- New articles for all DXers, including a summary of recent FCC actions (9 kHz proposal, expansion to 1700 kHz, etc.)
- And maybe a few surprises

In other words, it will be more up-to-date and useful than the first edition! We'll be accepting orders at the prepublication price until October 31. RADIO WQIQ-1590 Chester PA is off the air. The station was PPROGRAMMING last running a fairly successful adult contemporary format, NOTES but the owner saw the books and saw his top talent leaving for bigger markets, so he decided to throw in the towel...KARM-1430 Fresno CA has seven different formats, one for each day of the week. When the new owners took over, they ran a whole slew of different formats for a while and had listeners vote on them. The seven biggest were picked to go on line: top 40, big band, country, and four different-era oldies formats are on...More format changes: WKJJ-1080 Louisville KY from top 40 to country, now IDing as "Country 11"...WQAM-560 Miami FL from top 40 to country...WSAN-1470 Allentown PA from altum rock to country...WWOK-1260 Miami FL from country to Spanish/Latin...KORD-910 Pasco WA from pop to country...KENE-1490 Toppenish WA from automated to live country.

There are three major changes in NFL flagship stations this season: The Chicago Bulls move from WIND-560 to WVON-1390, which is a soul station. A controversy is underway as to whether WVON will require a black announcer to call the games. The Tampa Bay Buccaneers move from WFLA-970 to WDAB-1250. The New England Patriots move from WEZ-1030 to WEEJ-590. CBS Radio has a package of 36 NFL games to broadcast this season, including Monday-night games and all postseason games. CBS will also be doing the baseball championships and World Series in October.

Network news: WKXI-1310 Jackson TN is now cr. LARRY KING...KAYO-1150 Seattle WA has dropped AEC/E...KTNT-1400 Tacoma WA is now with ABC/C...KMO-1360 there is NBC...KZOK-1590 Seattle is with The Source...The owner of the National Black Network has formed a new American Black Information Network offering comprehensive black news. It should begin operation with 18 5-minute newscasts per day in November...CPWH-570 Whitehorse YT is now running all right with programming imported from Vancouver. The CBS net announced 3/4 that they have 361 affiliates now, 90 of which were added in the last 18 months.

Rumor department: undoubtedly, the rumor of the month is that KHJ-930 Los Angeles CA will be going country from top 40. The new Program Director is Charlie Cook, recently of country WFN-1050 New York...WCFL-1000 Chicago will definitely not be changing calls to WWTN (W-ten). WGN-720 protested that they sounded too much like their own call letters and won. The "Lifestyle" format which WCFL has been running for over a year, however, seems more sure to change, possibly to rock or country...It's rumored that HLDR-1090 Aurora CO will go oldies when the fulltime plant is built...KXA-770 Seattle may be switching from classical to oldies if the new owners have their way.

KREM-970 Spokane WA has been noted running a Sunday morning talk show on the broadcasting industry; could be once-a-month or weekly...KOMO-1000 Seattle is running old time radio programming 2130 FLT, except when pre-empted by sports...In Toronto, John Gilbert is moving his popular talk show from CFPH-1430 to CKEY-590, at 2300-0400 EDT. CKEY is considering networking it around Canada, making Gilbert another Larry King...Former US Secretary of Agriculture Earl Butz now has a short radio program. It's been noted on KID-590 Idaho Falls ID.

Syndication news: A big band live-performance program called LIVE AGAIN, is on WNEW-1130 New York and KQIN-800 Murien WA...There's another country countdown show out, COUNTRY REPORT COUNTDOWN, running four hours weekly, hosted by Ron Martin and Nancy Jordan of KMPC-710 Los Angeles...Elton John will be on the last of four ABC/I network ADULT CONTEMPORARY SPECIALS, to be fed on 11/5...The WALL STREET JOURNAL REPORT will begin feeding on 11/17 instead of 9/1. The delay is to allow some stations to receive it off AFR's new satellite network for better audio quality...Cleveland Amory's CUNNINGHEAD AT LARGE 90-second commentary is back in syndication. It's on KPRH-740 Houston, WQSA-1220 Sarasota FL, WING-940 Miami and WEBR-970 Buffalo NY...Fitness for 12 to 24 year old females is the subject of ACTION BEAT WITH KATHY RIGBEE, now in syndication...Drake-Chenault is planning another one of its 48-hour specials, this one called SATCCN ONE. It will imitate a continuous, two-day, live, intercity-via-satellite rock concert and will include 13 supergroups plus 60 other bands, interviews and features.

Ratings poop: In the August Mediatrends, in New York, WABC-770 moved from 11th to 5th, a reversal of their last-known direction. WJCA-570 went from 11th to 9th. In Los Angeles, KABC-790 is #1 again, but KMFC-710 drops to 16th. In Chicago, WGN-720 is still #1, and is back to a double-digit share, while WMAZ-670 goes 5th to 12th...In most major markets that have one, a 50000-watt fulltime AM station leads the ratings. In the Spring Arbitron results, here are markets where that was not the case, with the #1 station shown: New York (#1 market) WELS-107.5; Los Angeles (#2) KABC-790; Washington (#8) WVAL-630; Dallas-Fort Worth (#11) KVIL-FM 103.7; Cleveland (#16) WQAL-104.1; San Diego (#20) KJRY-103.7; Milwaukee (#27) WTMJ-620; Denver-Boulder (#22) KBFI-105.9; Miami (#23) WRHC-1550; Kansas City (#28) WDAF-610; Buffalo (#29) WJYE-96.1; Portland OR (#32) KGW-620; New Orleans (#34) WEZB-97.1; San Antonio (#37) KTSA-550; Sacramento (#38) KEAF-96.5; Memphis (#41) WHDG-97.1; Louisville (#42) WVEZ-106.9; Nashville (#46) WVCL-1470; Salt Lake (#49) KCFX-FM-98.7; Okla City (#50) KKNG-92.5. ...There's been a big flap in Miami over the way Arbitron takes the ratings. Storer Broadcasting, owner of WGES-710/WLYF-101.5, is suing ARB to recall as defective the April/May ratings report. The problem is that two of ARB's participating diary-filler-outers listed a station they listened to without call letters, but with only a frequency, 101.4. According to Arbitron's editing rule, there is no such frequency, and no station was given the listening credit. Storer says the listening belongs to WLYF.

WBTO-1600 Linton IN has hooked up a TRS-80 microcomputer to a voice synthesizer and the station audio system. You guessed it, the TRS-80 does the WBTO weather reports directly from typed-in copy. The computerized announcer has proved popular and the station is considering having it make personal appearances...On 9/1, CBS Radio provided live coverage of AFL-CIO President Lane Kirkland's first Labor Day Address...The 20-part weekend special planned by CBS called TELEVISION WATCHING: THE NEW SEASON reported in this column last month, may have to be postponed indefinitely. The problem is that there may not be a new television season this fall with Screen Actors Guild strike...Attempts are being made to either revive or replace Radio Caroline in International Waters off northern Europe. The boat carrying the pirate AM station sank early this year. The Dutch recording industry is in a slump without the rock station to give free airplay to its product. Hilversum Radio is not considered to be enough promotion.

In an upcoming President's Report, you will see the results of three proposals that seek changes to the major columns appearing in EM Monitor. This Forum tells why I voted "oppose" to the proposals. Proposal 9.2.2 suggests merging BDMF and WJMP to one column to become "IRCA Forum". Proposal 9.2.3 suggests merging BDMF, CHNR, and WJMR into one column. And proposal 9.2.4 suggests we drop EIT in favor of GMT. Basically I oppose these changes because IRCA and the National Radio Club complement each other as well as far as column formats and information provided. Combining the Roundups and Forums would give EM Monitor the same format of EM News, which I don't feel the IRCA members want. Look how EM and EM offer alternative approaches to providing information - let's examine an issue of each club's Bulletin. All switch in IRCA divides FCC actions into categories like call letters applied for, granted, changes and CPE applied for and granted, etc, listed by frequency within each; Broadcasting Information lists everything in one column by frequency. BDMF has the whole country in one column and divides tips by time of day; Roundups have all the day in one column, divided into three sections of the country by three editors. Similarly Musings all go to one editor while IRCA divides up into Eastern and Western IR Forum. IRCA lists foreign catches all in one column; whereas BDMF, while in one editors column, separates the catches by region of the station's origin. Each format has its advantages depending on your needs. And if you can afford it, the most information comes from membership in both clubs. Considering IRCA alone, these proposals do not take into consideration the added workload to the two editors chosen to do the country's worth of contributions. Do you, as proposer, know if Bob or Robert or Nancy, or Rick or I would be willing to take on a club-wide column? It's not like the columns aren't getting support and someone felt that his/her column isn't worth the effort. There were three Forum columns once, but when Bruce Weinberger moved out of the Eastern Region in 1978, the boundaries were changed to East and West of the St. River with then CHNR Editor and Board of Directors member John Zondla approving the change. That's the only "streamlining of editorial staff" that IRCA has had; instead there's been the tendency to expand our staff. At one time the Roundup and Forum in each region were done by the same person. At times heard and graveyard records were done by the same editor. So combining column and increasing workload is not a step in the direction that IRCA historically goes. As for GMT, I feel changing all the columns would cause more confusion than do anyone good; I also thought that discussion was settled several years ago when Bob Harrington, the proposer, was a member. Different times for reporting Domestic IR is one alternative IRCA and NRC need not offer. As a final note, I see that the proposer joined NRC and gets the combined columns he was looking for. Next issue features reports on the conventions you attended. Deadline September 23 (correct) then weekly on Tuesdays. 73 "u"

I've just started to DX again after a summer frittered away on less important pursuits, like working for a living. The new homebrew rx has reached the stage of being useful for some serious DX'ing, although there are still a couple of problems to be addressed. The combination of a diode-ring mixer with a very sharp passive front-end filter (the only RF amplification is about +6 db right at the loop antenna--just enough to ride out the inevitable noise picked up on the transmission line) works wonders at digging out signals out of the slop adjacent to the 50 kw locals. The defect of this scheme is that to build a really sharp passive filter with practical components, and to make it cover the 3:1 tuning range we have to deal with on BCB, you end up with so many ganged tuning capacitors that really good tracking is an impossible dream; but the effects of this don't seem to be intolerable. The alternative, I suppose, would be some sort of bandswitching scheme, but I have this irrational prejudice against bandswitching. . .

On another topic, although I have been a member for over a year now, it wasn't until I read in the 10 August CDXR that I found we have specific rules about the format of reports to the DXR columns. Maybe we should devote a page in the New Member Packet to these rules and a brief description of the sort of info which is likely to be most useful to other DX'ers reading these columns. I'm sure editors don't really object to violently when someone sins through the ignorance of the rules (I know I've submitted a couple of slightly defective reports to WDXR which Nancy has very graciously cleaned up for me without complaint); but I wonder how many readers and new members tend to be a bit shy about reporting at all simply because they don't know exactly what's expected of them? Or, perhaps, because they don't really understand just how the info in these columns can be used by other DX'ers, and therefore feel that their reports aren't likely to be of interest unless they're hearing 250 w daytimers from the other side of the continent? (Good point. I've listed WDXF rules until some IRCans thought I was overemphasizing. Basics are found in the IRCA By-Laws, however-Rth).

NICK HALL-PATCH, 1538 AMPHION ST., VICTORIA, BC V8R 4Z6 - Rcvd. 08 Sep

A very interesting piece of DU DX on 27 August; audio was noted at about 1302 GMT on 1566 with a woman reading news followed by a man reading weather. A TC heard places the station in the Australian eastern time zone. Five kw 3NE in Wangaratta seems most likely, so a tentative report out to them. Only other Aussie listed is a 200-watt ABC station in Queensland (4GM) which doesn't seem too likely--programming didn't sound like ABC anyway. On listening to the tape again, I noticed there's orchestral music in the background, so perhaps 4GM is a possibility after all, but I wouldn't bet on it!

I have also noticed the USSR station on 1476 a couple of times at 1300 GMT with the Kremlin bells--they used to s/on at 1430 GMT, so something new there.

I've inherited an RAS-5, a U.S. Navy communications receiver circa 1943, which is actually a National HRO traveling incognito; its circuit and physical design are quite close to what my HRO was originally, only it has 175 kHz IFs, which might prove interesting. It has suffered some modifications over the years, but nothing like what my transmogrified HRO has suffered. In fact I may try wiring the RAS-5 back to its original circuitry just for laughs. All for now. Best DX in the coming season. 73.

Everyone else has commented on strange summer weather, so I'll put in my dollar's-worth. (Inflation now makes 2¢ impractical, hi-Rth.) We've had the coldest, foggiest, drizzleiest, late summer I can remember since childhood. Even the inland valleys (read, wine country) which has near-daily temperatures in the 90s and occasionally in the low 100s, has barely reached the mid-80s. A Zonal Analysis Approach to Trans pacific DX

by Bruce Portzer

In recent months, Mark Connelly has developed the concept of zonal analysis, in which foreign ECB stations can be grouped according to loop bearing and distance from North America. As a result, generalized reception patterns can be developed and discussed for each group of stations. This article will continue the series of articles on the subject. The first two articles in the series covered TA and Latin American reception on the east coast. This article, as you may have already guessed, covers Trans Pacific reception on the west coast.

Table I shows the various Asian and Oceanic DX countries according to their loop bearing and distance from Seattle. If you live outside the Pacific Northwest, some stations may fall into an adjacent "box". However, that shouldn't have much of an impact on the comments which follow. Recategorization is left as an exercise for the reader, hi.

Zone 1 - Loop bearings of 200 to 240 degrees

The stations in this zone include many of the easiest-to-hear TP targets, located in Hawaii, New Zealand, and many of the Pacific Islands. Some of the more frequently heard stations in this zone include KORL-650, KIKI-830, KPOI-1040, Tonga-1017, 1YA-756, 1YZ-819, 1ZD-1008, Tahiti-738, and others. Many of the stations in this zone are audible the year around. Because of their easterly location, these stations fade in sooner than other Trans-Pacific stations. Those which are on 24 hours a day are audible (or at least feasible, QRM permitting) right up until West Coast sunrise. On the other hand, some of the smaller, more exotic stations in this zone sign off before midnight PLT, making them more difficult to receive.

Zone 2 - Loop bearings of 240 to 280 degrees

Reception patterns for stations in this zone are similar to those in zone one. However, these stations are noticeably more difficult to hear. Leading the pack are the Australians, especially 2BL-702, 4QS-747, and 3LO-774. Watch for Australians to fade in about an hour after New Zealanders appear. While reception from New Zealand is often good when Australians are in poorly, the opposite is seldom true. Other well received stations in this zone include Tarawa-846 and Solomons-1026. This zone also includes such rare and exotic stations as Papua New Guinea, New Calendonia, and Guam.

Zone 3 - Loop bearings of 280 to 320 degrees

Nearly all the Asian stations heard in North America are in this zone. Leading the pack are the Japanese stations. Although only a few hundred miles closer to us, Japanese signals need one less reflection off the ionosphere to reach the west coast than do other Asians. This, together with a more southerly path and high power, makes stations like JOIB-747, JOUB-774, and JOBB-828 come in well when other Asians aren't even audible. As a general rule, Koreans, Chinese, and some Russians are the next easiest stations to receive from this zone, followed by the less frequently heard Southeast Asia, Philippines, and Malaysia/Indonesia signals. Note the correlation between distance and ease of reception. Most of the stations in this zone are best heard between mid-September and early December, although Malaysia-1475 is best heard in May. The Japanese stations are first to fade in, usually around midnight PST, although fadeins as early as 2215 PST have been noted. Others fade in later in the night.

Zone 4 - Loop bearings of 320 to 360 degrees

Most of the stations in this zone are rarely, if ever, heard in North America. KFQD-750 is the only one I would classify as easy and more than one DXer would dispute that claim. Much of this region is sparsely settled with few high powered stations. All Asians in this zone arrive via high latitude, multiple-hop signal paths, making them easy prey for auroral disturbances and other nasty animals. Stations beyond 6000 miles are theoretically possible here but as far as I know, haven't been heard in North America in my lifetime; perhaps we'll nab them next time the sunspots bottom out (assuming North America isn't on the 9 kHz plan by then....).

IN CONCLUSION

As a general rule (ignoring interference, station power, and other considerations) the nearer a station is to the left hand side or to the top on Table I, the easier it is to hear in western North America. Hawaii, the "country" nearest to the upper left-hand corner, is certainly the one easiest to receive in these parts. Similarly, those in the lower right-hand corner are usually only called "pests" in the April Fool's issue of DX Monitor.

To some extent this table can be used for seeking out Asian and Pacific DX targets. If one or more stations in a particular "box" are in well, then try for other stations in the box and adjacent boxes. If those stations are also audible, move on to other adjacent boxes. By continuing in this manner you can conceivably get a better idea of the extent of a particular opening (and maybe bag a new country or two). TP openings vary in their extent, sometimes only one or two countries are audible while at other times, the entire Pacific, from Auckland to Vladivostok, is in.
