KGGM--somehow the test information got mislaid here at headquarters. The station address, according to the NRC Domestic Log is First National Bank Bldg., Munising, MI 49862.

KLYR will have its quarterly frequency check. Others will be the second Wednesday in May, August, and November. Reports go to Mr. Roy Forrester, KLYR, P.O. Box 188, Clarksville, AR 72830. Arranged by Karl Forth for IRCA.

Radio Anguilla will test from 0130-0330. The time originally set for the test was EST, so you might try an hour later as well. R.G. Dunlop, the Director of the station, says they ran a test about three years ago, and were pleased with the results. Address: Radio Anguilla, The Valley, Anguilla, W.I. Arranged by Bob Lucier for NNRC.

KFCB will hold its test on the fourth Friday of each month. They will dedicate a portion of their test to IRCA. The test will consist of 1000 hertz tone. Send reports to KFCB, Box 110, Redfield, SD 57469. Arranged by Darryl Belanger for IRCA.

Karl Forth reports that WHCO-1230, Sparta, IL tested on Feb. 3 at 0630 EDT with 1 kw, according to information from Tom McCormack.

## FLASH TIPS AND CPC RESULTS

Karl Forth reports that the CE from KFAY called to tell that the distortion analyzer needed for a variety of frequencies was not available, but he agreed to conduct the test as scheduled. Karl says the signal was poor, but IDs were heard at 0325 and 0355. Bob Neal in Forbestown, CA, didn't hear KFAY 0330-0400. KTMS was in like a 50 kwer with adult rock. WREN was deep under. No tones where heard.

Bob also reports not hearing KIAK-970 0440-0530. There were several on the frequency, none good, with XEJ and an UnID with easy listening music dominant. No tones were heard.

Bob also reports not hearing KCRA 0400-0430. KCPX was dominant with kid rock; another UnID was deep under. No tones were heard. Since KCRA is only 70 miles from Bob, he feels that they were not on the air at all.

Eldon Luoma reports that CHPQ are the calls for the new 1370 station at Parksville-Qualicum Beach, B.C., some 20 miles north of Nainaimo on Vancouver Island. Basically the station relays CHUB-1570 except for two hours of programming between 0700-0900 LT daily, when local programming is on. The station is owned and operated by the Nanaimo Broadcasting Company (CHUB's licensee); Eldon suggests

sending DX reports to the technical department of CHUB. CHPQ is 1000 watts NSP.

CKAY-1500, Duncan, B.C., signs off at 0000 LT and on at 0° 600 LT daily. Format is Free-Form Country (non-top 40 or non-current country) music. They have a wide range of lesser emphasized songs, some current hits, and lots of golden country music. Power is 5 kw day, 1 kw night. This from Eldon Luoma.

Pete Kemp reports, via the NY Daily News, that WNYC-830, has asked the FCC to allow it to broadcast starting at 0600, instead of 0700, daily. The additional time would be used to program "Traveler's TimeTable," a variety of announcements including school closings, transportation problems, and road conditions. WNYC-AM currently operates beyond its original daytime allocation under a Special Service Authorization granted during World War II. In addition to WNYC's encroachment on WCCO's nighttime clear channel signal, they have petitioned the FCC to boost their power to 50 kw with a directional power and permanently extended hours.

Svenn Martinsen, Bergen Norway, reports that the Dutch government has now signed the Strasbourg treaty and will make the North Sea pirates (R. Veronica-557, 10kw; Nordzee International-1367, 60 kw; Mi Amigo-1187, 50kw; Seagull-1187, 50 kw; and Atlantis-1115, 500 watts) illegal, but the treaty will not be made effective before "one" (presumably Veronica) has been included in the N.O.S.

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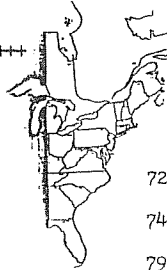

The SM-2 leads the list of loops at 9, the older SM-1 coming in 2'nd at 5. 4 contributors report using the Sanserino FET loop, all on the WC & HI. Home-designed loops abound, and only 2 report the NRC AA loop. Interesting!

Re the Foxworth proposal (as detailed in the 1/19 DXWW), I am 100% in favor of including LW b/cast reception in DXM but I don't believe any constitutional amendment is required. LW reception (down to about 150 kHz) is related to, and therefore sheds light on, BCB phenomena in much the same way that, for example, 2 MHz BC stns such as Pyongyang on 2850 & Fukien on 2600 kHz shed light on, specifically, Far East BCB reception in eastern NA and, to a lesser extent, Trans-Arctic MW reception generally. Thus such coverage, on an appropriately limited basis, is already constitutional. Ironically, this has been my position for about the last 20 years. So I guess what it really takes to prove a DX point is persistence - first R. Swan and now long wave, hi.

It is fascinating to speculate on what DXers might be able to hear if all U.S. stations observed a 5 hour silent period each night beginning at midnight local time. Something of that sort may even happen if the government ever decides that the energy shortage is critical. I think a nightly silent period would bring on regular reception of Japan on 830 on the East Coast as probably its first result. Secondly, the Japanese at 770, 670 would be heard back East, but 670 reception would have to wait until the Cuban fades out in the morning. I believe that IYZ and KGU could be heard back to the Atlantic in any WJR SP on 760. 3LO on 770 would be another likely catch in the East along with other Aussies and Zedders. In the 1930-32 period every DXer on the East Coast found it easier to get Japan, N.Z. and Australia than to get Europe or South America. Many EC DXers claimed 7 or more Japanese, 3 or 4 in Australia, a couple in N.Z., but virtually no one claimed any more than 2 or 3 in Europe or South America.

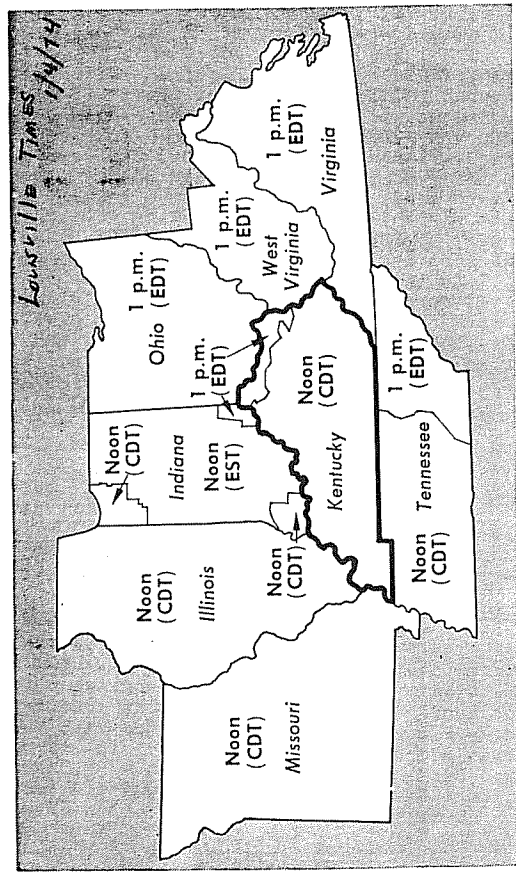

## STATES OF THE MONTH

The sparsely populated Dakotas are two of the harder states for DXers to log. There are no large powerful stations so the DXer has to rely on quick openings, regular checks, tone twists and plenty of good luck to log these states at any distance.

Look for KFGO - 790 and KFYZ - 550 from North Dakota and WNAX - 570 and K500 - 1140 from South Dakota. Several stns have fine groundwave coverage, KFYZ? WNAX? KSJB - 600, so try these at sunrise and sunset.

### NORTH DAKOTA

- 550 KFYZ Bismarck, 5000 D&N AN 6 SP MM 0100-0600, Top 40 RR. Superb day coverage to 6 states, broad night beam N. Best to WC MM before KBOW sign on. Has been hrd right to EC tho not as often now with WGR Buffalo MSP. Editor has tape w: KFYZ u: WGR so still possible. Notorious non-verifier.
- 600 KSJB Jamestown, 5000 D&N, AN 6 SP MM, C & W. Figure eight pattern day and night NE to Ont and SW to Wyoming. One to look for. To EC w: WMT - Iowa. QSL card.
- 790 KFGO Fargo, 5000 D&N, 0600 (0700) - 0200 (0130) C & W. Probably best bet for state. Fine coverage, similar to above two despite higher frequency. They run a r:c every month which makes it well to the EC on an uncluttered channel (2nd MM). Night pattern is all N but KFGO uses day pattern for frequency check. Sends a green v:l.
- 900 KFNW Fargo, 1000d, PSA 425w, religious. Exc groundwave sig N to Man & to NW out over CKDR. E, sunset at s:off to Ind. w: rel. nx. Nice v:l, bumper sticker and program guide.
- 970 WDAY Fargo, 5000 D&N, 0630 - 0200, MoR. ND days and directional nights north - south with null for KQAQ Austin Minn. MM s:on occ to WC and s:off N to Canada. Blocked E by a host of stns though has broken through to Mich at SSS.
- 1270 KBOM Bismark, 1000:250, 0700 (0800) -0200 (0000), ND. Rare days to Man, even more remote nights w: KWEE & KNWC. Despite low power should do better with ND signal. Most attractive QSL card.
- 1310 KNOX Grand Forks, 5000 D&N, AN SP MM, RR, ND days, broad NE beam nights. Good D&N N to Man, weakly nights G to Mich. w:g
- 1360 KEYZ Williston, 5000 D&N, 0700-0100, ND days, beams N nights. Easy to WC on MM b4 KMO 0745 s:on. Fine days to Sask, poor nights w: KSCJ & WBAY. No way E. Sends a v:l with a coverage map.
- 1430 KTYN Minot, 5000d, C&W, 'Kitten Radio.' Often to WC after 0700 s:on w: KLO QRM. Good days to Man. Sends a very friendly v:l mentioning receiving rpts from B.C., Edmonton, Alaska, Iowa, Cal, Okla, Oreg, Utah, Colo, Ont, Arizona, Ill, Wash, Hawaii, and Ind.
- 1550 KQWB Fargo, 5000d, PSA 500, Top 40 R&R, poor day signal N to Man, weak E to Mich at SSS. v:l or v:s on CM.

### SOUTH DAKOTA

- 570 WNAX Yanton, 5000 D&N, AM SP MM (?) ND days, wide NW beam nights w: SG null. Best G on day pattern at SSS b4 pattern change. Can make it nights to GC w: WMCA & WEXA if WKBN off. Occasionally tests MM w: day pattern & can be well hrd then. Fabulous daytime coverage. Sends a xerox copy or a verification card.

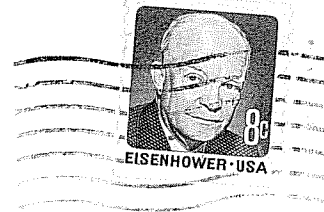

I would be inclined to count it as the studio location, London, England. My intuition says that each signal is travelling independent of the others, meaning that the lower powered ones get absorbed and only the stronger ones get through. So for now at least I'd say counting the studio instead of the transmitter(s) is the safest approach. 73 for now.
