1460 WPRW VA, MANASSAS 2/3 1743 dominant o/CKRB/WOKO w/ID jingle, then "Sweet Gypsy Rose" by Dawn. (MC-MA)

 KTGR MO Columbia, 2/12 1832, very good signals saying "where the winning is just the beginning". (MH)

+ + + + + ALOHA!!! Molokai, the closest island to Oahu, yet the least developed, was absolutely marvelous. Was w/15 other travel agents on a "working" trip, but did take along Dave Tonelli's Sony TFM 8600W, the "super Sony" and managed about 2 hrs DX time during my 4 days there, 11-14 Feb. Hotel Molokai about 2 mi (3 km) SE of Molokai's only town, Kaunakakai (pop 1200), adjacent to the water, of course. In fact, all along the 30 mi (40km) drive to eastern end of island, one fist pond after another, along with only waist deep water from shore to the reef, about 1km out, and I'm thinking to myself, "what a fantastic transmitting site", hi. Being closest to Maui, the 2 Maui stns, KNVI 550 & KNUI 1310 the strongest w/Honolulu stns just behind that, weakest from Oahu was KNDE 1270, possibly since theirs is the westernmost XR site from Honolulu of all Honolulu stations, around Salt Lake, I believe. I heard ALL HI. stns at midday, farthest was KUAJ 720, about 175 mi (230 km), but they were quite good, however within Hilo, KPUA & KIPA excellent, but KHL0 850 barely audible. That reversed itself at nite, KHL0 & KPUA excellent, KIPA in a 620 mess, almost sounding like a GY freq.!! My time was quite limited, so daytime DX amounted to little more than scanning the dial while getting ready for something else. Daytime Broadcasters Seek Breakdown Of "Super Power" Stations

The Daytime Broadcasters Association (DBA) filed comments with the FCC urging the Commission to break down the Clear Channels in a manner to provide additional Class IV local channels. Citing the need for more full-time local broadcast service, DBA presented an analysis of the FCC obtained Arbitration survey of the 25 Class I-A clear channel stations, "outside their home market areas." According

to the DBA analysis, 23.36% of the AM broadcast spectrum was serving only 1.3% of their "wide area" potential listenership. Furthermore, according to the DBA, the distant "skipping" skywave is no longer an acceptable service to the distant listener. DBA went on to cite the absence of ascertainment procedure on such clear channel stations regarding their distant listeners and suggested that clear channels should not be protected beyond their "home market."

president's REPORT

ELECTION TIMETABLE FOR 1977

- IRCA By-Laws, Article III, Section 5
- Part 1 - The President shall be responsible for announcing in the DX Monitor full details concerning the upcoming elections approximately February 15 of the election year.
- Part 2 - Nominations shall be open for President, Secretary-Treasurer, and the seven members of the Board of Directors from March 1 through April 15. Only one nomination each for President and Secretary-Treasurer, and only seven nominations for the Board, shall be allowed each IRCA member. All nominations must be submitted in written form to the ECC by April 15.
- Part 3 - As soon as possible after April 15, the ECC shall send to the Secretary-Treasurer a list of all nominees. The Secretary-Treasurer will return the list to the ECC as soon as possible, indicating which nominees have been members in good standing for the required one-year period.
- Part 4 - The ECC shall notify by letter all eligible candidates concerning their nominations by May 1. Each letter of nomination shall contain the names of all eligible members who have been nominated for the particular office in question. Such letters must stress that the nominee must reply in writing if he accepts the nomination, and each such letter must request from each nominee a campaign statement, not to exceed 15 stencil lines, to appear in a June issue of DX Monitor. However, a nominee is not required to submit a campaign statement provided he has duly notified the ECC of his intention to run for office. An IRCA member may be nominated for more than one office, but he must decide for which he prefers to run and so notify the ECC. A nominee who has indicated his intention to run for an office may not be considered as a write-in candidate for another office in the same election.
- Part 5 - All letters of acceptance of the nomination and all campaign statements must reach the ECC by May 20th. The ECC shall prepare the ballot and campaign statements and submit them to the Publisher by June 1. Ballots shall contain spaces for write-in candidates.
- Part 6 - Ballots must be received by the Elections Committee Chairman no later than 0001, Mountain Local Time, August 1.
- Article III - Section 3 - Eligibility to hold Office Any member in good standing, regardless of where he lives, shall be eligible for regular election to any office provided he has held one year's continuous membership

in the IRCA as of April 15 of the election year. For purposes of special elections, the requirement shall be one year's continuous membership as of the effective date of vacancy of the office in question, such date to be determined by the President. It is not necessary for an eligible member's name to be printed on a ballot for him to be elected.

DATES TO REMEMBER:

- March 1 - First day for nominations. You may nominate one person each for President and Secretary-Treasurer, and seven persons for the Board of Directors. You may nominate yourself if you so desire.
- April 15 Last date for nominations to be received by the ECC. He then sends the names to the Secretary-Treasurer for verification of eligibility.
- May 1 ECC must notify all eligible nominees that they have been nominated, providing each nominee with a list of those nominated for that particular office. Each person who wishes to run must notify the ECC before May 20, and submit a campaign statement if he so wishes.
- May 20 Last date for the ECC to receive letters of acceptance to run for office.
- June 1 Last day for campaign statements and ballot to be received by the Publisher. This will be sent to SPC. The ECC will type them up for printing in DX Monitor.
- June The ballots will be published in the June issue of DX Monitor.
- July 30 Last day for receipt of ballots by the ECC. (Per the By-Laws, the deadline is 0001 MLT, 8/1, which is 0201 ELT at the ECC's house. Thus, consider it to be 8/1 for all practical purposes.)

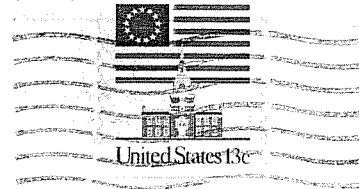
