Fri (4th Fri) at 0215-0230 KPOS-1370 is sched for r/c. Obviously, I have a problem w/this freq: local NSP WSPD. Well, they were (thank God!) a bit on the weak side that morning, and I could null them good enuf to hear a tone, but I realized that I'd never hear an ID, cause the null wasn't good enuf. So, I called the anncr at WSPD, and gave a brief explanation of DXing and asked if he could give me 5 sec of dead air after the next record, that I'd call the stn that was supposed to be testing & see if they'd ID. I'd like to touch upon the subject of stns that are reluctant verifiers, that once veried, and stns that have started to verify recently. I think that this depends on the periodic changes of key station personnel. Let's face it, some PDs and CEs like to receive and verify good reception reports. To some it is part of their job. But others could care less. I received a nice verie from WFEA back in July of 1966 signed by Alan Paige, CE. They are reluctant to verify even a good report now so I'm led to believe that Mr. Paige is not there any more and the new personnel in charge just couldn't be bothered by the receipt of reception reports. Don't give up on a stn because it doesn't verify. Sometimes it takes years, but a change in station personnel sometimes makes a change in station verification policy. Three veries: CKWS, WKIS, & WHLO. 73.

Re the recent suggested change for the IRCA administration format proposed by Rick Evans; he and I corresponded briefly on said topic--I think a more workable format would be to have 9 BoD members on staggered 3-yr terms, i.e., each year 1/3 would be up for election. To initiate said staggered "start" the 1st election would have the top 3 vote getters receive 3-yr terms, 4 thru 6 2-yr terms, and 7 thru 9 1-yr terms. If BoD seats or officer-level positions were vacated, runnerups in the latest year's election would fill, for the balance of the term, any vacated seat on the BoD. The BoDs would be responsible for filling the balance-of-term officer-level positions, either from w/in their ranks or **w/ outside help thereof, after which time the latest "runner-ups" would be used to fill BoD seats. Officer-level positions would be electable every 2 yrs. 2 items to note; this has the advantage of always having a "complete" administration and not having to determine "is this a 3- or a 4-man election year." If IRCA is to run on a "democratic" system, this kind of arrangement should "smooth" the otherwise wharp changes in policies et al that could otherwise occur, and I would not be opposed to same. 73.

On a topic that gets a lot of discussion at this time of the year, Bill says there are conflicting reports about Broadcasting Yearbook (also known as BYB); one says it will be out in a couple of weeks while another says not till April. From past experience, your publisher feels the safest thing is to add a month to the company's most liberal estimate. The publishers of BYB have been noted for years to miss their scheduled publication dates and later promises almost 100%. They are exceeded only by S9 magazine in their ability to mishandle correspondence related to their respective publications.

Two-letter state and province abbreviations are fine for their purposes; though I once felt they were the greatest invention since the typewriter, and still feel they have great merit, there has been a lot of misuse noted. Some are confusing MI (Mich.) with MS (Miss.), MN (Minn.) and MO (Missouri). The abbreviations for the provinces are an abbreviation of the U.S. Postal Service (apparently) are aren't always understood by Canadians, even those in the PO. When using two-letter state abbreviations, they NEVER require a period nor should one be used. Detroit, MI 48214, not MI. or Mi.; also, always double-space after a two-ltr state abbrev. when typing it and a ZIP code. When using Canadian postal codes, such as the one for Morris Sorensen, ROB OMO, remember that, unlike the U.S.A. ZIP code, it goes after the word Canada, when used, and always has a space between the first three characters and the last 3 characters. The sequence is ALWAYS: ltr-#-ltr-sp-#-ltr-#. -DEE

980 RBC Rhodesia, Umthali, General Service heard 1/15 at 1820 with play in EE. Good signal.

1133 ... Kuwait, Kuwait, R. Kuwait heard 1/14 at 1807 with pop music and announcements in EE. Considerable QRN. Good/excellent signal. 1/15 at 1736 with news in EE; station ID at 1740. Good/excellent with slight QRN.

1140 VOA Philippines, Poro relay heard 1/6 at 1637 in Vietnamese. Weak signal/

Radio Caroline-- Pirate Radio News, via Geoff Toon, Colchester, Essex, England

This is a summary of recent events with regard to Radio Caroline.

- Dec. 1, 1972 Test Transmission on 259 meters (1187 kHz).
- Dec. 18 Test Transmission on 199 meters (1520 kHz). Commercials for the ship owners who were supplying the Mi Amigo., as well as for a movie called "Gold, produced by the film company of Ronan O'Rahilly.
- Dec. 20 An insulator broke, transmissions ended.
- Dec. 21 Station returns, with apology for 1 kHz het with other stations.
- Dec. 22 Official start of Radio Caroline. Local commercials started on 12/23.
- Dec. 28 Trouble on board; DJs said not to worry; lights on rear deck had been damaged, and rockets were set off to give light for repair. Later on, real reason was found out to be that the Dutch crew wanted to be paid. One of the crew cut down an oil supply line to the generator and destroyed the rear deck lights. The crew was taken off the ship, with the exception of the captain, Capt. van der Kamp. Transmissions continued until 1553, when the DJ announced there was a fight on board; station again disappeared. The Dutch crew returned to the Mi Amigo, and took over the ship. A DJ hid the crystals with some other radio parts. Station returned at 1800, with announcement that everything was okay.
- Dec. 29 Station continued in operation, until 0300 1/30, when DJ announced the station was changing wavelengths, and would be back in 2 days. Went off, but came back on in a few minutes with a DJ giving a Mayday call. The captain and some crew returned, and after a breakdown of negotiations, decided to cut anchor and tow the ship away. Captains plans are to sell the ship and pay the crew with the profits. Entrance to IJmuiden is refused; Ronan O'Rahilly comes to Holland, but is refused entrance to ship by Gerard Van Dam, Managing-director. Van Dam is fired. Dutch police board the ship, ask for the ship's papers, but Captain declares the ship is registered as a Panamanian vessel. Temporarily the ship is anchored at IJmuiden, then towed to Amsterdam.

- Shipping authorities declare the vessel un-seaworthy. Repairs are made over the weekend.
- Jan. 1 Captain boards the ship, claims it. Long negotiations follow; O'Rehilly pays some fines.
- Jan. 2 Ship leaves IJmuiden and takes up position between Mebo II and Norerney. Station returns on 259 meters (1187) at 1508 GMT. Reorganization of the company is taking place.
- Maximum power is 50 kw, but at present still is using temporary mast, with lower power. On the air 24 hours, with English from 1700-0500, and Dutch 0500-1700.

Radio Veronica-- Colchester Evening Gazette, via Geoff Toon

Pop pirate ship Radio Veronica, 12 miles off Dutch coast, today (1/25) accused the independent Broadcasting Authority of "jamming" its programmes with test transmissions for commercial radio, and threatened to retaliate by swamping IBA wavelengths. A spokesman for IBA said the tests would continue. (538 meters. (557 kHz)

- 1140 VOA Philippines, Poro with WRVA 1135-1200 MM 1/29; at 1200 part of Yankee Doodle through KGEM s/on; some language; pretty good and strong. (JEC,W)

- 580 ??? UnID 1/14 0654, very weak with WTAG nulled; US rock and SS talk just barely heard. WKAQ? (TJS,E)
- 600 HJHJ Colombia, Barranquilla 1/1 0345 in strong with "Oiga, ciga, ciga, Radio Libertad..." Colombian music. (TJS,E)
- 640 YVQO Venezuela, Puerto la Cruz, fair at 0340 just under CMQ on 1/13, with fiesta music; s/off at 0351 with many IDs and NA. No deep fades. (RVM,E)

- YSLKB San Miguel assumed, for it was //765YSKL, but considerably stronger MM 1/22 1145. (GM,C) (New WRTH'73 lists YSKLC on 780; YSKL San Salvador here)

- 820 XESB México, Santa Barbara, Chih. 1/24 1343, male SS, "Radio ... en Santa Barbara"; Mexican music in for a couple of minutes. (RS,W)
- 830 CMCA Cuba, Havana fair at 0303 1/19, several call letter IDs, then into SS MoR music, under WCCO. (RVM,E)
- 830 HIJB Dominican Republic, Santo Domingo 0520-0550 1/28. Typical LA music, "Mas musica" IDs. Good signal, over WCCO much of the time, moderate amount of fading, though. (CLW,E)
- 830 XEVQ México, Novolato, Sin. 1/24 1335+, male SS noted using Radio Musical IDs. (RS,W)
- 840 ... UnID EE and gospel music 0930-0950 1/29; likely Castries. In/out with Jepko talk show on WHAS &%*#\$. (RJS,W)(Gene Martin notes that WHAS was on 1/22 MM with KSL's Herb Kepko show for the first time, so perhaps WHAS SP will change now to SM when this show is off. Ed)
- 855 PJC2 Netherlands Antilles, Curacao, moderate signal with DD DJ and EE pop music at 0050 1/13. Noted nightly now, with slop from CKVL-850. (RVM,E)
- 860 HOLR Dominican Republic, Santo Domingo 0640-0700 1/20. SS easy listening music, clear "Radio Clarin" ID 0640 with several mentions of Santo Domingo. Good signal with oly QRM coming from UnID SS with ranchera type music. (CLW,E)
- 868.5 CMEL Cuba, Havana, R. Internacional; 1/26 tune-in 0340 with music to 0400 ID, news headlines, then more music 0403+. Good signal with annoying het from WWL easily cut off though use of AM gating function on SSB adaptor tied into HQ-150. Obviously auroral conditions that have persisted at least 4-5 days after this logging. Still seemed strong for 1 kw. (TRS,E)
- 870 LRA Argentina, Buenos Aires. WWL was off and Ecuador pretty strong but the LRA pips arrived in fine style, 0900 MM 1/22. LRA was all talk, probably news for at least the next 13 minutes. But no ID was heard other than the 6 pips, finally one prolonged. (GM,C)
+Good signal 1/26 1050-1104, some background QRM. MoR SS music, good ID on the hour as Radio Nacional. WWL carrier on at 1104, testing, ending reception. (JET,C)

+The new station in strong with a bit of fade, all religious station with some syndicated programs, said that first report from distant countries (mentioning islands such as Jamaica, St. Lucia, etc.)*said they just made a move from another island and got a new frequency and a new transmitter. *would be acknowledged by a letter. (TJS,E)
+In good/fair with religious programs 0015-0230 1/30. Had both 15 and 30 minute programs. ID as "Radio Paradise, with 50,000 watts of Gospel Power" and as "The Gospel Voice of the Caribbean." Slop from WFBM and WHBF. S/off at 0301 1/30 mentioned return at 0900. (TMJ,C)
- 1270 CMJG Cuba, Camaguey fair/good with hardly any QRM at all 1/15 0815. (JAM,C)

- 1310 XEAM México, Matamoros, Tamps. 11/3, ID 0030 S7 over WRR with call letters, listed in WRTH as 250 watts nights. Not in NRC LA Log. (GS,C,NR&)
- 1349.5 XEMM México, San Luis Rio Colorado, Son., Radio Amor, positive ID 1/26 0102 s/off. (RJS,W)
- 1425 ??? UnID 1/29 0520-0530, lowlevel, no audio. (JET,C)
- 1525 TIEBAW Costa Rica, Turrialba, 1/29 0430-0445, very good level. Up temp and MoR SS music. Man DJ. Gave call letters once. Mentioned Turrialba between each record. (JET,C)
- 1547 ??? UnID 1/29 0410-0420, low level, SS music, too much sideband splatter. (JET) (Most likely the Costa Rican. Ed)
- 1560 XEVIP México, D.F. 1/1 0640 had a jingle as "1560, Radio VIP", MoR music and a TC at 0646. Good, all alone on the frequency. (TJS,E)
- 1565 ??? UnID 1/29 0401-0410 very low level signal, some music; unable to tell if EE or SS. (JET,C) (The Colombian. Ed)
- 1573 ??? UnID, 1/29 0335-0400, carrier only; no audic. Fair level, some fades. : (JET,C)

Radio Sutatenza information -- Angel Garcia

According to the v/l received from Juan Delgado Padilla, Gerente at R. Sutatenza in Cali, the operating powers are: 100 kw in Medellin; 120 kw in Cali; 250 kw in Bogota, 10 kw in Barranquilla, and 120 kw in Magangue. The pennant enclosed with the v/l has 590 allocated to Medellin, 700 to Cali, 810 to Bogota, and 960 to Barranquilla. Magangue and 1010 do not appear on the pennant, indicating that the 1010 outlet is allocated to Magangue, rather than Barranquilla. I have written to Sr. Padilla for further information.

Foreign Test

Angel Garcia has arranged with TIJC-675 to test for IRCA. The exact date and times have not yet been set, but will be a MM between 0700 and 1000 GMT. They are very anxious to get reports on their new 15 kw transmitter which will be used for the test. Angel says this is a very friendly station. It hasn't been reported much, so this is one that everyone should try for.

FJP The 1973 WRTH arrived this week. It lists a 2 kw transmitter for Gilbert and Ellice Islands on 580 kHz. Too bad they didn't choose a split freq. like 844. 73 de FJP.

- 1484 ... England, BBC Radio Merseyside here with 2 kw, on since 12/20. (TJG, Eng)

Latin America

- 650 HJJX Colombia, Bogota, Emisoras Monseratte, heard with uninterrupted light instrumental music and ID on the hour at 0800 1/15, with fair signal and QRM from WSM on ET at 5 kw. I finally IDed this one after months of hearing music and no ID. (RNA,C)
- 660 XERPM Mexico, D.F. bombing in like a local 1/22 playing US rock oldies with IDs after each song, plus a few SIDs. I didn't hear a single SS record all morning! 0547 0630. (RVM,E) (Overlooked earlier, sorry. Ed)
- 730 TGN Guatemala, Guatemala, R. Cultural, heard with MoR music by US artists, and occasional IDs at 0746-0817 1/29, with good signal and QRM from HJCU Radio Melodía. (RNA,C)
- 750 HJDK Colombia, Medellin, LV de Antioquia, heard with rock music at 0640 1/22. Had CARACOL ID at 0700. Good signal and UniD QRM. WSB was off. (RNA,C)
- 770 HJKH Colombia, Bogota, R. Tequendama, with MoR music and frequent IDs 0715-0745 1/29, with excellent signal and QRM from HOL83, Chitre. (RNA,C)

- 840 HOL80 Panama, Panama, R. Libertad, heard under WHAS with MoR music at 0525-0543 1/31, with weak signal. (RNA,C)
- 870 HCN2 Ecuador, Guayaquil. Please let me retract reception of HOHO, Panama here at 1118 MM 1/22 as reported (see above). That station was the old familiar R. Cristal and not a R. Colossal as I imagined when reviewing the tape. I had IDed R. Cristal more than 2 hours earlier, but at 1118, I made the mistaken assumption that some other LA would be there by that time. So that assumption made it easy for me to hear Cristal as something else. So be careful about assumptions, but how come Guayaquil addressed some message to amigos de la peninsula? Don't see any peninsulas attached to Ecuador. (GM,C)
- 900 YNRT Nicaragua, Managua, R. Tiempo heard under CJVI with MoR music and frequent TCs at 0733-0831 1/17, with very weak signal. (RNA,C)
- 910 YVRO Venezuela, Maiquetia, R. Aeropuerto, heard with Latin MoR music and frequent IDs by a YL at 0942 1/29, with good signal and no QRM. KGLC was off. ID was "Radio Aeropuerto de la hora." (RNA,C)
- 1030 LS10 Argentina, Buenos Aires, Wed M 1/31 0800-0900 was a great morning for LS10 arriving through, under and over XEQR with WBZ in the limbo of the null. On top of XEQR 5-6 times during the period, on top for 5 minutes,

- 1030 LS10 +0835-0840. XEQR enjoyed no more than 10 clear minutes during the hour. Failed to catch the Rio del Plata ID anywhere this time, but Buenos Aires is mentioned often. Buenos Aires appeared first as a bit of tango music about 0806. At 0813, there was a TC on the tape saying "Cinco trece," so BA is not on DST. BA appears to be almost 100% talk after 0815, alternating 2 male voices, but a female voice filled the minute before 0900. A 3rd LA seemed to be trying to arrive a couple of times during this hour, but it never surfaced. It seemed to take the air at 0820. Believe LS10 would be stronger than LRA-870 if the frequency were ever truly clear. Better get this one before XEQR becomes 50 kw, for that is in their plans. (GM,C)

(Incidentally it is interesting to note that they start only at 1500 GMT, which is midnight JST, when the Jap stations on 1470/1480 close, so no interference is caused. This was believed to be the reason why they dropped 1475 more than ½ years ago. (LR, Japan, NRC)
- 1493 ... USSR, station fairly strong heard from tune-in at 1340 with programs of R. Alma-Ata Foreign Service. At 1357 IS followed by ID (in Kazakh? - not RR). Still heard after 1450. Must be a relay, but interestingly enough, Alma-Ata is listed for 746 which X2 = 1492... Tape of ID, including frequencies, sent to RR station expert Olle Alm in Sweden for clarification. ANARC Executive Secretary-- The 9/15 deadline for nominations for Exec. Sec. for the next two years passed with no one who had been nominated allowing their names to be considered. Finally, Al Reynolds, has accepted the nomination. Member clubs of ANARC are asked to vote on this nomination. Allen H. (Al) Reynolds, of Jackson, Tenn., is a member of MASWA and ASWLC. His primary areas of DX interest lie in shortwave broadcast, and utilities, but he also does some MW DXing. He is 35 and is Director of Christian Education for First Presbyterian Church of Jackson, Tenn.

1973 ANARC Convention

A second bid to host the 1973 ANARC Convention has been submitted by Father Jack Pejza and a group of other Southern California DXers, to have the convention in San Diego, in late July or early August. The site would probably be the Fabulous Inns, where the 1972 IRCA Convention was held.

European DX Council-- Wolfgang Scheunemann has been elected to serve a one-year term as Secretary General of ANARC's European counterpart. His new address is D-6 Frankfurt 90, Alexanderstr. 122, West Germany.

ANARC Financial Report-- To summarize, ANARC received \$269.22 this past year for club dues, Newsletter subscriptions, Abbreviation List sales, and profits on the convention. Expenses for postage, stationery, and supplies, committee expenses, and Man-of-the-Year plaque totalled \$181.27. ANARC now has a balance of \$429.33, an increase of about \$90 from this time last year.

On behalf of the "Article X Committee", that portion of the By-Laws is being reprinted:

ARTICLE X - IRREGULARITIES, REPRIMANDS, DISMISSALS

Section 1 - Irregularities

Any irregularity of club policy must be brought to the attention of the Board of Directors and the President. A statement of the irregularity and the member or members charged must be made in written form and must bear the signature or signatures of the members making such charges, and shall be submitted directly to each Director and the President; all shall determine any action which shall be taken.

Section 2 - Reprimands

In case of irregularities, the IRCA President must, with the approval of the Board, issue a letter of reprimand, to be sent by registered mail, to any officer or member of the IRCA, clearly stating the nature of the offense and the proper means of rectifying said offense.

Section 3 - Dismissals

If the nature of the offense is serious enough to cause further action than a reprimand the President must, with the final approval of the Board issue a letter or letters clearly stating the nature of the offense and that dismissal proceedings are being taken. The aforementioned letter(s) are to be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. A sufficient amount of time must be allowed for the accused to answer the serious charges. If the reply is not forthcoming or if it does not meet with the satisfaction of the President, a letter or letters of dismissal may be sent with the final approval of the Board of Directors, removing the membership of the accused.

The Article X Committee requests comments on that article from the membership, particularly with regard to proposed changes. Comments should be sent to the Chairman of that committee, Jay Murley. RECEPTION REPORTS

Dave Schmidt, a top domestic DXer and very active in CPC work, has volunteered to write an article on "How to Write a Reception Report" for publication in DX Monitor. While the problem has improved greatly in the past 12 months, IRCA members still are responsible for some pretty awful reception reports. Many of them come from members who have no obvious excuse. They've received their NMPs with the 'DX Booklet' and its article, "Writing Reception Reports." Yet, among recent reception reports at KOB in Albuquerque, N.M., was one report so lacking in detailed information that it was not verified. The reports ranged from very bad to exceedingly good with one of the best being a report by Bob Foxworth, New York City area, editor until recently of NRC's "Monitor Reports" portion of the foreign DX section. Dave Schmidt is in a good position to write about the art of reception reports. Please watch for his article, read it, and try to get some ideas from it. IRCA has a lot to lose, individually and collectively from poor quality reception reports. -DEE

ANOTHER ELECTION FRAUD

The letter should have pointed out the advantages to the general public, not to just a few hundred hobbyists. The FCC's job is to protect the general public and maintain order on the radio band, not to protect perhaps a thousand DXers scattered across the country. Don't forget that Canada has had a similar rule for years, yet nobody is screaming about that. The biggest effect is that the stations playing long cuts of classical music will not interrupt a selection for an ID--and who would have stuck around for it on SSS, anyway! Most stations will still ID on the half hour and at odd times. Response to my query on reporting standards shows that everyone who bothered to comment feels I am justified. Another question: Do you prefer the state listed before or after the calls? Silence means approval of the way it is currently being done. Bill Harang to the contrary, one does not run a serious risk of being mugged in Hammond. Has anyone else noticed a shift of MM pests over the past few years? CKY and WPNX used to bomb in here, now they're rare. Must go. 73.
