Don't let the German title scare you; this is actually a listing of radio beacons. The book was compiled by Dr Jurgen Trochimczyk and is 252 pages long. It lists over 9000 radiobeacons in Europe, USSR, Africa, Near & Middle East, Asia, Pacific, Antarctica, North America, the Caribbean, Central America, and South America. It lists most beacons between 150 kHz and 1900 kHz alphabetically. The forward and abbreviations list are written in English, German, Dutch, French, Spanish, Swedish, and Finnish. Price is DM 30- including postage and wrapping, or US \$15- including postage and wrapping. You can order it from Wilhelm Herbst Verlag, Postfach 45 05 06, D-5000 Koln 41, West Germany.

There's an AM radio station for sale in Vancouver, Washington for \$960K, \$150K down. Have not determined which station it is, but the evidence points to either KKSX or KARO. The broker told me that the station's gross last year was \$660K. I'm sure KVAN did a better job than that and both KKSX and KARO have gone through difficult times in the last few years. KARO 1480 was the original KVAN (which is now on 1550) and was owned by the same guys who had KIL0 1460 in Kirkland (now KGAA). Their business practices at KIL0 were a little suspect, to say the least. I don't know if they still hold an interest in KARO. KKSX 910 was in trouble with the FCC a couple years back for ID'ing as "Portland" which is across the Columbia River. They've had financial problems off and on and have tried several different formats to pull out of it. At one point they imported Bob Simmons, ex of KSN-FM (San Francisco) to do AOR. Personality disc jockeys are back

Tacky stunts, machine-gun delivery keep us tuned to radio voices

Biondi's back? You mean Dick Biondi, the "Wild Eyetrailian," the guy who dyed his beard school colors, took baths in 7-Up, sat on flagpoles and jumped off a stage wearing an Elvis-autographed shirt into a mob of girls?

Yes, Peggy Sue, the very one. A generation later. Biondi, a blast from the past, is back in the big time, giving out with the triple-time rap and goofball humor on Chicago's WBBM-FM. His return coincides with the decline of album-oriented rock formats and the revival of Top 40 on radio stations across the country.

The buzz in radioland is that Top 40, now called contemporary hit radio (CHR), will lead to the rebirth of the fast-talking, wild-and-crazy style of disc jockey popular during the 1950s and early '60s.

WBBM, which switched to CHR before Biondi's return, now has a *deja vu* sound to those who haven't been teenagers for 20 years; only this time, No. 1 is *Sweet Dreams* by Eurhythmics rather than *Tossin' and Turnin'* by Bobby Lewis.

It's new to the ears of young Chicago listeners who may have heard about Biondi from their parents, but probably never heard of Cousin Bruce, Alan Freed, Murray the K, J.J. Jeffrey, Humble Harve or any of the other hyperkinetic and ultra-cool DJs who once strung together hits for young rockers who would fall asleep with transistor radios under their pillows.

In the old days, DJs often played a role in influencing young lives. Biondi recalls two troubled youths in particular: "I often wondered if I said the right thing to them. They've kept in touch... — the boy has become a paramedic, the girl a legal secretary."

Ten years ago, after aban-

doning big-time radio, Biondi fled to North Myrtle Beach, S.C. A station owner who had never heard of him hired him for \$97.50 a week take-home to host a morning show and do play-by-play of local high-school football games.

Last July, he was unearthed by a Chicago television station's *Where Are They Now?* documentary, which prompted WBBM-FM general manager Brian Pussilano to invite Biondi to do a week's guest stint. Lots of phone calls, flowers and telegrams later, Biondi was offered a six-figure salary; he's now the station's morning man. "Most guys don't get a first shot in a city like this; I'm getting three," says Biondi, whose on-air adrenaline flows as fast at 50 as it did when he was Chicago's most popular DJ from 1960 to 1963.

That was before he was fired by WLS during an altercation with a station executive. He later joined Chicago's WCFB for five years, then was fired again.

He could be hard to handle. Once he threw a phone at a consultant. Another time he announced that the station manager couldn't go home because his teen-age bride was having a pajama party and that anyone seeing the station manager driving around downtown in his gray Impala should throw a rock through his window. Someone did. Fired again.

Biondi badly wants to make a new start in Chicago, although competitors doubt he can dent a market dominated by WGN's mellow-but-quirky Wally Phillips and WLS' wryly creative Larry Lujack.

Bob Henabery, a New York radio consultant, says the personality factor has always been

the "strongest suit in the business," and is now more important than ever as stations turn to CHR.

"I sense a turnaround. The baby boomers are maturing, and 10 years from now they'll be the over-the-hill gang. They still represent the largest segment of the population, and we now have stations that are so much alike that people are looking for something different. It will encourage talent back into the medium."

But Doubleday Broadcasting president Gary Stevens, who recently switched Denver's KPXE-FM from album rock to CHR, says too much time and money is needed to build a personality, particularly in medium-size markets.

"The upside is that if you've got a good guy you make a lot of money. The downside is that if he leaves you've got a big hole to fill."

Stevens says radio stations first overemphasized personality, then "overshifted" to other types of programming. "The business hasn't been developing new talent," he says.

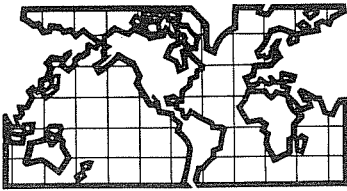
Sometimes, talent and popularity aren't enough. When Howard Stern was on WDCB-AM in Washington, D.C., ratings were high, but such tactics as a gay date-date service and an interview with a prostitute didn't please some advertisers or station president Goff Lebar, who now calls Stern the "National Enquirer of the air."

Stern left a year ago for WNBC-AM in New York, where he continues to ridicule management through such tactics as reading office memos on the air. He recently matched up a gay caller seeking his first date with a woman.

Lebar says radio is cyclical: "What's happening is that all those consultants who used to say get rid of the DJs, now are saying go get the DJs."

Some DJs never went

away. Gary Owens, named the USA's top DJ 10 times in the past 20 years by *Billboard*, says the "personality DJ is always akin to big money for radio stations." Owens, heard mornings on KPRZ-AM, Los Angeles, sees his show as a "fugue — a flight of fantasy."

"I try to be somebody they can trust — somebody they know is having fun and not taking life too seriously."

Owens, a former regular on television's *Laugh-In* who coined the term "beautiful downtown Burbank," bemoans the lack of training grounds for young DJs. "You have to be from somewhere to break into the big markets."

"But radio will always have personalities — they're the life-

blood. Those (DJs) that have them will survive."

Some of those personalities are created from thin air, as in the case of Detroit's Charles "The Electrifying Mojo" Johnson, "the protector of the groove, the keeper of the beat," who nightly arrives on WILB-FM in a "mother ship" to "make the metro come alive." After playing his picks for future hits — a "tripped-out prototype of your musical future" — Mojo calls the Midnight Funk Association to order and inducts new members: "At midnight, will you dance on your back if you're in bed?"

One DJ with proven staying power is Jerry Blavat, who returned to Philadelphia's WFIL-AM over the Labor Day week-

end after the station dropped him two years ago for a foray into country music. Blavat's firmly back in the groove as "The Geator with the Heater; the Boss with the Hot Sauce; the man with a plan to get everybody rockin' and rollin' in the land."

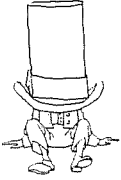
His persona was launched in 1962 when he bought two hours' time on WCAM in Camden, N.J., with a signal so puny that teen-agers had to hold their transistors to their ears. But he caught on with hip kids and unseated the big stations.

In Philadelphia, The Geator was Boss Radio, as Fat Daddy was in Baltimore; Frantic Freddy in Allentown, Pa.; and other rat-a-tat-tat types like Jazzbo Collins, Jocko Hender-

son, "The Ace from Outer Space"; Joe Niagara; Wolfman Jack; and George Woods, "The Guy with the Goods."

"The most important thing for a personality is to maintain credibility," says Blavat, 41. "Too many guys go along with the current fad and then switch to the next. The secret is to not sell out!"

Like The Geator says: "You got to keep on rockin' 'cause you only rock once."

The IRCA Central American List

Compiled by Bruce Portzer and Don Moore

Here is the much heralded and long-awaited first edition of the IRCA Central American Log. This list is believed to be one of the most complete and most accurate listings of stations in that part of the world. This log was a joint effort with Don doing the "field work" (DXing, visiting stations, etc) in Honduras and Guatemala, and Bruce sorting through old DX bulletins and compiling the information on a computer. The main sources of information include Don's DXing from Santa Barbara, Honduras, and his travels to other cities in the region, information obtained from stations, DX Worldwide reports from the last two years, information published in DX Worldwide II during the last couple of years, plus some odds and ends from NRC, MWSC, RIB, and other publications and clubs.

Here's a brief explanation of what the list contains:

Column 1: Frequency, unstable stations are listed on their most recently or most frequently reported frequency, with their nominal frequency listed in column 11.

Column 2: Call letters. For the uninitiated, the prefix tells which country the station is in: none-Belize, HO-Panama, HR-Honduras, HT-Nicaragua, TI-Costa Rica, TG-Guatemala, YS-El Salvador.

Column 3: Location (city)

Column 4: Departamento (their equivalent to states). The two letter codes have been developed exclusively for this list and should NOT be used when sending mail down there because the postal people probably won't know what you mean. BELIZE:

Column 5: Power, in kilowatts

Column 6: Slogan, (R: Radio, LV: La Voz)

Column 7: Schedule (in UTC). Times are approximate in some cases and may vary, especially on weekends. Some of the variations (where known) are mentioned in column 11. AN, of course, means 24 hour operation.

Column 8: Format. C1-Classical, In-Instrumental, Ez-light instrumentals & vocals, Po-Popular music (mostly in Spanish, possibly a few in English), Rm-Romantic (light vocals in Spanish), Ma-Marimba, Ra-Ranchera, Tr-Tropical, La-Latin American (various styles), Rk-Rock music (in Spanish & English), Va-Varied, Nx-News, Sp-Sports, Cu-Cultural programs, Ed-Educational pgms, Re-Religious programs.

Column 9: Network. If a frequency or call letters are shown it means the station is part of a network of unmanned repeaters, with the main station in the country's capital. In most other cases, the station originates its own programs most of the time but hooks up to the network for newscasts, sports broadcasts, and other special programs. Networks include: CAV-Cadena Audio Visual (main station HRLP-610), CRO-Circuito Radiofonico de Oriente (El Salvador) CZ-Cadena Zeta (main station HRZW-1180), CRH-Empresa Centra Radial Hondurena, EUG-Emisoras Unidas de Guatemala (main station TGRT-670), EUH-Emisoras Unidas (main station HRN-670), RCN-Radio Cadena Nacional (Guatemala), RM-Radio Mundial (main station TGHR-700), RNM-Radio Nuevo Mundo (TGJ-880), RPN-Radio Presna News Network (Guatemala), RDP-Radiopolis Network (HRZT-590), UNR-Union Nacional de Emisoras Rurales (Costa Rica).

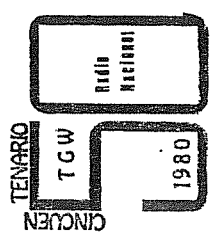
Column 10: Indicates if someone has received a verification from the station recently. In certain cases the verie is for shortwave or for the main station that is being relayed. Q-QSL Card, L-Letter.

Column 11: A catch-all, includes frequencies of shortwave and FM affiliates, information on non-Spanish programs, the nominal frequency (for drifters), variations in schedules, and miscellaneous information.

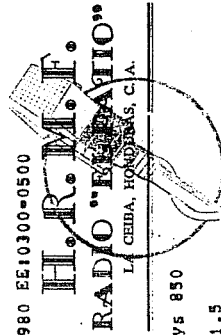
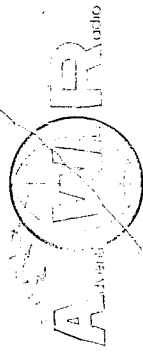

THE GOLDRUSH: Charlie Chaplin, Georgia Hale, Mack Swain, Tom Murray (1925) ****
Many critics consider this the top comedy of all time & one of the best films ever made. Charlie stars as the lone prospector, in the Yukon during the goldrush days of the 1890's. He stumbles upon a cabin occupied by desperado Black Larson (Tom Murray). Meanwhile, Big Jim McKay (Mack Swain) finds gold & marks his claim. A big storm brings him to this same cabin. After Black & Jim struggle over a gun (which always is pointed at Charlie) it is decided that Charlie & Jim can stay. Black Larson, sent to look for food, stumbles on Jim's claim & doesn't return, leaving Charlie & Jim to starve. The scenes involving Charlie as a chicken & the Thanksgiving Dinner are classics. Eventually, the weather clears up & both Charlie & Jim part. Jim returns to his claim & finds Black looting it. A fight breaks out & Black knocks Jim out with a shovel, giving him amnesia. Charlie, meanwhile, goes to town where he falls for Georgia. Georgia pretends to fall for Charlie to spite the local ladies man & accepts a dinner invitation from Charlie. The scene of Charlie waiting for his dinner guests, who never show up, is probably Chaplin's most memorable. Eventually Big Jim remembers where his claim is, with Charlie's help. Big Jim makes Charlie his partner and they set off on a ship to return to the U.S. On the boat, Charlie meets Georgia again, this time she falls for him.
