Tom Sundstrom and Angel Garcia hrd nothing on scheduled 11/11 date; Shel Swartz says they were on per sked without saying what day that was, so... WCVR is 1320, Randolph, Vermont.

Phone List Karl Bartlett, 26 Commonwealth Ave., Boston, MA 02116, is compiling a list of phone numbers. Will be available for Xerox costs & SASE; see future EDXF for details. In the meantime, Karl would like a card with your name, address, and phone # (include area code). IRCA has not published a list of phone numbers for a couple of reasons. Primary is the difficulty in obtaining all of them at any given time. Secondary is the problem that many members do not want their #'s published--most of those who do not mind have listed telephone #'s and there is no purpose in publishing a list of those #'s. The scenic state of Vermont is one of the rarest states for DXers to log. At the moment there is little chance of logging Vermont west of Chicago. The best bets are WCFR-1480 (r:c) & WVMT-620, with WDEV-550 a close third. The Green Mountains & poor ground conductivity lead the stns to belittle the effects of skip. Strong emphasis on fine local programming (e.g. WVMT, WBTN & WCFR) emanates from these friendly stations.

'Vermont' is derived from the french words "verd mont" meaning "green mountain." Running north-south, these beautiful mtns dominate the landscape. Vermont is famous for its maple syrup, produced every spring. Much granite is quarried & is evident in the buildings of the state capitol, Montpelier.
