FLASH TIPS AND CPC RESULTS

WCHL which tested on Feb. 11, reported to Skip Dabelstein, who arranged the test, that the purpose of the test was to test each transmitter for their night pattern. Programming was contemporary music with many IDs. The CE, Rick Edwards, would like reports to be as accurate as possible, with exact times. The test used the following transmitters and antennas: 0300-0315, main transmitter non-directional; 0315-0330, alternate main transmitter non-directional; 0330-0345, alternate main transmitter directional; 0345-0400 main transmitter directional. If you heard them and haven't sent them a report yet, the address is WCHL, 1721 East Franklin St., Chapel Hill, NC 27514.

WBCW-1530 is on the air, per Joe Gerring of "13Q"(WKTQ) Pittsburgh, where Brian Cartwright heard a mention on 2/4 that he has a 10-12 show, at least since then. WJNL prohibited Brian from hearing that morning at sunrise.

British Columbia will not go to DST this winter, according to Jon Pearkings. It will start the usual time in April. The announcement was made just 24 hours after B.C. premier Barrett announced that the government would definitely go ahead with DST as scheduled, but there were hints that the decision was not final.

Bill Hardy reports that Idaho is now evidently on DST throughout the state. The exemption to the Mountain Time part of the state to stay on MST (= PDT) was granted only until such time as the state legislature could take action to make the exemption permanent. Evidently such action hasn't taken place, as Bill heard KGEM-1140 using MDT TCs on 2/5.

Mike Mitock notes that the truckers' strike might keep mail from getting through. The independent truckers who haul mail from Lorain to the main P.O. in Cleveland are not working, and the Lorain P.O. was taking only small amounts of First Class Mail and Airmail to Cleveland by their own small trucks. Mike warns that he has received little mail other than local, so reports sent to him might be delayed, as might be delivery of bulletins.

930 WTRZ NY JOHNSTOWN; Weak u/WBEN 1500 1/24. I couldn't figure out who WIR Q was until I recalled U.S. "Z" (zee) and not "Zed" as up here. (EF) (All my lists show this as WIZR. unless my lists are wrong, you may have WIRD-920, Lake Placid, NY....mrm)

1000 *WSUM* OH PARMA; Had OC-ET 1/25 from 0112-24 s/off. Tough copy (uh-huh). (ELK)

KLIF TX DALLAS; 1/30 1930 Good, w/mx and IDs. Reported. (GLG)

1240 WJTN NY JAMESTOWN; Really clobbered the opposition 1/25 between 0141-55 w/"The All Night Show" (catchy name, that!). Solid S-3. (ELK)

1250**KFAY**AR FAYETTEVILLE; 1/28, only tentative on IRCA DX 0330+, w/CHWO & others on air. COMMENTARY:

The Board has approved two more By-Laws changes. While there are slight differences between the handling of certified mail and registered mail, the main purpose of registered mail is to provide insurance for valuables, where monetary value is declared. Thus, I feel we are better off with the lower costs of certified mail if the need should arise again. Let's hope it doesn't.

Under proposal 6.1-63 (amending proposal 2.1-98) members are requested to submit nine copies of a proposal they wish the Board to consider. The copies are distributed this way: one to each BoD member; one to the Secretary-Treasurer (who has no vote, but does receive a copy of the Board letter); and one for the permanent club files. Short proposals do not need all the copies as they will be included within the board letter itself.

Bruce Portzer will be taking over the Graveyards DX Records column, which was first handled by John Zondlo, and later by Mike Hogan. I understand the files are in Poway, so there will be a delay in getting them up to Bruce.

There seems to be a rumour cropping up around the club that the SDPC is unravelling fairly fast. While Father Jack and I have not been able to find out what is causing these persistent rumours, it would seem to boil down to two things. First, the SDPC has divided the workload there to suit their individual needs and personal workloads. Thus, Father Jack has taken over some functions that one would expect the publisher to handle, simply because he has the time available to him.

Also, the shift of a permanent address to Father Jack has come about due to the filing of the application for a second class mailing permit. The Postal Service requires a permanent office address where a club official can be reached during normal business hours. Since Grant lives alone, works days with frequent overtime, the club was forced to go with Father Jack. Grant is still the publisher.

On hand is a proposal to amend the constitution, by-laws and editorial policy to permit the inclusion of long wave material in the DXWW section. The constitutional amendment will have to be debated at the 1974 business meeting before it goes to the club for ratification. If anyone wants a copy of this two page proposal submitted by Robert Foxworth, drop me a postcard at Box 2048, Gary, Ind. 46409. Ron Schatz mentioned this proposal in a DXWW column, dated 1/19/74.

Despite rumors which apparently have reached Rick Evans. San Diego Publishing Committee is alive and well. As Rick has indicated in his President's Report, perhaps our modus operandi is different from what might be expected, and as a result, perhaps some might have felt that there was dissention or lack of cooperation.

Nothing could be farther from the truth. There are five regulars who assemble DX Monitor each week. Each contributes considerably to the effort.

The process of publishing a bulletin begins when Round-ups, Forums, Special Features, etc., are received at SDPC HQ, Grant Manning's home. The material is assembled and taped onto large sheets of white paper; filler material is added to make up the twelve pages common to most issues.

Monday morning, FJP makes a 15 mile round trip to San Diego Printers and drops off the camera-ready copy. Friday afternoon, he makes the trip again and picks up the bulletins which have been printed and collated (gathered together) by the printer.

Saturday morning, two cars usually wend their way to Poway. Randy Seaver, sometimes accompanied by Linda, makes an 80 mile round trip from his home near the Mexican border. A car pool, with FJP, Albert Lobel, (sometimes Helene Lobel), and Dave Stroup, alternates from Albert's home in El Cajon (60 miles round trip) or FJP's (50), to Poway. So far, gas hasn't been that short here.

Once in Poway, the crew joins Grant to fold, staple, label, and stamp the bulletins. Others who occasionally join the crew include John Kolb, Ralph Sanserino (from Huntington Beach, 100 miles north), and Jim Campbell. The process takes 2-4 hours, depending on how many people happen to show up that week. Publishing sessions usually begin about 10 AM. They turn out to be social gatherings as much as work sessions. Anyone who happens to be in the San Diego area on Saturday is invited to join the crew.

During the work session, the mailman usually arrives with the last installments of the next week's bulletin, and the process begins again. On the way home, the car pool drops off the finished bulletins at the main postoffice in San Diego.

During the week, Grant receives all incoming mail and sends out information sheets and samples. FJP types up the stencils for the mailing labels and runs off reprints in his spare time on the copy machine at his school (paying for them later). Various members of the crew count out stationery and package it for mailing.

The most time consuming parts of the publishing sessions are labelling and stamping the bulletins. We have proposed to the BoD that an addressing machine be purchased to simplify the process of addressing. When we obtain our second-class mailing permit, it won't be necessary to paste stamps on, so the time involved in publishing at present can be shortened, and the gained time can be devoted to putting out a better bulletin.

"Right now I don't think I can ever go back to sleep again," Scott said later in the morning.

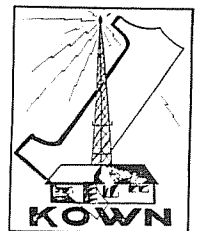
But falling asleep at the switch "is something that happens to all night people at one time or another," he said.
