If you like to listen for the splits, the FRG-7 is not recommended for this. It makes a good amateur or CB band monitor. So, I took the QR-666, and this one has fairly decent selectivity on tuning foreign splits. I'd also be interested in knowing about the performance of the new Drake SRR-1 receiver, as well as QR-666 from any fellow members. Dear Mr. Belanger:

I received your report of KOGA reception for December 7, 1975 and I would like to verify your copy. It may interest you to know that KOGA just went to directional night time operation on the 21st of November 1975. Before that date, we were a 500 watt non-directional daytime station only.

We are now broadcasting at night with 500 watts directional and the pattern two major lobes are orientated North and South. The directional antenna system authorized to KOGA for nighttime use consists of a 250 foot tower used for daytime purposes and two additional towers spaced 501.5 feet and 1095.3 feet to the East of the present tower on a line bearing North 98 degrees East. The coordinates of the antenna system center are North 41 degrees, 9 minutes, 32 seconds and West 101 degrees, 42 minutes, 48 seconds.

Enclosed is a non-directional area coverage map.

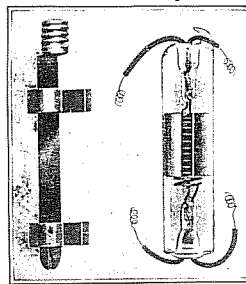

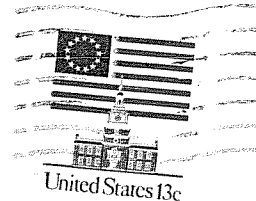
