced tests at 2300-0200 //1367 (these RNI transmissions involve inter-ship relays). A station was heard all day Sept. 30 in London with continuous pop music on 1187. This should be the heralded Radio Calo-line 72 International, but at 2000, a Radio Veronica jingle was played. Also Radio Veronica had made up a jingle for "Radio Veronica International on 1268" (heard on 1562 prior to changeover at 1200 9/30).

England --- Alan Merriman

According to an item in Broadcasting Magazine for October 9, the new independent commercial stations in Britain may be on the air by late 1973. Present plans call for 5 stations; 2 in London, and one each in Manchester, Glasgow, and Birmingham. One of the London stations will operate on 1546 kHz and the other four will be on 1151 kHz. These stations will be owned by the Independent Broadcasting Authority and will be leased to various groups for operation.

Japan time is GMT + 9 hours, so it would be 2100 (or 9 PM) Japan time, on 10/2.
