Greetings. Right now I don't have my DX-150A with me. All I've got here is a clock radio. One thing nice about this place is the lack of locals. A local for me is something 180 miles away. The DX should be very good here with no FM stations at all unless you use the 120' TV tower on the station. The power supply here puts out a very bad line noise wiping out the band from 780-1370. The only way to get around that is to use batteries. One thing you don't do here is tape off the radio as we get a beep every 12 seconds from the radar antennas and when you replay it back, you get twice as many beeps. Since Alsask is on the border, you could say I live in Saskatchewan but work in Alberta, so I'm almost living in the 'Wild Rose Country'. 73's

Will be in Europe all summer; please hold all correspondence till September.

Here's a report on the February 11 DX Test run by WQGN-1400, Munising, Michigan. Manager Paul E. Petosky is an enthusiastic DXer himself, currently most active in TVDX. Daytime power of 1,000 watts, march music, tones and frequent IDs were employed during the 4-5am EDT hour. Only four reports were received, but they were all good, detailed ones. Most distant was Kermit Geary, Walnutport, PA, about 700 miles, with Carl Dabelstein, Lincoln, NE a close second. Also reporting were Robert Kramer, Chicago and Len Kruse, Dubuque, IA. As the arranger, I was particularly pleased that the test added a new station to Len's already immense log. Three of the reports were on NRC stationary (all different versions), and one on IRCA. Paul says he would like to run more tests every quarter, so you might express your interest to him, and indicate whether you feel the 4-5 am slot will suffer the least QRM, as we surmised. 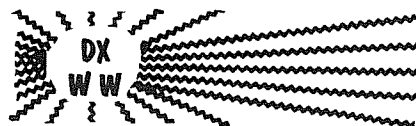

Argentine Radio Station Destroyed

BUENOS AIRES (UPI) —Guerrillas destroyed a radio station and bombs damaged seven offices, including an American cultural institute, in the industrial city of Cordoba Saturday in a wave of violence touched off by the arrival of a new federal administrator.

In a separate incident in Resistencia, farther north, members of the same guerrilla group that attacked the radio station—and is holding an Ameri-

can businessman and two Argentine army colonels hostage—killed a policeman and wounded another in an attempt to steal weapons, police said.

Hundreds of Cordoba youths demonstrated in the streets Friday night hours after Duilio Brunello took power as federal administrator in the central Argentine province, replacing leftist Gov. Ricardo Obregon Cano who was forced to resign by a 2-week-long uprising of Cordoba police and heavi-

ly armed right-wing civilian supporters.

Fifty persons were detained after the crowds supporting Obregon Cano set fire to a car.

By Saturday morning, seven bombs had exploded throughout Cordoba.

GRAVEYARD DX RECORDS

I am now in receipt of all the GY Records info. What I intend to do with it is to republish the listings started by John Zondlo a couple of years ago. I had thought about listing the record breakers only but decided to list everything, for the benefit of the newer members.

In case you are new to the club and don't know what graveyard DX Records is, it's a listing of the stations on each of the local channels (1230, 1240, 1340, 1400, 1450, & 1490) which lists the person who has heard them from the greatest distance and the number of miles between him and the station.

If you have already sent in a list of your GY catches, I probably have it and you only have to send in a list of your "record breakers." If you are a newer member, send in a list of your GY catches and if any of them break the previous record you'll be listed.

For the time being, let's use the following guidelines:

1. Stations need only be heard, not verified on paper or tape, and info such as date, time, programming is unnecessary. All I need is call, location, and frequency. I will compute the distance myself.
2. Reception should be from a permanent or semi-permanent location, including your present address, former home address, college or military address, etc. For the time being at least do not include catches heard while on vacation, at conventions, etc. If your location when you heard the station was different than your present one, please say what it was.
3. Since the purpose of the listing is to encourage competition the record holder on a particular station may be a present or former member, living or deceased.
4. For interests sake, stations now off the air and those that have changed frequency may be listed.

The first GYDXR will be 1230. Deadline is April 23. 73. bp.

3 Held in Radio Extortion Case

As We See It

Canton, Ohio

Three persons, including a 19-year-old college sophomore, were being held in Stark county jail yesterday on charges of extortion after they allegedly tried to force a New York radio station to broadcast their views.

The FBI at Cleveland said the trio, Larry N. Cooper, 26; Gwendolyn McCutcheon, 21; and Wooster College student Carol Holmes, called radio station WABC several times Saturday demanding air time and threatening to kill a hostage if their demand was not met.

The station was told to provide four hours of broadcast time for a taped statement, the FBI said. The three threatened to commit

suicide after killing their hostage, a spokesman WABC said.

In New York, a WABC spokesman said the callers wanted the air time to discuss prison reform and other issues pertaining to the nation's legal system.

The three surrendered to authorities on Saturday after officers surrounded the building they were in, the FBI said.

No hostage was found.

The FBI said Cooper is the director and Miss McCutcheon an associate of a group known as the Alternative Political Action committee.

The FBI describes the committee as a nonprofit service organization.

□ The Thanks of a Grateful Nation go this week to Hittman Associates, Inc. In this Year of the Shortfall, the Hittman men have apparently solved a shortage before it even began.

We speak of the recently proposed Viewing Shortage, or broadcast curfew. The idea was to order all TV (and radio) stations off the air earlier at night, with a hoped-for energy saving as viewers tuned out and turned in.

□ The FCC offered no opinion, but it did estimate that TV and radio stations and sets used a grand total of 143 million kilowatt-hours a day. The National Association of Broadcasters then hired Hittman to make an estimate too. Not surprisingly, Hittman concluded that the FCC's figure was right on. The Hittman people added that the curfew's effect would be "negligible." In fact, they said, even if broadcasting were banned 10 hours a day—for three peak-demand hours (4-7 P.M.) and seven late-night hours (11 P.M.-6 A.M.)—there would be a saving of only about one-tenth of one per cent of the Nation's "energy budget."

Hats were still in the air and cheers still echoed when relieved broadcasters heard that TV can conserve energy even without a curfew. For warmth, Hittman pointed out, TV sets are "almost as efficient as electric heaters."

□ It is understandable that Hittman, as an employee of the NAB, would seek not only facts, but also a silver lining to make TV look even better than it actually is. But here they have gone overboard. After all, the TV set that warms a room this winter will also make it hotter this summer, prompting some viewers to turn on air conditioners. No saving there, eh, Hittman?

Let's just say a curfew wouldn't be worth the effort, expense and inconvenience—and hope we've heard the last of a U.S. Viewing Shortage.

For years, since the beginnings of radio and DXing back in the 20's, the pursuit of an acknowledgment card or letter from a station heard has become, for some, as important as the initial logging of the station. Some DXers undoubtedly like to receive colorful cards, pennants or whatever. Others like to receive mail from across the country or around the world. Many believe that the "verie" from the station is the only way to prove reception.

Nowadays many DXers believe that the receipt of a verification has no part in hearing the station, or in the hobby at all. Others have abandoned the "written verification" in favor of tapes.

Perhaps verifying stations is not as important as hearing them, but no DXer can say that writing reception reports and receiving letters, cards or whatever is not a major part of the hobby. Granted, it is only a part of DXing and not all DXers engage in it but most do. The pursuit/receipt of verifications is one of the most interesting and challenging parts of the hobby and is what this new IRCA column will deal with.

This will be strictly a feature type column, some information from time to time but no real station "tips." I will welcome membership contributions and at the end of each column will print a list of upcoming columns so you can send in your opinions comments, etc. on them. Experts, old-timers, and those who have been particularly active in verifying stations will also be consulted for their views on specific topics.

The first thing many DXers look for in a verification column of any kind is tips to help improve the number of returns and things like "How to write a reception report." These topics will of course be covered but will be only a small part of the total content. There are also several "debates" about how a report should be sent: form letter vs. personal report, etc.

The type of veries will also be explored, QSL cards, letters, rate cards with a verification text written on them. I know many DXers who prefer different types of verifications and look forward to receiving a letter more than a card.

What is a "verie" and what constitutes true verification? Good question. There are no set guidelines for DXers as what should be regarded as verification and what should be regarded as acknowledgement. One DXer may require a well-worded statement from the Chief Engineer listing time, date and frequency while another may accept a survey chart or coverage map with no text at all.

Just as any DXer has had his great experiences while DXing, what your reception report may bring can sometimes be amazing or humorous. Like that CE up in Minnesota who used to live a matter of blocks away from you. Remember

that station that you and a friend of yours got that same night?
