A forum report has been in the thinking stages for a while. We've moved 1.5 blocks west of 939 Eastern. Ex-NRC and IRCAer Donald Roller and I attended LADS Louisville 1976 NRC Convention. It was quite an experience to see many faces not seen since the 1962 NRC Convention here in Indianapolis, plus many more that were merely names till now. Don is on the verge of a long-considered return to active MW DX; acquisition of a suitable DX machine is the first step. Expect more MW DX rumblings from the Indianapolis area. In the meantime, the 1976-77 MW DX Season is upon us, and I have resolved to be more active in the MW international and domestic DX spheres. Concerning DX machinery here, I completed construction of the MCF-1 Preset Frequency Counter, a device of my own design. For use with PFM, it has 1 ms, 10 ms, 100 ms, and 1 s gate periods. For use with FSA (Frequency Signature Analysis), it has a 10 s gate period. The time base, made by Monitor Products of California, is specified to have a stability of 1 part in 100 million per day, and 2 parts in 100 million per week. The preset mode allows it to be used as an electronic dial with the local oscillator of a receiver, for direct signal frequency readout to 1 kHz. I haven't inter-connected it with the current receiver, an AR-88 (RCA), but that will be done tomorrow or within the week. More work is obviously necessary with the TC, as it is impossible to achieve SAH of less than one-tenth of one second by direct adjustment, although timed SAHs against WSM (which is phase-locked to WWVB Boulder) agree well with the counter readout. Anyone who expects to pass through Indianapolis should contact me, as a visit is in order if possible. 73

WIBU-1240 in Poynette, WI, has recently switched to the NIS all news format. They're now apparently MSP. WIBU puts a good signal into Madison during the day and they are apparently aiming at a Madison audience since Poynette only has about 1,000 people in it. At night, however, WIBU is rather poor here in Madison and I really wonder if it is worth it for WIBU to be AN. If you need a Wisconsin graveyard you can try WIBU on MMs. Other WI CJs that are AN on MM are WDUZ-1400, WDLB-1450, and WLCC-1490. WTSC-1070 and WISM-1480 here in Madison are AN MM also and they should get out pretty far. I'd suggest you give them a try if you need them. Personally, I'd rather have them off since they make a pest out of themselves. A couple of other WI stations to watch for are WOKY-920 and WEMP-1250 in Milwaukee which test almost every MM. I recently went to the library and looked through some recent issues of Broadcasting. I was amazed at the large number of applications for fulltime by daytime stations. Chicago area stations such as WEAW-1330, WJLB-1370, WRMN-1410, and WLTD-1590 are all requesting fulltime. Looking at the NRC Pattern Book, I can't see where some of them can direct their signal without interfering with other stations. WBEV-1430 Beaver Dam, WI, wants fulltime also. While they can go fulltime without interference to anyone else, I doubt that they could serve too large an area since WIL and WIRE really bomb into WI at night. WYFE-1150 Rockford, IL, is now C&W and they will change calls. 73 & good DX.



- 529 ALGERIA, Ain Beida, strongest signal ever noted from this one 0130 9/13 w/AA lang phone talk show! (Nelson,MA) --- way atop Canadian beacons w/AA moaning & talk 0225 9/14. (Connelly,MA)
- 539 LIBYA, per GPN info, the stn now dominant here is a new Libyan //827. Occasional AA chanting & banjo-like inst mx-noted. Mostly just a bad bet on CRT 0114 9/15. (Connelly,MA)
- 539 HUNGARY/LIBYA, Budapest-Lakihegy poor-fair u/the Libyan on a measured freq of 539.0004; audio in & out until s/off 2325, carrier cut 2336:50. This left the new high powered Libyan alone on the channel very strong w/Ramadan type pgmning in AA // Sebha-827. This new stn has been noted in Europe but location not yet known; my DF suggests the Tripoli area rather than Eastern Libya. Measured freq of the Libyan is 538.9995. (Nelson,MA)
- 557 PORTUGAL/UNID, Faro noted w/good sigs 0111 9/13 w/man & woman speaking in PP; freq measured as 556.9988. A 2nd stn on the channel at the time but couldn't pull any audio; 2nd stn on 557.0013 was prob Rostock, E. Germany per latest EBU frequency signature. (Nelson,MA)
- 558 IRAN, Qazvin, After spending the last week & a half parked on 557 looking for the MSP 2000 kw Iranian w/o success, a letter in today (9/14-bp) from Bengt Ericson in Sweden rptd that they had just moved to 558. Weak carrier rntd on meas'd freq of 558.0001 at tunein 2345 9/14. Sig continued to improve as the evening wore on w/Ramadan audio on peaks every few minutes; sig peaking at 0045 just prior to s/off w/carrier cut 0048. Mean DF bearing (25 cuts) 43.1°; calculated great circle bearing to Qazvin is 43.8°; uncertainty on measured bearing ±1.2° Logged for country #134. I've been after Iran since 1963 & I believe this is the first NA logging. This logging made during best TA cx since 1965. (Nelson,MA)

(Curtis,VT) --- Norte I extremely strong 2336 9/11 on measured 719.0005; Sfax, Tunisia in background in AA on meas'd 719.0317; also strong jammer for RFE at the same time. Unusual to hear this jammer. (Nelson,MA)
- 728 EAST GERMANY/SPAIN, strong audio from Berlin-Uhlenhorst 0119 9/13 w/man in GG on measured 727.9996. Ordinarily we have Oviedo RNE dominant here but my attention was called to this one by the freq signature. (Nelson,MA)

- 746 UPPER VOLTA, Ouagadougou very good w/W. African-type mx 2315-2330 9/17. (Eckman,PA)
- 746 UPPER VOLTA/E. GERMANY/BULGARIA/KENYA, Ouagadougou is one of the most reliable of the Africans; noted nightly to s/off 0002 on measured 745.9995. The programming ranges from Dakar-type vernacular to latest US pops & rock so beware. Around 0200-0300 this channel is lots of fun to sort out; on 9/13 noted Cottbus DDR on measured 745.9996 w/soft mx & man in GG 0220-0247. At 0240 a 2nd carrier came on measured 746.0312; DF for E. old blues songs in EE 2300 9/11. Also noted on late for Ramadan 0101 9/15. (Connolly,MA)

764 UKRAINE/SWITZERLAND/SENEGAL, Dakar the best TA nightly; measured 764.3765 on 9/12 at 2314; your all-time bad TA drifter! Sottens noted poor w/man in FF 2332 9/11 on measured 764.0000. Odessa alone on the channel 0311 w/YL reading mx in RR 0311 9/13 on 764.0000. A real surprise to hear this one; last noted here in 1967 I believe. Was looking for Sudan on late for Ramadan, of course. (Nelson,MA)

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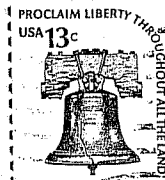
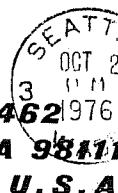
South of the Border
