The Handicapped Aid Program has formed a Planning Committee to work on details for a universal committee to promote, construct and distribute information about and for HAP projects. The HAP International Coordinating Committee (HICC) has been set up.

HAP was begun in 1972 by SPEEDX, but it is now completely independent, except for a column in SPEEDX. It is now an inter-club organization. HAP has over 50 members. At present there are two chapters, one in England and one in Canada. The following services are given free to members: club memberships (some at half cost), Pen Pals, equipment, handbooks, Blind DXers Course by Arthur Cushen, translations, plus instructions on an informal basis and in a monthly newsletter, Spearhead.

HAP is presently beginning its year-end fund drive, to raise funds for free memberships, etc. Donors should send their contributions to HAP Headquarters, 6805 Woodland Ct., Coloma, MI 49038. Please include your club affiliation. HAP will notify each club of donors and the total contributed. This is a worthy cause, so please help.

HAP has recently revised its policies to include BCB, Utility, FM, and TV DXers as well as SW DXers.

HAP feels that each HAPie should contribute to the bulletins of all clubs they belong to, to show their interest in the club and the hobby.

(Ed. Note-- at present IRCA does not have any set policy regarding HAP. We haven't been asked yet officially to contribute a membership/subscription to a HAPie. Perhaps this might be something that we as an organization could do to promote further fellowship among DXers. Let's hear your comments in DX Forum. FJP)

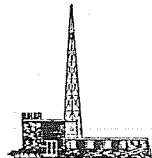

Skip Dabelstein tells us he didn't arrange the CJKD test. Ron Sibbit, the CE of the station, is a member of NRC and set up the test.

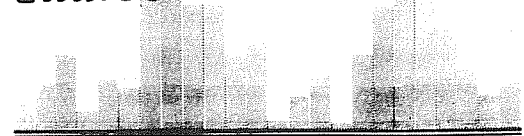

Conditions were relatively good through 12 October and then became severely disturbed for a large portion of 13 October, following a sudden commencement geomagnetic disturbance which began 1244 UT 12 October. Conditions improved 14 October but were moderately disturbed again 15 October. Conditions should be unsettled 17-24 October.

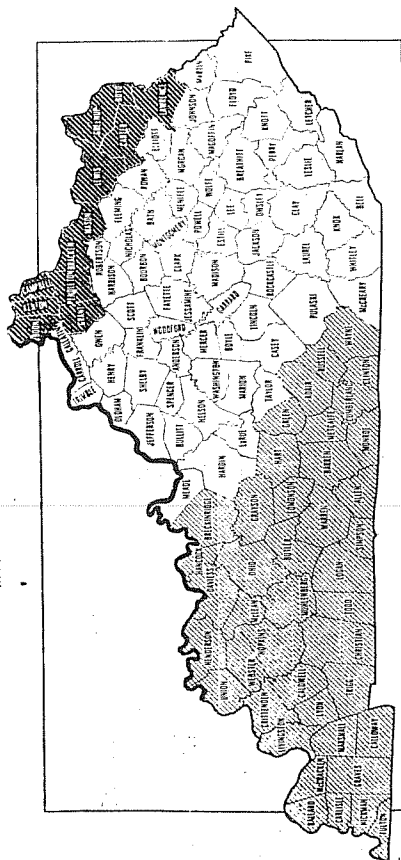

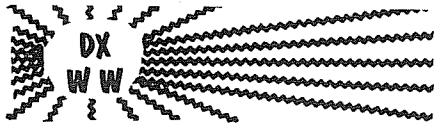

Ye ed has been corresponding for some time with Carlos Maslatón of Buenos Aires, Argentina, who is also a member of the nascent Buenos Aires DX Club. Carlos is a DXer of the SW, as well as MW. Perhaps this will come as a surprise to some of you, but apparently MW DXing does exist as a hobby down there although possibly not as independent of SW DXing as here in Anglo NA. Carlos reports reception of HJED, 820; WLAG, 1510; HOA 95, 1510; HRH6, 1340; R. Tequendama, 770; ZNS1, 1540; and R. Disco, 1500, Colombia. Also says he has verified WLAG and has a report to WCKY. Carlos mentions some interest in becoming a member of the IRCA, also.

In view of that possibility, I would like to suggest that serious thought be given to mailing the DX Monitor overseas on lightweight paper. It seems that postage becomes a very significant portion of total bulletin cost for an overseas member. Secondly, since we have assumed the name

International Radio Club of America, we should take more positive steps to see that it become even more international. Sending only DXWW to international members strikes me as a second rate compromise approach.

Carlos says (translated): 'Originally, the "y" was called "I griega" in Argentina. Now it is also called "Ye." Contrarywise to México, the "w" is called "Doble vé," rather than "Doble u."

(Plain Truth, Oct Nov 1974) King Hussein is now planning to install a two-million watt radio station at Amman, and time will be made to the Worldwide Church of God on this possibly unprecedented superpower station.

Why not start a graveyard with all the superpower stations in the world on it?

(C.M. Stanbury II) SAUDI ARABIA
Saudi Arabia plans to operate from two new MW sites according to a document received from a Mid East source. At Dubai (on the Red Sea not far from Sinai) they will have two parallel million-watt xmtr's on 548 kHz and two-million-watt xmtr's on 1520 kHz. At Querayat they will have two million-watt xmtr's on 611 kHz and two 500 kW xmtr's on 899 kHz. Presumably this will mean alterations in the existing facilities on 347 at Riyadh and on 610 at Jeddah. (This should have been credited to SHORT WAVE NEWS SERVICE via Stan. Sorry for the lateness on this, Stan. ed.)

MALTA

(SCDX B1290) The Independent Broadcasting Authority Malta is on 998 kHz from perhaps 0400 to 2100 as Radio Malta No. 1. Radio Malta No. 3 has just been put on the air, intended for international broadcasts. It is now currently giving test transmissions on 755 kHz 0700 to 1000. When it has come into full operation, there will be programmes in English, French and Italian. Addr. of Radio Malta is: National Road, Plata 1-Bajda, Malta. The station is said to appreciate rec. reports on both MW stations.

BRASIL

(SCDX B1294) A number of Brazilian MW stations can be heard on their harmonic Fq's. One example is Rádio Clube de Riberão Preto, São Paulo. Their fundamental fq is 1090 kHz, but they can be heard on the third harmonic fq of 3270 as well.

BRITAIN

(SCDX B1294) IBA station Radio City, Liverpool, is to run test broadcasts prior to the start of regular transmissions by Oct 1974. The MW channel will be 1546 kHz, broadcasting with 5 kW power from Rainford. Also to use this channel, and to commence regular transmissions by Nov Dec, 1974, will be Radio Forth, Edinburgh. Power will be 1.6 kW, location Barns Farm

COLOMBIA

(SCDX B1293) Acc. to a recent verification, Radio Nacional de Colombia, Ministerio de Comunicaciones Intransivión, Bogotá, now broadcasts on 570 and 680 kHz.

COSTA RICA

(C.M. Stanbury II) A current Continental Electronic brochure reads as follows: "Continental designed and built the first super power transmitter for the Voice of America. Delivering 1000,000 watts of continuous power to the antenna, it was installed at Munich in 1953 (173 kHz, ed.) Similar Continental 1,000,000 watt broadcast transmitters are installed in Okinawa (Okuma VOA 1178, ed.), the Philippines (Poro Point, San Fernando, La Union 1140, ed) Thailand (Saraburi Prov. 1580, ed.), Central America and Egypt." To the best of my knowledge the only million watt BC XMTR to ever operate in Central America was that tested by La Voz de la Victor in the late 60's on 625 kHz (entirely without commercials), used briefly by the Christian Broadcasting Net-

work at the end of 1969 (into Jan. 19 70) and then completely disappeared from the scene. But-- even though a new, apparently much lower powered station (R. Omega) has taken over the 625 spot in San José--the Continental statement clearly implies that this super power XMTR is still installed in Central America.

Stan has broached a point that is fascinating to me: Where is the Continental 1 MW transmitter that was used by La Voz de la Victor? Has anyone bothered to write to Continental to determine if they have current information on this critter? Did any of our more enlightened members measure the frequency of La Voz de la Victor when it was using 1 MW? Currently, Radio Omega's frequency is 625,492 Hz. If R. Omega is using the Continental Xmtr excitor plus some low powered stages, as its current Xmtr, the current frequency ought to agree with that of Victor's 1 MW. If not, chances are that the two are entirely distinct Xmtrs. If they agree in frequency, there is an implication that the Continental 1 MW Xmtr was at least partially dismantled to provide material for the R. Omega Xmtr. If not, the implication is that the Continental 1MW Xmtr is unused and possibly destined for further use.

Stan realizes something that perhaps fellow Northamerican DXers do not: We cannot expect the world's governments to be as free and open with information about their respective broadcasting configuration, as the CRTC and FCC are (or even comparatively, the Mexican SCOP). Sometimes one must aggressively monitor and seek sources of information when official information is not forthcoming, or is at variance with the facts. One wades through haystacks to find the needle of truth. Often the conclusions are erroneous. We know that the CIA has its hands in many pies, and we must sometimes out-spy them. The DXista norteamericano is spoilt, with his Jones Log, his NRC map book, his NRC Domestic log, and his Broadcasting Yearbook. He often expects his foreign sources of information to reflect the truth...often they don't. I learned my lesson well researching and monitoring Sabah, Filipino and Taiwan broadcasters (not to mention the PRC) End of editorial 73 del CAT.

GERMANY, Federal Republic
(SCDX B1293) Every Sat. at 1545 there is a programme of interest to all German speaking DXers broadcast by Süddeutscher Rundfunk, Stuttgart, on 575 kHz. Every 4th Sat. you can hear the "Kurzwel-lenbummel," otherwise there is a programme of technical advice about radio reception, quadrophony, tests of recorders, etc. Recently there has been also a series of presentations of German language broadcasts in Europe with recorded illustrations, and in the near future there will be some programmes dealing with the MW reception.

GUINEA BISSAU
(SCDX B1294) When the Rep. of Guinea Bissau became an independent state on Sept. 10, the supervision of Emissora Nacional's regional station in Guinea was taken over by the PAIGC and renamed "Rádio Bissau". At the same time, the "Rádio Libera-tion" (prob Rádio Liberação, ed.) that has been operated by the PAIGC, stopped broadcasting.

INTERNATIONAL WATERS
(C.M.Stanbury II)Netherland's new anti-pirate legislation is definitely to go into effect Sept.1. R. Northsea International, Veronica, Atlantis will all cease broadcasts on or by Oct. 31. Radio Caroline says it will continue from a new anchor age but still in Northwest Europe. RNI says that after a refit it will anchor off Italy as R. Nova International named for the owner's plush Nova Parkhotel in Zurich. Provisional starting date

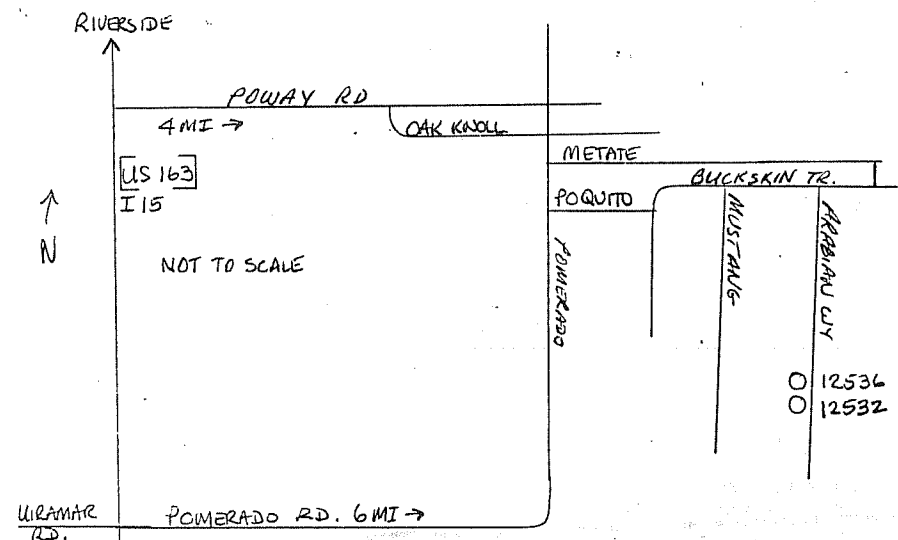
for R. Nova International is Oct 13 with tests before that date.

DAYLIGHT SAVING ENDS OCT. 27 Congress has passed and the President has signed legislation returning the United States to standard time from 2 a.m. (local times) Sun., 10/27/74, to Sun., 2/23/75. This means that the U.S. will be back in step with most of Canada for all but two months of the upcoming DX season.

As most of you know, Congress (at the President's request) instituted year-round daylight saving time last winter during the energy crisis. DST began in most of the U.S. on 1/6/74. Hawaii, Arizona, and part of Indiana opted to stay on standard time, and Kentucky juggled its time zones. Idaho stayed on standard time (except the Pacific zone, which did go to DST) for four weeks, then decided to go on DST statewide in Feb.

The effects at that time were to make Canadian stns seem to s/on an hour later and stay on an hour later as far as U.S. DXers were concerned. Canadians found, based on the standard time they stayed on till late April, that U.S. stns were signing on an hour earlier and going off an hour earlier. These circumstances may have resulted in some new catches for a few DXers. They will return this February, when the U.S. goes on DST two months ahead of Canada.

Winter DST was unpopular in the U.S., especially in the northern latitudes, when school children had to leave for school in the dark. It also provided very minimam energy conservation - maybe as little as 3%.

One effect of year-round DST that will disappear, according to 10/14/74 Broadcasting (used by permission), is the emergency pre-sunrise authority (PSA) for a few hundred stns. The FCC had granted 50-watt PSA's (WLIB-1190 got a special 100-watt PSA so they could cover Harlem) to stns who had to stay off the air till local sunrise because of U.S. Class I-A stns to the west of them; they could use the 50-watt PSA for one hour before sunrise from the last Sunday in Oct. to the last Sunday in April. The FCC has rescinded those temporary PSA's from 10/27 till 2/23, but stns who had them will be able to use them from 2/23 till 4/27/75.

KQRX-720 TOWER DAMAGED Item from the 10/14/74 issue of Broadcasting (used by permission):
 "Authorities Friday (10/11) were investigating possible sabotage or vandalism of portion of three-element directional array that had been completed just two days before (Oct. 9) for new KQRX(AM) Las Vegas. Carl Jones, part owner of permittee Radio Nevada and principal Gauthney Jones, Washington consulting engineers, said bolts on 392-foot east tower evidently had been cut Thursday, collapsing structure. Damage was estimated at \$50,000."

The latest updated NRG Log puts KQRX on 720, 50 kw-D, 10 kw-N, DA-N (U2). No address given except for Zip Code 89101. KQRX is the second-last Class II-A assignment to be made on 11 U.S. II-A channels made available for powerful West Coast operations in the early 1960's. The only remaining II-A channel is 890 kHz for assignment in Utah, and early this year, competing applications were filed by KDXU-1450 and another applicant for St. George, Utah on 890, so that will take a hearing to straighten out.

Meanwhile, KQRX-720 should be on testing soon, and after that, they'll be on RS within a few months. Better DX on 720 while you still can! -BH.

KAAY-1090, TWO OTHERS BEING SOLD IRCA Special Features does not report every little sale announced or approved by the FCC, since in most cases the stns format and facilities change, and you get 30 days' notice of any call letter changes anyway. However, we like to let you know about sales involving some of the 50 kw stns (which obviously are bigger DX targets, as well as familiar to a lot more of you).

Oct. 7 and 14 issues of Broadcasting (used by permission) report the sale of three AM and an associated FM stn by LIN Broadcasting Corp. to Multimedia Inc. The three AM's being sold are KAAY-1090 Little Rock, Ark., 50 kw, DA-N (U2); KEEL-710 Shreveport, La., 50 kw-D, 5 kw-N, DA-2 (U4), and its sister KHEQ(FM); and WAKY-790 Louisville, Ky., 5 kw-D, 1 kw-N, DA-2 (U4). Multimedia owns WFBC-1330 (plus FM-TV) Greenville, S.C.; WBIR-1240 (plus FM-TV) Knoxville, Tenn.; WMAZ-940 (plus FM-TV) Macon, Ga.; WWNC-570 Asheville, N.C.; and WXII(TV) Winston-Salem, N.C. LIN has contracted to buy WBAP-TV Fort Worth, Texas, and is keeping WBBF-950 (plus WBFB, FM) Rochester, N.Y.; WFIL-560 Philadelphia, Pa.; WIL-1430 (plus KFMS-FM) St. Louis, Mo.; KILT-610 (plus FM) Houston, Tex.; WAND(TV) Decatur, Ill.; and WAVY-TV Portsmouth-Norfolk-Newport News, Va.

Whether Multimedia changes anything or not remains to be seen. If you see anything about format changes, call changes, change in hours of operation, or anything like that in your local newspaper, if you live in the Little Rock, Shreveport, or Louisville areas; or if you hear any format or hours change - why not mention it in a Forum report? And any definite changes should go to the DXR's tool! -Bill Hardy.

WMAQ-670 MAY GO COUNTRY A record industry trade publication suggests that WMAQ, NBC-owned 50 kw outlet in Chicago, is gearing up for a format change to country music. Chicago's major country-music outlet presently is WJJD-1160, limited-time 50-kw-DA stn operating from Chicago sunrise to KSL sunset, which has a country FM stn also. WMAQ was still using a pop-rock format on 8/18, but if you start hearing C&W on 670 kHz, don't think that WSM is off frequency! -BH.

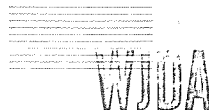

Use of Broadcast Facilities by Political Candidates. The Commission has released a Public Notice designed to afford guidance to broadcast licensees with respect to the limitations which may be imposed on the right of political candidates to use broadcast facilities. Specifically, the Commission made clear a licensee may not deny access to prime time by candidates for federal office nor arbitrarily deny candidates for any public office the right to purchase the various lengths and/or types of spot announcement which are available to commercial advertisers. Although licensee discretion is not foreclosed, the Commission states that it would be unreasonable for a licensee to adopt a rigid policy of refusing to sell prime time programming to legally qualified candidates for federal elective office. Prime time as used by the Commission means evening hours for television and drive time for radio.

Posting of Operator Licenses. The Commission has revised its Rules to eliminate the posting of operator licenses in AM, FM and television broadcast stations. It is now permissible to put the license in a binder or in a folder and retain it at the control point. Licensees are no longer required to have the licenses posted on the wall at the control point. Additionally, the Commission clarified its rule to require that operator's licenses must be available at the control point during both on-duty and off-duty hours so long as the operator is in the employ of the station, either full-time, part-time or on a contract basis.

Application of the Fairness Doctrine. The Commission has issued a report which concluded an inquiry it began in 1971 on the effectiveness of the Fairness Doctrine. The Commission reiterated the basic two-fold duty of the Fairness Doctrine is that broadcasters must devote a reasonable percentage of time to the coverage of public issues and coverage of these issues must be fair in the sense that it provides an opportunity for presentation of contrasting viewpoints. The Commission will continue to rely heavily on reasonable and good faith judgments of licensees in determining what constitutes a controversial issue and how to insure both sides are presented. The doctrine will not, however, be applied to standard product commercials except where paid announcements are obviously and meaningfully devoted to the discussion of public issues. However, false and misleading advertising should not be accepted by licensees. The Commission also stated that it will continue to consider all fairness complaints at any time, but charges of news misrepresentation will not be investigated unless substantial extrinsic evidence is presented which on its face reflects deliberate distortion.

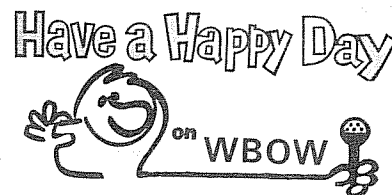
Newspaper-Broadcast Station Cross-Ownership. The Commission heard two and a half days of oral argument on the question of whether it should require the breakup of commonly owned newspapers and broadcast properties in the same market. The Department of Justice, which originally proposed the rule, argued that on economic and antitrust theory no one entity should be allowed such combinations. Broadcasters and newspapers generally argued no evidence had been presented to show abuses which would justify divestiture of such combinations. The Commission hopes to make a decision in this matter this fall.

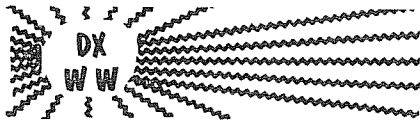
Aug.-Sept. 1974—Religious Broadcasting—

On 10/15 had C&W pgm 1335-1400, mentioned "country music time" at 1335. At 1348 mentioned "Australia" & "New South Wales". On 10/17 noted Simon & Garfunkle at 1413. Who? (Godwin) § UnID heard 10/18 1306-1425 w/jazz pgm & Glenn Miller type sounds. At 1400 mx ended & ancr said "You're listening to ..." followed by 5 pips, same pitch as ABC pips. Then more jazz (no other anmts). I thought all ABC stns had 6 pips as IS. I'm not ruling out 6WF here (Godwin) Maybe either you or the stn lost count?? (RFS)

As I remember, this is the characteristic IS for NHK & also for N. & S. Korea. No mention of NHK on the hour like they used to. I remember from Berkeley I used to hear NHK stns s/off at 1500 giving call-letter ID's, so I'm waiting for those shorter days in November & December! (Godwin)
- 1178^c JAPAN, Okinawa, VOA is so strong here some AM's, it's incredible. Monitored 9/26 & 27 between 1330-1400, by far the best time slot to hear this one, as its antennas favour NA reception (Should be audible as far east as Texas/Kansas for sure). DJAKARTA, INDONESIA (NRB)-Four years ago it was estimated that there were more radio stations per square mile in Indonesia than any other country in the world. At that time there were nearly 350 stations in the capital city of Djakarta:

Since that time, strict government regulations have reduced the number of stations considerably. Stations are licensed locally, making it difficult to list all that are in operation, although estimates currently stand at 350 for the entire country.

Yaski Studio in Djakarta has taken advantage in this interest in radio. The studio has offered its expertise to persons interested in establishing radio stations or receiving help with stations already on the air. Consequently, Yaski Studio has developed a network of about 80 stations which air programs produced in Yaski Studio in Djakarta.

Yaski Studio is an Indonesian sister organization to FEBEC. It currently receives some financial support from the Far East Broadcasting Company, although increasing local support is making it more self-sufficient. The studio produces programs for use on international shortwave stations operated by FEBEC, as well as the network of stations in Indonesia. Programs include "Science Corner," Christian drama and preaching programs. The programs are distributed on high quality cassettes.

Yaski Studio has offered extensive consultation to cooperating stations regarding studio design, transmitter layout and other technical subjects. Two "how to do it" books on programming and technical problems have been produced jointly with a local Christian publishing foundation.
