Well, at this time of year, most reporters are probably involved in intellectual pursuits, such as studying for final exams, seeking the wily trout under the bridge, or observing the warbler migration (I knew you'd get a laugh out of that, hi). Regarding Bill Estes' last Forum report, the amount of sunspot activity determines the amount of ionization in the upper atmosphere. The more ionization, the more rapidly the skywave is bent back to earth. Also, the lower the frequency, the more rapidly it is bent back. So if we consider

reception on a given night from, say, Hawaii, it is quite likely that (in Central DX Land) a BCB skywave at 1 mhz will be bent back to earth too quickly to reach our shack. A short wave at 10 mhz will be bent just right, and FM at 100 mhz will not be bent enough, and fly off into space. If solar activity is very low the shortwaves will also suffer from not being bent enough (though such conditions might be excellent for BCB DX). All of this convinces me that we sure could use a good, simple special features article on propagation. I'll volunteer, but if somebody else thinks they can do a better job (no doubt many could) it's their baby. I also wholeheartedly agree with those who still prefer to receive DXM by 1st class mail. You originally contracted to get it that way, and you have a right to see your contract fulfilled. 73 till next time-JCK

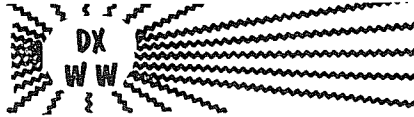

Casual ID's as "8-10 Radio". Mentioned celebration of first anniversary w/stn tours, etc. Daytime pgmg is Soul, w/ghetto-accented DJ (RFS)

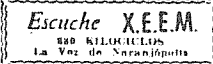
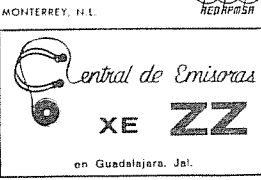

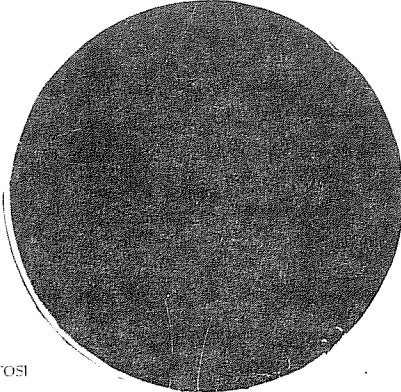
