Listeners were heartbroken on the 8/25 "Herb Jenko Nitecan Show". An announcement by Herb at the beginning said the program would soon be discontinued. A substitute host took over and the remainder of the show was on this subject. On the 8/28 show, Herb was back and an insistent listener got out of him that he "Had collapsed and couldn't take it any more." Herb cried on the air.

Two famous top 40 AM's have moved the rock to co-owned FM's and instituted new formats on AM: WAVE-1300 New Haven CT is now automated MOR w/Red Sox Baseball (stolen from WNHQ-1340) while WKCI-101.3 is now rocking. WMEF-1380 Fort Wayne IN changed calls to WQHK and is now country. The rock is on WMEF-97.3.

The new, interconnected RKO Radio Network should be in operation by 10/1/79. It will share APRadio's satellite system and be 15 kHz stereo....On 8/24, WCFL-1000 Chicago IL kicked off it "Lifestyle Radio" format under new (Mutual) ownership....WFMT-1450 Cicero IL, now operating temporarily simulcasting classical WFMT-FM-98.7, will soon be two stations; Polish-formatted WCEV and Black-formatted WXOL, which will share transmitter and time....KTNQ-1020 Los Angeles CA is now Spanish. The top 40 format and jocks all went to KHTZ-97.1....WCBS-880 replaces WOR-710 as NY Jets football flag this year....WPRN-950 Philadelphia PA now runs talk from 7-11PM EDT, and ID's as "WPRN-950" instead of "95-PBN". Format is pop....WCIQ-1590 Chester PA is on the Mutual Network.

Drake-Chenault (syndicator) has come out with competition for Watermark's "American Top 40" national countdown show. New program is called "The Weekly Top 30" and does not use Billboard magazine as a sole source. RKO & Drake Chenault, in the meantime, are working on a yearend "Top 100 of the Seventies" program...Dean Tyler is out as PD at WNEW-1130, to be replaced by Russ Knight from WHK-1420...Don "Imus in the Morning" Imus will be back on morning drive at WNBC-660 New York by the time you read this...Larry Berger, Program Director of WPLJ-95.5 New York has taken on additional duties as PD at WABC-770 where the last PD, Glen Morgan, had disagreements with corporate management over how much disco WABC should play.

James Gabbert, longtime radio proponent, is selling his KTQI-1010 San Francisco, among other stations, so he can buy KEMO-TV-20 there. He's planning on one unusual program, a "video DJ" show, similar to radio programming, but where videotapes of performers, instead of records, are played. He also wants only UHF stations to be allowed to broadcast stereo audio, should stereo TV audio ever be approved.

KSTT-1170 Davenport IA broadcast a 40-minute talk show featuring President Carter during his recent Mississippi cruise. It was a telephone-talk format, but the calls all had to be outgoing. The telephone company wouldn't allow a call-in show as it would probably destroy telephone service in two states.

KFWB-980 Los Angeles is now an NBC affiliate.

I hope all had a good summer. Now, a new DX season is upon us. It's about time for some East Coast DXpedition activity. This desire is spurred on by accounts of Rick Kenneally's successes on his recent Florida TRF IA DXpedition and by the TP party held by Portzer and others in the Pacific Northwest. Not since the New Hampshire Beverage days of Gordon Nelson has there been any serious DXpeditioning in the Northeast having the logging of overseas stations the major thrust of operations. I'd be willing to get involved in such an endeavour, provided that is held within a reasonable distance of my QTH: this would include ME, NH, MA, RI, CT, Long Island, and (maybe) eastern NJ. The site chosen should be a coastal one with water to the NE, E & SE for European, African, & eastern South American reception. There should be sufficient land to permit erection of at least one Beverage 1200' or longer to be pointed

60° E of N to haul in TA's; a second Beverage or LW could be used for LA's. The ideal site would be a beach cottage: the "TA-bev" would be strung from the cottage to the edge of the water. The location chosen should be reasonably free from strong local stations, powerline noise, & TVI. If someone can come up with a suitable site, I can offer the following: R390A/URR, Realistic TRF, MW-1 and SM-2 loops, Beverage wire, phasing unit for 2-wire operation, tape recording gear, tapes, reference books, maps, headphones and other accessories. If a cottage is not available, a well-equipped van could be used to house the operation. A good DXpedition would consist of 4 to 6 experienced DXers operating 3 or more stations: one receiver (R390A or HQ180A) coupled to a TA Beverage (or phased Beverage array), a second receiver on an LA Beverage, and a third receiver on a loop for general purpose band-scanning. Sunset would be the most active time. A fourth station (TRF or car receiver) could be pressed into service if a really ripping aurora developed & LA's covered the dial. During such an aurora, the TA position would be used for catching rare Africans of the type heard by Mike Dunn in Nova Scotia a few seasons back. Come on, East Coast DXers-let's try to get something together this winter in the DXpedition department. 73, Mark.

The HQ-160 was in the shop for most of July (one less thing to move, hi), but the repairmen, both old Navy hands familiar with Hammarlunds, were unable to correct the problems because they said the proper adjustments could not be made without a functioning S-meter, which they also couldn't fix. Any information on where I might be able to find an S-meter that would work in the HQ-160 would be appreciated. I've tried several that should have worked but didn't. Even with the problems, the HQ-160 is in good shape and will be used for the upcoming season, which will be my first full season of DXing since 1976-77.
