THE 1981 IRCA CALGARY CONVENTION

This years annual summer get-together will be held in Calgary, Alberta, August 20-23 at the Westward Inn. The hotel is located just south of the downtown core and is within easy walking distance of the main downtown mall, where a number of eating establishments, small shops, and large department stores are located.

The convention will formally (I hesitate to use the word with DXers, hi.) begin at 6:00 PM MLT on Thursday, August 20th with registration and refreshments in the meeting room followed by get-acquainted bull sessions for the duration of the evening. Friday morning we will take a tour of the studios housing all CBC facilities in Calgary. (TV, AM, and FM) This tour will be fairly extensive and should take virtually all morning. Friday afternoon will be unstructured (ie. free time) however, if there is enough interest, further station tours and transmitter site tours will be conducted at this time. Friday's schedule will culminate with an early evening tour of Broadcast House which houses the facilities of CPCN AM-TV, CJAY-FM, and CFVP-SW. A tour to Banff (located in the scenic Canadian Rockies) will be the major event during the day on Saturday. For those of you wishing to stay in the city for the day there are a number of attractions that will be of interest to many. Saturday evening will be the highlight of the convention with the banquet, business meeting, and auction scheduled. Sunday morning will be left open for rest and recovery, with Sunday afternoon reserved for the annual IRCA softball game. The convention will formally conclude Sunday evening.

As you can see, we have a great weekend planned for you in Calgary and some additions (ie. a beverage ante.na party) are still being discussed so stay tuned for more details. The Ted Vasilopoulos Award

Each year the IRCA Board of Directors award the Ted Vasilopoulos Award to the IRCA member whom the membership believes has done the most in that year to promote the affairs of IRCA and to improve the BCB DXing hobby. The award consists of an inscribed plaque and a year's free membership. In case of a tie, duplicate awards are presented. The TVA is presented at the annual convention by the chairman of the Election Committee or his representative. No IRCA member is eligible to win the TVA more than once over a five-year period. A nominating committee, consisting of the last three winners of the TVA, after soliciting nominations from the membership will submit a minimum of three names to the general membership to be voted upon. A space on the ballot shall be provided for write-in candidates. The committee shall submit for each of its nominees a brief statement indicating why they believe each deserves to be recognized by the club through the TVA.

The following are ineligible to receive the TVA since they have won it within the past five years: Bob Curtis (1980), Mark Connelly (1979), Rich Segalas (1979), Don Veskey (1978), Bill Hardy (1978), John Zondlo (1977), Phil Brehaway (1976).

I am rather pleased at the number of people responding to my recent statements. My
sole intention was to create an atmosphere of concern about IRCA's future. However,
some of you need to do some research. There was a time when the DXR sections easily
outdistanced NRC's DDXD, in both quality and quantity. At the same time, membership
numbers in both clubs was nearly identical. Today, it would take 2 Or 3 issues of DXRs
combined to make 1 DDXD. Additionally, NRC has about 300 more members than IRCA. Also,
many of the top DXers in North America belong solely to NRC (some were former IRCA
members who have dropped out because of lack of support & content in IRCA). In order
to reverse this trend, innovative, and common sense, steps must be taken. I'd really
doubt that a 25% a year increase in dues will cause anybody to drop the club.
Additionally, it might make the \$16 spent on membership a better deal, since DXM would
be more informative if our plan works. But we also have to appoint active people to
editorial positions. You would never see the NRC appoint a non-DXer to a major editorial
post. Yet, this has occurred several times in the past. Jef Jaisun also overlooked
one thing in his comments in the anniversary issue. If a person becomes an editor &
doesn't support his column, there is really nothing that can be done about it. There
may be 15 active people interested in doing that column. But if the vacancy doesn't
exist, how then can they apply. I know of at least 3 people, who have contributed to
CDXR since I took over, that are interested in the seemingly vacant contest chairman
post. Yet, as long as that position is taken, they can't apply for it. And, as I recall,
when it was open, the position was not very diligently advertised. Whenever there
is an opening, it should be mentioned in every DXM until it is filled. Then the
number of people applying might increase. Also, just so some of you don't jump on me
again, I'm only using the contests as an example. I have great concern about IRCA's
future, that is why I bring these matters up before the elections. Whether or not you
vote for our coalition or not is not as important to me as making you think about
issues that will be confronting the future BoD. By next issue I will have a new
receiver, a Radio West modified Kenwood R-1000. Additionally to the modifications
they normally make, I also will have a 4.0 kHz ceramic filter in the AM wide position
& a 1.9 kHz Collins mechanical filter installed. I'm also getting a Radio West loop.
The HQ-100 is being sold to my brother (a former IRCA member in 1971) who is planning
to get back into DXing (I'm not sure which band though). 73, RK

IT'S FUN TO BE AN IRCAN

- 1090 *XEPRS* BCN, Rosarito 3/29 0530-0815 kept going on & off the air every few minutes w/OC's & strange sounding TT's. DX'ed 0530-0745 & hrd XEOD (new) & unID EE. Assume KBOZ, but too much KNX-1070 splash. My tape recorder "DX'ed" from 0745-0830, which caught KKYN at 0800 (see previous page) & XEPRS return to the air at 0815 (no s/on--just mx--as though nothing ever happened). (SMM-CA)
- 1120 (KPNW) OR, Eugene-Springfield 4/6 0307 noted w/OC. (RW-CA)
- 1150 KDRM NE, Albuquerque ex-KDQQ w/oldies, "K-Dream." Ex-C&W. (BN-CO)
- 1150 *KPRZ* CA, Los Angeles Su 3/4 0405-0428 noted going totally off & on w/OC. Returned to the air at 0428. When off, hrd Larry King (WJBO) & sometimes very faint C&W (KCKY?). KCKY is still needed here, but believe it or not, horrendous sloop from KSL-1160 (Yes--sloop at 600 miles!) made it very difficult to DX 1150. You'll note that they were off for less than 30 min. The only other time I've hrd this stn off was last March 30, 1979 (as KIIS) for less than 40 minutes! This stn is the worst NSP'er I've ever known! (SMM-CA)
- 1280 KFRN CA, Long Beach 4/13 0530-0556 way atop freq. w/relig. mx. No sign of pests KIT/KEDF unless they were the weak unID QRM way in the background. This during the most severe auroral storm in ages. (bp-WA)
- KBRQ CO, Denver will begin using this call 5/1 and go to C&W. (BN)
- KWWS UT, Salt Lake City format change on weekends--now all nx. Weekdays same as before. (WJH-UT)

SPORTS RADIO / 'SON OF ESPN' LAUNCHES NEW SATELLITE 'ENTERPRISE'

In the fall of 1978, Scott Rasmussen took some of the money he had earned from the sale of the ESPN sports cable network to Getty Oil, and went off to the New Jersey shore for two months. He says he spent half his time building driftwood fires on the beach and the rest glued to the telephone.

Less than two years later, on Jan. 1, all the calls and contemplation coalesced into Enterprise Radio, a sports network based in Avon, Conn., and fed by satellite to more than 40 stations around the country.

Rasmussen, Enterprise's 24-year-old founder and president, says his ambitious operation will change the face of sports radio programming. Well, not really. Enterprise offers basically the same sort of format other networks dispense to their affiliates: It just supplies a lot more material.

In Washington, the only member of the Enterprise network is country and western station WMZQ-FM (98.7). WMZQ already has a fulltime sports man, Mike Patrick, and uses the Enterprise feed only at 6:30 and 7:30 AM weekdays and 8:35 AM and 6:35 PM on Saturdays.

"We use it mostly for scores and some features," Patrick says. "I've been impressed. They're very complete and they're real good getting us stuff overnight. I was also pleasantly surprised by the audio quality.

"I take out a lot of their reports and use them in my own show later in the day. They get pretty good interviews, and with what I come up with locally, it's a pretty complete package.

Enterprise offers quite a bit more, however, than what WMZQ puts on the air. From 7 PM-8 AM daily, there is a national sports call-in show. That's right, 13 hours a day, seven days a week. Eat your heart out, Phil Wood.

Each hour of the talk show is self-contained, so stations do not have to use the entire package, although Enterprise asks them to take a minimum of five hours a day. The show has eight hosts, including John Sterling, the television voice of the Washington Bullets. And Enterprise frequently brings in a sports personality to spice up the show. A free "800" telephone number guarantees the switchboard stays lit.

WMZQ so far has passed on the talk show, mostly because its listeners would rather hear Willie and Waylon. Says program director Carol Parker: "I've got Mike Patrick and I feel real lucky to have him. But for stations without a sports person on the staff, what they provide is very good."

In addition to five-minute

programs at quarter-till and quarter-after each hour, Enterprise sends out two-minute features and essays on sports nostalgia, sports law, sports medicine, etc. Baltimore Oriole announcer Bill O'Donnell is a regular contributor, as is former Boston Celtic Bill Russell.

Enterprise is starting to bid for play-by-play rights to major professional sports, but is hampered by the fact that only 40 stations are now hooked into the network. It's a chicken-and-egg dilemma: Do you get major league baseball and hope to expand the number of stations, or do you expand first and get baseball?

"We think we've got a shot at getting some of it," says Rasmussen, admitting in the next breath that "the more we grow, the better chance we've got.

"Right now, I think our biggest asset is that we treat sports

intelligently. Many times sports [is] used to fill a local news hole. We cover sports first, last and always. We give 'em a lot more than just the score.


"There's also no battle with the news department over where the budget is spent. We don't have a news department. We have a staff of 105, and people feeding us reports from all over the country. Right now, we put more sports out than ABC, CBS, NBC and Mutual Radio combined."

Rasmussen and his father Bill, the founder of ESPN and now the chairman of the board of Enterprise, raised close to \$900,000 to help launch the new network. Enterprise recently issued a million shares of stock at \$5 a share. "We think we've got something really exciting here," Rasmussen says. "And we're really catching on."

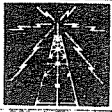

Here is the first edition of what may someday become an IRCA Institution. This list of stations was compiled from many sources, including several years' worth of DX Monitor and other DX bulletins, various station lists, and Mexican notifications to the FCC. It is my firm belief that this list would not have been possible without the use of a computer. This list was compiled using an HP3000 Computer system; the computer's editing and sorting functions helped make the job tolerable and reduced the number of errors considerably. A special word of thanks goes out to Pete Taylor, who was able to check an earlier revision during his vacation in Mexico.

The information in the list is as follows:

Column 1: Frequency

Column 2: Call letters. All calls begin with "XE", of course, but I left them off in order to save space.

Column 3: City of License. A city name in parenthesis refers to a much larger, nearby city the station probably attempts to serve.

Column 4: State. These are as follows:

Columns 5&6: Day and night power in kilowatts.

Column 7: Slogan. A few are several years old and some may only be names of station owners, but most should be okay. Abbreviations used include: R-Radio, LV-La Voz, Stn-Estación, Mx-Música.

Column 8: A "Catch-all" column which includes the following:

Schedule: in GMT, some zeros have been left off to save space, i.e.: 12-130 i.e. 1200-0130. AN means station is 24 hours.

Formats: Many stations play a mixture of different musical types.

Others play "música moderna", which I guess is their equivalent to adult contemporary. The following rather general categories have been noted for others:

EC: Educational/Cultural. Noncommercial, generally operated by a college or university. Talks, classical mx, jazz, folk, etc.

EE: Full or part time English-language programs.

EZ: "Easy" listening. Can include any of the following: romantic ballads, light instrumentals, light pops (in EE or SS), classical.

ME: "Mexican" mx. Mexican artists and/or traditional Mexican styles: Mariachi, ranchera, Nortefía, Folk, regional, etc.

NX: News, sports, discussion, features, telephone talk, drama, etc. May also have a few hours of music per day, but places heavy emphasis on the spoken word.

RA: Ranchera. May also have Nortefía or folk music thrown in.

TR: Tropical mx. Cumbias, merengues, etc.

UP: "Uptempo": "Juvenil mx, lively pops, EE or SS rock, disco.

Shortwave Parallels: noted by SW, then the freq in kHz

Verifications: VL-letter, VQ-Card, VP-prepared card.

Network Affiliations: NS:Notistema; RPM:Radioprogramas de Mexico;

RCN:Radio Cadena Nacional

Potential Changes: Applications and Construction Permits are noted by "CP" followed by the proposed freq, power, or pattern change.

PO means "presently operating (on or as)". UC means under construction. Some ctas w/oslogans,skeds,etc listed may also be UC.

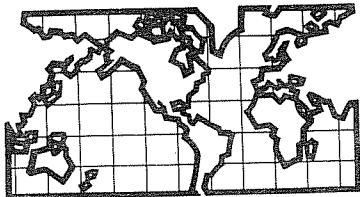

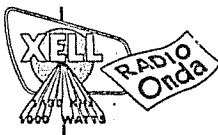

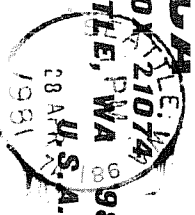
