WCAU also runs Mutual's Sunday football, even though they are a CBS affiliate. WCAU is no longer all-news and is getting heavily into sports...WCGM-1310 Camden NJ carries Notre Dame football as well as Temple football...More football: Villanova on WHAT-1340 Philadelphia; Penn State on WAP-1110, WBY-1570, WQJZ-1590, and now WCAU-1210, all in the Philly area...WTNJ-1300 Ewing NJ was noted on the Mets network this past season. WTNJ is also on ABC/I. WIOD-610 MiamiFL is on all of the following networks: Atlanta Hawks, Milwaukee Bucks, Philadelphia 76ers, Washington Bullets, New York Islanders, Philadelphia Flyers!

WAKY-790 Louisville KY is on ABC/I...The new RKO Radio Network is now in operation. It's been heard on WYLO-98.7, but not on WOP-710. According to various trade papers, all of the following AM stations, famous for their formats for years, have turned to pop/adult: WBBF-950 NY, WKTQ-1320 PA, WHB-710 MO, WFIL-560 PA, KNOW-1490 TX, KYNO-1300 GA, KRKE-610 and KQEO-920 NM, KCBQ-1170 CA, KLIP-1190 TX. KFJZ-1270 Port Worth TX runs talk 2000-2200 CLT. KSD-550 St. Louis MO is now news/talk. WJNO-1250 West Palm Beach FL is now all-news. WGMA-1320 Hollywood FL dumped a country format for pop and decided to make fun of country music in its last hours. Announcer: "Rednecks are a race that come from bus stations where they spit on the floor and pick their nose!" Caller on phone: "How would you like your nose picked with a shotgun?" WGMA also received bomb threats.

In New York, the CBS Mystery Theater has moved from WMPW-1130 to WMCA-570, where it airs at 1907. WNEW has moved Sears Theater to 0007 Tues-Sat. WNEW has also brought back the "Make-Believe Ballroom" big band program from 1000-1400 ELT daily as they aim for an older audience.

(WGR) KY, Buffalo 9/30 0230-0330. Noted off. (MB-ON)
560 WFIL PA, Philadelphia 9/25 0200-0223 w/rock and disco mx, "56 WFIL" ID jingles, PSA from the Big Sisters of Philadelphia, promo for contest. Fair o/WIND w/little WGR slop. (EB-ON)
610 WGIR NH, Manchester 10/20 2243 Coming in lousy compared to usual strength. Fair amount of QRM u/them. (MPS-NH)
640 KFI CA, Los Angeles 10/3 0210-0230 Finally in well over CMQ with Top-40 mx, U.S. Silver Co. com'l, Liberal TCs, Fair-good (JB-NY)
WHLO OH, Akron 10/18 1930-1943 Fair-poor. Phone talk pgm, TC & ID at 1933, commercial at 1936, ID and wx at 1938. Now at least 1 stn for every freq. Kind of surprised to hear this. (MPS-NH)
680 WETF NC, Raleigh 10/3 2100-2111 NBC News, Raleigh area wx & news, a local insurance co. spot. Poor, buried by CFTR. (JB-NY)
730 CJNR OH, Elind River 10/21 0211-0231 A confusing recurring problem here: T-40 mx by Supertramp, Donna Summer, Kiss etc., commercial for Mel's Furniture and Carr's Esso in Elliot Lake and ID's by DJ only as follows "C K N R". Fair signal in CKAC null. CNRR (also heard once) is in Elliot Lake on 1340, both stations are related; but when does CJNR have their own pgm & when do they relay CKNR? I noticed that they failed to mention the freq in the ID. This heard few times before also, and my report from March is un-answered; as is the mystery... Note also, that Carr's Esso must have a big advertising budget, because I've heard the same commercial 4 times now!! (NW-ON)
740 WBAM AL, Montgomery 9/13 0130-0200 On all night w/Hurricane Frederick warnings & c/w mx. Warned people to turn off all electricity except a radio. Fair-poor. Heard before on ET. (MB-ON)
790 CKSO OH, Sudbury 10/15 0139 Was just tuning across the dial when I noted CHIC really with QRM, 0139, ID mention of CKSO sunspots into "What's It Gonna Be" by Private Eye. Fair o/u CHIC w/WTAR (NW-ON)
- 830 WNYC NY, New York 10/20 1923-1935 Good. Opera mx until 1925, talk-show at 1926. (MPS-NH)
910 CHRL EQ, Roberval 10/20 1947-1955 Fair. WJAR slop, FF, FF & EE pop mx, OM. (MPS-NH)
WNHV VT, White River Jct. 10/26 1622 In very good w/ads for Lehanon P&C and Bradford, VT and TC. (BC-VT)
920 WGHQ NY, Kingston 10/26 1628 Ad for Kingston Trust & "...on WGHQ". In fair w/others. (BC-VT)
950 WIBX NY, Utica 10/20 1958-2009 Very good. Battlestar Gallactica Theme, ID "Serving the communities of...Albany...this is WIBX, Utica", then CBS nx & 5 way wx forecast at 2006. Faded out at 2009. WPEN QRM. (MPS-NH)

- 950 WROL MA, Boston 10/20 1618-1631 Good. Many commercials, wx, ID at 1630 "950 WROL Boston" by OM. Mr. Uptodate here never realized that WRYT changed calls! (MPS-NH)
- 980 *WFHG* VA, Bristol 10/15 0158-0217 The capping of a successful MM. Apparent ET or automated pgm (although they are listed as sign off at 0100) w/nonstop mx by Styx, CCR, Herb Alpert, Stealer's Wheel, Led Zeppelin, Commodores w/one jx ID at 0210. Very good loud signal way above CFPL. My 5th newie this MM. (NW-ON)
- 990 WVSC PA, Somerset 10/21 1844-1845 Very good. Mx, s/off by OM, "WVSC-AM now leaves the air. WVSC-AM (freq, power and what sounded like Husband Rd.)...PA...7:30. We now invite you to tune to 97.7...County...portions of today's programs were pre-recorded", then gone. They weren't fadey, I just couldn't write fast. (MPS-NH)
- 1050 (CHUM) ON, Toronto 10/15 0115-0230 Silent this AM 0115-0230, leaving WHK and XEG underneath. CHUM was also off in Sept. on the 3rd NK; so may be something new! I'm crossing my fingers that they are off on 11/7, 11/10 and 11/19. (NW-ON)
- WWGP NC, Sanford 10/16 1832 c/w mx following wx forecast. Good atop the channel. (WPT-DC)
- 1060 WNOE LA, New Orleans 10/15 0116 Already a regular now, ID at 0116 into "The Logical Song" by Supertramp and "Don't Bring Me Down" by E.L.O.. Fair w/CJRF and KYW off. (NW-ON)
- 1070 KNX CA, Los Angeles 10/15 0115-0130 In dogfight w/WIBC and HJAG w/mx and commercials including one for a Fiesta contest. Poor-very poor signal w/CHOK and CHUM both off. (NW-ON)
- 1110 CED NE, St. John 10/25 1640 Local nx by male & wx for the Maritime Times by a girl. Good. (BC-VT)
- CEPR ON, Hawkesbury 10/25 1520 In good w/FF mor & ID in FF. (BC-VT)
- WSEW NY, Seneca Falls 10/18 1834 S/off w/went of FM outlet on 99.3 MHz, then SSB. Fair signal. (WPT-DC)
- 1150 CHSJ NE, St. John 10/25 1658 "Radio 1150, the Spirit of St. John" in good w/SSB o/others. (BC-VT)
- WSKW ME, Skowhegan 10/21 1625 w/rock & ads, ID as both WTOS & WSEW. WTOS is FM. Very good w/CJRC/u. (BC-VT)
- 1190 WANN MD, Annapolis 9/26 1913 W/s/off annocmt ending with "...Have a most pleasant good evening and may God bless you...and may God bless your family too...peace, love, health, wealth, prosperity, loads of happiness...God bless you, my friends...nitey nite...have a great evening". No SSB. Fair-good o/WOWG & WLIB. (HB-ON)
- 1230 CHVD PQ, Dolbeau 10/14 0328 w/FF talk, message for "Participation" (a PSA for physical fitness), "CHVD" ID jingle, then gone in GY mess. (HB-ON)
- WCMC NJ, Wildwood 10/22 1932 Wx forecast for southern NJ (temp 62°F) Fair atop GY pile. (WPT-DC)
- 1270 WXYZ MI, Detroit 10/21 0154-0159 Good. Phone pgm, OM gave ID's before taking another call. (MPS-NH)
- 1340 WEPK WV, Martinsburg 9/22 0404 w/local nx mentioning a speech by Governor Rockefeller (he's dead, no?) wx, then lost. Very poor. (ed: The Rockefeller referred to is Jay Rockefeller, (HB-ON) presently governor of West Virginia and a nephew of Nelson Rockefeller, former governor of New York, who died about one year ago.)
- WHID NJ, Atlantic City 10/1 0215-0217 w/PSA for prevention of cruelty to animals, promo for "WHID's Music Bonus" contest. Good for a minute, then lost. (HB-ON)
- WTRN PA, Tyrone 9/29 1914-1917 w/long sports report mostly on college football. Promo for Pirates baseball on WTRN. Gave scores for local small colleges, but signal was lost before they got to Slobovia State vs Basketweaving A&K (hi). (HB-ON)
- 1410 WHLN KY, Harlan 10/14 1853-1859 Good w/ON-J, "Rise" u/WING, then loud 1853-1859 s/off in WING null, tristate wx. Short s/off, SSB. New. (PRM-OH)
- 1420 (WHK) OH, Cleveland 10/15 Silent this MM. (NW-ON)
- WOC IA, Davenport 10/15 0047-0106 In w/mor mx (mostly inst), ID's and TC's and some commercial for a shampoo at 0058, no nx on the hour. Poor-fair w/QRM from UNID stn w/EE talk show, & CKPH slop. Number 581 heard. (NW-ON)
- ???? UNID, 10/15 0045-0110 EE talk show, no ID's heard. Thought there was CBS news on the hour, but not sure. Poor w/WOC/CKPH QRM. (NW-ON)

1440 WBUY NC, Lexington 10/22 1831 End of nx pgm, ID w/ment of NC. Fair, before switching to night pattern. (WPT-DC)

1460 WBUC WY, Buckhannon 10/14 1730 First noted 1730 u/WBNS BB, jx into nx, louder, equal to WBNS near home, and ID'd and taped off TRF at home in WBNS null 1801. New. (PRM-OH)

1480 CHRDR PA, Drummondville 10/20 1819-1820 Fair. Mx, "Dim All the Lights", then FF talk by OM. (MPS-NH)

WADR NY, Remsen 10/20 1815 Very good. S/off "WADR...Remsen, NY.... pre-sunrise power of...hundred watts...9579 Main St....Join us again tomorrow for more of the mx America loves" by OM (MPS-NH)

1510 WAHT PA, Annville-Cleona 10/14 1822-1829 Good w/WLAC QRM w/rock and spots for Lebanon, s/off 1829 w/address. New. (PRM-OH)

???? UNID, 10/21 1829 Mention of Tri-valley Area wx at 1829, 101 FM under WLAC. (PRM-OH)

1540 WARD PA, Pittston 10/18 1831 S/off after some song, the announcer simply said "and good night from WARD Pittston...", no SSB. Good signal w/no QRM, as CHIN had just left the air. (NW-OH)

WNIO OH, Niles 10/11 1845 W/end of a program on mental health, s/-off at 1845 with two sign-off announcements but no SSB. Fair over WPTR. (MB-OH)

WRSM AL, Sumiton 10/13 1915 Heard only part of s/off annmnt, mentioning studios and offices located in Sumiton and giving call letters. Very poor. Ten minutes later I heard ZNS-1 in Nassau on this same frequency. IRCA Almanac lists this station as having been granted permission to move to 1190 kHz. I definitely heard mention of Sumiton in their s/off, though I am only 90% sure of the call letters. (MB-OH)

1550 WBSC SC, Bennettsville 10/13 1900-1922 Blasting in over CBE w/c&w mx, several local ads, OM DJ w/a thick southern accent. (MB-OH)

WNOO AL, Mobile 9/12 0133 On AN w/hurricane warnings, warned people to stay inside, keep their radio on, don't use phone and not to drink tap water, as Mobile's water supply may be contaminated. Also had short message to Mobile residents from WNOO's president (and v/s) Wilbur H. Goforth. Fair-good o/CBE's OC. (MB-OH)

WORI TN, Oak Ridge 10/15 1901-1907 Very good near Logan, OH on U.S. 33 w/TN mentions in mx, then into rock 1901-1907. Not heard before, but not countable. (PRM-OH)

WRHC FL, Coral Gables 10/17 1845 Caught s/off, only could decipher the call letters; but s/off was in EE. Poor u/CBB. (NW-OH)

1560 WMIC MI, Sandusky 10/8 1825 ID by OM after talk by YL, rather weak w/WWBK and WQXR QRM. (NW-OH)

WPAD NY, Paducah 10/7 0300-0307 w/CBS nx, short local nx and wx, s/off w/SSB played on guitar. Fair & alone on freq. (MB-OH)

1570 WKOL NY, Amsterdam 10/23 1741-1743 A real surprise coming in good over CPOR & CKLM with Amsterdam wx and Amsterdam McDonalds' Halloween Party spots. Quickly in and out. (JB-NY)

WLEK MA, Westfield 10/20 1708 Fair. Wx, ment of Westfield, I think OK said 40 degrees. (MPS-NH)

t WOBS IN, New Albany 10/14 1900 Fair at s/off "tomorrow morning at 6 when...a fine day...WOBS(?) Radio" and SSB. Can anyone confirm these words used in WOBS s/off? (PRM-OH)

1580 KCHA IA, Charles City 10/14 1928 Fair w/talk by F DJ, wx, s/off by F promos 95.9 FM, girl spoke again, then off 1930. (PRM-OH)

KFDF AR, Van Buren 10/14 1944 Fair w/s/off "entire s&m of KFDF, bidding you...", no SSB. Often heard at SS. (PRM-OH)

KNIM MO, Maryville 10/14 1945 After KFDF s/off, KNIM started theirs 1945 mentioning 250w and South Highway 71, Not A Way Broadcasting Corp. Second time heard. (PRM-OH)

WANB PA, Waynesburg 10/24 1815-1845 Good-very good above 1580 mess, CKLM & WAKR slop. Fine sounding YL amncr spinning pop mx like "Enjoy Yourself" and "You Shine A Light On My Life". Union-town Farm Equipment & other local spots. sign-off at 1845. Invited listeners to join WANB-FM, 103.1 mhz. (JB-NY)

WBBR SC, Travelers Rest 10/13 1858-1859 W/sign-off, no SSB. Fair to poor. Last heard in November '78. 10/13 was a weird night for sunset and post-sunset DX above 1500! (MB-OH)

WCRV NJ, Washington 10/22 1803-1815 Out of local news into country mx like "Burgers & Fries" and "You Decorated My Life". S/off at 1815, no SSB. Good, but prone to fading. (JB-NY)

- 1580 WSBP FL, Chattahoochee 9/13 0000-0018 w/hurricane warnings, gave coordinates (latitude & longitude) of the eye of the storm, played c&w or Gospel mx between hurricane reports, s/off at 0018 w/full sign off announcement, no SSB. Fair-poor o/XEDM & CBJ. (NB-ON)
- WSRF FL, Ft. Lauderdale 10/20 2216-2232 Good. c/w mx, ID at 2231, "This is WSRF, playing the best...", then SID. State # 27 and now halfway to 500. I could feel that FL heat coming thru, (either that or sweat, hi!) (MPS-NH)
- 1590 WHPY NC, Clayton 10/21 1845 Very good, s/off by F at 1845 mention 2.8 mi W of Clayton, 500 dir. W 06-SR, 5000w SR-SS. (PRM-OH)
- WVNA AL, Tuscumbia 10/14 1946 Good w/CBS Dateline America nx pgm, and ID into PSA at 1946, o/WAKR. New. (PRM-OH)
- 1600 CHNR OH, Simcoe 10/20 2307-2315 Good. Wx, sx, ID "And that's sx at CHNR" by OM, mx "It Don't Come Easy" & "Pop Muzik" (MPS-NH)
- WEUP AL, Huntsville 10/15 1900 Blasting in at Logan, OH w/wx for Montgomery, Birmingham and Huntsville, "Disco 16 WEUP" sic-gans. (PRM-OH)
- 1620 "PRN" MA, ??? CLANDESTINE Pirate Radio New England 9/21 0110-0146 w/Stones mx, not taking call-ins, OM ancr said that they had moved from 1615 because of slop from stations on 1600 (more likely to keep the feds confused). Played more Stones mx, oldies like "Get Off My Cloud", "Satisfaction" & "Route 66". Fair-poor and faded out by 0146. (NB-ON)

Hi. Today is October 22, and I just realized it was time to write a forum. This month has netted me 13 new stations so far (I only needed 9 to fill my quota) including CBN for province #10 and a couple of Colombians on 1070, 1100 & 1550. Hopefully you will see my loggings in EDXR or DXWW. Verification-wise, all reports (6) sent out this fall have been verified, plus a couple of overdue ones: CHOR, CHOW, WFBL, WDEE and WWDR recently. Totals are now 585/225 stations, 16/10 countries, 41/38 states and 10/8 provinces. Hopefully I'll reach 600/240 by 1980, and I hope to verify CBN soon to make me 10/9 in Canada (need AB verified). This fall has shown me two interesting DX pointers: (1) "When DXing, scan the whole band." I used to only concentrate on 1500-1600 and FY frequencies. Now I scan, and have become successful in an area (540-1100) which I used to ignore. WEBC, XEQN, XEG, HJCN, HJAG, CJET, WNOB, CJRP, and CBN are a reward for this new style. I was checking 640 to see how CQZ was doing when CBN popped in. (2) "If you can't FRG, then TRF." What? What I mean here is, I am never able to DX with my FRG on MM with lights on, etc. (due to my parents), so I have to resort to my TRF while I lie in bed in darkness. It works! I believe that 21 of 24 new stations since September were on the TRF. Well, gotta go. Don't I? 73's.

A Staten Island friend who I'm trying to get to join IRCA tells me he picked up Stuttgart, West Germany, on 576 kHz, during a WMCA silent period. He is more dedicated to DXing than I am, and is in a better location. I still notice a few sets on the market with super sensitive on them. Sharp has a nice one going for \$30. I've been looking at it. Sanyo has a smaller one, their model 514, marked high sensitivity. Some of those smaller sets are powerhouses. They will pull in a station on an adjacent New York frequency with clear audio. Lately I find myself listening to shortwave. When I travel around I like to take a radio with me to scan the bands as to distant stations coming in 10 and 20 miles from my QTH. Elliot Straus is looking for the worst DXing locations. Well, my mid-town Manhattan spot has to qualify as rock bottom. Harmonics from WINS, WMCA, WOR, WABC, & WFRW flood the dial. I should also add WHN

comes in on a few dial spots. Paul Mount has tried DXing from my loft and he calls my location "Spur City". That should explain why I was sending in poetry instead of fantastic DX reports. 
On Saturday, 1 December 1979, CJVB takes another giant step with the official inauguration of its new 50-kilowatt transmitter.

Not too long ago I was one third which means I'm slowly fading away to nothing! Last Jan. I reported in CDXR having received simultaneous signals on 540 and 990 of CBF 690 morning warm up. Some months later I received a letter from CBC Montreal saying what I heard was 40w LPRTs, CBF 540 located in Chibougamau, PQ and CBFB 990 Lac Megantic, PQ. Hard to believe, but there it is. Things I'll never understand - after CKPR 580 Thunder Bay, ON reduces power and changes pattern at night, 580 is nearly a dead freq. Nobody has a signal in this direction. Still living in cramped trailer so reception conditions still not the best w/noises at all hours of the day. It rolled into our condo on Maui last Dec via the little TRF with its obvious commercial religion program much stronger than any of the JOs. I might say it was even stronger than the mighty KNBR, because it was! It also beats out the JOs as heard in Denver and can be found many times when the most potent JOs cannot be heard at all. In checking my notebook recent weeks, I find that I have heard it w/the A-Index as high as 15, 18, and 26. On 04 Oct I noted no pips on the hour @ 1100. Speaking of QRM, a few weeks ago I was listening to 1310 w/the old DX-160 and picked up some faint splat from local 50kw CHQM 1320, which prides itself on having the cleanest sound around. Every 20 min or so the announcer was on to apologize for the QRM dues to "technical problems"! What a terrific hobby this could be if a few more stations would adopt that attitude. 73 de UGH.

891, 1134, 1143, and 1566, all SE Asians. KCBS 740, KEX 1190, and KFBK 1530 noted in strong. All of these loggings were made between 1200 and 1300 GMT. Rx: Song ICF-6700W w/internal loop. I have ordered a Radio West 22½" "DXers Special" loop which should improve reception, especially on marginal nights. Up here most nights seem marginal, often there is nothing on the dial at night except local KIAK 970 and AFRN 1490 at Eielson AFB.

UCLA CARRIER CURRENT STATION VS. KDOR

Dick Dorwart, operator of pirate station KDOR is filing with the Federal Communications Commission with hopes of turning his station into a legitimate operation. In fact, he has even gone around to the West Los Angeles and Santa Monica residents, collecting signatures to show that there is a need in that area for his non-format radio station.

However, there is a problem. KLA, the carrier current radio station on the UCLA campus, is planning to fight against Dorwart's attempts at returning KDOR to the air. KLA also broadcasts on 830 kHz and General Manager Manuel Pacheco says, "There's more than one side to this sob story." He referred to Dorwart's crippling bone disease that has left him in a wheelchair with his life-long ambition of operating a radio station.

Pacheco says that if the FCC approves KDOR's application for a building permit, KLA will start a petition to be circulated at various colleges in the area. In addition to the petition, KLA will also file a complaint with the FCC on the grounds that Dorwart's taking over the frequency of an already established station and that he had operated a pirate station for ten months.

Dorwart said that he had been assured by the FCC that his past record would not be held against him, and that since KLA is a carrier current station, as opposed to a station that transmits over the air, it has no claim over the frequency of 830 kHz. Dorwart added that he's not out to hurt anyone but, when the FCC grants someone the frequency on 830 kHz, it's going to knock KLA off the air.

"They're going to have to find a new frequency anyway", Dorwart says. But Pacheco claims that a frequency move would put undue strain on KLA's budget.

We'll just have to wait and see what the FCC decides to do about the fight over 830 kHz between KLA and KDOR.

This is a good place for a little TA discussion. With weak TA's being heard on the west coast now, there are some things to be watched for. Most TA's are very high powered as opposed to LU's so these freqs. would be your best bet. The following is a list (hardly definitive by any measure) of the TA's heard most often & most loud here, plus some info. According to my brief calculations the best chances for WC TA's would be 0130-0730 GMT, after 0730 most of Europe & British Isles are in daylight.

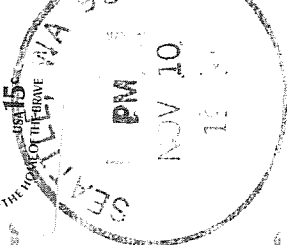

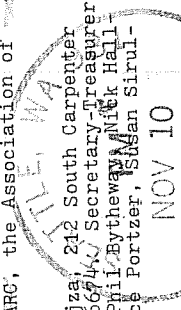
