- 8.1-45 Raise the annual membership dues to \$16.50 domestic, \$20.00 airmail via Canada, and \$6.00 trial.
- 8.1-46 Change article V, Sec 2, Part 1.i of the IRCA bylaws to read "(The President) shall update the Constitution & Bylaws whenever amendments are enacted and make printed copies available to the membership."
- 8.1-47 Delete Article V, Sec 2, Part 2.b of the IRCA Bylaws and renumber the remaining parts.

COMMENTS

Bill Hardy indicated that while he personally favored 8.1-45 because the membership at large seems to prefer it, he abstained due to a conflict of interest caused by winning a free year's membership. 8.1-46 & 47 will be voted on by the membership at some convenient time in the future. 8.1-46 eliminates the requirement to print the C&BL in the bulletin once a year. 8.1-47 eliminates the requirement to issue membership cards (however, Rich still has a few hundred of them in case anyone wants one).

1350 KIDN CO, Pueblo 8/28 0420-0443 w/light C&W mx, and SIDs. Promo at 0442 that KIDN & Squirt are giving away prizes at the Colorado State Fair. "We're never kiddin' when it comes to winnin'" slogan. (SMM-CA)

1360 KFIV CA, Modesto 8/23 2353 fair in KGB partial null w/"KFIV, playing the rock & roll for you." Then OM ment that Robert W. Morgan would be next on the air. (SMM-CA)

1440 USA, Corpus Christi, KEYS, nil-good last Feb & nil-fair in May w/"Keys" IDs & dial-a-hit requestline. Friendly QSL from Marc Parma, Chief Operator, who has been w/the stn for 31 years!

1530 USA, Harlingen, KUBT, s/off in EE after SS pgm 0500 very good. No real sign of usually dominant KFBK.

1555 CAYMAN ISLANDS, Georgetown, R. Cayman, fair 0345 to s/off w/EZL mx & full ID at s/off.

1600 USA, Winter Garden, WOKB, fadein 0345 w/black soul mx 5/25 & "W-O-K-B Winter Garden" ID 0400 & into Black National Netwk Nx til 0405, then further black mx w/host who called himself "Dap Sugar Willie". Still hrd 0700 way o/other US stns. Couldn't understand why I hadn't hrd the previous night. Subsequent rpt sent proved to be their first from NZ (along w/Bryan Clark's rpt, who was listening w/me) as it was their first night of 24 hour operation. Very friendly v/l & tape verification 10 minutes long from Stn President Jack Everbach.

REPORT FROM BERMUDA - Charles A. Taylor

Greetings from beautiful Bermuda, land of sun, sand, & DX. Arrived here 9/3 at 1500 LT, 1800z, 1300 EST. Presently staying at Harbor Lights Apt, St. George's Parish, until we find more suitable housing. We're on same island as NAS Bermuda

(formerly Kindley US AFB). NASA site is on Cooper's Island, the extreme SE extension of NAS Bermuda, about 1 mile SW of St. David's Lighthouse. At NASA am currently working on UHF command uplink to Skylab. DX is something else here! During day, mainland (US) signals are barely audible via seawave on nearly every freq, except big NY 50 kw clears (such as WOR) which are quite listenable on the SPR-4. At ISS, eastern Caribbeans & Venezuelans begin taking over dial, followed by Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico, & Dominican Republic, later. The Cubans are generally buried w/cochannel YVs, HIs, & PRicans. Your 50 kw US & Canadians are usually buried, not to appear clearly (along w/Cubans) until around ISR. Europeans still aren't too hot, but Monaco/France-1466(sic) noted w/armchair copy, along w/fair sigs from Dakar-765, Agadir-935, BR-1602, & the usual powerhouse Conakry-1403. Expect TAs to improve.

- *Been hearing Asian TPs regularly the last month, though mostly w/weak signals, & not too many have been present at any one time. Brief check 1330 9/19 yielded only 3 weak TPs. Have managed to bag 2 new Aussies this month, 5CK & 2GF. DUs have been weak in general and, strangely enough, 2NR-700 has been generally absent. This high sunspot count has me worried... I miss those outrageous TP openings I hrd many times in 1976 (Tomer, CA)
- *This has to be the poorest start to a DX season in many years. Looking back I note that w/o exception the late Aug/early Sept period has always been very productive for TAs since at least the 74-75 period. The first 6 days of 9/75 produced xlnt TA openings w/better than average eastern European reception. By contrast, the 9/78 season has been the pits w/few TAs hrd. As I only seriously DX on occasional weekends there's always the chance I'm missing something during the week but even during 76 & 77 when I was also only a "weekend DXer" cx were far superior.
- Solar activity has taken an upswing after relatively low summer activity. The flux is back to the high 100's. Geomagnetic cx have been generally unsettled to active w/a major storm noted 8/28 w/A_p up to 78, I believe. (Eckman, PA)
- *I've never seen a September so devoid of TPs. I haven't hrd one speck of audio from northern Asia all month. This season is not getting off to a very good start. A-index has been high every time I checked; now I just hrd a polar cap absorption event is in progress which can't bring anything good. (Peterson) (It's DX'ings answer to the abominable snowman, hi.bp)
- *All the usual TPs have been hrd. Cx picking up. 9/22 very good. Should be interesting sorting things out after freq changes. (Williams)

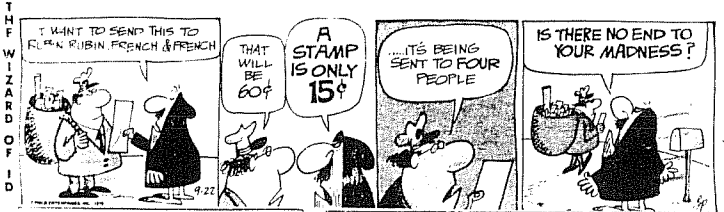
