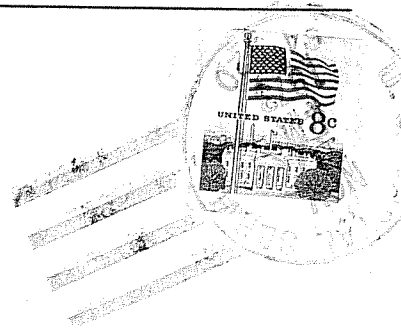

A SEASON OF TAPE REPORTING -- Angel M. Garcia

A considerable amount of time was devoted last season attempting to verify many of the foreign stations which were logged. Hoping to increase the return percentage, I reported to all stations via the "tape report" format. The standard reporting methods associated with tape reporting were followed, i.e., full track, 7 1/2 ips, sufficient leader, etc. The tape, on a 2 1/2" reel-standard hub, was accompanied by a neatly typed letter, a postcard of New York City, and mint stamps (or IRCs where appropriate). In all cases, the accompanying letter followed the format of the IRCA SS/PP/FF report forms. The results were rather interesting:

AREA	Reported/verified	Return percentage
Europe	24/19	79%
North America	10/7	70%
Africa	4/2	50%
Central America	14/6	42.9%
South America	23/8	34.8%
Caribbean	17/5	29.9%
Total	92/47	51%

The Latin American response was very discouraging. If I were doing it all over again, I would suggest:

- 1) Registering all taped reports to Latin America AND/OR
- 2) Listing the program details and including a tape. In this case, list the details under "A continuación detallo..." as you would in a normal written report. Add "También le incluyo, para su comprobación, una cinta grabada..." as the next paragraph. The following paragraph should begin with "En base a los detalles arriba enumerados y la cinta adjunta ruego a usted..."

The European response was much more rewarding. While many of the Europeans are considered to be automatic verifiers, I did receive some nice comments regarding my tapes. Considering the large disparity in returns from LA and Europe it would appear that the Europeans are much more interested in receiving reception reports or that Latin America has outrageously corrupt postal personnel.

In closing, can I suggest that Larry Godwin's fine article, "Taped Reports to Foreign Stations" be published again.

REPORT FROM THE PHILIPPINES-- Charles A. Taylor, DeLeon Apts, Sorsogon, Sor. H-318, Philippines

Comment on Mike Worst's Country List of 3/18: Philippines and Indonesia, although island countries, have been traditionally associated with Asia rather than Oceania, even by their own people. Maybe they ought to be listed as such. Ain't no biggie.

On the other hand, using the 50 mile separation criterion, Palawan Island (province of the Philippines) with DYPR-770 and the Sulu Islands (also a province of the Philippines) with DXSM-1220, DXSU-1310, and DXAS-1430, should be counted as separate DX MI countries as logically as Quemoy and Matsu islands of Taiwan. Understand (from NZDX Times, Sept.) that Indonesia intends to shift domestic stations to MW by '79. That will mean several more MI countries by our 50 mile criterion. Despite the fact that DX is a highly individualized hobby, I still prefer to discipline myself according to accepted DX criteria-- I'd prefer that these criteria be a tad bit more consistent. Country Committee take note! That is a biggie.

MONEY GONE

Peace Ship Says 'That's All, Folks'

TEL AVIV (UPI)—Abie Nathan's went out in business Sunday. "That's all, folks," broadcast Capt. Nathan. "Now we wish Salama, shalom and peace, and rest assured we will return." Salama and shalom are the Arabic and Hebrew words for peace.

"To all our friends in Beirut, in Damascus, in Amman, in Tel Aviv and Jerusalem, in Cairo, throughout this whole region, we end this program with love and peace to all of you."

Nathan then checked at Asided, south of Tel Aviv, Aviv.

He said lack of money was responsible for the sinking of his peace project, which he launched after a year of preparation with a vow never to put into an Israeli or Arab port until peace came to the Middle East.

The ship suffered at the outset from financial difficulties. Its crew members quit one by one.

Many of Nathan's young potential donors have been at the frontlines of both sides for a month, cutting into the funds. War taxes levied by Israel and Egypt had diverted money that could have been used for donations.

Nathan said he had raised only \$1,000 of the \$71,000 he needed.

He said that after repairs were completed on the ship he would sail to Marseilles and Rotterdam to try and collect money there to begin broadcasting again next year.

"If I can't get support from the Jews, then I'll just have to look for Christian help," Nathan said.

WHAT IS DX?

Gray Springeour

The constitution of our club says that we are "interested in the hobby of broadcast band DXing." But just what is DX? Yes, DX is distant reception--the reception of distant and weak radio stations. Let's examine that phrase, though. KDKA is distant for us on the West Coast, but KDKA is not DX here. Similarly, CKOK is only 500 watts at night but I don't consider it DX for myself--simply because I can hear it at least 300 nights a year, if I try. Therefore, we've got to add regularity of reception to the definition. DXers mature as they learn their hobby; what was DX for your first season often is old hat for your second, and so on. I got a thrill the first time I heard Japan in September 1964. A little over one year and 30 JJ stations later, I'm still impressed to hear TPs--even if they are only the same ones. It's the unusual that really gets your heart beating, whether it's from another continent, a domestic DX special you didn't expect to hear, an equipment test on a new station close by, or a nighttime regular heard by freak conditions at midday. So let's add the unusual flavor to our definition. But there are also many things that are not DX, and really don't concern a club like

ours. It would be a stretch of anyone's definition to include nighttime reception of a local 5000 watt station, a semi-local 50 kw outlet, or even your hometown graveyarder as DX. That doesn't mean the club isn't interested in news of your local stations (f/c times, strange s/on times, verification policies, etc.). But a report of hearing a local station during the daytime rarely helps any other club member. So if one or the other editor cuts XETRA, or WLS, or WABC or one of your local stations from your Forum report, don't be discouraged. Listen to these stations, verify them, and keep moving on to tougher stations. Ones that really deserve the name of DX. Granted, most of the club members who have been DXing for several years have communications receivers, but don't think that they hear DX (by our definition) only because of their big radios; they've learned where and when to listen, and to recognize stations that are out of the ordinary. They've also gone through the same process of hearing the easy lons first, and finding out just what DX is all about. So if you are interested in DXing, don't get in a rut of just listing those stations that come in S9--go after those stations in foreign languages, pay attention to the tips in DX Monitor (all sections), try the stations you hear weakly under your regulars. It's the only way you'll get the most out of a great hobby!!!

Commentary:

It should be noted that 6.1-36 is a board resolution dealing with taped varies, and covers basically the same grounds as the discussions carried on about the subject since about the first of the year in the various Forum sections. It

should go to the Board in Nov. It was held back to get a general idea on how the board felt about the wording, ideas, etc. first.

6.1-18 adds the editor-in-chief to the list of those signing checks and savings withdrawal slips. During the past two years, Don Erickson was both publisher and E-I-C, and thus the extra name wasn't needed.

6.1-30 is an acceptance of an offer by the NRC to cooperate on a joint f/c list, and avoid the duplication of effort by the two clubs. The list should appear in about a month from when you read this report.

6.1-32 is a By-Laws amendment to correct a "mis-spelling" in kiloHertz in Article II. It now goes to the membership for ratification, which will probably be done in January.

6.1-36 is in recognition of the service given by Larry Godwin over the years to this club. In the past ten years, he helped found the club, served on the Board of Directors, was Chairman of the Board in 1965-7, took over as President when Paul Kirkpatrick resigned in early 1967, served as President in his own right 1967-9, served as S-T from 1969-73, and is serving as our registered agent in Colorado. In addition, he edited a very highly regarded frequency check list, has (and still is) handled the purchase of various publications from World Radio Publications. He also helped Bill Nittler publish the DX Monitor during its first two years of existence. It should be fairly safe to say that nobody else has put into this club the amount of time and effort that he has, with perhaps the exception of Don Erickson.

6.1-29 merely does away with duplication in the club's paperwork, since the S-T has the authority to appoint members to help him with paperwork.

War can't stop Abie Nathan's broadcast

TEL AVIV (AP)—Renewed war didn't stop Abie Nathan from broadcasting for peace from his 50,000-watt pirate radio station aboard a ship in the Mediterranean.

For six months the 46-year-old Israeli has been broadcasting peace messages and songs from the remodeled Dutch coastal vessel.

When renewed fighting started, he moved the ship to a point 30 miles from the Suez Canal and broadcast songs like "Give Peace a Chance."

Correspondents reported that Israeli troops listened but laughed off his calls to lay down their arms. Now anchored off Tel Aviv, Nathan says the war has disillusioned, but not defeated, him.

"We will broadcast from this ship until lasting peace comes to the Middle East," he said.

The Award is issued by ASSOZIATION JUNGER DXer IN OSTERREICH (adxb-oe) for ARBEITSGEMEINSCHAFT DX (AGDX).

It can be worked by any BCL, SWL or licensed radio amateur.

The Award is issued for verifications (OSL) from at least 25 radio countries, and can be endorsed for 50, 75, 100 and any further 10 countries. The names of bearers of Awards for more than 100 countries will be published in the AGDX Magazine WELTWEIT HOREN.

All bands, all modes, all services (broadcast, amateur bands, utility), individual or mixed.

Either the EDXC or the ARRL-DXCC Land List will be considered.

Applications must include a statement on the mode (s) and list chosen (e. g. „EDXC, mixed“, „DXCC, 2 x SSB“). QSL need not be sent if the application is confirmed by an Award Mana-

ger, 2 licensed amateurs or (with listeners' clubs) 2 club members. The publisher might ask for sample QSLs to prove that the list was correct.

Award fees: In Austria öS 40.— to Girokonto 00665 009908, Zentral-sparkasse der Gemeinde Wien. (Enclose payment slip to your application!)

In the German Federal Republic: DM 5.— to Postcheckkonto 1111 89 - 305 Pscha Han (Sonderkonto Kurz-welle, Klaus-Dieter Rudow, 3011 Letter). (Enclose payment slip to your application!)

In all other countries: 10 IRC (and additional IRCs if airmail and / or registered mail is desired).

Endorsement stickers are available free, but a self-addressed envelope with 1 IRC for postage are required.
