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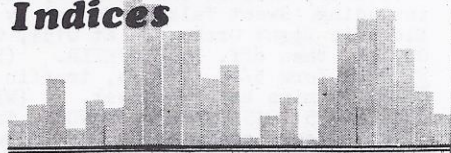

WNTY CT, Southington 3/15 1800 W/sign-off, no SSB. Fair-good o/CFRB slop. (MB-ON)

1010 CFRB ON, Toronto 3/15 0120 In all alone w/no sign of WINS. (SGA-PA)

1050 CHUM ON, Toronto 3/15 0124 In with great sig and no sign of WHN or KYW splatter. (SGA-NY)

1070 WCIR WV, Beckley 3/27 1830 Stn ID by OM anncr Fair. (WPT-DC)

WIBC IN, Indianapolis 3/15 0133 W/YL anncr. Pretty much alone on the frequency. (SGA-NY)

WWVA WV, Wheeling 3/15 0835 In like a local w/C&W. Faded out at 0837. (SGA-PA)

1190 WANN MD, Annapolis 3/15 0800-1000 Good sig and soul format. (SGA-PA)

1220 CHSC ON, St. Catherines 3/13 0023 Up to very good strength w/WGAR off for MM. SID noted 0023. Has this stn improved its facilities? Seems too strong to have been missed for so long. (THW-VA)

WCDQ CT, Hamden 3/17 0558 Good o/nulled WGAR w/rock, Terry Christopher DJ, full ID at 0558. On early due to wx. New. (PRM-NJ)

1230 WEEX PA, Easton 3/15 0800-1000 In all day and night w/Top-40 mx. (SGA-PA)

WERI RI, Westerly 3/17 0454 Fair w/promo, "so listen to WERI0454. (PRM-NJ)

WINF CT, Manchester 3/17 0444-0454 Fair to good on Gary Arnell show w/Top-40 mx in QRM 0444-0454. Pest. (PRM-NJ)

WNIA NY, Cheektowaga 2/25 0930 Rlgs mx, 0930 ID. Local nx. Very poor. (DM-ON)

1240 WHIZ OH, Zanesville 3/13 0005 I rarely have the patience to listen to the turmoil of the GY frequencies, but did pick up this one w/s/off and SSB. Within a couple of minutes a second SSB and a GSQ were added, must be a popular s/off time, hi. No details gotten on the other s/off. (THW-VA)

WHUM PA, Reading 3/15 0800-1000 Battling for the channel w/WSNJ. (SGA-PA)

WSNJ NJ, Bridgeton 3/15 0800-1000 Fighting it out with WHUM. (SGA-PA)

WWWD NY, Schenectady 3/17 1447 Atop at 1447 w/Bob Green Show, "3WD" ID. Pest. (PRM-NJ)

1250 WMTR NJ, Morristown 3/15 0800-1000 Very surprised to get this station, which is a semi-local at home.

1270 WSPR MA, Springfield 3/25 0130 Now w/AEN. (SGA-NY)

+ 3/17 0414-0437 Good, battling WXYZ, both w/rock. Not usually this good this long. (PRM-NJ)

1280 WROC NY, Rochester 3/15 0815 I guess that somewhat unusual skywave cx were present aouns 0815 this morning. Signal was very strong, but eventually gave way to New York's WADO. (SGA-PA)

1290 WEYE NC, Sanford 3/18 1830 Fair o/jumble, Just got there in time to catch ID and station address at end of s/off message No SSB. (THW-VA)

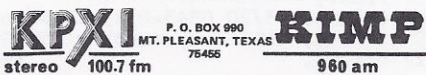
WFBG PA, Altoona 2/23 2316 Spot for audio store clearance, 2317 ID as "the new 1290-WFBG" into mx. Fair. (DM-ON)

WIRL IL, Peoria 3/18 1832 While writing WEYE above stn info into my logbook, I left the radio on 1290. The result was this station w/a wx forecast followed by YL DJ, who gave 2 IDs before playing rr record. (THW-VA)

1300 WERE OH, Cleveland 3/21 2048 "WERE time coming up on 8:48" by YL anncr in the mess on 1300. (BC-VT)

WGRC NY, Spring Valley 3/22 All day. Former WKQW in like semi-local for the past few days. In strong for these few days and then disappeared on 3/24. Station has a format that they describe as "mellow gold", a mix of MOR & EZL oldies. Billboard magazine says that they have been on the air for about three

months prior to this reception, so I believe they might have been non-directional during the time received. (SGA-NY)

1310 CHGB + 3/14 0730 Pesty w/WAVZ all day today. Format promoted as "all gold". Long nx at top of hour. This is the old WKQW, of course, but was this channel dark for a couple of years? Seems like WGRG just popped on all of a sudden. (GM-NY)

1310 CHGB QU, La Pocatière 3/25 1849 Good w/promo from Baie-St-Paul & St. Simeon w/folk songs program, "Soirée Canadienne", 1900 ID, "CHGB 1310 & CHAL 1350", then SRC (is CBC FF!) Nx. (DB-QU)

CKOY ON, Ottawa 3/13 0208 Fair, "You're listening to CKOY" between talk show calls. Freq is much clearer now that CFGM is on 1320. (THW-VA)

WWKR MI, Dearborn 3/20 0102 s/off, on again at 0500, said to turn to WNIC FM-100, good signal. It is a good sign that although they switched formats, they are still silent MM's. (NW-ON)

1320 CFGM ON, Richmond Hill 3/25 1835 Good despite some QRM w/sports. (DB-QU)

1330 WCRB + 3/17 0350 A top on new frequency. (PRM-NJ)

1540 *KPOL* CA, Los Angeles 4/3 0424 testing w/rock mx & ID's "This is KPOL 1540 Los Angeles the adult mx station," yet they were testing w/rock. (ASL-CA)

1540 *WKIE* VA, Richmond 3/19 0211 tried but not heard, only KPOL, KZAM & KXEL. KXEL s/off 0215 leaving just KZAM & KPOL. Their DA must not have been pointing this way. (RW-CA)

1550 KUAT AZ, Tucson 3/31 0857 poor, in & out of KRG0 w/wx for Tucson, into "Samson and Delilah," first time on RS. This was unID classical reported on 1550 by a member a few weeks ago. (RW-CA)

1550 *KXEX* CA, Fresno 3/23 0455 xlnr in KKHI null. Noted ET'ing for a good 20 minutes w/CC and occasional TT's, unnullable at 0505 w/KKHI off. (RW-CA)

- 1550 *unID* 3/13 0430 TT on/off u/KRGO for five min. then gone. Ideas? (ASL-CA)
- 1560 *KPMC* CA, Bakersfield 3/16 0320 testing w/OC, strong. (RW-CA)
- 1560 *KGHO* WA, Hoquiam 3/20 0647 this sounds like it's becoming a weekly thing, almost sounds like they're a RS station, do they simulcast FM when testing or do they do it live? (RW-CA) (FM is off MM's. Don't know about weekday ET's.-NH)
+3/22 0328 testing again w/FM simulcast, but this time on a Wed. morning! Maybe they're going RS like KCJJ??? I hope not. (RW-CA) (They're a daytimer! We don't think the owner is about to invest in the equipment it would take to go fulltime.--NH)
- 1570?*WOKZ*?IL, Alton 3/20 0640 tentative on f/c, very weak 1 kHz TT noted u/XERF w/CKTA null. (RW-CA)
- 1580 *KNIX* AZ, Tempe 3/19 0644 poor to fair u/KDAY w/TT, moderate KLIV-1590 slop. New, as pesky KLIV kills 1580 at SSS. (RW-CA)
- 1600 KUBA CA, Yuba City 3/28 2047 poor to fair w/"More music, KUBA" ID and into pop mx. (MB-ML)

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Some comments and answers this time. Enjoyed the article by Cary Simpson on unusual stations. Cary, you missed the call change of WELA to WJDM-1530, though. Another odd station is WNUS, West Springfield, MA, a U5 station, directional day, non-directional night. Mike Brooker and others notice the non-IDs of stations such as his W-16 on 1580. I think we should have a column listing slogans of AM stations like WTFDA has--what do they call it, JZ? (It's not a regular column, but rather an every-so-often feature called "Non-IDs"-jz). Greg Monti: You're SSE of WVIP. I'm SSW, and that makes a difference. I don't see how WVIP could put much down this way with WCAM and WJLK on 1310, WGRC and WTTM on 1300, and WKAP on 1320. The main problem in hearing WKMB was its getting past WHN. Mike Dorner- do you know Albert Ron Williams? He used to live in Alaska and now lives in Metairie. I don't like seeing veries on the front page. There's got to be something more important than that, even if it means starting EDXR there as has been done in the past. I don't about aesthetics, I'd rather DX, so I put two strips of index card on my TRF and drew lines with a sanded down Scripto mechanical pencil. The top line marks locals, and the bottom marks other frequencies. This makes it easier to mark frequencies at the high end of the dial and also number them. I liked the Anniversary issue, good to see a renewal in Teaneck. Charles Taylor- keep trying for CHTN-1190 PEI. In NJ they are heard every MM w/WOWO off w/a fair-very good signal. The Little River Band must have loved the publicity in the Anniversary issue. 14 more years? It's a long way there, hi. Gerry Thomas--what is tweaking? Airchecks welcome here. Response to the mention of SCs good - one guy sent 60 surveys from 1 stn.

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Greetings. Spring break was a complete success even if I couldn't afford a trip to Florida like a certain affluent suburban CADXer could. But DX made up for it, with what I have titled MARCH MADNESS (I always give great DX periods titles) (that's also what they call the Illinois high school basketball tournament-jz). This one week period netted me 17 new stations, including 3 of my top 10 best catches of all time (2. KCHO-1560, 6. CJWW-1370, & 10. KTRB-860). In addition, the logging of WADM-1540 and WPCO-1590 left me with only 9 Indianas to go. Illinois is closer to completion with only 5 to go, but the rest of Illinois is nearly hopeless. As for the call change controversy, I think the whole thing is ridiculous. I count call changes, and nothing anyone says is going to make me stop. Besides, they count for such a small percentage of my total stations logged that they are almost hidden. A recent tally shows that I have logged 62 call letter changes. Since my total stations heard is 2,276, this counts as 2.77%, or about a ratio of 1/35, of my total stations. Hardly an amount to waste valuable DX Monitor space to argue about. The reason I count call changes is that when I first started DXing, nearly every DXer I knew counted them. The justification I use now is that the call letters are the station. When a station changes call letters, in the eyes of the FCC, the station with the old calls ceases to exist, and only the new call letters exist. Some people argue that there is no change in reception conditions with call changes. Well, I agree with this, but some stations heard on more than one call aren't very easy to hear to start with (e.g. KEZU & KKLS-920). Also, this argument would justify counting a station as 3 stations if you hear it on a daytime power, a night-time power, and a PSA power. Or different directional patterns would count as different stations. I say stop bickering about something that you aren't going to change. If you don't want to count call changes, then don't, but don't expect others to do something just because you do.

Finally got a Realistic TRF, and after having read Gerry Thomas's comments, I'd have to agree. I didn't expect too many new stations (daytimers) at the low end of the band, and didn't get many more either. Got loads of new stuff at the high end of the band in daylight, tho. A few more observations about the TRF: The nulls and lobes of its receiving pattern are not symmetrical. The null off the end marked "TRF" seems to be deeper than the null off the end with the tuning knob. And the lobe off the front appears to be larger than the one off the back of the receiver. Dunno, maybe it's a subjective judgment, or may be due to the fact that I don't have stations in all directions from here (not too many to the S and E, anyway). Also noticed that the power cord changes the pattern and can destroy nulling of a local. Was listening to WQQW-1590 on battery power and, when I plugged it in, WWRL-1600 splattered all over it. The fact that the batteries were a little low didn't make the difference either, since just touching the plug's prongs to a grounded outlet plate had the same effect as plugging it in, even tho it was still on batteries. The TRF's audio output appears to be of excellent quality, but not when using the internal speaker, of course! The speaker appears to suppress everything but midrange, including the 10 kHz het, which is easily noticed at the output. The TRF also sends out a very good bass end. Have heard a few complaints about the volume and tone controls getting noisy after a while, and that appears to be a curse cast upon all slide pots, well cheap ones anyway. Your basic 73's.

I think I'm a little late for the Anniversary issue. Anyway, Happy Anniversary to IRCA! Re-intro time: I'm 29 years old and I've DXed since the age of ten. For the last 3 years I've been an IRCA member. My main interest is Trans-Atlantic DX. I'm married and presently living in the first story of a 2-family house. Mary Lou and I hope to be living in a house of our own within a year or two. Although she's not a DXer, Mary Lou sometimes finds it interesting when, on Sunday afternoon

drives to Rockport, MA, I tune the car radio local-like Arabic wailing from Morocco on 818 and 827. I work as an electronics technician and engineering aide. DX gear here includes an R-390A/URR, Realistic TRF, longwires, and an SM2 loop along with recording equipment, an audio amp, and a Drake TR-4 for the amateur bands. Sometimes I DX from my parents' house in West Yarmouth MA on Cape Cod. Besides LW/MW/SW/FM DX and ham radio, interests include 35mm photography, nature study (plant identification, rock and shell collecting, etc.), travel, weather observation, architecture (especially Tudor, colonial, and modern), and music - particularly European rock (Who, Yes, Moody Blues, Jethro Tull, Beatles, ELO, EL&P, Fleetwood Mac), folk music (e.g. Steeleye Span, Horslips, Chieftans), punkrock in small doses, classical music, some disco and jazz. The coastline is my "natural environment" and its influence has made me "internationally-minded", both in terms of DXing and other cultural aspects. Going along with my interests in radio and music, I am active in taping rock shows: my library extends from 1963 to the present. Instead of watching TV or listening to records, I sometimes put on an old radio show tape and relax with a pint of Guinness Stout.  Greetings again from interference city! Very little DX done here in recent months due to severe electrical and other types of interference. It's very discouraging to turn on the set and hear that garbage coming out. My immediate reaction is to turn it back off and contribute my own type of interference in the form of TVI. Yes, sorry to say, watching the boob tube has been more enjoyable lately than DX'ing. On the positive side, I did manage to acquire a better receiver recently, a government surplus job which tunes 200kc-2mc. It seems to be in reasonably good condition, but needs some work, especially on the audio section. A local ham is going to try to obtain service info from a friend for me. I hope to have it in good shape by next season. Even in its present condition, it is superior to the TRF and Philco selectivity wise. I've heard several split stations which I had only read about in DXN and DXM previously. Next on the agenda will be acquisition of SM or loop antenna, which I think will improve reception several hundred percent over the present attic longwire antenna. It's good in a pinch, but only being 40' long and parallel to electrical wires seems to hinder its performance. DX wise, the WXAP test heard well 3/27 even through the noise. This is the first station added to the log since January. Present state total is 38, which is where it's been since last season. The last test I tried for was the KFDI-1070 test, which was not received. I did hear a TT through much of the period but no ID. Local WAMS recently replaced their transmitter and their signal quality along with it. It used to be possible to null them with ease on the TRF, but that task is somewhat difficult now. Needless to say, along with a signal boost, a significant boost in slop was also noted. Those problems with spurs they were having have been, I believe, for the most part eliminated. I tuned to 1220 one day and my S-meter jumped 6 units from one of the spurs. I called and they said they were aware of the problem and were working on it. A local NRC'er claims to have heard several others on his HQ180. Enough babbling for now, so 73's to all until next time.

 Hello fellow DXers. Well, the time has come, and after careful deliberations I can now announce the winner of the first annual, and much coveted, World Champion of Radio Splatter Award. This year's award goes to radio station WZZD, Philadelphia PA. On a recent trip to Bryn Mawr PA (a Philadelphia suburb) I was able to receive

"Wizzard 100" (actually 99, but who's gonna argue over a lousy ten kilohertz) all the way from 1040 down to 960, then a break for WPEN-950, and then from 940 down to 920. All this, in addition to a spur over WNEW at 1130, was received on my TRF while the station was on daytime power (50kw) and pattern at a DX location approximately 4 miles from the WZZD transmitter in Lafayette Hill. In addition to this, WZZD was slopping all over WPEN as I listened to the latter on my car receiver on the PA Turnpike approximately 2 miles from the 'ZZD transmitter. None of this occurred after the "wizzard" changed to nighttime pattern. I would think that this is the worst slop of any station in the continental US or the Dominion of Canada (at least it's the worst that I ever heard), but if any other members have heard worse than this, speak up, maybe we can set up a competition for next year's sloppiness award. Noticed a 4 tower array on the Germantown Pike (US 422) east of the intersection with Potshop Road just west of Norristown PA. I suspect that this might have been KYW. Does anyone know for sure? I only had a little time for DX on this visit and I was interested in checking out what the daytime band looked like. For the more surprising catches see EDXR. Enough for now. Best of DX.

+++++ Well, after a futile battle w/the University of California at Irvine's registration computer, I finally have time to type out a Forum. The biggest event here recently was the KEZY 3/27 SP! This was the first time I have ever heard them off and during this period I logged KEX and KRDS. Last week I went skiing at Mammoth Lakes, CA and did some DXing with my Zenith Transoceanic. Most of the stations heard there are semi-regulars at this QTH, and the only new stations heard were KUBA & KOFI. There was very little DX during the day; at most there were 10 station audible. The Bay Area stations came in poor at best, and KFBK was non-existent. Reno was another story; KOLO came in fair while KCRL was only poor. Their patterns are both ND during the day, but KCRL has much more power. KIBS is located on the southern edge of Bishop. They have a one tower array, a small one building XR/studio, and appear to have a staff of about 3, judging by the number of cars in their parking lot. On the way back I went through Ridgecrest, but did not see any sign of KZIQ. As a final word about my trip, are there any FM propagation experts out there who can tell me why I can hear KMET (94.7) on about 98 only while in the vicinity of Bishop? They are inaudible on their fundamental frequency, but come in strong enough for stereo reception on the other. (KMET has several translators, that was one of them-RtH). The other day my WHOO verie came in and it included a form v/1, the 990 page from the NEC Pattern Book, 3 different pattern field strength maps & XEROKS of 2 aerial photos of their XR site. RtH, yes I would count KHEB/KLTV/KXRX as technically new stations. However, since the only totals I primarily care about are states heard/veried, for simplicity's sake my stations total reflects the number of XR sites heard/veried. If I wanted to take the time and really be picky about it, I would count any station that changed XR facilities as a new one. Re MFSS Forum about KORI, per my 12/5/77 verie Alan Roycroft says they share tower w/KIKI/KZOO/KHVV. Has anybody else heard the KWAC harmonic on 2980? They have SS programming and ID as R Variadades. On the hour they ID in EE as "This is KWAC Bakersfield, CA". In closing, I would like to see the FCC prodded into doing something about non-IDing ETers. +++++ RtH, your Forum was very interesting last time. So that's the reason I've not been able to get HI till last week definitely. I thought that was the reason. The Santa Cruz Mtns are 2000ft/609m high, effectively blocking out anything to the west, but for some reason, the Diablo range doesn't block out reception to the east, but instead enhances it! But, LA reception is severely limited due to the mtns to the SE. (Mt. Hamilton?-RtH). This is primarily the reason I get KIDN 1350 but have never heard KIVM, whereas DKK has KIVM nightly but has never heard KIDN. He has mtns to the SE (Sutro & Davidson) which block out reception to the SE, in the direction of KIDN. As far as SF stations go, I can put a sharp null on KYA & KSFO, getting KGIL on 1260 & zilch on 560. As far as Oakland and other Bay Area stns go, I can put a total null on KRE 1400 & KEST 1450, to get KBMI/KAAP on 1400, and KONE/KTPT on 1450. 1230, 1240, 1340 and 1490 are totally open, except 1490 is closed to the east, as KXRX 1500 lies in that direction. 1230 here is dominated by KLVY/KRDG, 1240 by KMBY/KROY/XECC, 1340 by KMAK/KRAM/XEAA. Bill Harms put my situation into a few short words rather nicely. When we were in Salt Lake City on vacation a few yrs ago, I noticed that at night, reception was very limited to the east, and such strange things occurred as KYA dominating 1260, etc. This theory of mtns blocking out signals could make an interesting technical article. +++++ Re the comments that Don Davis had in regard to my article on a switch for monitoring your tape recorder thru your rx, I'd like to say that no one should try to put a tape jack in a rx unless he/she knows how; and above all, not in an AC/DC rx unless there is a transformer to isolate the AC line voltage. Yes, 110 volts house current can be quite deadly! As for some of his other comments, I disagree slightly. You can eliminate the problem of hearing your receivers audio & your tape recorders by flipping the rx's standby switch to the standby position. This will still allow the tape recorder's audio to pass thru while eliminating the audio from the rx. As for modifying the set to put in an extra switch vs. the extra outlet, maybe you don't want to change the appearance on the front of your set, but don't mind the extra jack on the back. Who listens to 2 rx's at the same time anyway? Usually if you have 2 rx's you may compare the signals and record one and then the other. You can always flip the standby switch on one. As for my using the bakelite box instead of a metal box, I selected the bakelite box because of the fact that it won't scratch as easily and worked well w/my receiver/tape recorder combo. If you get too much hum and/or feedback you may have to use the metal box. Basically all of Don's comments were good and well taken. Just be sure you know what you are doing if you ad a tape jack to your rx. I suggest you either get the IRCA/NRC reprint and follow it to the tee or have someone who knows how to do it install your tape jack for you. The new DX room is complete. All the DX gear is moved into it and I DXed from the new room this past MM (3/27). Results were good! See WDXR for details. There's still some minor work to be done and then I have to re-do the other room that was the DX room. Well, till next time.. 73 de ASL. Have an ALL-STAR Summer in San Diego w/the Padres in '78. 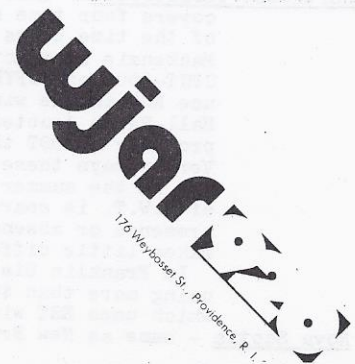

DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME STARTS SOON

by Special Features Editor Bill Hardy

DST begins in the U.S. at 2am local times on Sun., 4/30/78. It will be in effect until 2am local DST times on Sun., 10/29/78, in 46 or 47 states and the District of Columbia. If you DX on 4/30, be sure to write down the correct times for DXR & DXF reports. Use EST until 4/29 and until 0200 EST on 4/30. Use EDT starting at 0200 EST (0300 EDT) on 4/30, and thereafter. You may wish to specify "EST" or "EDT" in your DXR reports of 4/30 loggings, so that the editor will know you did it correctly. Another tip: Watch for stations signing on, signing off, or doing sunrise/sunset power/pattern changes at the wrong times on 4/30 only. This year, with DST in effect only the last day of April, some small stations may forget to adjust their log for the last day of the month, and the Sunday help might goof it up themselves!

Based on reports from newspapers and various DXers, here are details on the non-DST states:

Alaska? - From 1967 thru 1977, Alaska has observed DST every summer, statewide. However, an item from Ernie Wesolowski in the NRC's 4/3/78 DX News says, "Alaska does not use Daylight Saving Time." So, we have some conflicting information here.

Arizona - Stays on MST year-round, except for the Navajo Reservation, where DST is observed.

Hawaii - Stays on Hawaiian Standard Time year-round.

Indiana - Most of the state stays on standard time year-round, but there are exceptions. The portions of Indiana in the Central Time Zone (the northwest corner near Gary, which is in metro Chicago, and the southwest corner near Evanston) go to CDT for the summer. Jeffersonville and New Albany, IN, which are just across the Ohio River from Louisville, KY, observe EDT with Louisville. The rest of the Eastern Time Zone in Indiana stays on EST year-round. Since EST = CDT, this means that all of Indiana (except Jeffersonville and New Albany) is on the same time during the summer.

Now, information on time zones in Canada, courtesy of Nick Hall-Patch and Brian Vernon. Canada does not have a nationwide DST law as does the U.S. DST start-and-stop dates may vary there.

Alberta - MST in the winter, MDT in the summer.

British Columbia - The majority of B.C. uses PST in the winter and PDT in the summer. The northeast corner of the province is in the Mountain Time Zone, and may or may not go to DST in the summer.

Manitoba - CST in the winter, CDT in the summer.
New Brunswick - Atlantic Standard Time (EST plus 1 hour) in the winter, Atlantic Daylight Time by annual government proclamation in the summer.

Newfoundland - The Labrador portion of the province (i.e. the land-based portion) uses Atlantic Standard Time in the winter, Atlantic Daylight Time in the summer. The island portion of Newfoundland uses Newfoundland Standard Time (EST plus 1 1/2 hours) in the winter, Newfoundland Daylight Time in the summer. DST is used throughout the province.

Northwest Territories - This sprawling territory covers four time zones. However, two of the time zones include LPRT's only. Mackenzie District contains CHAK-860, CFCT-600, and CFYK-1340, all of which use MST in the winter. Although Nick Hall-Patch doubted that there was probably no DST that far north, Brian Vernon says these stations did use MDT in the summer of 1977. Since most of N.W.T. is sparsely populated, the presence or absence of DST probably makes little difference!

In Franklin District, the only station using more than 40 watts is CFFB-1210, which uses EST winters and EDT summers.

Nova Scotia - same as New Brunswick.

Ontario - EST in the winter (except CST west of 90° West Longitude). DST in the summer is by local option, but most communities seem to observe DST.

Prince Edward Island - same as New Brunswick.

Quebec - EST in the winter (except Atlantic Standard Time east of 63° West Longitude). DST in the summer is by local option, but most communities seem to observe DST.

Saskatchewan - Time zone is up to the individual communities. Hence, the MST-CST border changes from time to time. Most are now on CST year-round. Those communities in western Saskatchewan which still use MST in the winter seem to go to MDT in the summer, putting the whole province on the same time for the summer.

Yukon Territory - Uses PST year-round. They call this "Yukon Time," rather than PST. Don't confuse this with "Yukon Standard Time" (EST minus four hours), which is no longer used in the Yukon! In fact, Yukon Standard Time is now used only in a small portion of the Alaskan panhandle between the Alaska and Pacific Time Zones, less than 100 miles long, and containing no AM-broadcast stations!

While this list should be fairly accurate, please advise me right away of any errors and I'll run a correction if necessary. Thanks to Nick and Brian for their help. --Bill Hardy, 2301 Pacific Ave., Aberdeen, WA, 98520

Local Radio Forum

New ILR stations could be on the air before the end of 1979 if the government White Paper approves the IBA plan for radio organisation. Locations quoted are Peterborough, Coventry, Cardiff, and Londonderry plus two others; one in N.E. Scotland (Aberdeen, Perth, or Aberdeen), and the other in Gloucestershire (Cheltenham or Gloucester). The IBA has received over 200 serious inquiries about stations on new frequencies. Next stage is to look at possibilities for Fylde of Lancashire, Northampton, Luton, Huddersfield, Southend, Bournemouth, and Exeter or Torquay.

LBC-1161 London resumed 24 hour schedule on 2/21. Swansea Sound-1169 is now off Monday through Friday at 0100. As of 3/5, Beacon Radio-989 is on 24 hour schedule for a period of 9 weeks. (MWN 3/78)

A large number of "Free Radio" stations have been set up. These are unlicensed operations. The use of the term Free Independent Radio seems to be an indication that those who campaign for free radio are dissatisfied with the commercial stations presently set up in England. Basically, free radio means freedom from restrictions. Prosecutions have resulted in fines ranging from £100 to £800. (MWN 3/78)

Holland. Radio Stad-1250 (soon to go to VHF) is scheduled 1200-1300 and 1700-1900. Address: Postbus 50575, 1007 DB, Amsterdam. (Distance, via MWN 3/78)

Ireland. RTE has a 1-0 watt transmitter on 1484, a "Community Radio Service", which is mobile, visits carnivals, etc. (NRC via MWN 3/78)

Nigeria. NBC, Enugu, is now on 827 ex 1320. Tola-1017 began tests on 2/16 0500-0800 and 1400-2000. (MWN 3/78)

Uganda. Uganda operates 0400-2210 on 908 (100 kw); 575 (100 kw); 658 (20 kw); 728 (100 kw); 809 (100 kw); 998 (50 kw); and 1160 (2 kw). (NRC via MWN 3/78)

USSR. Vladimir-926 seems to have increased power as it now booms into Sweden. (Distance via MWN 3/78)
