Ernie also has an apparent re-sked on WFLN-900 for Mon. May 28, 0515-0530. However, no word rcvd at IRCA HQ and this is an r/c. In addition, WCHE-1520 West Chester, PA, has been re-sked for Tues. 4/24; this is a new r/c to add to your list. 4th Tues., 0015-0030 ELT. WCER-1390, according to Dave Faulkner, has not replied to his correspondence in many months so it isn't known if that series of tests (testing) is still scheduled. Ernie Cooper and Wes Boyd (arr.) have noted a coming Test from WLLL-930, Lynchburg, VA, on a MM near the end of April. Nothing from Wes on a firm date yet so would guess a test unlikely.

WJAS/WKQP/WKTQ The mystery on this stn was never that much of a mystery but there are 3 conflicting notes at HQ. FOLLOWING A SUGGESTION FROM GLENN HAUSER, PHONETIC SPELLING OF SPANISH CALL LETTERS HAS BEEN DROPPED, SINCE ONLY W AND Y HAVE VARIABLE PRONUNCIATIONS. IF YOU NEED A LIST OF PRONUNCIATIONS OF SPANISH LETTERS, SEE BRUCE PORTZER'S Q&A IN THE MARCH 17 DX MONITOR. HOWEVER, I DISAGREE WITH HIS STATEMENT THAT NON-EE DOMESTIC RECEPTIONS SHOULD SIMPLY BE LISTED IN THE DOMESTIC ROUNDUP SECTIONS. I AM AFRAID THAT, AS IN THE PAST, THEY GET LOST THERE; HERE, IN A SPECIAL SECTION, PEOPLE MIGHT BE MORE AWARE OF THEIR EXISTENCE. I DO AGREE THAT NO ONE SHOULD JUMP TO CONCLUSIONS ON THE BASIS OF LANGUAGE ALONE--A GOOD DXER NEEDS MORE THAN THAT EVEN TO COME UP WITH A TENTATIVE ID OF A STATION.

IN ANSWER TO DEE'S QUESTION ABOUT WHAT TO DO WITH SMALL BLANK SECTIONS OF STENCILS, MY SUGGESTION IS TO LEAVE THEM BLANK. WE ALREADY PUBLISH MORE MATERIAL THAN ANY OTHER DX CLUB AROUND; DEE ALREADY HAS A BIG ENOUGH WORK LOAD WITHOUT HAVING TO PUT EVERY STENCIL WHICH HAS 5 EMPTY LINES INTO HIS TYPEWRITER TO FILL IT UP. 73/FJP
