Time Changes. New Zealand and Australia change to Summer Time on 10/29. NZ is GMT +13; Victoria, NSW and Tasmania are GMT +11; South Australia is GMT + 10½. Other Aussie states are on Standard Time-- Queensland GMT + 10, Northern Territory GMT + 9½ and Western Australia GMT + 8. The only other countries in the southern hemisphere observing DST appear to be Lord Howe Island (GMT + 11½), Chile (GMT - 3), and Easter Island (GMT -6). (NZDX 10/78)

TRANS-PACIFIC

Australia. The government has been considering legislation covering commercial FM licenses, with one condition being that no AM operator will be able to hold an FM license in the same city. (NZDX 10/78)

China. China has already switched to the new MW plan. Channels noted // to PLA-2340 are 558, 612, 615 (tentative), 882, 890, 1450, and 1470. Other CC stations on 684, 702, 909, 1008, 1053, 1323, 1368, 1404, 1494, 1566 and 1603. Many hets with stations still using old frequencies. (Mike Hardester, SCDX 10/24)

Hawaii/Japan. K200-1210 and Japanese station NSB (3925, 6055, and 9595 khz) will simulcast for more than 15 hours on 11/23 starting at 1530 GMT. Satellite linkage will be used to get the two stations together, to contribute to better understanding between the U.S. and Japan. Programming apparently will mainly originate in Hawaii. Special QSL cards for 1 IRC from NSB, 9-15, Akasaka 1-Chome, Minato-ku, Tokyo, Japan, 107. (SCDX 10/24)

Laos. External service on 1030 and 7145 khz is in various languages 2300-0130; 0400-0630; 1130-1400. Internal service on 640 and 6130 2230-0200, 0400-0700, and 0900-1530. (SCDX 10/17)

New Zealand. Radio Rhema began broadcasting late in October on 1575. (NZDX 10/78)

TRANS-ATLANTIC

Angola. Radio Nacional de Angola uses 944 and 1088 for B programming, 0715-0900, 1600-2300. Sundays 1615-2100. Emissor Regional de Mogamedes-1331 now signs off at 2400. (Arctic 10/20)

Bophuthatswana. A group in Johannesburg has applied to the Bophuthatswana government for permission to operate what they call 'southern Africa's first gospel station (what about TWR-Swaziland?). If granted, they hope to be on the air in five months, too optimistically. Richard Ginbey notes that although not recognized by most governments of the world, this country is independent of South Africa; it formerly was British Bechuanaland (not to be confused with the former Bechuanaland Protectorate now Botswana). (Arctic 10/20)

Bulgaria. Radio Sofia reported on 1511 with Home Service. (MWN 9/78)

Czechoslovakia. The three transmitters formerly on 272 when Topolna was under construction are now off that channel. Two (Strakonice and Olomouc are silent; Moravske Budejovice is on 899 relaying the South Moravian regional. (Arctic 10/20) 899 signs off at 1500. (MWN 9/78) A Czech jammer is used against Radio Free Europe on 720. (SCDX 10/17)

Egypt. Voice of the Arabs is now on 1106 with 1000 kw, //620; 0100-0600 and 1430-2235. (MWN 9/78)

France. Marseille-1241 has increased from 20 kw to 150 kw. (MWN 9/78)

Germany, East. Power increases 11/23: Neubrandenburg-657 2000/20 kw; Burg-783, 1000 kw; and Neubrandenburg-1575 500 kw. Burg also on 1044 with 1000 kw. (MWN 9/78) The transmitter at Burg on 908 is still in operation despite promises to West Germany to stop. Noted on Wed. and Fri 2115-2215 in Italian. (Arctic 10/20)

Germany, West. Muenchen-Ismaning will move from 1602 to 801 on 11/23 and Nurnberg from 800 to 909. DLF now has another transmitter on 548 (300 kw) at Mainflingen. Braunschweig 548/755 is now out of service. There are two new stations: due: 200 kw at Thurmau (Bayreuth) and 100 kw at Nordkirchen (Dortmund). (MWN 9/78)

Great Britain. As of 11/23, 38 new BBC transmitters will come into operation along with 28 new multi-frequency aerial systems carrying up to five simultaneous transmissions; 24 new masts have been put up. Crowborough when on 648 is due to have 1200 to 2000 kw later this year. Traffic information will be broadcast on 526.5 khz, in the London area. World Service transmitters will be as follows:

200 kw is due for use in C. Scotland Radio 4. (MWN 9/78)

Radio 2 on 693 and 909 after 11/23 will be 24 hours. BBC hopes to open a Local station in Wolverhampton later this year. Ten more Local BBC stations are planned over the next two years. (Arctic 10/20)

Holland. Hoogeveen will move from 1594 to 1395. The two new Flevoland stations will be 600 kw each. (MWN 9/78)

International Waters. Radio Mebo II--announces 1610 khz. Peace Ship-- Power is still 50 kw 24 hours a day. FM/SW plans have been dropped. Abie Nathan will close down the Voice of Peace unless he can find two volunteer transmitter engineers. Anchored six miles off the Israeli coast, the station is staffed by international group of Jews and Arabs, broadcasting pop music, news and peace messages on 1540.

Radio Mi Amigo--will go to SW; will use a transmitter from Paraguay; expected to be in the 60 m band with at least 50 kw. Scan Radio-- a new pirate operating in the Sound between Sweden and Denmark. Will be on the air before Christmas, using 1430 khz. Operated by a group of Britons from a Dutch vessel under the Panamanian flag. Will have 20 hours a day of music, ads, and news, aimed toward Finland, W. Germany, Denmark, Sweden, and Norway. Most programming will be in EE. The Danish government has promised to close down any ship broadcasting illegal programs to Denmark. (MWN 9/78, SCDX 10/17 and 10/24, Arctic 10/20)

Iran. Abadan-576 is on 0100-0400 and on 1080 from 1400-0100 in Farsi, Arabic and English. (MWN 9/78)

An UnID Iranian has been heard at 0230 on 882 khz. Mahabad ex 897 is listed. Sanandaj(?) now heard on 1476 in evenings. (Arctic 10/20)

Ireland. Pirates are now on 1118, 1185, 1149, 1286, 1304, 1322, 1358, 1502, and 1586 khz. (Arctic 10/20)

Isle of Man. Manx Radio has been allocated £60,000 to start broadcasting in stereo. They moved on 10/1 from 1295 to 1367. Power is expected to be 4 kw into directional antennas. (MWN 9/78)

Italy. RAI plans to have Radio 1 on MW only by 1979, Radio 2 on MW and VHF, Radio 3 on MW and VHF with regional and local programs plus a new national Radio 4 network on VHF only (the former Radio 1 VHF network) with classical music and cultural programs. (MWN 9/78)

Lebanon. The Voice of Palestine, controlled by the PLO, has been heard in Finland just before s/off at 1800. Sawt al sauda il Palestina. Scheduled in AA 1100-1200 and 15-0-1800. (Arctic 10/20)

Madagascar. Antananarivo-1394 is now an all-nighter. (Arctic)

Malta. Deutsche Welle, Cyclops on 1554 now used 0700-0900 by other services than DW. DW will use this from early morning until early evening after 11/23 when they will move to 1557. (Arctic 10/20)

The Prime Minister of Malta has closed the British Forces Radio Station on Malta until the BBC makes amends for various alleged errors committed since March 1977. (MWN 9/78)

Morocco. Tetuan is now on 1060 ex 1052. (MWN 9/78)

Mozambique. Quelimane has finally switched to 1295 from 935. (Arctic 10/20)

Sri Lanka. TWR Puttalam-890 began regular modulated tests to India on 6/6, but ten days later the base insulators on the tower started giving way. Transkei. A little background info from Richard Ginbey: Transkei was annexed by the British in 1894 and incorporated into the Cape Colony. In 1930 the United Transkeian Territories General Council was formed to deal with matters of local government. In 1963 Transkei became a self-governing territory and in 1976 an independent republic (although not generally recognized as such by other governments. Ed). (Arctic 10/20)

Tunisia. Sfax-1570 will change from 5 kw to 1200 kw. (MWN 9/78)

Our US stations in the AM band are gearing up to 125% modulation as swiftly as they can while European stations are using 95% modulation daytime, but dropping to 85% at night by continent-wide agreement. These figures on European modulation levels, the first I have ever seen, come from Howard Eldridge who operates a frequency monitoring service in Denver for many stations in the rocky mountain area. At least half of the Denver stations have abandoned the long-established 100% modulation standard and gone to 125% modulation according to Eldridge. The results of this change in Denver and elsewhere are nothing less than catastrophic for DXing the BCB as a hobby. As the years go by in ever city it will become more difficult to hear out-of-town stations for 125% modulation creates local images that never existed before, and our local stations emit splash that may be heard 40 or 50 kHz away from their frequency. The broadcasting industry used to take pride in the quality of the sound transmitted, but quality is degraded at 125% modulation. I think we get more treble and less bass, but I wish someone like Bob Foxworth would comment on this point. And those figures on European modulation, I suppose, explain why the Europeans sound so much better than our US stations. 73.

Howdy! Bill Harms' DXW tip on JOIB 750 has prompted me to write this long overdue forum. JOIB is indeed constant, and also can have an extremely early fade-in. I mean blasting in right on top of YHX/WSB by 0700 GMT! If it's making it to Provo, it should be heard all over the west. I've also heard the Siberian on 840 making it's evening debut by 0700. After reading Jim Korn's comments re KRCQ 1500, I'm no longer wondering why I've never logged that station! Their coverage sounds about as bad as local KNCR's. One hilltop XR site that seems to work well is 1400 KSLY's, they're my main pest on that freq and I'm 500mi/800km away. DX here this fall has been severely hampered by me being worked to death by my employer, and even worse, the local noise level has gone from awesome to horrendous. Even my little mini-beverage picks it up now. Pest overall results lately seem to be w/the 30' shortwire draped across the roof. In my experience, wire antennas don't work too hot w/out a good ground, like grounding your rig to the nearest cold water pipe. I rarely use a loop at all anymore for foreign DX (must be getting lazy, hi). The new radio shack DX-300 looks good on paper. An unreliable source told me it was manufactured by R/S themselves, but it looks to me like a warmed over yassu frog. #1 rx for me is still the HQ180, a marvel on American ingenuity, it keeps on doing the job (sort of like a '64 chevy Impala, hi.) 73 de RET

First, briefly, KDIA, KNEW, KEST, KABL, KPFC, KGS, KRE all date back to the '20s, and all but KPFC & KEST had 3 letter calls. David, you're a good distance from KNBR, but I believe you're directly across the bay from their Redwood City XR site, and if it weren't for Coyote Hills, you could probably spit at KGO, hi! Gene, a lot of US broadcasting has gone bad sound-wise for one thing, MONEY!!! What you were describing is mid-range sound. Signals are being severely compressed, dropping both highs and lows so that they will sound louder. The result, as you pointed out, severs splatter in spurs. The bigger the market, the worse the competition and the worse the quality of the signal. Some stations here, especially KNEW 910 and KPFC 610 compress so much that it sounds like everyone has asthma! In Europe, most stations are government owned, with 1-3 networks, no competition, no race for the big mark (goodness knows they're not interested in the dollar, hi), no

ratings games, so they can sink govt money into good equipment and really sound good. The times I've been to Europe, I really appreciated the full-range sound and lack of slop. A good example, in Monte Carlo, looking at their XR, I could DX 9 kHz away from 1466 w/minimum slop, & they're not exactly low power! But, away from large markets, Santa Rosa in particular, KVRH 1460/101.7 has fantastic range of sound, and on FM, their bass makes my speakers rumble. I also would like comments re this from poxy, would be interesting from an engineer's viewpoint. Gotta run. Remember gang, double space, pls. 73 de RTH..

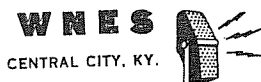

(continued from last DXM) Take a piece of insulated stranded #26 wire and strip off 1/8" of insulation. Tin the lead with solder and solder it to the black transistor lead closest to the top lead of the .04 uf. disc. Bring the wire to a terminal pin or screw going through the back cover of the TRF to the outside. Install a second such terminal and solder a .01 uf. capacitor from it to the yellow external-antenna jack lead. Remove the black lead from the antenna jack to the main tuning capacitor: it does nothing. Close up your TRF. At the external pins, place a 2K potentiometer. Adjust it on a split until over-regeneration (a squealing or motorboating sound) occurs. Increase the resistance slightly: enhanced selectivity should occur. The optimum condition will be when the trimmer capacitor (adjacent to the upper right side of the main tuning capacitor) has been tweaked for peak sensitivity at the frequency of interest. Drilling a hole in the TRF back to make this trimmer accessible from the outside would be advisable. If the 2K pot used for the regeneration adjustment is too hard to fine-tune, go to a 1K, or lower, pot. If the over-regeneration (squealing) will not stop with the 2K pot, try a 10K pot. I have initiated these ideas for the experimenter - maybe one of you will improve upon them. It does supply a cheap and easy alternative to installing a mechanical filter and added gain stages. 73.


