What's Happening?

We'll begin this issue of DX Monitor with details of DX Tests, rumours of DX tests, and rumours of rumours of DX tests. To wit---

- Mon Sept 28 **KJNP-1170**, North Pole, Alaska, will run a PoP test from 0500 until ????, hopefully with 50 kw ND antenna with various TTs and possibly code IDs. This date is somewhat tentative, as the CE told Robert Kramer the test would be the last week of Sept & almost definitely on a MM. Arranged by Robert Kramer.
- Mon Oct 12 **KUAD-1170**, Windsor, CO, 0200-0230 ELT, this one is very tentative at the moment. The station has said they will test and RK has requested this date and time but hasn't heard back yet. If it's on it will most likely have code IDs. Arranged by Robert Kramer for CADX.
- Thu Oct 15 **WVMT-620**, Burlington, VT, will test from 0115 ELT until whenever. Will open with a legal ID, and will repeat it every 15 minutes. Test will include 50Hz-10kHz tones at 25/50/80/100% modulation. If problems develop, the CE will reschedule the test for 0115 10/16. Send reports to Michael Seguin, CE, WVMT, P.O. - Mon Dec 28 **KADE-1190**, Boulder CO, will test 0200-0300 EST w/5kw ND, using 1000 Hz TT, mx, and frequent IDs. Phone # is (303) 444-5600. Arranged by Bob Greenlee, NRC.

I wouldn't mind a station that played real Jaxx from the 30s, 40s, or 50s, like Duke Ellington, Billie Holiday, or Jimmie Lunceford for example, but this Al Martiano-Tony Bennett-Guy Lombardo gargabe seems geared only to terminally old white folks in hospices and retirement villages. And then the person who invented the "Music of your Death" format has the audacity to tell the Grand Rapids Press that the aforementioned audio sewage is a return to "true pop music." (That must have been a misprint, I'm sure he said "pap".) If he thinks droves of young adults who grew up with Elvis, the Beatles and so on will suddenly start swooning over Dick Haynes or Sammy Kaye, he's taking more hallucinogens than most of my peers have ever done! The real tragedy is that the true artists and talent from 50 years ago are being largely ignored in this type of format, even as contemporary radio ignores most new, talented artists in favour of washed-out, washed up boring music that is considered "safe". No matter what format, radio is increasingly afraid to play anything but the real monster hits, afraid to take risks, afraid to show any emotions--trying to "aenethstetize the way you feel." Radio will only get away with this for a while, before it loses all credibility, and people seek entertainment and music from new technologies, such as videodisk, cable FM, or whatever else comes along. The public does not have to--and will not for long--put up with the general level of imbecility inherent in radio today. WTRU-1600 has suddenly received a dose of common sense, and has begun to rock again at night. After 7 pm, they play the likes of Billy Squire, Led Zep, Benetar, et al, which is still not exactly progressive (hi) but a heck of a lot better than the snooze-a-rama AdCon crap they used to run. In fact, WTRU's latest slogan is "Where AM still rocks"/ Almost as good as WLS! The award for most boring contemporary station is now transferred to WOKY-920, which wouldn't know rock and roll anymore if it bit them. In otherness, I talked to WKJR's CE/vs, Mark Kowitz, about a week ago, he told me WKJR's 500 watt, nine-tower array should be on the air by Oct 1, barring any unforeseen snafus. Mark is also a contract engineer for WPBK-1490 and WSHN-1550; I don't know if he bothers to verify for those two. WPBK has an interesting technical set up. A couple of years ago (as WLRQ) their original studios and xr site burned to the ground. Apparently the fire KOed their original 150 foot antenna, so the tower of what was then WLRQ-FM 95.3 was also used for the AM antenna. WLRQ-FM was sold a couple of years ago (it's now WCNF, with a new tower closer to Nuskego) but that tower is still in use as the WPBK antenna. Here's the hitch: It's about 425 feet tall! That's about 7/8 wavelength, according to Kowitz. With that kind of tower, most of WPBK's signal actually gets

(PB) radiated as skywave, with very little groundwave. (See the "Variations in Vertical Patterns" article in the NRC Pattern Book). So while WPBK is hard to hear at night more than 5 miles from its transmitter, it does present DXers with a fairly good opportunity. They do go off at midnight, however, so good luck if you want em...73.

FCC Reverses Its Position On Adding Radio Stations

The Federal Communications Commission, in what amounts to a major victory for the broadcasting industry, has reversed a 20-month-old decision that could have increased the number of AM-radio stations on the nation's airwaves sharply.

In a preliminary 4-1 vote, the agency yesterday backed off an earlier plan to cut the separation between standard AM-radio broadcast stations from the present 10 kilohertz (khz) to 9 khz - a move which could have put at least 300 new broadcasting outlets on the air.

The vote, expected to be made final today, represents a sharp turnaround by the commission, which unanimously approved the 9 khz plan in December 1979 as part of an overall campaign to increase the variety of programs the public receives.

Two of the commissioners who voted for the plan in 1979 - Abbott Washburn and James Quello - changed their votes yesterday. Joining them were two Reagan appointees, chairman Mark S. Fowler and Mimi Weyforth Dawson.

The vote was taken after a 45-minute closed-door meeting.

According to commission officials who attended the meeting, most of the commissioners argued that the costs of trimming the space between stations was too high, given the anticipated benefits. The FCC staff estimated it would cost broadcasters between \$15 million and \$28 million to change their equipment and antennas to the new spacing requirements. Industry estimates go as high as \$40 million.

Some consumers might have to buy new radios to receive the added stations, these commissioners argued. Moreover, they added, the benefits were too speculative to merit these costs. Although some have estimated that as many as 1,500 stations could be added to the airwaves by the reduction, the FCC staff said yesterday that only 300 new stations would be created, and even then there might be greater interference among signals.

Commissioner Joseph Fogarty was the lone proponent of the reduced spacing, saying it would create more opportunities for minorities to own broadcasting outlets. The change would also permit many of the daytime-only stations to operate full-time.

The vote represented "a change in the social concept of a majority of commissioners of what is in the public interest," said Fogarty in an interview after the meeting. "The industry arguments were the ones that prevailed. Cost-effective arguments won over minority interests, daytime licensees, and the general public's opportunities to acquire additional AM-radio stations," Fogarty said.

Commissioner Anne Jones is expected to join Fogarty in voting against the majority. However, the air controllers' strike left her stranded in Georgia and she was unable to attend the meeting. Her return is expected today, at which time the vote will be announced formally by the commission.

The broadcasters, who long have urged the commission to keep the present 10 khz spacing, were pleased by the agency's decision.

"AM broadcasters and their listening public are the beneficiaries," said Irwin Krasnow, senior vice president and general counsel for the National Association of Broadcasters.

"Reduced channel spacing would result in more interference being created and a high cost of conversion (for broadcasters) with very little benefit as far as new stations are concerned," Krasnow added. Consumer groups were displeased. "Our worst fears are being realized. Amid the rhetoric of up-regulation, the FCC is reverting to its protectionist pro-broadcasters' roots," said Andrew Jay Schwartzman, executive director of Media Access Project. "If the FCC is interested in real competition and new entrants in the marketplace, diversity of ideas and thoughts in society, it should be proceeding straight ahead with 9 khz."

The FCC's decision to retain the present spacing amounts to a recommendation to the State Department as to what position the United States should take at an international broadcast conference this fall when Western Hemisphere countries meet to consider radio-spacing frequencies.

FCC officials expect the State Department to reaffirm the agency's decision.

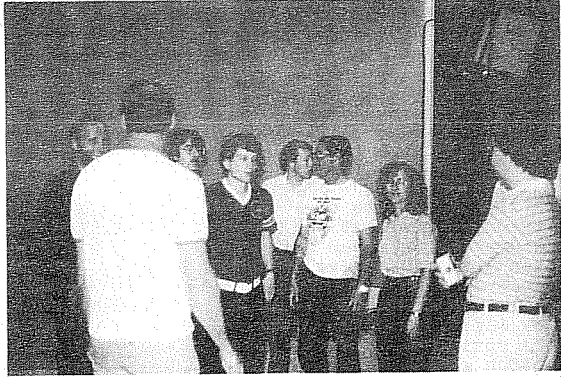

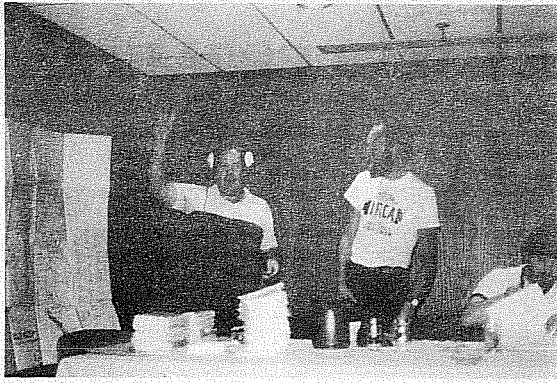

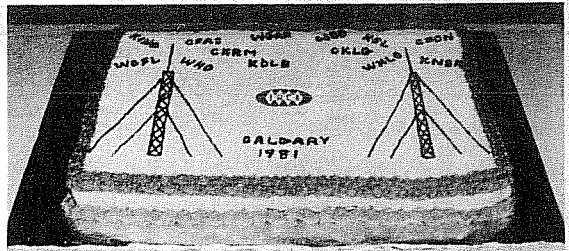
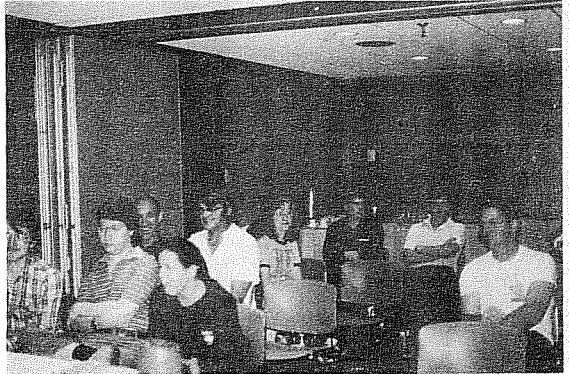

Minutes of 1981 Business Meeting

Convention host George Kesteven turned the business meeting over to the Chairman of the Board, Bruce Portzter, and the Secretary-Treasurer, Rich Segalas.

Chairman Portzter called upon Rich Segalas to read the President's report from Father Jack Pejza. Father Jack's report stated that nothing of earth shaking importance has taken place. Increasing postal and printing costs may force an increase in dues within the next year, especially if the increase to 20c postage goes through. (This was later refuted by Rich and Bruce). The Board of Directors was confronted by routine business such as approval of editors and committee chairmen. A By-law amendment cutting out the annual re-confirmation and replacing that with confirmation only at the beginning of the new term of office of the president. A continuing problem has been the supply of qualified volunteers for various committee jobs, particularly for Conditions of Frequencies and CPC. This was Larry's last report as he has resigned as Election Committee Chairman and also dropped out of IRCA due to problems with his employer, the U. S. Navy.

Rich Segalas then read an Almanac Project Report from Bill Hardy. Bill reported that IRCA found a winner in the Almanac. The second edition compiled in late 1980 and off the presses in January has been a success. Bill would like a bit more "feedback" from Almanac users on how they like the Almanac. He also wants comments and suggestions. If the members want a third edition, Bill plans to be ready to put one out in late 1982. He would like to know what types of material to include and what to leave out. Bill has already started to work on some new features for the next edition. Rich Toebe has taken over the slogans section. Bill closed out his report by quoting from a Musing from the 20 April 1981 DX News in which the writer asked "to see the NRC publish an Almanac like the one I've read about in DX NEWS put out by the IRCA...What do you say NRCers?" Would YOU like to see such a publication from the #1 MW DX Club?" Bill resisted the temptation to write the NRC'er and tell him that the #1DX Club in participation-per-member already published an Almanac. He also resisted the temptation to suggest that IRCA put out a Domestic Log!

Rich Segalas then gave a quick financial report. He reported that out of San Francisco \$6,324.51 was received and 5,990.41 was spent for a profit of \$334.10. The savings account was increased by approximately 1,300 for a total profit of 1,734 in San Francisco. The figures were incomplete due to lack of figures from the Goodie Factory including postage expense for the bulletins. The club seems to be in good financial shape at the moment with approximately \$2500 - \$3000 in the bank (This estimate includes the Seattle account).

Bruce Portzer then read the Goodie Factory Annual Report. Sales were approximately \$4215. Expenses were \$2,867 for a net of \$1348.

Bruce Portzer read the Publishing Committee Report.

Last year IRCA published 884 pages or about 2.2 pages/member.

Present Plans

Color Mastheads - This was discussed and decided that it would look better aesthetically but was not worth the cost (approx. \$400).

Special Issues - Possibly we could devote an issue to one topic such as receivers or antennas - Forums could be discussion of this special topic.

Mailing will be done from now on by the Printer. This will cost the club approximately 400 per year, but will ensure that the members will get their bulletins on time, unlike this past season, when some bulletins were late. Dave Korinek has said that he will not have as much time to work on mailing the bulletin.

Also discussed was including FM in DX MONITOR. There were more arguments against this proposal than for it. Arguments included the fact that medium wave coverage might suffer because of FM. Also, if many people report FM tips the bulletins would be larger and would cost more to print. This could result in an increase in dues.

After the business meeting, the auction was held. The club made approximately \$153.24 CANADIAN or \$126.17 U.S.

After the auction the convention hosts brought out a cake for all members present to enjoy.

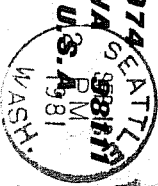
