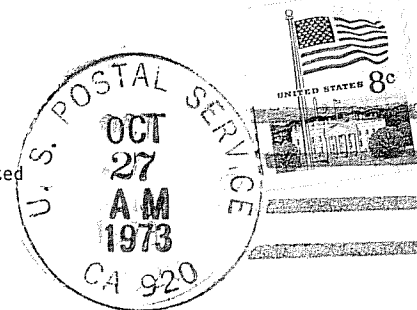

**LISTENERS' LOGGINGS-- TRANS-ATLANTIC**

- 533 ... Algeria, Les Trembles. Strong with AA chants 2250 10/14; much stronger than beacons down there. (JMP,E)
- 635a ... Iran, UnID station here here in Finland at about 1750. (SCDX)
- 656 ??? A definite something has appeared here on this TA frequency; 3 consecutive nights although I am reluctant to call it a TA. First noted as a healthy carrier with faint audio, and occasional beating as from another station on 656 on MM 10/15 0620-0702. Looped 80°, north of Dakar but south of Portugal. During this period, signal went downhill, fading away, by 0700, was only a BFO whistle. WSM and WNBC were off; checking that region of the band didn't turn up any tester radiating off-frequency ghosts. A vernier test procedure gave me a readout of exactly 656. BFO whistle also noted that night after 0700 on 836, but no other TA indications to be found across the band. Began looking again 10/16 spotted carrier at 0547, weaker but definite alongside 660 occupants, on same 80° bearing. Had declined to BFO whistle by 0628, gone by 0640. 10/17 only as BFO whistle at 0608 with A index of 18. Summing up: it behaves like a TA but is heard at a time when the TAs are not being heard. (GM,C)
- 746 ... Holland, Lopik, very good 0609 10/15 with man in DD and light semi-classical music. Nice signal, easy to pick off from WSB OC. (JMP,E)
- 854 RNE Spain, Murcia noted at 0515 10/8 with the clearest signals of any European so far this season, which up to this point has been pretty mediocre condition-wise. (CMS,E)
- 908 BBC England, Brookmans Park. Strong 0620 10/15 with man in EE; discussion program. (JMP,E)
- 935 ... Morocco, Agadir, fair/poor under WTTM-920 slop with AA chanting 2255 10/14. (JMP,E)

OKINAWA BY THE SIDE DOOR? -- Glenn Hauser

I don't want to prolong this discussion unduly, but here is a summary of my second reply to my friend Gene Martin's second discussion of the Okinawa case. No implication was meant that radio signals are like bullets. But the width of a beam in a distant area is entirely unrelated to the direction from which the signal will arrive at any one point! An Okinawan signal arriving in Uppsala, Sweden should come in by the great circle (shortest possible) path, and that would be from 60° east of north. For a signal to proceed on to New York from Uppsala without turning, it would have to come in the first place from the direction of Karachi--about 115°--55° away from Okinawa. This is obvious when you check a globe equipped with a goniometer. If Okinawa's Chinese beam is centered on Shanghai (313°), then it is not surprising that it would be received well in Sweden (331°), only 18° away. However, Denver is almost 90° away from Shanghai as viewed from Okinawa; thus it is quite likely near a null on VOA's directional pattern. This explains why the signal suddenly appears when they switch to the northward Korean beam, which is also, apparently, broad, tho Korea could be covered with a 'tight' beam, unlike China. I must insist that there is only one 'back door'--via Antarctica, etc., and in this case it is much less likely than the 'front door'--short path (tho I must concede to meteorologist Martin that summer thunderstorms may not be much of a factor). A radio signal, no matter how powerful, is going to follow the shortest path between two points. For it to arrive in New York via Britain or Greenland, it would have to zig and zag, or follow a strange curve--and come in by a side door. That just isn't the way medium radio waves behave, to the best of my knowledge. If a recognized propagation expert can contradict this, I'll gladly concede. Shortwave and mediumwave propagation have some things in common, but SW has one advantage--certain frequencies can propagate both over daylight and darkness paths. The long path between Australia and Britain could never have less than 1500 miles of daylight in it. That's why you don't see European MW reported in Australia via long path. New Zealand is quite different, closer to the antipodes from Europe, so Cushen's observations are not surprising. So, unless you're at the antipodes from a station, there's only one basic position of a bi-directional loop from which its signal will loop. I feat that looking for Okinawa from the NE or any direction other than its true short-path bearing from your location will prove futile. But go ahead and try. The results may be more convincing than my argument. By the way, Gene has come up with a theory to explain the so-called midwinter anomaly, which has a lot of merit!

## War Ousts 'Peace Ship'

BEIRUT (AP) — Able Nathan's peace ship was intercepted in international waters off the Israeli coast late last night by an Israeli gunboat and warned to leave the combat zone, the ship's radio announced.

The former Israeli restaurateur has been broadcasting music and peace messages to the Middle East from the 110-ton vessel in the eastern Mediterranean. He broadcast a blow-by-blow account of the interception to listeners on the mainland.

"It is an Israeli warship and they want us to return to shore with them," Nathan announced in the middle of an evening music program. A babble of voices sounded in the background. The ship then began playing its theme song, "Give Peace a Chance" by the Beatles.

Later, Nathan came on the air again to announce that his ship was moving more than 50 miles from Israeli and Egyptian coastlines to "send messages of peace to the leaders and all the people in this area that violence will not solve anything." The peace ship has an international volunteer crew.

Sweden Calling DXers says that the mailing address of the Voice of Peace is now P.O. Box 1695, Nicosia, Cyprus. The other address, P.O. Box 3462, Tel Aviv, Israel, remains unchanged. Abie Nathan was in Israel from Sept. 23-27, and then began broadcasting appeals for volunteers and advertisers, and then would move to a point north of the Suez Canal.

#### Radio Free America and Rev. Carl McIntire - continued

As there is a bit of mis-information in the IRCA DXM of 10/6/73 (cf pages 10 and 5), I'd like to offer the following -- which also expands upon the effort of Gordon Nelson in NRC's DX News of 9/29/73.

What started everything off here was a telephone call to my local 24-hour news station KYW-1060 Philadelphia on the morning of 8/31, seeking more info on RFA which had supposedly anchored a few days previously outside the territorial limits off Cape May, NJ. Instead, I wound up on the air for 7 minutes speculating on the choice of frequencies and what could be expected in the way of coverage. Frequency #1 was 1160 kHz and #2 was 1610 kHz. The next day, 9/1, Rev. Mood, McIntire's pastoral assistant, traced me down and said, "We heard you on KYW yesterday, and Dr. McIntire wants to talk with you." I spoke with Dr. McIntire that afternoon, and RFA's GM Dr. James Shaw, the next day, 9/2; both conversations centered around my choices and some other alternatives and potential interference on each.

On Monday, 9/3, KYW called me back and told me McIntire announced his main frequency as 692 with alternates of 1160, 1613, and 1500 kHz! We cut another tape for KYW speculating on the coverage using 692 -- obviously bad at night due to Montreal and Cuba, but OK in the daylight. That tape was aired mid-day 9/3. Later I passed word to McIntire that 692 was also a bad frequency due to ITV (bkw on 693.0 and color on 692.31 kHz), something I didn't realize at the time KYW called, and would further limit daytime reception. On 9/6, Rev. Mood called me back to say McIntire had dropped plans for 692 and was indeed tuning equipment for 1160.

Dr. Shaw called me the evening of 9/12 to say RFA would be on testing, this at 2200. (All times in this article are EDT.--ed.) Nothing was heard until 2345, as was reported to IRCA and NRC. The test continued to 0050, then went silent to 0130 or so, and then 20 minutes of audio was aired until 0200 at which time the engineers came in from the ship. In the hour that I listened/watched it, there was only an OC, but Shaw verified it by times I reported peak signals (@ 002C) when they were up to 10 kw.

Dr. McIntire called me Thursday, 9/13, also to see how RFA did, and among other things in a 60-minute conversation, he told me of some of the engineering problems. Aside from those reported in the news clippings, there was a small fire in the control room due to inadequate shielding and overheating of equipment -- a copper-lined shield was being installed.

RFA did perform another ET on 9/16, from midnight to 0530. Not heard here, but it was heard by Nelson and he reported it to McIntire.

The ship had lost an anchor on 9/14 in a rainstorm and was cruising outside when testing, and RFA would have come on the air Monday 9/17 if it were not for the refitting of a new anchor located in Baltimore and trucked up.

RFA did come on the air at 1223 9/19 (Wednesday) and remained on the air until 2214 that evening (regular schedule). Although McIntire announced they were cruising north to Asbury Park before turning around (all outside the 12-mile limit), in fact the ship only made it to Avalon (just south of Atlantic City) before turning around.

Phone calls received up to 1600 were from as far away as Bangor, ME; Pittsburgh, PA; and Rocky Mount, NC.

Dave Schmidt of DE told me he was driving in downtown Wilmington listening to WDEL-1150 when they lost their carrier for 20 seconds at 1307, in the middle of a record; it would be interesting to know if NRCer Joe Jones pulled same at the xmttr to see if RFA was on the air! I should note that this is just speculation on the part of Dave and myself.

I also learned, later, that RFA never did get to 10 kw during RS on 9/19, but only 5 kw. It was apparent that they were having difficulty in the first few minutes following s/on -- on my tape you can hear the swish of the OC bobbing and weaving around for a few minutes prior to Dr. McIntire's first words, and for the first few minutes of the xmsn.

WHLW called Cape May circa 1600 and complained bitterly about the adjacent channel interference -- as it turned out it was from listeners outside WHLW's prime listening area (i.e., a tight pattern SE for Toms River and Lakewood) and it was only secondary coverage complaints from Atlantic City -- the point at which the ship turned back. No one will ever know if that was a putup job by the FCC through WHLW -- WHLW's president was advised by the FCC "not to talk about his complaint."

RFA, learning of the complaint through the ship's mail/ferry boat (no ship-to-shore radio) that evening, went off at 2214.

To make a long story short, McIntire spoke with Nelson and myself in the next couple of days -- did not want to interfere with any licensed station -- and despite our comments that "you've said you want to wind up in court anyway and the interference to WHLW isn't even in their prime listening area," McIntire later made the decision to go to 1613 kHz. The ship had a 1600 kHz crystal which, as their 690 and 1160 crystals, can be padded to slide 20 kHz either way.

On 9/21 the FCC got a restraining order to 10/1, the date for arguments on whether or not to make the order permanent. On 10/1 McIntire got an extension to 10/11 (time to prepare case), and on 10/11 arguments were presented. The judge said he'd issue a decision by 10/22 or 10/23 and continued the ban to 11/1.

Although the outcome is not known, but most probably will be in the FCC's favor, I do not expect RFA to return to the air until the final decision in the injunction is heard. McIntire may not return to the air at all, but, if he does, it would probably be on the same day as the court hearing. All I can suggest is that DXers check 1613 each date a hearing is scheduled. The next few dates would be 10/22, 10/23, and 11/1.

Rather than bore readers with news clippings, most should have access to the New York Times in one form or another. Releases appeared in the NYT on 9/20, 9/21, and 10/12/73. In the Philadelphia Inquirer, 9/20, 9/21, 9/23, 10/2, and 10/12/73. Other newspapers should also have stories around the key dates following 9/19, 10/1 and 10/11.

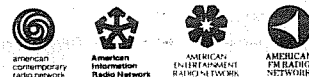


