Radio stations KOME and KBAY stayed on the air despite the blast. Radio station KEEN left the air for a few minutes after the explosion. According to a KEEN DJ, when the bomb went off, everything in the room jumped and a piece of plaster board flew off the wall and onto the turntable, causing the record to skip. STAR STATIONS PLAN TO FIGHT - AND WHY THEY LOST THEIR LICENSES

By now, most of you have read the feature in the 2/8/75 DXM (pp. 287-88) reporting that the FCC has decided to deny license renewals to WIFE-1310, KOIL-1290, KISN-910, WIFE-FM, and KOIL-FM, all owned by Star Stations, whose principal stockholder is Don Burden. The FCC denied the license renewals on the basis of "serious misconduct" in the operation of Star Stations, and we promised to bring you further details of the reasons for denial once we had them. Here, now, is further information, from the Feb. 3 issue of Broadcasting, used by permission.

The magazine says the FCC based its decisions on misdeeds attributed to Burden dating back to 1964 and focused largely on allegations his stations were improperly used to favor political candidates of his choice - and thus to "subvert the political processes" - in 1964 and 1966.

The FCC said Burden favored Senator Vance Hartke (D-Ind.) in 1964 and Oregon's Republican governor, Mark Hatfield, in successful Senate race two years later. The magazine says Burden was also said to have made an illegal corporate gift of \$1,000 to the Hatfield campaign. In both campaigns, the FCC said, "newscasts were used as a vehicle to publicize Burden's preferred candidate - not as an exercise of news judgment, but as a deception of the public and to further his private interests."

The FCC also said: "Criminal provisions of federal statutes governing corporate gifts to candidates were disregarded. Such attempts to use broadcast facilities to subvert the political processes cannot be ignored or condoned."

The FCC vote was 5 to 1, with Commissioner Robert E. Lee the only dissenter, and Commissioner Hooks not participating. Commissioner James Quello, who for years managed WJR-760 Detroit, concurred "reluctantly." Quello said the FCC action was "harsh in the extreme," but that he could find no evidence in the record to warrant any other conclusion.

The FCC had set the five license renewal applications for Burden's stations for a consolidated renewal hearing on 30 issues. A few years back, Hearing Examiner (Administrative Law Judge) Chester Naumowicz, who heard the renewal hearing in Portland, Indianapolis, and maybe Omaha too, had decided to grant all renewal applications except WIFE(AM), and the only reason he had decided not to grant WIFE(AM)'s renewal was that he had decided to grant the competing application of Indianapolis Broadcasters Inc. for WIFE's AM frequency. (Commissioner Lee would have supported the judge's initial decision.) But, as always, initial decisions by FCC hearing examiners are subject to review by the full seven-member Commission. And in overruling Judge Naumowicz, the FCC said he had not given proper consideration to past misconduct of WIFE. The Commission noted that, as a result of one misdeed or another, WIFE-AM-FM had not received a full three-year renewal since Burden bought the stations in 1963.

The Commission rejected contentions by Star Stations that Ron Mercer, general manager of WIFE from 1963 to 1965, was responsible for preferential treatment given Senator Hartke and had duped Burden. The Commission also did not accept the argument that Mercer gave the senator free advertising without Burden's knowledge. And it said Burden was guilty of misrepresentations in denying knowledge of those improprieties.

Broadcasting says Burden promptly announced his decision to carry his fight to the courts. The magazine says Burden said that although he had not yet seen a copy of the FCC order, his attorneys were certain it was "fraught with errors of both fact and law."

So it looks like WIFE-1310, KOIL-1290, and KISN-910, plus their FM's, all stay on the air during the appeals process, which could take months or even years. Even if Burden had a hopeless case against the FCC, the appeals process will at least gain him more time to operate his stations, so he has nothing to lose by appealing. -BH.

- NEW ZEALAND. NZBC has activated two new MW stns recently. On 1120, 4YX in Queenstown, 100 w., sked 1700-0700 (This info conflicts w/WRTH-75--GH); and on 1410, 2YM (or 2YN? GH) Palmerston North, carrying the National Programme 24 hr. (Arthur Cushen's Pacific DX Report, R. Nederland, 2/6, via GH)
- PORTUGAL. Will hold elections on April 12, a Saturday, per 2/10 Seattle Times (BP)

ATLANTIC DX ROUNDUP

- 1502 SPAIN, Sevilla, BAKZ, R. Popular de Sevilla was logged for the first time 1/6 at s/on 0600. Fine signal but I couldn't really follow them too well as they were covered by another UNID Spaniard at about 0605. Definite ID and I think the other stn may have been Bilbao (BLK,OH)
- 1529 VATICAN CITY was logged at s/on 1/27 0628. IS till 0628:30 then bells till 0630. ID then and into Mass. Noted Rosary at 0635. Het on 1530 was noted as early as 0608. First time hrd here and country #78 hrd. Good signal but het and WPR(1) slop hurt as did the QSB. Strangely enough other TAs (1554/1562/1586) were not particularly good that AM (BLK,OH)

- 640 CUBA, La Habana, CHQ 0540 2/3 faintly u/KFI's religious program w/male & fem ancrs giving nx. Hrd often u/KFI whose towers are approx 100 mi away. A strong regular when KFI is off the air (ASL,CA) --- 0645-0715 coming in like a local, no QRM from KFI. Usually nitely here (FAW)
- 645 PARAGUAY, Coronel Oviedo, R. Caaguazú presumed, man & woman w/ads 2/10 0915; splatter from 640; Asunción sunrise this date about 0930, per SPEDX table (GH,OK) --- R. Caaguazú might have been the one here noted in passing one night at end of Jan. (can't remember which). This was at approx 0040. Weak SS; not as good as on MM
- 650 COLOMBIA, Bogotá, HJJK, Emis. Monserrate annd (LMA,MI) 0700 2/3. Held from 0645-0720 when I retired. It was coming in S849. Being an MM, WSM was off the air. Also had a lady ancr. Bells & chimes at 0700 (FAW,PA)
- 655 EL SALVADOR, San Salvador, YSS, R. Nacional 2/3 0110, marimba mx from Guatemala per anmts, complete taped ID 0120, QRM de WNBC & WSB (DM,PA) (You mean WSM? ed)
- 660 COLOMBIA, Cali, R. Uno 1/27 0753-0759, ID 0753, U.S. pop vocals. R. Uno ID by OM at 0755+TC. Sig not too bad (DJW,OR) (Did you hear mention of location? This might be XERPM per format & recent DXWW rpts. We need two R. Unos on 660 like we need more MSPers....ed)
- 660 NICARAGUA, Managua, "Mi Preferida los desca...mejor suerte en el futuro"; 2/10 0918; American romantic mx in EE; a het above 660, this stn is (GH,OK)
- 660 VENEZUELA, Coro, Ondas de los Médanos, 1/27 1001-1006 fadeout. ID 1001, then band mx, good clear ID by OM at 1003. SS vocals followed. First time hrd for me on this one (DJW,OR)
- 699.1 COSTA RICA, San José, R. Reloj hetting W1W 2/10 0845 ID, mx 776006 SW (GH,OK)
- 710 MEXICO, México, D.F., Radiorama is now R. Dos as hrd 2/10 0721 w/record offer, 7 digit phone beginning w/5 (invariably Mexico City); same ripple, whoop-WHOOP-WHOOP as on other digitally identified Organización Radio Fórmula stns (GH,OK)
- 720 COLOMBIA, Barranquilla, HJAN, R. Unidas 2/5 0425-0433 ID 0433, freq+call. Col lively mx, chimes & ID 0445. Then ballads after. Good signal. (DJW,OR)
- 730 UNID, SE pops, ID as "Radio Setenta y Tres" at 0130 2/3 (DM,PA) (Sounds like XEX, Mexico City. ed)
- 760 GUATEMALA, Guatemala, Super R., 0057 2/3 w/ID "Aquí ... en Super Radio." fair w/1940's type inst mx, mixing w/ WJR. Country #20 (DM,PA)
- 760 VENEZUELA, Puerto La Cruz, R. Puerto La Cruz, 2/3 0101, this soon overtook Super and had ID fair w/WJR (DM,PA)
- 777 CUBA, this one drifting way down here on 1/20 0750. Good signal (LMA,MI)
- 780.33 CUBA, the drifter measured here 2/10 0730; E-naturally. Surprised WBBM hasn't donated them a crystal (GH,OK)
- 750 NICARAGUA, Managua, YIK fair o/WSB 0940 1/20 w/m&f ancrs and "Equis" IDs (ECR,CA)

- 800 NETHERLANDS ANTILLES, Bonaire noted good for contest 1/19 1000-1002 w/Bonaire monts on the hr & R. Transmundial ID 1002. Fair sig o/u XEROK/CKOK (ECR,CA)
- 810 COLOMBIA, Bogota atop the freq 1/20 0912 w/R. Sutatenza ID, 0112 TC and Bogota mention (ECR,CA)
- 830 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC, Sto. Domingo, R. HJJB, romantic mx TGs, ID 0045, Ron Brugal ad, good, no sign of WFCO, 2/3
- 830 VENEZUELA, Los Teques, R. Sensación ID 0039 u/HIJB 2/3 (DE)
- 840 HAITI, Cap Haitien, WVEH, 0034 FF rel talk, hymns, on top of WHAS, 2/3, good (DM,PA)
- 840 PANAMA, Panamá w/fantastic sig completely wiping out WHAS 1/20 0930-1005. Lively SS mx w/inrequent IDs. Had mx from "The Sting" 0943. Possibly for the first time over a stn violated Murley's Law by fading up for the ID. Had excellent level at 1000 w/trumpet fanfare, "R. Libertad" (actually sounded more like R. Libertada) and an address "en La Ciudad de Panama". Went into nx after hr. (ECR,CA)
- 885 MONSERRAT, Plymouth, ZJB good 0000 2/9 w/ID as "Zed-J-B", BBC World Service mx (SHM,TK) --- ZJB noted 2/10 1015 w/ hymns in EE. Must start looking for a Malaysian SAH (GH)
- 945 HONDURAS, Tegucigalpa, HRYW, R. Panamericana had just about the best sig I've ever hrd from them 2/3 0525-50 w/the usual program of pop & light classical mx (BLK,OH) (ASL,CA)
- 990 MEXICO, Mexicali, XEGL 0600 2/3 w/"Música Moderna" ID
- 1005 COLOMBIA, Meiva, R. Colosal w/HJ mx at 0743 on 1/20. Fair signal (LMA,MI)
- 1035 HAITI, Cap Haitien, WVEH, 0028 2/3 EE rel talk, ID, Songs in the Night o/m by Moody Bible Institute. QRM de WBE, good (DM,PA)
- 1035 PANAMA, Panamá, HOS21 fair w/live mx, talk, "R. Unión" ID 0659 2/9 (SHM,TK) --- "R. Unión, la onda del deporte" ID 2/10 0653 w/1:52 TC, s/off, giving 1035 kHz & 104.5 MHz, address as Antdo. 3175 (not 8172 as in WRTH 75), Panamá 7, Panamá; NA until 0657 CC. A carrier was also here at 0737 check, perhaps from same stn. Later than WRTH-listed s/off of 0400 (GH,OK)
- 1100 BRAZIL? Well, there is some doubt in my mind now about my assumed logging on 1/13 on basis of Portuguese; does KFAX, by any chance have sermons in that language Mondays around 0317-833? (GH) (Dunno, KING-1090 slop wipes them out at that time. KREX carries SS Sun. nites but would prob be off by then. Can anyone help? ed)
- 1100 BRAZIL, São Paulo, PRG9, R. Nacional was in w/an extra good sig 2/3 0525-0550. Many ads and other anmts make reporting a cinch but how do you get'em to verify? (BLK)
- 1120 COSTA RICA, R. Capital 2/10 0613, full MW, SW ID w/An. 311 address; no KMOX at the time, but a variety of hets under (GH,OK)
- 1175 UNID. This one new here and a real mystery. Logged at 0920-0110 on 2/L. Sports events w/VI ancr at hr & half hr apparently w/ID which I hrd but could not make out. TC given was CST and I thought I hrd Costa Rica mentioned. Reception was fair w/fades at the wrong moments. If C.R. has truly vacated this freq. then it might be El Salvador or a drifter. By the way, this was logged on a very non-audral evening (LMA,MI)
- 1180 BRAZIL, Rio de Janeiro, Globo finally hrd after hundreds of attempts 1/9 0740-0905. Got "Golbo" & "Brasil" mentions at 0740 fading up o/KLOK slop & recognizable snatches of PP till about 1205. At 1205 I caught a 6 note mx box IS which prob originated w/this stn also. My first definite DSA (ECR,CA) --- very good 2/9 w/many mentions of carnival, ID 0705 "Em(?) Carnaval, Globo!" (SHM,TK)
- 1180 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC, Santiago, HIBB, R. Mil 0110 1/30 fair reception, gives ID after every song, emmm., etc. (GG,TK)
- 1180 VENEZUELA, Cd. Ojedá, R. Petrolera suspected here w/mx pgm 2350 on 1/31 (LMA,MI)
- 1190 MEXICO, Mexicali good 1/26 1305 2/"XEBHC, Mexicali, Baja California" ID for contest (ECR,CA)
- 1265 CUBA, Reloj Nacional drifting down here now; well at least on 1/20 at 0810 they were here. Do not know if this is permanent or not. I doubt R. Paradise would be too thrilled (LMA,MI) (This is the one drifting up from 1210; as far as I know the 1270 Reloj is still there (per 2/10 monitoring by RFS). It appears that the 1234 hrd 12/23 by TRS, 1235 on 12/30 by GH, 1246 1/15 by GMS, 1245 1/24 by GMS, 1229 2/3 by RFS, and this one are all the same stn. Sounds like the xmtz needs some repairs. ed)
- 1265 ST. KITTS, R. Paradise on 1/6 at 0950 w/local live gospel mx BC called "Morning Devotions". Very colorful local ancr urging people to get out of bed and get to work. Good signal (LMA,MI)
- 1270 MEXICO, Mazatlán, Sin. XSNK fair o/CHMK 2/2 1230 w/ "Este es ene-equis" IS (ECR,CA)

CONDITION OF THE AIRWAVES

Conditions during the last half of January were quite good, for the most part. Latins were in well, especially 1/19-27. Some DU/Oceania activity was noted 1/23-27, w/1385 & 844 hrd as far inland as Colorado. In keeping with a cycle of roughly four weeks, TP's were hrd by several WC DXers 1/31-2/5. Around 2/8 or so, solar flare activity increased, resulting in unstable ionospheric conditions. MM 2/10 was a complete bust in Seattle, but Glenn Hauser reports "signals (were) generally unsteady, but condx good enough to log a 50-watt beacon in Quito, "UIO" on 1675 kHz!" 

4. Frequencies within parenthesis are alternate frequencies transmitted by the station due to usage of two separate crystal oscillators on alternate days.

We feel that the measurements speak for themselves, that although some stations may be off frequency, their actual frequencies may be quite stable. The above frequencies do not represent all of the five classes, and are not intended to do so.

Numerous comments have come to hand concerning the proposed PFMS column (i.e. precision frequency monitor-survey vide DXWW II.14 of 25 Jan 75). All have been favorable. However, some reservations have been expressed about the utility of such a column. Those reservations center on the assumed propensities toward frequency drift by broadcast stations, especially those outside North America (Mexico excluded)

Actual drift, as typified above, is not an unsurmountable problem. In fact, it will not be a major problem at all to alert DXers. After a year of PFMS, it will be quite obvious as to which stations drift (and the degree and polarity of their drift) and which do not. Perhaps other DXers will discover, as I have, that a station's precise measured frequency may be as useful as human fingerprints, in the face of QRM and changing station names, not to mention the unidentified (especially in the cases of TPs and TAs whose modulation is lost in their journey across the oceans.) More comments are invited. 73 del CAT

Without immediately replying to these assumptions, I will report briefly on my past observations based on approximately 3,000 recorded measurements, done in the Philippines, of South East Asian broadcast stations. These 3,000 measurements, although a small minority of the total number of measurements made over a period of three years (about 10,000 in round numbers), are an excellent statistical representation of the totality.

Stations observed in South East Asia, can be divided into five classes according to their propensities toward frequency drift:

- 1. Stations whose frequencies remain stable over long periods of time.
2. Stations whose frequencies jump between two distinct values, both of which are essentially stable over long periods of time...
3. Stations whose frequencies show a gradual drift, usually in a negative direction, over a long period of time.
4. Stations whose frequencies show small, short-term instabilities...
5. Stations whose frequencies show large short-term instabilities.

Various countries and the corresponding classes of stations that have been observed:

To allow DXers to get a "feel" of what to expect from PFMS, we will present measurements made of Philippine broadcast stations over a period of 13 months:

- 1. Initial frequency is the frequency of the station upon first measurement on or about 28 July 1970.
2. Absolute drift is the sum total of all changes in frequency of the station between the initial measurement and the final measurement on or about 25 August 1971.
3. Relative drift is the difference between the station frequency upon initial measurement and the station frequency upon final measurement.

Radio station tower of Babel?

"What's the closest thing
Winnipeg has to the Tower of
Babel?"

"The transmitting towers
for radio station CKJS!"
That's the kind of joke
which will be making the
rounds come the end of
February.

That's when CKJS expects
to go on the air, broadcasting
in 15 languages and becoming
Manitoba's first full-time
ethnic radio station.

And when station owner
Casimir Stanczykowski says
full-time, he's not kidding.
The station will be on 24
hours a day.

In English. In French. In
German. In Urdu. In
Ukrainian, Polish, Czech,
Slovak, Greek, Portuguese,
Filipino, Yiddish, Hungarian,
Dutch and Russian.

It will all be in AM and
available to 85 per-cent of
Manitoba's population,
according to Mr.
Stanczykowski.

It will broadcast on 810 on
your dial with a power of
10,000 watts from four
transmission towers in St.
Norbert.

The programming, mostly
ethnic music and news, will
be in the time proportion of
60 per-cent French and
English and 40 per-cent
ethnic languages.

Casimir is investing
\$500,000 to open the station.
Included in this figure are
four broadcasting studios and
a newsroom now being built
on the 12th floor of the Union
Tower Building, 191 Lombard

Pl. He plans to hire up to 35
staffers, with Manitobans
getting first preference.

It will be a commercial
station — "Whatever we can
sell within the regulations,"
he says.

Casimir expects the station
to be a hit and he should
know: He runs Montreal's
Station CFMB, one of the
major ethnic radio stations in
North America.

Casimir will stay in
Winnipeg until the station is
in full operation. Then he will
turn it over to local personnel
and return to Montreal.

Why did he choose
Winnipeg for his second
ethnic station?

Mr. Stanczykowski says the
1971 census revealed that 60
per-cent of the residents of
Greater Winnipeg are of an
ethnic neither French nor
English background, and 25
per-cent of them use their
ethnic language at home.

Commission Adopts New Rules on Extension Metering

As a result of a rule making proceeding
instituted to provide greater flexibility in
design of station facilities, new rules have
been adopted which allow operation of a
non-visible transmitter without a remote
control authorization. The new rules re-
quire that the transmitter be located in
the same building not more than one floor
from the normal operating location. Ad-
ditionally, the path from the normal op-
erating position to the transmitter may
be no longer than 100 feet and must pro-
vide the operator with ready access to the
transmitter. Extension meters and mon-
itoring devices must also be close enough
to the operator at his normal operating
position to insure that deviations from
normal indications will be readily ob-
served. The new rules become effective
on February 5, 1975.

House Committee Postpones Vote on All Channel Radio Bill

After two days of hearings on the All
Channel Radio Bill which would require

all factory-installed automobile radios to
be equipped with both AM and FM bands,
the House Rules Committee has voted to
postpone a vote on whether to send the
measure to the floor of the House. Re-
portedly the Committee voted to defer
action since both the bill's supporters and
opponents were not sure they had suf-
ficient votes to win.

The Senate has previously passed a
comparable measure which would require
all radios costing more than \$15.00 to be
equipped with AM and FM bands. The
Senate version of the bill is not restricted
to just car radios.

Sponsorship Identification Phraseology

The FCC in October, 1974 assessed a
fine against an AM station because the
sponsorship identification of certain inter-
view programs sponsored by a local school
board association was not adequate. The
Commission made it plain that announce-
ments such as "presented by," "brought
to you by," etc. do not conform with the
sponsorship identification requirements of
the law and the FCC Rules. Instead for
programs, other than those involving com-
mercial products or services, for which
payment is received by the station, the
FCC position is that the necessary phrase-
ology for sponsorship identification must
include either "sponsored by" or "paid
for by," such as "The Religious Hour is
sponsored by The Religious Hour Evan-
gelistic Association."

Court Reaffirms Commission Powers Against Obscenity

The U.S. Court of Appeals in Washing-
ton has held that the Commission did not
"unconstitutionally infringe on the pub-
lic's right to listening alternatives" when
it determined that a broadcaster violated
the anti-obscenity statute and fined it.
The Court, in reaffirming the Commis-
sion's authority to crack down on broad-
cast of material it considers obscene, held
that the broadcast of explicit discussions
of sexual acts in a titillating context is not
protected by the First Amendment.

Over and over, radio station WNUS-AM played "Midnight at the Oasis" and "Sweet Georgia Brown" Wednesday as a sort of hello and good-by.

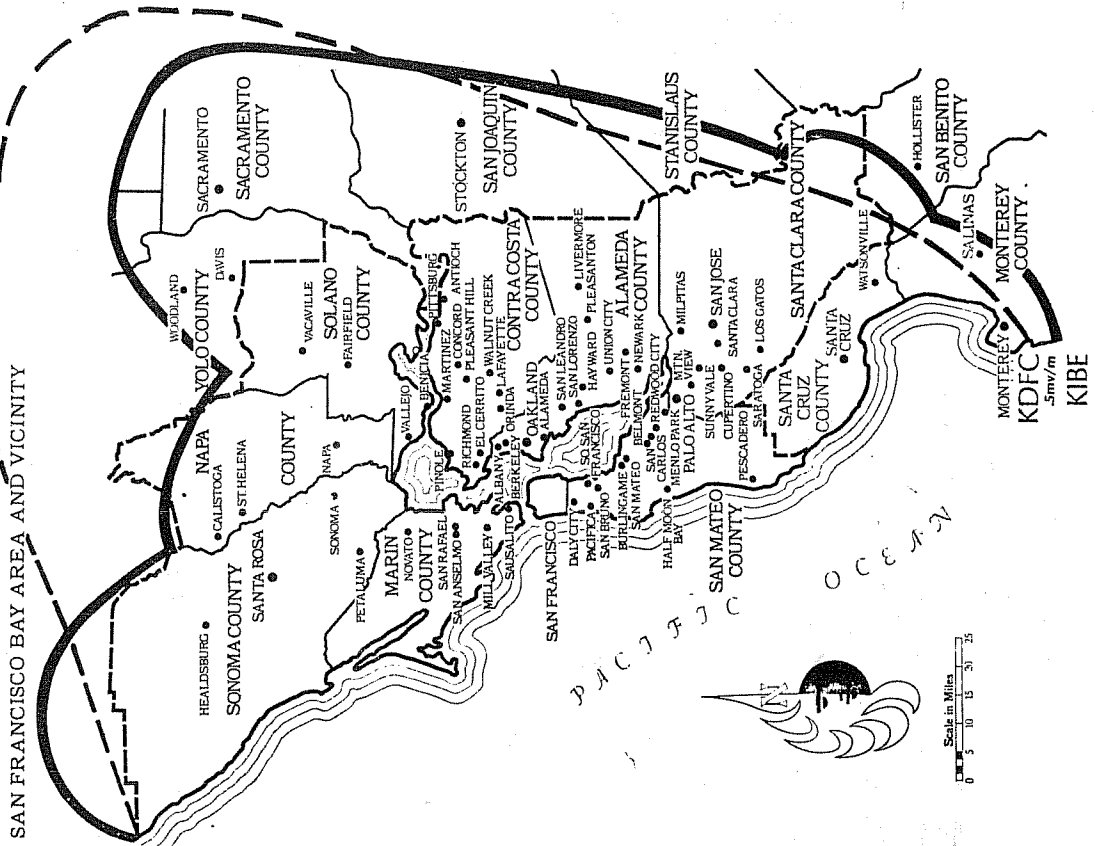

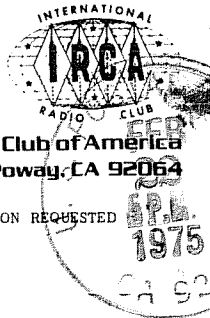
