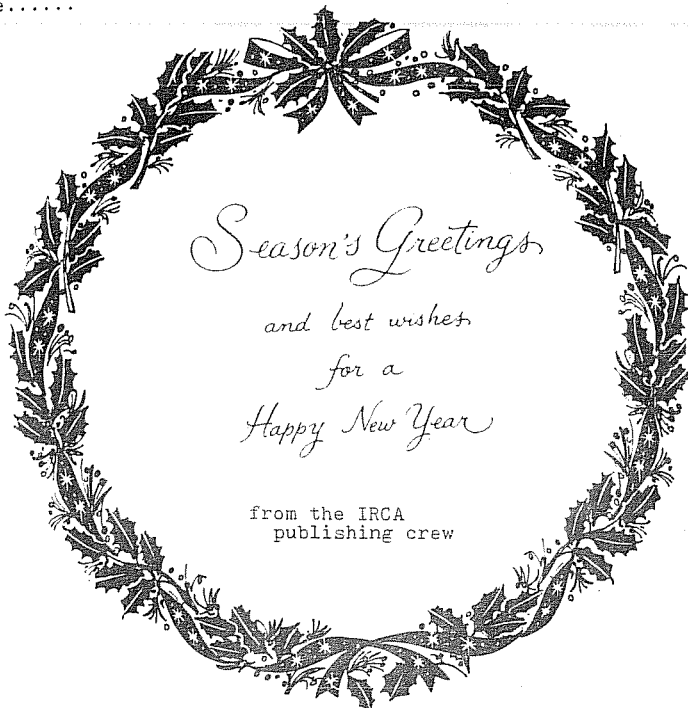

RADIO PROGRAMMING NOTES  
Stations: WASG-1140 Atmore AL is on the air with (apparently) a gospel format... Reports differ, but they agree that WMID-1340 Atlantic City NJ has dropped rock and gone either MOYL or talk/MOR... WQTK-1580 Saint Johns MI

(x-WRBJ) is now country, still with MBS... the new KKCN-1390 Waite Park MN is on with country... KANC-1080 Anchorage AK is back on with rock & oldies... WNPS-1590 Beech Grove IN is now fulltime with album rock & UPI net... WXVW-1450 Jeffersonville IN, an MOYL station by day, has added DR. POPP, 0000-0600, a blend of big band, jazz & soul... WHAS-840 Louisville KY has moved CBS MYSTERY THEATRE to 0007 and extended METZ HERE to fill 1900-2200, when not bumped by sports.

Networks: In a most unusual \$500,000 deal, ABC Radio (all six sub-networks) have acquired exclusive radio broadcast rights to the 1984 Los Angeles Summer Olympics, the first time an exclusive radio rights contract has been signed for that. ABC predicts it will air 1000 reports and 100 hours of programming, making use of its satellite system which should be in place by then so that each of the 6 sub-nets can have its own reporter covering the same event live simultaneously. On the surface this appears to be a violation of the FCC's multiple-network rules which might be waived or repealed by that time. ABC also expects to have 2300 affiliates by that time... CBS' RadioRadio service will be airing a comedy special in the summer, headlined by National Lampoon types...

New to the Continental pop/religion net is WHAG-1410 MD; the station also has-ABC/I service....New to Mutual's LARRY KING show: KUGN-590 OR, WIZM-1410 WI, WKNY-1490 NY, KOGO-600 CA, WDSM-710 WI, WPKE-1240 KY, WMAS-1450 MA, WBIG-1470 NC. New to MBS: WIRL-1290 IL (x-UPI). Mutual has also started a 5-minute, daily college basketball report-and-commentary, THE BILLY PACKER-AL MCGUIRE SHOW, which will run thru 4/2.... NBC's new TALKNET all-night telephone talk show has been reported at least 0100-0300 on KFAB-1110 NE. WTIK-690 LA uses the NBC :55 news feed. ...National Black Network's nighttime talk show should be on in 24 cities as of 1/16, station unknown....New to Satellite Music Net: WEEQ-1310 PA (StarStation) and WPAD-1560 KY (Country Coast to Coast) which drops CBS....KKSJ-910 WA is rumored to be on one of the pop/adult satellite nets, which one?...NJ Nets basketball is on WLNA-1420 NY, WWRL-1600 NY, WVNJ-620 NJ, WCTC-1450 NJ and WIMG-1300 NJ this season.

Syndication: The METROPOLITAN OPERA's season is underway, on AM stations in a few markets, live, Saturdays at 1400 most weeks....The Simon Weisenthal Center for Holocaust Studies is producing a weekly, 30-minute program of Jewish news entitled PAGE ONE. It's on WVNJ-620 NJ (Sunday 0800), WINZ-940 FL, KSDO-1130 CA and KPSI-1450 CA....There's a syndicated part-of-a-talk-show thing out now that works like this: Subscribing station is sent a script of questions plus a voice tape of a celebrity answering them. The station can deftly assemble it into what sounds like a live, local interview and can use each "guest" to start off a segment of a telephone talk show. They're called SHOW STARTERS, naturally.

Miscellaneous: WWRL-1600 New York NY has been donated by Viacom to the United Negro College Fund, which is, in turn, selling it to the National Black Network for \$1.5 million. The station is valued at \$3 million and was handed to the charity to avoid a lengthy license-renewal fight; it's still all subject to FCC approval....This one should have been in the "BI" column: The National Association of Broadcasters has asked the FCC for an across-the-board ruling allowing all class IV ("local", "graveyard") stations to operate with 1000 watts nighttime. The current limit is 1000 day/250 night. The NAB predicts that the Region 2 radio conference will approve it anyway and just wants to get the usually-very-slow-moving FCC started on the paperwork early.

CALGARY GETS SOME MORE

Calgary Family Radio Limited was awarded a license for a new AM radio station from the Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission. The Commission also approved plans for two new FM stations to be established in Calgary.

All three stations will be on the air within a year as it's a condition of their licenses. The addition of the new stations brings the number of radio outlets in Calgary to eleven.

The CRTC said it picked Family Radio over five other competing broadcasters who made bids for the Calgary AM radio license, because the Commission was convinced that the needs of the Calgary community would be best served by the approved family-oriented station.

Family Radio plans to feature music that has been popular over the past forty years, as well as providing families with a variety of programs on contemporary social issues.

Broadcaster Gordon Rawlinson, Family Radio Limited president, says a major factor in the development of the station is a program where listeners can seek advice on personal problems.

Rawlinson, along with his brother Doug, owns radio station CJME in Regina, Saskatchewan.

## NOTE:

Just a reminder that all reports should include the following nine items:

1. Frequency.
2. Call letters.
3. State.
4. Location.
5. Date.
6. Time in Eastern local (i.e. Standard when it's in effect and Daylight Savings when that's in effect.)
7. A description of reception quality: this can range from a single word such as "good" or "fair" to more detailed descriptions of interfering stations, etc.
8. A description of the programming heard: this can range from a format description ("C&W", "top 40", "talk", etc.) to a more specific description of what was heard. Please don't make a long list of songs or commercials heard — one song title or ad is okay but a longer list doesn't serve much of a purpose.
9. Your initials and state at the end of the item. The reason for this is that I sometimes cut items up and place them in frequency order. Also, even if I don't cut up your reports it helps me from making mistakes.

Several reporters recently have omitted important items such as the time and either program details or reception details. Leaving these items off greatly reduces your reports' value to other DXers.

Greetings. Since it has been quite a while since my last bit of input to this column a re-intro is in order. I am 34 years old, married 8 years,

(Tom Jasinski, continued...) have two beautiful girls ages 3 and 5. My job is on the Technical Staff at the Commonwealth Edison, Collins Generating Station near Morris, Ill. This power station is one of the biggest in the country. My membership in this club goes back to when the IRCA was a 9 month old baby. And it has come a long way! As for FM-TV-SWL DX there are plenty of other clubs that cater to these other bands. This is a BCB DX club and lets keep it that way. Frank Aden, I sold my 9 year old VW to a sucker last year and bought a 1980 Datsun 210, 5 speed. So far am averaging 39 MPG! The VW radio also outlasted the car but will not fit in the Datsun. As for DX'ing with a car radio I have found that Motorola and Delco made good sets. They are rugged and durable and have a lower frequency IF giving them a slight in selectivity over the average table model or portable set. One problem though is using a battery eliminator that is free of annoying 60/120 Hz hum. Also when using an auto radio in the home with a long wire or a loop antenna, an antenna tuner is a must. Karl Zuk perhaps shielding and/or an LC network on each and every lead coming into/out of the C4 Computer System may rid you of the 131 Khz interference. Also a similar LC network on the +12V lead at the Radio may help too. 73 and good DX.

First off, a pat on the back to the retired PRM, for a great job. This club may have to face an important issue by the end of this decade--AM radio may be all but extinct by 1990. Ratings-wise, AM is in deep trouble, even the big 50 KWers are losing audiences fast to FM. Even with the preservation of 10 kHz spacing, interference on the AM band continues to increase, both from other stations as well as from the multitude of new electronic gadgets that are coming out each year (video games, home computers, and God-knows-what-else, hi). Many older 5 KW regional stations have seen their market area expand beyond their nighttime coverage areas--resulting in poor or nonexistent signals at night in critical ratings areas! Meanwhile, FM continues to grow exponentially, if the current rate of growth is maintained, fully 90% of all listening to radio will be to FM in 1989. As this shift--or perhaps I should say rush--of audience to FM continues, the result will be more and more AMs leaving the air, unable to "make it" financially. For the BCB DXer, this will in one respect be good--more foreign catches may become possible, and there will be less locals to bother the DXer, but on the other hand, in the long run, BCB DXing may be dead hobby. Many members of this club became interested in DXing after becoming enamoured with AM station programming--for example, trying to hear a distant T40 or C&W station at night that they knew was exceptionally good. But as fewer & fewer people bother with AM, and as younger people refuse to listen at all to that antiquated medium, BCB clubs may find it harder to attract members, particularly members of high school and college age, which have in the past formed a large part of the active membership. Perhaps this argument could be a factor in considering other bands for IRCA, if it wishes to survive.

Thoughts while listening to an endless unID TT in the small hours: I've never been involved in setting up a DX TEST, so I don't know much about how it works; but there have been comments in the forums about the difficulty of getting stations to go along. And it's easy to understand the average CE's reluctance to haul himself out of bed at some insane hour of the morning and fire up the transmitter just so a bunch of daft DX'ers can get their jollies. I wonder, though, if it might be easier to persuade some of the stations with regular f/c's to slip in a few code ID's. The CE's going to be there operating the transmitter anyway; I don't know what he has to do during a f/c, but if he's going to have his hands full it surely wouldn't be difficult to record the whole thing in advance. You might even find a few friendly people who'd be willing to do it on a monthly basis. And I can't see where this would present any problem for the monitoring agency.

Obviously this would be much less desirable from our point of view than having the station run a full-blown DX TEST, but where that can't be arranged this alternative would at least produce some interesting DX. There are several stations whose monthly TT's are heard quite regularly here, but from which I've never been able to get an ID; and I'm sure I'd find a lot more if I knew they were going to run code ID's and really went after them with a good tight bandpass filter. There was a Woolco ad in Sunday's paper, 29 November, for the GE AM-FM combination cassette player model 3-5280 for \$99. This was the first ad I had seen for what was rumored to be the GE Superadio combined with a cassette player. On 01 December, I made my way to the store to check it out, reading the manufacturer's specifications, and so on. So I bought it having little sales resistance for a product which held the promise of being what many DX'ers are looking for when they go travelling. (Besides I figured on returning it in case it didn't live up to my expectations). My verdict: I'm quite pleased. Possibly the AM side of it is even a better DX'ing tool than the Superadio; in any event it's every bit as good. The 3-5280 is larger and heavier than the Superadio. It's 15-and-a-half inches long, four-and-a-half inches deep and stands nine-and-a-half inches tall before the handle is pulled up. The GE Superadio is about the same height but is only 12 inches long and three-and-a-half inches from front to back.

And for those of you who do know me you can skip this paragraph (no comments, Ric, hi). (Oh, the temptation, hi-Rth.) I've been a DX'er for 16 years. I'm 34, married 12½ years to Helene and no kids. I'm interested in the following DX types from most to least interested: BCB, SW, FM, TV, LW. I'm a member of the following DX clubs: IRCA, NRC, WTFDA, LWCA, SCADS, IDXCSD and member #13003 of the now defunct Radio Canada Shortwave Club. I'm also somewhat interested in old radio programs from the '40s and '50s. By profession I'm an appliance repairman and run my own business from my home. In fact, if you call the 484 or 566 numbers you might just hear me answer in the business name. The 271 number is strictly residence.

Really good all-day short-skip conditions here for the last month or so, with Western stations coming in from everywhere. Just bagged KART 1400 Jerome, Idaho, at 2PM local time.

During the big storm of 13 and 14 November, KATA 1340 was knocked off the air for a while in the early evening so I bagged KBBR North Bend, Oregon. Having a local go off at an early hour gives a whole new dimension, you can hear stations that usually sign off at midnight. Still, big storms can be a real drag, damage so far this season includes having the lead-in of my 250-foot longwire blown away (gotta climb up a 20-foot pole to resolder it) and the front end of my SPR-4 got zapped during a recent thunderstorm.

On the subject of car radios: The best I had DX-wise was the little AM-only Philco that was in my '72 Ford Courier. Its sensitivity was astounding and selectivity no bad for a car receiver. I think Ford put this receiver in most of their low-cost cars and may be the same kind that Mark Connelly used in his famous drive-time TA receptions. Parked in a quiet location during good conditions I could get fine reception of WNBC, WCBS, Guatemala, Colombia, Alaska and Japan with mine, and I used to amaze non-DX'ers with it. I should have yanked that radio out of the truck before I sold it. Another great one was the AM receiver in a '72 Kenworth truck that I drove; hooked to a nine-foot CB whip its pull-in ability was amazing. It was built by Motorola but had the KW name on it (I've tried some Motorolas that were worthless, however). I can recommend AM radios made for big trucks as generally being good performers; it seems that truckers want to hear their favorite all-night trucker's C&W show no matter where they're at. Like Rth says, AM/FM's are usually bad, and AM/FM stereo units are abominable. I had a \$400 Jensen unit that I sold because its AM section was absolutely worthless. I think the best way to hop-up a car receiver is to hook it to a CB whip, although doing this makes your car look stupid. (You've never been to Sonoma County, have you? Hi-Rth.) The antenna trimmer has to then be readjusted or performance will be worse than before. A car receiver can be useful for home use, too. I recently took the Panasonic AM/FM out of my new pickup and installed it in a metal cabinet along with a simple AC power supply so it runs on house current, and also added a Pioneer stereo speaker to the cabinet. Sounds real good and gets a lot of use here in my radio room for listening to locals and nighttime talk shows. It has pretty good pull-in just using two feet of wire for an antenna. To improve reception I made a little un-amplified ferrite loop for it, using two 7½" bars with a 50-turn closely spaced coil and a five-turn pick-up winding that feeds the receiver. This makes a dramatic improvement in selectivity due to the high "Q" of the loop, and pull-in is excellent, the whole setup performs as well as a TRF portable but with better sound. Use of an amplified loop or longwire with this receiver causes total overloading.

The 3-5280 pulls in KWMT on its ferrite rod as well as my HQ180 on its loop antenna, so I'm sure the Canadian can be delivered too when northern conditions prevail in the daytime.

The 3-5280 has several novel features, front and back sides, and I'm not sure I understand them all completely. I will let others fill in all the graphic details. Of course, the 3-5280 will go to Hawaii with me at Christmastime. Meanwhile, perhaps this is the first DX'ers report on the quality of this new tool for the radio nut who travels. My preliminary examination of it makes me think it's the best set-up yet for use away from your home base. 73.

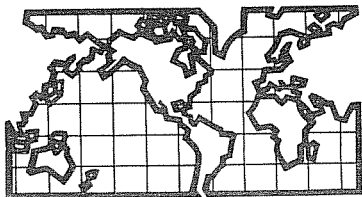

And yes, most CE's have their hands full while tweaking and fooling around with the transmitter to ID every few minutes. And FCC (and I believe CRTC also) says an ID once an hour and at beginning and end of test is all that's required.

Couple forums back I mentioned KPLS was on night power/pattern fulltime due to troubles and suddenly popped back to 5kw. Wrong! They popped back to 1500 watts and didn't get full power until 08 December. Karl Jeter: if you haven't already tried, you might write "contenido: carta y cinta magnetica, sin valor comercial" (contents: letter & tape recording, no commercial value) on the envelope --- customs/postal employees in some places might then conclude that what you're sending isn't worth wrapping in red tape and/or stealing. I do that on all my rpts to Latin America and a few have actually reached their destination, so it might actually do some good, hi.

The station is 500 W D3 and puts in quite a potent signal here in west Kent. It almost silences the strong KIRO-710 harmonic here.
