Networks: The play-by-play team of Jack Buck, Hank Stram, Brent
 Musburger and Dick Stockton will be calling a 36-game schedule on CBS
 this fall. That includes 10 post-season games including the Super Bowl.
 CBS has also acquired the rights to broadcast the extra layer of
 baseball playoffs required when the baseball owners decided on a
 "split season" after this year's player strike. CBS is calling it the
 best-of-five Division Series, which determines the contestants for the
 League Series. First game is 10/6. CBS will also do the League and
 World Series...WTRU-1600 Muskegon MI has joined the NBC Source net,
 ex-regular NBC net...CBS has announced that it, too, will organize
 a second, young people's network which will be called RADIORADIO.
 For those trying to keep track, I count 13 national radio networks
 at this time, including the new ones just gearing up for operations this
 fall and winter. Alphabetically now (number in parentheses is the
 number of "sub-networks" or multiple-programs-at-a-time capability
 which the network has): ABC (4), Associated Press, CBS (2), Enterprise
 (2), Mutual (2), NBC (2), National Black, National Public Radio (7),
 RKO (3), Sheridan, Satellite Music Network (3), Transtar, and UPI Audio.
 Transtar and SMN are syndicated-delivery systems of sorts, intended to
 replace the existing syndicated-format system in which prerecorded tapes
 are mailed to the station(s) buying the service. Anyhow, looks like a
 total of 30 sub-networks in all, quite a bundle, I'd say.

Syndication: Reports vary, but there seem to be between 48 and 60
 stations carrying SATELLITE LIVE, a nationally-syndicated telephone-talk
 show with host Joey Reynolds from Hollywood. Guests are usually "adult
 stars," i.e., stage, screen, TV, and MOR recordings, no rockers. Partial
 station list: WCAO-600 MD, KFMB-760 CA, WLEE-1480 VA, KPNW-1120 OR,
WGAR-1220 OH, WKBW-1520 NY, plus FMers in San Francisco and Detroit,
 and unknown stations in Boston, Indianapolis, Wichita, Miami, Denver,
 and Columbus. Feed time Sundays 2200-2400 ELT.

WMAL Takes a Dip in the Radio Ratings

Arbitron's advance radio ratings report had surprises, pleasant and unpleasant, for area broadcasters. The just-released spring data brought good news for rockers WPGC AM/FM, DC101 AM/FM (WWDC), WAVA-FM and WJMD-FM; and bad news for both ABC radio stations, longtime ratings leader WMAL-AM and rocker Q107-FM (WRQX), as well as contemporary music stations, WASH-FM and WKYS-FM.

WMAL's 8.6 listener share represented its worst figure in many years; down significantly from an 11.1 in winter and a 10.3 last spring.

Nevertheless, WMAL kept its first-place ranking despite the best ratings FM band stations have ever posted (a total of 66.4 percent); and the worst ratings to date for AM stations (24.7).

DC101 ratings jumped from 3.9 listener share to 6.6. The top 10 area stations and their respective listener shares were:

WMAL, 8.6; WGAY AM/FM, 8.3; WPGC, 7.3; tie, DC101/WWDC and Q107, 6.6; WKYS, 6; WASH, 5; WHUR-FM, 4.6; WAVA, 4.5; WRC-AM, 4.4; and "Kicks Country," (WVKK-FM and WPKX-AM) 4.2.

Gas Leak Put Radio KCBS Off the Air

KCBS, the all-news radio station with studios on the 32nd floor of 1 Embarcadero Center, was knocked off the air at 1:44 p.m. yesterday when all of its employees were forced to leave the building because of the ruptured gas main in the Financial District.

The station went back into operation at 2:15 p.m., after news director Larry Cooper returned to the studio and used a desktop radio to call the station's chief engineer for instructions on getting the main transmitter back in operation.

"He told me what switches to throw and buttons to push, and we started broadcasting in a round robin over five two-way radios outside the building—one in a car and four hand-held units," Cooper said.

At 4:30 p.m. the station began broadcasting from a temporary newsroom in the studios of KFO radio at the Fairmont Hotel.

"It was the first test of a reciprocal agreement we had set up with KSFO in case of an earthquake," Cooper said. "The phone company ran a line to our transmitter near Black Point in Marin County, and we arranged to stay at KSFO all night."

All connections with the CBS network were cut off during the afternoon, but network news was provided after 6 p.m. through a telephone link with KNX radio, KCBS' sister station in Los Angeles.

I must comment on a few statements made in the 6/13 DXM. First, to Phil Conley: the reason that I never report to the contest standings before the end of the contest is that more than one report is inefficient and confusing. The first report is required to have all stations that have been heard for the contest listed, and any subsequent report must include all new stations and the stations being replaced. I feel that there is too much room for error in this system, so I wait until the end of the contests to make one complete entry. I think that the reporting method should be changed to make updating much easier and therefore increase reporting. A reporter should be able to simply send in his point totals, stations, and states and provinces without having to list every station heard. I sent in a post card with the above information, but I was listed as having no entries. Hopefully the system will be changed next year. (See comments-PRM) Ernie Cooper: FM in the DX Monitor will not work. FM and BCB DX are two completely different types of DX. BCB DX can be received on any sort of radio, and is generally the same night after night. FM DX is very unpredictable and occurs at all hours. The two major modes of FM DX, trop and E-skip, are virtually unknown to the pure BCB DXer. In addition, the BCB DXer is not equipped for FM DXing. The only BCB receivers that have adequate FM bands are the Superadio and the Panasonic series. GWDXA covers both BCB and FM, but the club leans more toward promo collecting, and FM is a gold mine for junk. (??-PRM) I don't think that too many IRCA members would be pleased at the idea of the club they joined for BCB DX being transformed suddenly into a BCB and FM club. I hope that everyone (and I mean everyone) has voted by now. I am going to submit a proposal to the new BoD that all proposals be printed in DXM before they are voted on to give members an opportunity to express their views. In keeping with this proposal, I am printing the proposal before the BoD votes on it. I hope that members will make some comments, either pro or con, to not only debate the proposal, but to get the idea itself off the ground. The reconfirmation of editors is also approaching, so get in your votes of confidence for your favorites. PRM should be a shoo-in since he's done such a fine job with EDXF. Hi to all! And my best wishes to all those of you going to the IRCA, ANARC, and WTFDA Conventions in those "outposts" of Calgary, Thunder Bay, and Oklahoma City! I'm able to make only one convention this year, that, the NRC's in New Jersey over the Labor Day weekend. BCB DX and the Baseball season came to an end at virtually the same moment here, while the FM season has gone off with all the ferocity of a wet firecracker here at the Tip of the Cape. In addition, in a year when extra points are given for hearing a mystery station, you just have to report all the stations heard to get the maximum number of points. I found that keeping neat records, and a carbon of every entry I sent in, eliminated most of the error in the system-Paul.

But most people were on a CATV system, their equipment atop the mountains west of town. KUKI is silent every night, as is their FM. Actually, KBLC 1270 Lakeport was in more danger than KUKI, however, the fire was still several miles away from KBLC.

Some time back, many WDXF reporters requested that forums be dated so that the reader would know what time frame the forum was referring to. During the summer months when we're monthly, I've left off the dates, and many of you have also stopped dating your reports. A suggestion. When referring to specific DX information in your forums, most give the date, and I think that would eliminate the need for a date at the beginning of each forum. Yes? No? Opinions?

I'll close on the upbeat. Our midday man at Country Plus got creative (read bored, hi) and requested medfly jokes. The winning joke went something like this. Czechoslovakia. The Foreign Service of Radio Prague has started MW transmissions in Polish along the border. Ostrava-1521 has moved to 1233. (Arctic 5/8)

External Service on 621,864, 981,1314,1422,1476 and 1593 0300-0500, 0600-1400 and 1700-0030. Holy Qur'an station is on 1161 and 1341 0300-0900 and 1200-2100. (Arctic 5/8)

Germany, East. 558 and 729 R. DDR Ferienwelle now on 0300-1800. SWF Rohrdorf-666 uses 500 kw all day; no reduction to 180 kw at night any more. (Arctic 5/8,5/22) [Sorry, the SWF station is West Germany, my mistake. Ed.]

Germany, West. A new station, University Radio Munich, is on 909 with 10 kw 0600-1600 Mon-Fri. Uses studios of AFN Munich. The new 100 kw transmitter on 630 from Luchow will soon begin, but it will be a couple of years before it goes on the air. NDR Hannover-828 will increase to 100 kw early next year. (Arctic 5/8)

Great Britain. IBA has plans for a nationwide commercial network, plus the IBA locals, most likely on FM, in the 1990's. Radio Aire, Leeds-828 opened in June. BBC R. Birmingham-828 will have an additional transmitter of 200 watts in Wolverhampton. They will move to 1458 later this year and reduce power to 7 kw. BBC R. Medway will move to 990 and up power to 1 kw. North Sound, Aberdeen opens on 1035 in June. Moray Firth Community Radio, Inverness opens on 1107 in June. Centre Radio, Leicester-1260 and R. Avonside, Bristol-1260 will open later this year. (Arctic 5/8,5/22)

Holland. Because of the high costs involved in the new LW station (joint venture BRT/IOS) on 173 khz, the authorities are now looking into the possibility of using the existing Lopik Radio facilities. The plans also include a possible link-up with a BRT transmitter in Belgium. The station will be called Radio Delta, 24 hours a day. (Arctic 5/8) Lopik-675 uses 100 kw (ex 20 kw) since early May. (Arctic 5/22)

International Waters. The return of Radio Caroline has been delayed. The information about Voice of Peace in WRTM is not correct. No plans for SW; TV service has been postponed. Temporarily the station is on 1539 only after collapse of the mast in heavy seas. (Arctic 5/22)

Israel. Two new stations are on: Eilat-1305, 2 kw with the GT program; Ezion-1458 with 1 kw and the IBA program. (Arctic 5/8)

Lebanon. Voice of Hope seems to use 2x15 kw transmitters on 945, 0400-0000 (Arctic 5/22) U.S. State Department is unhappy with this station and American evangelists' involvement in it. (SCDX 3/24)

Malta. As of March, only 999 is used by Radio Malta with the Maltese national program. International programs quoted in WRTM for 756 are on FM instead. (Arctic 5/22)

Morocco. Agadir 3-1197 was taken out of service in February. (Arctic 5/8)

Portugal. The Radio Comercial station in Lamego now uses the name Radio Alto Douro. The Radio Comercial stations seem to use a local name together with Radio Comercial. This station is on 926. The RdP station in Porto on 1578 is now off. (Arctic 5/22)

Romania. Two new stations on 1530 began in January, from Mahmudia and Mihaileni, both 15 kw, relaying the 1st program. (Arctic 5/8)

Saudi Arabia. 1386 is used for Foreign Language program //98 MHz. (Arctic 5/8)

Transkei. Capital Radio will not be sold. The 500 kw transmitter will be sold and the Herschel site closed. The South African government has allowed Capital Radio to buy land outside Johannesburg for a 100 kw MW station. The Durban service from Umzumkulu (on 8017) will be upgraded to 100 kw. There will also be an East London service with 100 kw on 603. (Arctic 5/8)

United Arab Emirates. Dubai is commissioning 600 kw for 1251 khz, probably the old 1481 transmitter. (Arctic 5/8)

Yugoslavia. R. Koper is on 24 hours on 549 with 20 kw. R. Capodistria in II 0600-1900, 200 kw from Beli Kriz. 1080 is not used anymore according to EBU. (Arctic 5/22)

Zambia. A transmitter not listed in WRTH has been noted on 1125 carrying R. Zambia's Home service. According to the Geneva plan, it is in Solwezi with 10 kw. (SCDX 4/28)

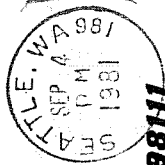
