#### POSTAGE INCREASES

With last week's issue, postage rates have increased from 8c to 10c for first class and from 11c to 13c for airmail. International airmail has gone up from 21c per half-ounce to 26c. These increases will cost IRCA about \$300 per year. For the time being, at least, there will be no increase in subscription rates. For one thing, our second-class application is still being processed. Even though second-class rates also have gone up, there will be a considerable savings in postage when the application is approved. Secondly, the club has enough funds in reserve to compensate for the additional postage costs for some time. The membership will certainly be notified if and when a subscription increase becomes necessary.

**\$50 million for CBC**  
**to add 600 stations**

The federal government is giving the CBC a \$50-million grant that will allow the network to build 600 more radio and TV stations, to carry signals into every community in the country with a population of more than 500.

By the time the extension is completed, in five years, CBC radio and TV will reach more than 99 per cent of Canadians. At present CBC-TV serves 94.7 per cent, including 96.5 per cent of English-speaking Canadians.

The grant, announced yesterday, by Secretary of State Hugh Faulkner, will answer the most insistent demand faced by the CBC, for extension of service into more than 300 small communities that now lack either radio or TV or both.

The new stations will not originate programs of their own, but will be satellites of existing stations. However, they will be equipped to re-

ceive provincial or regional programs applying to their own part of the country. The CBC is under heavy pressure to provide that sort of regional and intra-provincial service.

Without the special grant, the CBC would have been able to do only about half this amount of extension work in the five-year period. Once the new stations are opened, it will cost the CBC about \$12 million a year to maintain them and feed them programs, by either satellite or microwave.

Mr. Faulkner announced the program in a speech to radio and TV arts students at Ryerson Polytechnical Institute.

On Monday, the CBC goes before the Canadian Radio-Television Commission with an application for a five-year renewal of its national broadcast licence. At least 300 briefs critical of the corporation have been filed with the CRTC.

Colombian Political Elections

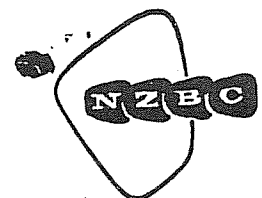
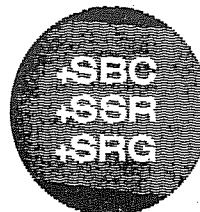

Political announcements are already running heavy on the HJ's, some of them even sung, and it dominates the newscasts. Here's some background to help prepare you for that forthcoming Monday morning:

Colombian political divisions consist of 22 "departamentos", 4 "intendencias", and 4 "comisarias". To be elected are "el Presidente", 118 to the "Senado", and some 210 to the "Cámara". Various "diputados" are to be elected to the "Asambleas Departamentales". The two major political parties are the "Liberal" (accent last syllable) and the "Conservador". Segun the constitution, it's the Liberal's turn this time to elect the Presidente.

The principal "departamentos" & their major cities include: Cundinamarca (Bogotá), Antioquia (Medellín), Valle (Cali), Boyacá (Tunja), Santander (Bucaramanga), Atlántico (Barranquilla), Tolima (Ibagué), and Bolívar (Cartagena). § Major "cadenas" (networks) include CARACOL, Todelar, & RCN.

# An OK for 4-Year FCC Licensing

Washington

The House Communications Subcommittee yesterday adopted a bill to license broadcast stations for four years instead of three after changing two controversial provisions.

One provision by Representative Lionel Van Deerin (Dem-Calif.), inserted at a meeting last October, would have turned over a station license to any challenger who "demonstrates" his proposed service would be "clearly superior."

In its place, the subcommittee adopted a provision saying the Federal Communications Commission shall establish "procedures for broadcast stations to ascertain the needs, views and interests" of its listeners.

If the station is "substantially responsive" to these, the license would be renewed.

The FCC would be permitted to prescribe different procedures for different categories of stations.

This is a compromise between Van Deerin's approach and one by Representative Clarance J. Brown (Dem-Ohio), who wanted a two-stage hearing. Brown wanted the FCC to rule first that a station hadn't performed in the public interest and then conduct a second hearing with all applicants.

The other provision that was changed would have directed the FCC to "conduct a study of the social, economic, political and other consequences" of dual ownership of stations and newspapers. A report to the subcommittee would be required within two years.

In its place the subcommittee provided that the FCC shall within six months after the legislation becomes law complete all action appropriate relating to multiple ownership of radio and TV stations.

## McIntire sea radio banned

CAMDEN, N. J. (AP) — The Rev. Carl McIntire cannot legally broadcast from the high seas, a federal court order said yesterday.

U.S. District Judge Mitchell H. Cohen issued a permanent restraining order prohibiting the fundamentalist preacher from broadcasting aboard a ship beyond the U.S. territorial limits, where McIntire claimed he did not need a federal license.

The Federal Communications Commission had sought to silence "Radio Free America" last summer after McIntire began broadcasting from a converted World War II minesweeper 12 miles off Cape May, N.J.

Cohen's ruling makes his temporary restraining order permanent. In his opinion, the judge said McIntire's defense did not answer FCC charges that the "pirate" station had interfered with licensed radio transmissions.

McIntire argued the government had "unclean hands" because it had sought to take the conservative preacher off the air for criticizing President Nixon.

Cohen cited an "overriding national interest" in supporting the FCC contention that McIntire's broadcasts were illegal.

McIntire has not indicated whether he will appeal the ruling.

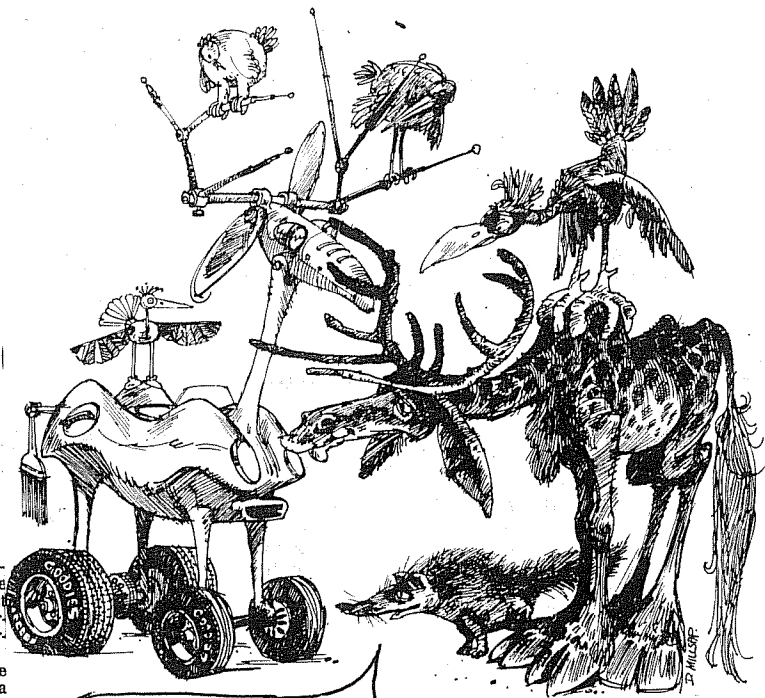

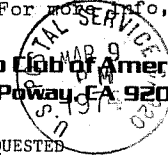
