The National Black Media Coalition has decided that the FCC's use of marketplace forces to select a system for AM stereo transmission is a failure (many broadcasters agree). NBMC has asked the commission to conduct a lottery by which a final system can be chosen. (The FCC has already indicated that all five systems are technically acceptable.)

From the 6/13, 20, 27; 7/4 issues of Broadcasting with some help from Jerry Starr of Youngstown OH who writes the equivalent column to this one for the National Radio Club who supplied several entries which Broadcasting completely overlooked.

WYNT 1290 Petersburg-Colonial Heights va is now beautiful music; "Fine, fine music, AM 12-90"; "The new sound"

KQV 1410 Pittsburgh PA has dumped Sam Nover's 2 1/2-year-old sports talk show as the station drives toward an all-news format; KQV is also rumored to be dropping Larry King soon.

WDBF 1420 Delray Beach FL is unusual in that it owns an 18-piece big-band of its own, which plays commercially

WMDJ 1440 Martin KY is now on the air, format unknown  
 WWCN 1460 Albany NY (x-WOKO) is now all-news using the CNN network, also carried USEFL football this past season

WCEA 1470 Newburyport MA (x-WNBP) is adult contemporary "By the Sea"  
 WPJM 1540 Adamsville TN is religious; "We Praise Jesus' Ministries"  
 WLDM 1570 Westfield MA is all-news, using CNN net; "Newsradio 15-70"

AM stations in the Dallas-Port Worth market (which is heavily FM-penetrated) have each contributed \$50,000 toward a market research study and a re-marketing of all the AM's in the two towns. They'll try to turn back the listeners that left them for FM stations. The CBC's "As It Happens" and "Variety Tonight" series have each been cut back by a half hour per day; the "Nightfall" drama series will be cancelled this fall. CBS will carry a newly-invented NCAA Football game, the "Kickoff Classic", to be held 8/29 in East Rutherford NJ. Mutual is planning additional fine arts programming after last year's success with National Symphony Orchestra transmissions; it's also planning "Olympics '84", two daily, 5-minute reports and commentary hosted by former medalists and coaches; Mutual is also negotiating with Pat Buchanan (conservative) and Tom Braden (liberal) to bring their successful WRC 980 Washington DC 1700-1900 ET talk show to network radio; the two are also newspaper columnists and hosts of a similar TV talk show on CNN. Among RKO's special summer programming are "Countdown Summertime", for broadcast around 8/20 featuring the top 50 songs of the past 10 summers, "Live in Concert: Air Supply" on 9/4, and "Solid Gold Scrapbook" a two-hour show each week from 9/10 to 11/11 with each show featuring pop music from two years in the 1963 to 1982 range. Various programs in syndication: "Rock of the 80's" a 2-hour weekly countdown; "Robert Plant Special" with the former Led Zeppelin lead singer hosting in August; "Olympic Minute" a twice-a-day feature on 66 stations through 7/27/84; an album-oriented country format designed for younger demographics; "Hot Summer Rock" specials from United Stations; "Solid Gold Country" a weekly 3 hours starting Labor Day weekend on KSON 1240 CA and WNYR 990 NY; and "Ringo's Yellow Submarine... A Voyage Through Beatles Magic" on the ABC-FM net, started 6/4. The TV version of Larry King's radio show had its last broadcast on 7/10. One major sale of an FM station (subject to FCC approval) this week: KGO-FM 103.7 San Francisco CA has been sold by ABC to KLOK Radio for \$5.5 million.

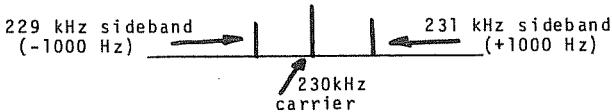

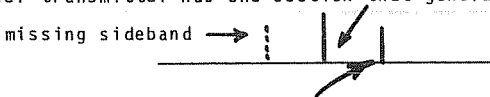

- 1710 ??? 0238 6-1 3 separate pips hrd instead of 2 as in previous months. Same situation on 1746 kHz. Sounds the same on AM.(Frodge)
- 1715 ??? 0231 6-2 Double pips-42/min.-occasionally merging to one long pip. Loops tightly 340 degrees. (Frodge)
- 1783 ??? 0205 6-20 Two separate stations here. One has 30 long pips/min. and the other has 30 short pips/min. Hrd simultaneously. "Long pip" station runs carrier only (A0) for long periods of time. A 100 Hz het noted between the two carriers. (Healy)

CPP Cullman, AL is widely reported on 1615a instead of it's "correct" 7th harmonic of 1610 kHz. (nominal 230 kHz x 7 = 1610). Howcum?? Most newer beacons on the air today do not use AM transmitters as we know them. A true AM transmitter would have a spectrum like this, using a 1 kHz modulating frequency.....




The newer transmitter has one section that generates the carrier only....



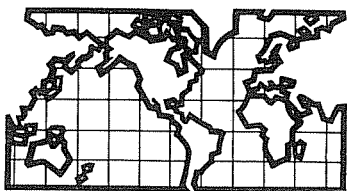
And a separate circuit that generates a lower power CW (A1) signal at a frequency 1 kHz higher, or 231 kHz in our example. The signals still heterodyne together in the receiver as they did before and, Viola! An equivalent to MCW (A2) code transmission. Now, how does this relate to CPP? OK, if the +231 kHz circuit was defective and radiating a harmonic it would be  $7 \times 231 = 1617$  kHz. This is about where most reports put it. Even if the carrier were present, (1610 kHz), it would be buried by Anguilla, TIS, etc. An article in "Lowdown" a while ago had a good explanation of this type of beacon station.

Of some interest is the current status of the marker beacon in Newark, CA (Metro San Francisco). Frequency, tone, how well it seems to get out, and any other info of interest.

Lots of these "KA&five numbers" beacons have shown up in the last six months. It would seem that these are FCC type calls. Anyone know anything about these?

Oh yes...Logging credits: The Frodge and Healy Show, Same equipment.

Just a small space here, so I thought I'd put in a word or two about the CPC. The CPC was founded by folks who wanted to hear stations that normally could not be heard during the night hours. **CHINA** - CPBS-1 has been observed on a new freq., 1080. Xinjiang PBS Uighur programming has been noted on a new frequency, 1044 (Y. Kato, FERC). A new powerful Yunnan PBS transmitter on 990kHz went on 6/1. Guizhou PBS on 765, 927 & 1026, is on 2130-0030, 0150-0600, 0850-1605. Fujian PBS P1 is on from 2050-1700 in Standard CC & Amoy on 506 668 612 824 840 882 1050 1370 1392 1400 1420 1452 1492. The service also carries some programs for listeners in Taiwan (BBC).

**INDIA** - A new 10kw AIR MW outlet is planned for Gauhati (No freq.-PT). Delhi "B"-666 (ex-1020) is now 100kw (BBC).

**INDONESIA** - Ramadan took place 6/13-7/12. One result was early sign on times for many Indonesian stations (David Foster, NZDXT).

**KOREA, NORTH (PRK)** - R. Pyongyang has JJ on 783kHz 0900-1455, 2100-2250 (BBC).

**SRI LANKA** - TWR Puttalam has EE 1830-2030 (FERC)  
**TAIWAN** - As of 5/8, Taiwan BC, Taipei 2nd network is on 1190 rather than 1180 (Y. Kato, FERC). Fu Hsing BS noted on 560/909 (S. Hasegawa, FERC).  
**THAILAND** - A new 50kw XR goes on the air in September from Kravi; it will be part of the Educational 2nd Network (BBC). (No freq.-PT). Radio Thailand-927, Bangkok, 10kw, has EE 2330-0200, 0500-0600, 1130-1230; FF 0430-0500; **Laotian** 0915-1000; **Std. Chinese** 1000-1030; **Vietnamese** 1100-1130; **Cambodian** 1230-1310; **Malay** 1310-1400; JJ 1400-1430; **Burmese** 1430-1500 (BBC). A later BBCMS bulletin says EE is now on from 2330-0600, but no fate of the other foreign languages as noted above was specified (BBC).  
**USSR** - Magadan-1008 now Orbita-1, ex-Mayak. Khabarovsk-999 Mayak 2000-0900, local 0900-? Petropavlovsk-Kamchatka-576 is on 1700-1600 (Olle Alm, ARC)

**ALBANIA** began DST 4/10/83 (BBCMS)  
**ANGOLA** - Luanda is off GP, on 944/1088/1367. Lobito is on 1000kHz, Lubango on 1232, Benguela on 1502.5 (a compromise?) (V. Korinek)

However, the tourist program is back on the air as of 6/27 ("Welcome to Cyprus") 0500-0700 on 603kHz (GG 0500; EE 0530; Swedish 0600; FF 0630; AA 0645) (BBC).  
**CZECHOSLOVAKIA** - Radio Prague has Polish on 1071 & 1287kHz from 0530-0630. The **Inter-Programme** is then on Mon-Sun. 0630-0900 and continues til 1200 Mon-Sat.; it is in C/S, GG, FF, EE. It is on again 2300-2355 Mon-Sun. A Sunday concert is on Sundays 0900-1200, followed by RR 1200-1300 and GG 1300-1400. The following 1/2 hour pgms. are on 1287 only: GG on the hour between 1700-2130; **Italian** 1730, 1930, 2200; FF 1830, 2030; EE 2130 (BBC)  
**EGYPT** reverted to Standard time for Ramadan, but will go back on DST when it is over (BBC)  
**GABON** is pre-GP, 989kHz (V. Korinek). (The 1554 station is still heard in Europe, but I heard and verified their 1602 outlet in Kenya - PT).  
**GERMANY, BRD (WEST)** - SWF-666 installed a new 240m antenna 4/14/83, thus providing better coverage (350kw) in the southern region. WDR-774 was off 4/18-7/1, reason unknown. AFN Monchengladbach will be on either 1107 or 1143 with 1kw (MWSC).  
**GERMANY, DDR (EAST)** - R. DDR Ferienwelle-558 is using only 20kw year round. SP Tuesdays after Ferienwelle s/off 1800. The latter goes for 729kHz as well (BT, ARC). **GREENLAND** - AFRS-1430 Thule closed in late 1982, leaving only Sondestrom's 1000kHz (500w) and 1490kHz (1kw) (SCDX)  
**IRELAND** - In May, Irish authorities closed Ireland's two most popular pirate stations, R. Sunshine and R. Nova after complaints that they interfered with British stations, and aeronautical and maritime services. However, they are now back on, with R. Sunshine back on 531 and R. Nova-828 with reduced power, ex-819. Boyneside Radio-1323, Navan, ex-1260 (other XRs: 1233 Carrickarnon (studios in Newry; Drogheda-1305; Skerries-1314 (new); Dublin-1323, ex-1404). R. Carousel-1395, Northern Ireland, ex-1413. (SCDX, SM, KB, SDXL via ARC). R. West, Mullingar, is on 703 (WDXC via ARC).  
**ITALY** - New RAI P. Uno-999, 50kw, is on in Capo Vaticano (O. Alm, ARC).  
**KENYA** - The old VOK stations seem to be on pre-GP frequencies (611, 953). (V. Korinek).  
**LEBANON** - The Palestinians are planning to establish a station in the Jabal Turbul area of Northern Lebanon, despite opposition of local inhabitants and leaders and concern by Syria. The Voice of Hope's unannounced 1593kHz station has shifted down to 684kHz (BBC).  
**MOZAMBIQUE** - All stations are on pre-GP frequencies, except Maputo, which alternates between 1008.00 and 1010.00 (1010 is favored at the moment). Lichinga drifts from its nominal 782 down to 777 (V. Korinek). R. Mozambique began a 60 lesson EE course 6/6, with assistance from the BBC. Times are 1630 & 1940 MWF, with repeats the same time TThSa (BBC).  
**NETHERLANDS** - Hulsberg: 891 P1, 1251 P2 under construction, 10kw (MWSC)  
**NIGERIA** - Owerri-721 is off GP. FRCN-666 Benin has an early 2130 s/off (V. Korinek). Six new FRCN stations were to have been commissioned before the end of June -- Abeokuta (1170kHz), Benin (?Akure), Enugu, Owerri, Calabar (BBC).  
**POLAND** - Polish radio has been restructured. P1 remains on 227LW 24 hours. P2 has been discontinued; its MW outlets are now P3 except for a 90 minute period on Sundays. P4 will be renamed P2 (FM only) (BBC).  
**SAO TOME** is GP, on 945kHz (V. Korinek).



**SOUTH AFRICA** - Johannesburg East-1286, R.5, is now on 828kHz. Only Pietersburg remains off GP (1115kHz) (V. Korinek).

**SOUTH AFRICA/BOPHUTHATSWANA** - 1098 is on M-Thu 0300-2100, Fri-Sun 0300-2200 (V. Korinek, DXA)

**SWAZILAND** - TWR-1170 has EE 1730-2000, Zulu 300-0330 (WRTH NL). SBS is on 881, pre-GP, whereas SCR-1377 and TWR-1170 are conforming (V. Korinek).

**SYRIA** went on DST 4/9/83 (BBCMS)

**TANZANIA** - R. Tanzania external service carries these programs on 1035kHz: "V. of Pan Africanist Congress of Azania" 0415 MWF, 1815 TuTh, 1845 Sat; "Radio Freedom" (African Natl. Congress pgm.) 0415 TuThSa, 1815 MWF; "Voice of Namibia" (SWAPO) 0415 Sun., 1815 Sat., 1830 M-F (BBC). R. Tanzania National Service is on 531, 621, 657 (to 1300 only), 720, 1215 from 0300-2100 approx. in Swahili. The Commercial Service is on 657kHz 1300-2015. R. Tanzania Zanzibar is on 585 (probably 584-PT) but no details are available (BBC).

**UNITED ARAB EMIRATES** - The new AA powerhouse on 1539 is "The Voice of the UAE" from Sa'diyat (Bengt Erickson, ARC)

**UNITED KINGDOM** - Chiltern Radio South-828, Luton, on 0558-0103 M-Sat, and 0658-0103 Sun. Chiltern Radio North-792, Bedford has its own programs M-F 1006-1300 and 2103-2200 Tue. & Wed. BBC R2-990 Cardigan Bay area, Tywyn, began 5/11 with 500w. GB Radio-1305 (Gwent Bcasing), began 6/13. BBC R. Bristol-1584 relay will move to 1323 in Sept. Southern South-1332, Brighton, due on the air later this year (SDXL, SCDX, BDXC via ARC). BBC R. York-666 began 7/4 with 500w. BBC R. Shropshire-756, Shrewsbury, 1kw, due on early 1984 (WDXC, BBC).

**YUGOSLAVIA** - Rikeja-864 has Italian 1930-2000 (WRTH NL). Between 7/1 and the end of September, all 8 Yugoslav radio centers will carry tourist information in EE, Greek, GG, Italian, with segments lasting from 3-5 minutes. The broadcasts will have the same introductory jingle (BBC).

**ZAMBIA** - 2kw, rather than 250kw, is in use on 816 (R. Ginbey, WRTHNL). Kitwe is on 548.7, Lusaka on 630 (GP) and 818 (pre-GP), and Mongu on 828 (GP) V. Korinek).

**ZIMBABWE** - On GP are 585 612 684; pre-GP are 791 and 854 (V. Korinek).

## WGAN-AM and FM may be sold

Portland radio stations WGAN-AM and FM are for sale.

For about two weeks, "Discussions have been held to that end, but nothing has been resolved," Guy Gannett Broadcasting Services executive vice president Robert Gilbertson said Thursday.

Gilbertson said he could not name the other party in the negotiations, but added it is an organization established in broadcasting.

The stations' availability "was not a general announcement," Gilbertson said, but was communicated specifically to the potential buyer.

WGAN radio has 30 employees, counting both management and labor.

Gilbertson said negotiations could conclude "in 24 hours or 24 days," but he could not predict the result.

He added, "Guy Gannett Publishing Co., through its subsidiary in the broadcasting company, plans to continue to expand in broadcasting."

The company owns newspapers in Portland, Augusta and Waterville. Its broadcasting arm owns stations in Maine, Massachusetts, Florida, Iowa and Oklahoma.

WGAN-AM first broadcast Aug. 3,

1938 from the old Columbia Hotel on Congress Street.

Regular programs of the 7 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. broadcast days of August 1938 included the Late Risers' Club, Montana Slim the Yodeling Cowboy, Problems of Life, Happy Cherie and his Hillbilly Champions and Richard Maxwell, Tenor Philosopher.

The Evening Express of Aug. 27 that year called the new station "a definite progressive influence in the state."

The broadcasting service later moved to the Gannett Building at 390 Congress St. Its present home is at Northport Plaza, Washington Avenue.
