NEW ALASKA TIME ZONES

According to newspaper articles sent in by Steve Mittman and Art Peterson, Alaska's time zones will be rearranged on October 30. Most of the state will be on what is now Yukon time (GMT-9), except for the westernmost part of the Aleutian Islands, which will be GMT-10.

BOOK REVIEW: WHITE'S RADIO LOG

A few issues ago, we mentioned that this log, formerly part of Communications World & other magazines, is now available in booklet form. We're pleased to say we recently received an evaluation copy in the mail and it looks well worth the \$4.95 (plus S&H) they're asking for it. The guide is 138 pages long, in 5x8 inch format, making it handy for taking on DXpeditions and other travels. It includes listings of AM stations (by freq, call, & location), FM stations (by call & location), and TV stations (by location). There's also a listing of shortwave stations. Content-wise, it seems to be quite accurate. In years gone by, the White's log was known to have all sorts of typos and glaring errors. This edition has obviously been very carefully checked before publication. However, it's not as up-to-date as one might hope. The log was apparently not updated after about August, 1982, even though it was released in mid 1983. For example, KIXI and KWIP moved to 880 in Sept 1982, but are still listed on their old freqs of 910 & 1460. Also, the lack of "by frequency" listings for TV & FM stations limits their usefulness for DXers of those bands. Overall, though, the first edition of the log is quite useful and nicely complements our IRCA Almanac. You can order the White's Log from Worldwide Publications Inc, PO Box 5206, North Branch, NJ 08876. Price in the US/Canada/Mexico is \$5.95 (including postage & handling).

We have lots of material on hand, but not much room to run it so we'll wait until later to run it. In the meantime, I think you'll enjoy this week's issue. See you next week.....bp.

Bosh -- a sort of "Post Sunset Authority?" Should be an added challenge for SSS DX'ers. The longer hours for daytimers looks good to cover PM drive, but would it do much good beyond 7PM? KIBE 1220 has been ribbing FCC in their sign-off (. . . "due to antiquated rules from the 1930's," or something like that), then they've been staying on for up to eight minutes beyond s/off time with the KDPC simulcast (compared to going off as much as 15 minutes early last year). They probably wait for KASY, KCOS or CKDA to start clobbering them before cutting the AM switch. (Daytimers are allowed a five-minute grace period, once in a while, hi-RtH.)

KNBR 680 is carrying (L.A.) Raiders this season (waiting for the Giants' season to end first. . . finally, hi). They dropped the Warriors BkB; KCBS will have them instead.

Weird conditions last night (29 September), with fair signals from the east (WJW, WLS, WCAU under KCLG, etc) while I had much trouble trying to get the Padres/Dodgers on either KFMB or XEXX (had to settle for the Dodgers side. . . on KDWN and KWTMS).

THE RATINGS IN GUATEMALA CITY

These two charts are taken from an eight page booklet entitled "La Radio Es el Medio", printed up by Radio Rumbos, 1210 kHz. It summarizes the 1982 Multiplex ratings survey in Guatemala.

The top chart is interpreted as follows. Three time periods across top followed by an average (promedio). Stations are down the left column. S.S. and Fabuestereo are FM, VEA is the 1570 station. "Otras 20 emisoras" refers to 20 others not listed above. "Encedidos" is the percentage of the total Guat City population listening to the radio during that time period, and apagados, those not. The station percentages are not audience shares, but the percentage of the total Guat City population tuning in. E.g., Nuevo Mundo's average of 4% is a 10% audience share of the 39.4% average listening (Arbitron might disagree with me...).

Below are the ten most popular programs. Number one is the country's most popular news program. The others I've not heard but can judge from titles: #2 Children's Festival, #3 Marimba Music, #4 radio soaps, #5 not sure, Flash Gordán maybe?, #6 "Cleaning Clun", music for housewives, #7 soaps, #8 memory club, #9 "Little Mornings in Your House", #10 "Guatemalan Hour" (Chapino is a slang term like Yankee).

The booklet is of little practical DX use but interesting nonetheless.

If anyone is interested I can photocopy and air mail it to you for \$2.00 US, cash only please. It is entirely in Spanish, but is rather easy to understand.

While on booklets, another one I just got is a 38 page (20 pages photocopied) one on Emisoras Unidas in Honduras. Again not of practical DX use, but if you're interested in broadcasting down here, this contains station profiles and lots of operational details. At least a fair Spanish background is required for this booklet. I can photocopy and airmail it at \$4.00 US, cash only.

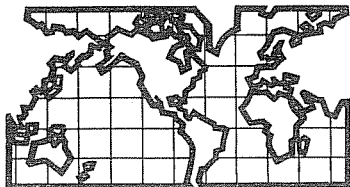

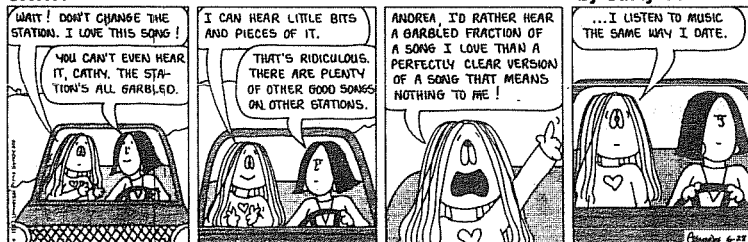

-----An interesting logging sheet has been developed by Don Moman (see sample section below). It's based on the 9 kHz channel spacing, and can be used to give a graphic illustration of how the band sounds as you tune across it. Although originally designed for use on Beverage DXpeditions, I've found it useful to use during overseas openings at home, as I can tell at a glance where the hotbeds of activity are. Due to my work schedule, I got up regularly before sunrise during August. A 15-minute bandscan each day netted some fascinating information about DU reception that month. For example, DU signals (if only a weak carrier) were noted here on 60 channels that month, while reasonable audio showed on 17 channels--much more than was expected.

To use the chart, note the time the bandscan starts where it is indicated, above 531. Then note signal quality, if any, on each channel as you tune up, using one or two letter abbreviations--Don uses fh = faint het through to GA = good audio. Note the time the scan finishes and there you are, the band from 531 through 1602. Over an evening's, morning's or mon month's listening, trends will show, and you'll have a good idea of where to hunt for the new ones, especially if you're going on to a Beverage expedition as I plan to. I can't wait to use it on TA's hi.

Don's not insisting on a copyright on this, so anyone is welcome to use the idea. I've had a couple of hundred printed for my own use, but with postage, etc. it would cost me about 7 cents each sheet to send them in quantity to others (U.S. stamps accepted as payment if you decide to go this route). I will send a single sheet to anyone who sends me a U.S. 20¢ or Canadian 32¢ stamp; then you can get 'em photocopied or printed in bulk, which will probably be much cheaper than my mailing quantities to you. Good DX.
