2480 WKDA TN see primary frequency of 1240

Would suggest including full period you listen when it is more than a couple of minutes. The tendency to mention program info from several minutes listening but given a single time has been noticed. Dates should be placed along w/ time in all instances; usually right before time the first instance cited, as in WWUN-1590 above.

With EST now here, please be sure that any DX you report from the change (Sun 10/29) forward is EST; but most importantly, the DX previous to that should remain in EDT. The rule is to use EDT based on the date of reception, not the date of issue. DX has been much more current recently and this is appreciated; esp. Larry Flegle's method of reporting the DX just as quickly as it is hrd, even if that is 3 or 4 times a week. Makes for no more work here but gives the VERY latest info. And while we're at it, could we PLEASE have no less than TWENTY reports for next deadline? Listen for a few sign-offs at sunset and jot them on a post card. Every item helps.

Regarding NRC 1973 Boston Convention Ron Schatz sent a lengthy piece for publication regarding NRC's decision to have the '73 convention in Boston breaking tradition of switching sides of the Miss. River. Because it is too long for a DXF and the content not suitable for verbatim inclusion, a synopsis: NRC chose Boston for lack of a suitable bid on the WC; the only bid was deemed unsuitable not for personal reasons but for the harsh realities of hosting a convention. It was at the 1967 Denver IRCA Convention that a similar decision was made when there were no EC bids; Hollywood was chosen. It was this fact that put the two conventions on the opposite side each year thereafter.

Data requested for a DXing research project if you please: to all DXers in Oregon, Washington, British Columbia, Alberta and Saskatchewan: I would like to make a study of the dates when you fellows have been able to hear Britain, France, Germany, Holland, or anything else in northern Europe, but no Spain, Portugal or Dakar data, please. The objective is to look at the calendar dates through the years on a genuine trans-Arctic transmission path. This Pacific Northwest-Northern European path is the only one fairly active which meets these specifications. I would like also to see Richard Wood's report of any European reception from Hawaii for that would also be trans-Arctic. Makes no difference how old the information may be; the important thing is the calendar date. When I get it all researched, I think the study may show something new about the famous midwinter anomaly. In any event, I will report on the findings.

England According to the October 9, Broadcasting, the new commercial outlets in London will be an all-news outlet on 1151 and a general entertainment station on 1546. Birmingham, Manchester, and Glasgow, Scotland will have stations on 1151. According to an editor of the British electronics magazine, Practical Wireless, there will be 60 such stations on the air within 3 years. (C.M. Stanbury II)

Israel According to Great Neck DX Newsletter, IBA's 1200 kilowatt transmitter on 737 is being used for unpublicized Russian transmissions from about 2200. These are aimed at Soviet Georgia, and initially at least, have evaded Soviet jamming more successfully than IBA's SW broadcasts. (C.M. Stanbury II)

DJ Indicted on Obscenity & Indecency Charges A disc jockey on WOWI-FM in Norfolk, Virginia, faces a possible 2-year prison sentence and a \$10,000 fine simply for playing portions of the Woodstock album on the air. DJ John Nesci was indicted last month by a federal grand jury on "obscenity & indecency charges" after he allegedly played Country Joe MacDonald's "Fish Cheer" on the air last summer. The "Fish Cheer" contains a section where Country Joe and the Fish lead the audience at Woodstock in spelling out a four-letter word for sexual intercourse. Nesci reports that he was visited by FBI agents several months ago; they told him they had been monitoring his show for a 30-day period. The FBI agents then played a series of tapes they said they had recorded during Nesci's show. -LVF
