Pete Taylor reports KFIA-710 is testing their new 10 kw rig 8am-4:15 pm, per a phone call in late May; they expect to get the full go-ahead in late June. Bill Nittler says KUAD-1170 has changed calls to KSGR and uses the slogan "K-Sugar Radio". KXOA-1470 has changed format, they're now Music of Your Life, per Pete Taylor and Floyd Perry. KRVN-880 and KKAA-1560 are now 24 hours and probably NSP, per Roy Millar. KZOK-1590 has changed calls to KJET and is now album rock, with heavy emphasis on "new wave" music; Jef Jaisun heard the official call/format switchover at 0000 PDT on 5/31. ### RADIO MARTI OUT?

According to a Broadcasting magazine article, via Greg Monti, a congressional committee has voted against allowing the federal government to operate on AM Broadcast Band frequencies, which would effectively prevent the proposed Radio Marti from going on the air (at least on medium wave). The House Telecommunications Committee, in reaching this decision, cited the increased likelihood of Cuban interference and/or jamming and suggested shortwave frequencies as being more appropriate for broadcasts to Cuba.

We've got several items on hand for next issue, including a big Technical Column and a Verie signers column, so expect a Biggie in July. Until then 73 and good DX! bp.

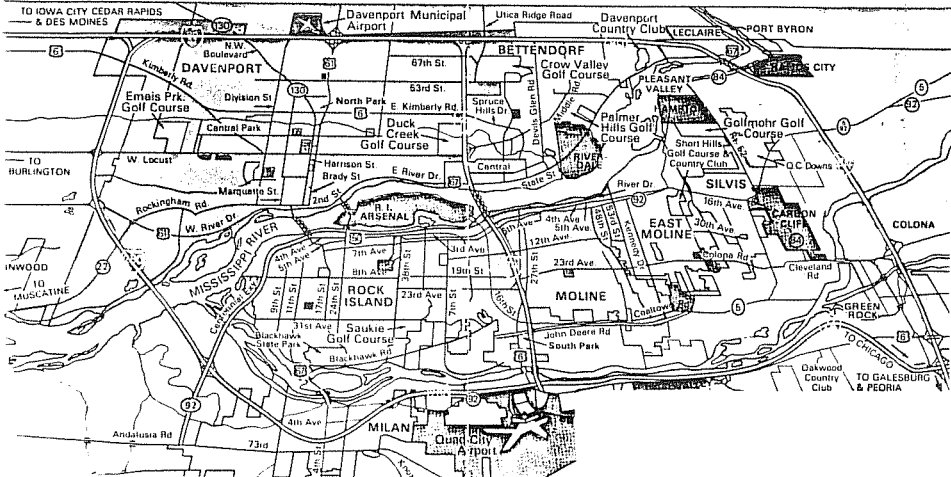

## 'Enemy' music out; Argentine in

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP) — The Falklands war has changed Argentina's music-listening habits. With English-language songs banned from radio and TV, the country's young rock musicians are getting onto airwaves previously dominated by Pink Floyd, the Rolling Stones and Queen.

The songs of the British enemy and its U.S. ally have been banned since Argentina invaded the Falklands. But previously ignored music from Latin American countries that side with Argentina is getting a big push.

For the first time in four years, Argentines can hear the celebrated Argentine folk singer Mercedes Sosa, whose protest songs had been forbidden on grounds they encouraged leftist revolution. Now, she

is off a junta blacklist and has performed to sellout crowds.

In a country that prides itself on cultural sophistication and has had strong British influence, not everyone has jumped on the bandwagon for a return to things Latin American.

Maria Maria Serra Lima, a ballad singer at the top of Argentine sales charts, asked, "What does a war with the English have to do with songs in English?"

"We are following an openly nationalistic policy," said Carlos Alberto Cappiello, a radio-show producer whose program has switched from English top-40 music to 60 percent Argentine. He says his listeners like what they hear.

A FRG-7 with a 2.9 kHz Collins Filter, a Radio West ferrite loop, Realistic CTR-51 recorder as well as various reference books and wire for an outdoor antenna. May build a wedge or box loop. DXers watching for FIBS (LRA60) on 536 kHz should also listen for a possible A1 beep type jammer. I heard the latter four times in April around 2385 kHz - one of two 120M freqs apparently used by LRA60 after the invasion. For what it's worth, Argentina claims that Chile has jammed some of its XMSNs. Regardless of the military outcome, I suspect the broadcast fun and games will continue for some time. Meanwhile except for TPs in the western states and provinces - actually recent openings have been reported as far east as Louisiana - I note that international broadcast reception continues to decline and as more and more domestic stations appear on former clear channels things are going to get worse. One step which might keep MW DXing alive would be for IRCA to increase its coverage of 2 MHz BC stations. As there are significant propagational links and similarities between 2 MHz and the standard AM band, such material in DXM would be permissible under IRCA's constitution - just as in the past we have covered LW BC stations. Those of us who were "hoping" that the R. Marti/Cuban superpower scenario would boost interest in BCB DX may be "disappointed". As a result of the Falklands confrontation, Reagan Administration Latin American policy is for the moment at least in shambles and R. Marti may in fact never come on the air. Best.

Antennas comprised of built-in antennas with sets, a 30-foot long-wire and a partially working SM-2. The SM-2 has the battery leads broken and most of the coax lead is gone but it works well with the Panasonic.

I've done announcing in the past at a local community access FM station. Because I like announcing, I bought a broadcasting board for announcing/production practicing, a Spotmaster 4BEM50 with four pots and eight inputs.

I hope that everyone is having a great summer. Sure glad that I got a GE Superadio. Overall, it's the best portable I have for domestic AM reception. Audio quality is nothing short of phenomenal, making it a great one for program listening. Sensitivity is excellent for a portable being just as good as my RF-2200, but without the birdies. About my only complaint is that it's so huge, but I'm getting used to that. Also for some reason my "homebrew" shotgun tuner doesn't seem to couple properly with the Super; it seems to give a null instead of a peak. I've noticed the same problem with my older GE TRF 2870A, so maybe it's a characteristic of the GE design. The same shotgun tuner gives spectacular results with my other portables, so I'd like to figure out some way of using it with the GE. I was kinda surprised to find that the Super's external AM antenna terminals work fairly decently, even with my 250-foot long-wire. The FM performance of my Superadio seems to be fairly good. ERC, I hope you can return your Superadio to the factory to have its FM section brought up to specs.

Ric, did you solve the ignition QRN problem in your car? (Nope - too lazy, hi-RTH) If all else fails you can install a new diesel engine in it, shouldn't cost much more than about \$10,000, hi. (With friends like you. . . . hi-RTH.) Diesels don't cause any ignition noise in radios, in fact that might interest any DX'ers who are shopping for new cars. Actually, Ric, I'd recommend you install twin nine-foot CB whips on your car's rear bumper and hook 'em to the radio. It would look real snazzy and would fit right in with the Ukiah scene, then you could really cruise State Street, hi. (Or Broadway in Eureka. I like C&W music, I'm not a redneck, hi. 10-4 good buddy-RTH.)

One real doozy of a potential QRN problem in modern cars is the fuel gauge voltage regulator, located under the dashboard. The one in my '79 Mazda pickup was so noisy that I couldn't even pick up local stations when only 5 or 10 miles from town. Of course the local dealer couldn't have cared less about the problem, even though it was on warantee/ To remedy the situation I had to remove the entire instrument panel to get at the offending regulator, then put a 0.5 mf electrolytic capacitor across it which did the job. 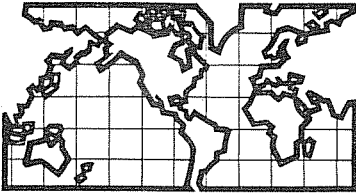
