- 670 KBOI ID, Boise noted this w/very brief s/off 0205 10/24 after CBS nx. NRC Log says 0237 s/off, which appears incorrect. 0700 s/on is OK though. (NHP-BC)
- 710 WOR NY, New York City 0607 10/17. W/KIRO off and WMP3 nulled, a steady fair signal noted here w/nx, ad, then "WOR news-time 6:17." I didn't expect this w/their directional pattern. NYC #5. (NHP-BC)
- 760 WJR MI, Detroit ID's have been coming in all week at different hours, at the earliest 2245 10/26 football game o/KFMB the pest at times. (TW)
- 780 KORN NV, Reno having troubles? CJ noted 0040 10/28 for a few minutes, then orchestral mx w/quite low modulation. (NHP-BC)
- 840 WHAS KY, Louisville 10/29 0426 fair w/"War of the Worlds" broadcast. Also noted 10/30 0319 w/song "Oh my Doctor Frankenstein" sung to the tune of "Oh my Darling Clementine." (MB-JA)
- 860 KOAM KS, Pittsburg 10/30 0330 poor w/KONO. OM reading lots of sports scores, many agriculturally related spots. New state, but was a super pest when I was going after KONO. (MB-JA)
- 860 KONO TX, San Antonio 10/30 0330 lousy, mixing w/pest KOAM w/pop/WOR mx. 0330-0400 many IDs but none were readable due to KOAM. After hearing such info as the DJ (Billy Watson), the temperature (70°) and phone number (227-9200) and many TEs, QTH was finally given at 0400. Still unsure of the ID, I looked up the area code, gave 'em a call & confirmed the ID as "KITY Y92, KONO" & learned that they were simulcasting on FM. (MB-JA)

 I hope everyone read my offer to hand deliver reports to the Macon stations, and will take advantage of it. I'd like nothing better than to take an armful of reports to each station here. The only thing I would ask is that you contribute something to the DXM, if you don't already. Fair enuf? An interesting situation presents itself in the new FCC R&Rs that place station logs (and copies thereof) to be made available, open to public inspection. Would a verification by proxy be considered legitimate? Of the few stations who would not verify during a personal visit (I think most would, tho), they are now required by law to show you their log! Interesting? You bet! I would like to see a "QSL Bureau" like set-up for BCB stations. We have enuf members across the country, so that almost every station is within reasonable reach of an occasional trip by a "QSL Manager" for the particular stations he "manages". This, of course, would only apply to stations who do not verify. This scheme is used widely by hams, and proves most useful with foreign stations, although I think the greatest advantage here would be with domestics. I'd be interested in hearing from anyone, pro or con, if it has been tried before, or any comments. I just got a letter from a midwest member who is not renewing his IRCA and NRC memberships. He cites the lack of technical articles and that both are "dull". I have to agree strongly with the lack of technical material. Cross at midnight on a Sunday night during the summer. The employees are mostly students who don't know a thing. One girl took a look at my R-390A and then said "how old is that?". Normally, I'd explain how great a receiver it is, but in this case I just let it pass, hi! I really enjoyed the IRCA convention and getting together with other DXers. I've heard where at other conventions Canadians are not treated too well, but here both Paul Routenburg and myself encountered no such problems. (Just good ol Hoosier hospitality, Fred-jz) I must mention here how great Charles Taylor was that weekend. Even though he was loaded down with problems concerning the convention, he still had plenty of time and generosity to look after us with the R-390 and the R-390A I finally took back with me. Many thanks, Charlie. The receiver, by the way, is working fine and I have logged six new countries since mid August - Costa Rica, Panama, St. Pierre et Miquelon, Senegal, Haiti and Dominica. I use the SM-2 antenna. My countries heard total is now 28. As you can see, I am a country DXer. My best catch lately was on October 18 at 2345 EDT, when I heard Radio Artibonite in Haiti on 895 with play-by-play of the Haiti-Guatemala world cup soccer playdown. It went on til 0045 and then went off. This was a tape, as the game was not played that night - in fact, they (Haiti) played to a 1-1 tie with Canada the next night (here is one other sport where Canada has an edge on the US, hi). Also heard, lately, were ZDK Antigua on 1100, R. Omega on 575, and R. Jumbo 545 in Dominica. This brings up my location problem. I live on the east side of Toronto. All transmitters of Toronto stations are either in the west end or the north side. The only one in the east is CHOO 1390 in Ajax. Therefore, I don't have major interference problems from Toronto stations, save CHUM and CFTR. Even CHOO doesn't cause much problem. My #1 pest is WGR 550 in Buffalo. Let's gaze into the crystal ball for 20-30 lines. What lies ahead for the WC foreign DXer? The frequency relocations of the European, African, Asian and Oceania stations is suppose to be completed by Nov 1978. The frequencies are 531 through 1602 in 9 kHz increments. Whether the N. Koreans, Chinese and Indochina stations will actually change frequencies is conjectural at this point. Some stations, especially the Indonesians, are already on these frequencies. It's very important for all of us to try and log the Indonesians before the other stations change frequencies. This next year is our best chance to log Indonesia without other stations on the frequencies; the best Indo. frequencies to date have been 1053, 864, 1134, 1215, 1044 for me w/occasional carriers and rare audio. DYLA 1555 and RMKK 1475 are good indicators for these. After the frequency changes, it may be possible to log several countries - especially India, Bangladesh, Vietnam, Taiwan, Malaysia, Papua, New Guinea, Philippines - that are rarely heard now. DU stations on split channels should be well heard - we will need a loop to null DU to pick up the Far East. As a result of the Asian stations moving to the split frequencies, we will probably hear Central & South America (especially deep SA) better on the even frequencies. TA reception may offer some new countries as all stations move up 1 kHz. The split frequencies on which we will hear these goodies best are 567, 576, 585, 594, 603, 648, 657, 666, 675, 684, 693, 747, 756, 765, 774, 783, 828, 837, 846,

855, 864, 873, 927, 936, 945, 954, 963, 1017, 1026, 1035, 1044, 1053, 1107, 1116, 1125, 1134, 1143, 1197, 1206, 1215, 1224, 1233, etc depending on local QRM. Some predictions: 1) We will be awed by the signal strength of some of these stations, especially DUs. 2) We will be surprised by the early fade-ins of some Oceania stns (0500-0800 generally in the Winter) - evening reception! 3) We will be inundated w/erroneous DXW/IDX reports as DXers hear these stations for the first time. Would you believe that New Zealand and Great Britain will be on some of the same frequencies? And 180° apart on the loop? Sounds great - I can hardly wait - in the meantime I'm going to continue chasing Indonesia and would advise others to do the same. 73 de Dan d. Receiver.

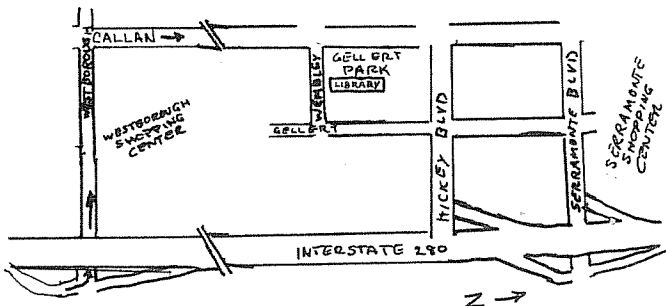
BART IS BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND
