DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA. WTOP-1500 nightly w/xlnt sigs., Pest. WJAL-630 some ME's w/good sigs. (RCM-QU) WTOP-1500 (TRS-NJ)

FLORIDA. WAFB-690 easy on winter SSS, esp. when auroral takes out CBF. WHEL is hrd w/good sig on strong auroral nights, w/little QRM. (TW-VA). Nothing regular here. WINZ-940 appears often on auroral cx after local CBM s/off. Poor-good sigs. On heavy auroral cx, gets bombed by LA's. WJAM-560 not too often on auroral cx but can be hrd if you wait long enuf. (RCM-QU). WINZ-940 (TRS-NJ). None hrd (GS-IL, AD-WI). WJAL-1560 hrd once or twice w/assorted QRM (BP, PB-WA). WOA-1180 many evenings w/KOPI QRM (BP-CA)

GEORGIA. USB-750 (everybody-everywhere).

HAWAII. KORI-650 (TRS-NJ). KORI easiest eves & AM w/ WSM QRM. KGU-760, KPB-590, KHWI-550, KTKL-830, & KAIM-870 also often hrd (BP, PB-WA) KORI-650 hrd once one AM (BP-CA)

IDAHO. Not hrd yet but KBOI-670 or KPEH-1140 would be my best chances (TRS-NJ). Odds of pests, easiest during the evening include KBOI-670, KGERL-1140, KIDC-630, KFXD-580, KQWI-930, KTKR-1310, KRIC-1350, & KAIM-1340 (BP, PB-WA) KBOI-670 by far the easiest, KTFI-1270, KGRN-1140, KRIC-1350, & KIDC-630 hrd many eves also (BP-CA).



Reports should be as detailed as possible, with interference, propagation conditions, type of receiving antenna, SINPO or SIN codes are okay. Brad Hart, Transmitter Engineer, is a member of IRCA. Geomagnetic Indices



October 23-29 5 31 17 23 20 23 16

Radio conditions should have been fair to good in the period 31 October- 6 November, in a portion of the 27-day recurrent cycle when geomagnetic conditions tend to be quiet. A recurrent geomagnetic disturbance is expected to begin about 8 November and be associated with disturbed radio conditions 9-14 November.

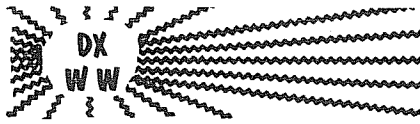

... MEXICO, D.F., XERPM 10/14 0755 noted w/R&R & Full ID on hour resembling "XERPM, desde la capital de México, sur 660 kcs" or similar. Taped ID but too lazy to check tape. 0957 to 1230, 1230 to 1357 irregularly, and 1357 to 2100. On 1473 kHz are programmes broadcast in English 1000 to 1145, 1630 to 1800, 1830 to 1930, and in Greek 1145 to 1230 and 1800 to 1830. After 3 weeks Radio Bayrak has verified a reception report with a nice verification card. The report was addressed to: Radio Bayrak, Ataturk Square, Nicosia, Cyprus (SCDX B #1296)

GERMANY, Federal Republic of: The DX Programme of Radio Deutsche Welle, which for the time being is broadcast in German and English every 2nd Tuesday of the Month, will as from Nov. onwards instead be aired on every second Sat. of the month. As we reported three weeks ago, there is a DX broadcast in German every 4th Sat. of the month by Süddeutscher Rundfunk on 575 and 6030 kHz at 1545. And also RIAS, Berlin, broadcasts a monthly DX programme, viz. on the 1st Sat. of the month at 1100 to 1130 on 6005 kHz (SCDX B#1295)

That last SW article got past me, rats.

MOÇAMBIQUE: Radio Clube de Moçambique, Lourenço Marques is operated by the Armed Forces since Sep 11. The "A" programme is on 24 hrs schedule on 737 kHz. The "C" programme was still not back on the air as of Sept. 13. Quelimane is on the air mainly in the Chua language and some Portuguese throughout the day. The stations in Inhambane and Fôro Amélia are relaying Lourenço Marques. "A Voz de Moçambique" via Lourenço Marques in the Ronga and Shangaan dialects is on the air 24hrs on 1223 kHz. A new station has opened in Moçambique. It is "A Voz das Fôrças Armadas" (the Voice of the Armed Forces) heard on 1484 kHz broadcast ing African and Portuguese music. It does not appear to be the old Rádio Mocidade which has been active (inactive, ed) since April 25. The new station has been noted at 1730 until after 2000. (SCDX B#1294)

El Perú: This country, since last week suffering from another terrible earthquake, was recently visited by our friend Jürgen Knoppek, Hamburg, W. Germany. He found that Radio Sudamericana, Piura, on 750 kHz, no longer exists. Among the Peruvian stations still to be heard are Radio Océano de Huancayo, which got new installations in June 1974 and operates 1100 to 0400 on 1350 kHz, with 1.5kW Radio Sideral, Pucallpa, operates on 590 kHz with 1 kW 1100 to 0500 (SCDX B#1296)

CAMEROON: The French firm Thomson-CSF has got a contract for a transmitter centre at Ekoa near Yaoundé. There will be three MW transmitters of 20 kW each, which will be operational within 30 months. At the same time the broadcasting house in Yaoundé will be enlarged. (SCDX B#1295)

TAHITI: Acc. to schedules received, ORTF, Radio Tahiti, 410 Rue Dumont d'Urville, 125 Papeete, Tahiti, has an output of 20 kW on 740 kHz. Most of the programmes are in French and Tahitian, but there are also programmes in Spanish and English. There are news broadcasts daily except Sun. in English at 0900 and in Spanish at 1000, according to a printed schedule. Also in English at 1900 and in Spanish at 2000. (SCDX B#1293)

U.S.S.R: With reference to Sweden Calling DXers 1286, Radio Moscow in a DX Club programme on Sept 22 at 1040Z denied and contradicted that DXing in the Soviet Union is to be prohibited at that Soviet DXers will be prosecuted (SCDX B#1296)

HORST Rauch, 87 Wuerzburg, Ullandstrasse 4, W. Germany is working on a USSR MW and CW (SW: ed) list. Any information would be appreciated.

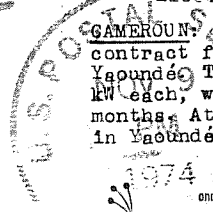
VATICAN CITY: The local MW transmitter of 5 kW has now moved from 782 to 1259 kHz and broadcasts programmes in various foreign languages 0930 to 1115. (SCDX B#1295)

ZAIRE: La Voix du Zaire, Lubumbashi, is not currently using its MW frequency. (SCDX B#1294)
