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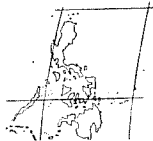

As threatened in last number, I'm going to do something called Focus, in essence the same as past "Country of the Month" columns, but under a new name to avoid the fact that many a month has past since a country has been featured. This Focus is on the Republic of the Philippines...



**FOCUS:**  
ANG REPUBLIKA NG PILIPINAS  
THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES

Home of more than 200 mediumwave broadcast stations, the Philippines is one of the most illusive countries in the Far East for the North American mediumwave DXer.

Despite having three 50-kW stations, a 40-kW station, a 25-kW station, and numerous 10-kW stations, the Philippines is rarely heard even on the North American West Coast.

An exception to this generality is, of course, Poro "A" 1140 kHz, located at Poro Point, San Fernando, La Union. Poro "A" seems to be reported nearly every season.

That DZ's "get out" is doubtless. The DZ's are routine in Australia and New Zealand, and often reported in Europe. My own experience bears this out. I was stationed at Sa Dec, Republic of Viet Nam in 1969 to 1970, with the U.S. Navy. During this period, DZ's were noted in abundance across the mediumwave dial. In fact, while stationed there in the Delta, I often listened to the programs of music and drama on DZAQ (now DWXX), 620 kHz, in Quezon City, using a Panasonic portable HF-6070 during early morning watches.

Then, why are DZ's so illusive in North America?

Consult a good atlas, one that will show the topographical features of the Luzon Island, where the Greater Manila Area and the nation's high powered mediumwave stations are located. Along the East Coast of Luzon, one will observe the Sierra Madre mountain range. Easily visible from the east side of the Manila area, this range of mountains,

running the length of Luzon as a backbone, constitutes horizon blockage from azimuths of nearly 0° to lower than 90°, blocking off radiation at the low vertical angles of departure necessary to propagate a usable signal to North America.

Fortunately, there are some signals available from unblocked areas in Luzon, the Visayas, and Mindanao. Some of these are presently split channel frequencies, although they will probably be ordered to return to their assigned 10 kHz waveplan channel in a year or so.

**End of Focus**

**PHILIPPINES:** Former DZEL, 690 kHz, Legazpi City, reopened last month as DWGW under ownership of the Banahaw Broadcasting Center ("BBC"), according to Cielito Vita, CE of DWGW. This brings to four the former ABS-CBN stations that have been reauthorized under new ownership of BBC. ( ed )

**Philippines:** The Barangay Broadcasting Corporation, which acquired the property of the now defunct ABS-CBN Broadcast Corporation ( silenced by Martial Law declaration P1081 of 21 Sept 72 ), in Nov. 73, has changed corporate name to Banahaw ( bah nah NOW ) Broadcasting Corporation ("BBC", for short ). BBC is operating DWWX, 620, 50 kW ( ex-DZXL ); DWNA, 1160, 10 kW ( ex-DZQL ); DWWO, 1340, 5 kW ( ex-DZOA ) in Quezon City. The several provincial outlets will probably be reauthorized within the year. Current address: Banahaw Broadcasting Corporation, Broadcast Plaza, Bohol Avenue, Cubao, Quezon City. (ed)

**CORAL GABLES, FLA. (NRB)** Radio Lumiere, a 5-station network reaching nearly 94% of Haiti's potential listening audience, is currently stepping up its news handling capabilities. Under the direction of Emmanuel Blaise, the station will use increased ability to present Haitian news events as a springboard for education, cultural and religious programs.

Blaise has just returned from a six-month period of study and work with ORTF (Office Radio Diffusion Television Francaise) in France. During the period of his scholarship with the French government radio network, Blaise spent two months in Monte Carlo and four months in Paris working with the French language activities of the world famous news service. While in France Blaise was in charge of the African desk. He collected news, did interviews and prepared broadcasts for the French Radio's international short-wave service.

As Director of News and Cultural Programming at Radio Lumiere, Blaise will attempt to bring to the Caribbean island a similar radio reporting facility. He is instituting a morning conference with his news staff, teaching research and the art of interviewing in order to more adequately cover the Haitian republic.

West Indies Mission, which operates Radio Lumiere, anticipates that the increased news capabilities should develop a sizable audience which will be carried over into the other areas of the station's programming, including the broadcasting of the gospel message.

**JOS, NIGERIA (NRB)**—Government owned radio stations in Nigeria have asked the "New Life for All" evangelism movement to provide programs for broadcasting in Nigeria.

A heavy schedule of broadcasting over state-operated radio stations is being undertaken. New Life for All reports that they are having difficulty keeping up with the requests.

In January the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation requested NLFA to begin a daily devotional broadcast in Egnlish. Programs are also being done in Hausa, the trade language of West Africa.

**MADISON, NJ (NRB)**—World Religious News is quickly becoming a familiar name to listeners of stations around the world. In its first four months WRN has an impressive record. The unique program/news service is being used by over 100 stations in the United States. 65 overseas stations receive a bi-weekly cassette containing two WRN programs. In addition, a decision by the Board of Chaplains who approve religious programming for American Forces Radio and Television Service (AFRTS) opened the door for WRN to be used on the entire AFRTS network.

Correspondents in every continent are contributing stories and interviews to make the weekly tapes truly international in flavor. During the months of June and July the program was produced in Lausanne, Switzerland, allowing the WRN staff to interview Christian newsmakers attending the International Congress on World Evangelization. During the congress, WRN also produced several special documentaries which were distributed on cassette. WRN, under the direction of Dr. Armstrong, distributed special news and documentary programs in Portuguese, German, Spanish, and French, as well as English.

A toll free WATS line installed in the Madison, New Jersey office has been used by WRN to provide broadcasters with a daily feed on fast breaking news stories. Hundreds of calls have been handled by the equipment during the first few weeks of operation. During the ten days of the International Congress on World Evangelization the WRN filled daily stories which were available and used by stations across the country through the use of the WATS line.

World Religious News is available for use on stations and programs on a free basis. There is a small weekly charge of \$2.00 to cover duplication and distribution charges. Dr. Armstrong is assisted by LaVay Sheldon, who edits the weekly material, and Denny Milgate, the program host.

**WASHINGTON, D.C. (NRB)**—The United States Supreme Court has refused to review a ruling that radio and TV stations can lose their licenses if they fail to "ascertain, understand and evaluate" the content of recorded song lyrics they broadcast. At issue was the broadcasting of songs which "tended to 'promote or glorify' illegal drug usage."


**MONROVIA, LIBERIA (SIM)**—Liberia's President, W. R. Tolbert and Madame Tolbert have pledged to underwrite the cost of producing three English language programs broadcast over ELWA, the radio station of the Sudan Interior Mission.

The President said that ELWA had become "a vital part of the nation's life," and that Liberians should consider themselves fortunate to have a religious broadcasting station.

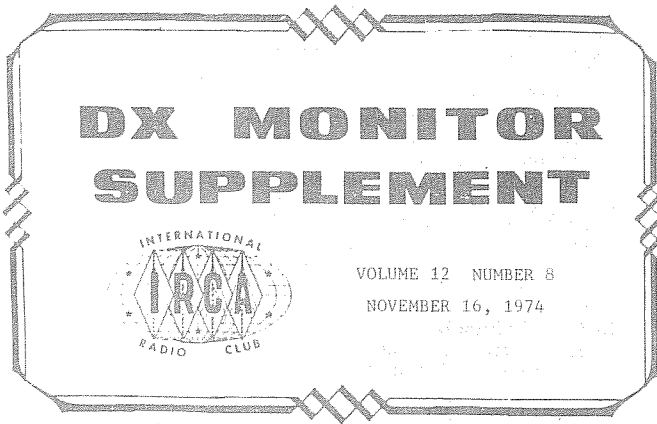

### WRTH-75

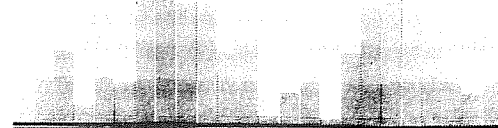
Gilfer Associates has sent out a flyer to the effect that the 1975 edition of the World Radio-TV Handbook is scheduled to be released in early January. This edition will be printed in the U.S., so distribution should be easier. The binding, historically a weak part of WRTH, promises to be stronger, and the type face larger for easier reading. The type-setting will be computerized. Gilfer will ship all copies ordered before Dec. 16 by UPS, First Class Mail, or Air Priority Mail. Delivery time should thus be cut 2 to 3 weeks. Pre-publication prices for these speedy methods of delivery are \$8.95 east of the Mississippi for those in UPS delivery areas; \$9.50 west of the Mississippi via UPS; and \$9.75 for those not in a UPS delivery area (AK, AZ, HI, NV, UT, plus Canada and Mexico). 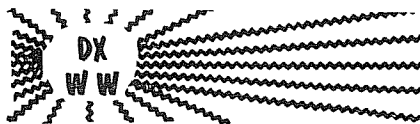

"República" of the Week

We would like to start a new weekly feature in DXWW. Like SoM & PoM it will cover a Latin-American "República" each week. I'll head it off with data on calls, time zone, money, etc., and it will conclude with best bets for logging the country. Experienced DX'ers are requested to submit 2 or 3 "best bets" for each "República" for use in the section. We'll start with Argentina & work down the alphabet to Venezuela. § If response is good we'll start with Argentina 3 issues from this one.

Precision Frequency Measurements

The philosophy of DXWW's tough reporting standards would require that reporters not submit frequencies of greater accuracy than what they can measure themselves. But the other extreme, such as lazily submitting Canajagua as "1045" rather than 1047, is not to be condoned either (A lot of beginning DX-ers seem to assume that all "splits" end in "-5"). Several reporters have asked me to "correct" their frequencies for DXWW where inaccurate equipment may leave the accuracy of their submitted measurements in question, and I shall do so - using key measurements made each MM where time permits me. So - a report of CMJG-1269 for 11/4 will be "adjusted", with out mention in DXWW, to read CMJG-1270.

The following key measurements were made between COCO & O400 MM 11/4. Mean reader's-time accuracy +/- 4 khz:

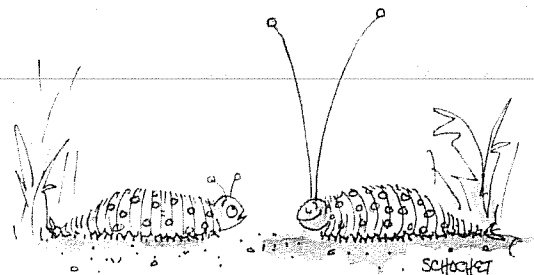

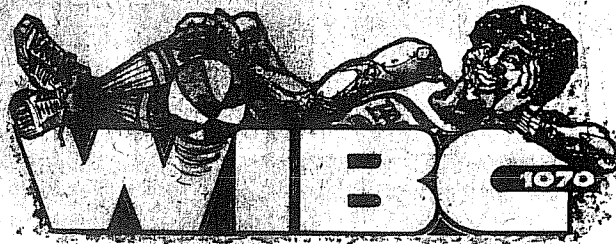
